

Easy to Win Elections Sitting in Jail: SC money laundering case. The

The Supreme Court on Monday remarked that persons like former councilor Tahir Hussain, an accused in the Delhi riots, should be barred from contesting elections. The remarks by the apex court came at the hearing on a plea filed by Hussain who sought interim bail to campaign for the upcoming Delhi Assembly polls. He is undergoing judicial custody in a

top court deferred hearing on his interim bail plea to Janu-A bench of Justices Pankaj Mithal and Ahsanuddin Amanullah adjourned the hearing due to paucity of time but just as it was rising for the day, Hussain's lawyer mentioned the matter and requested for a hearing on January 21. "It is easy to win elections sitting in jail. All such persons should be barred from contesting the

elections," the bench remarked in response. Hussain's counsel said his nomination was accepted. The Delhi high court on January 14 granted custody parole to Hussain to file nomination papers from the Mustafabad constituency on an AIMIM ticket. It, however, refused his plea for interim bail from January 14 to February 9 to fight the polls, saying the gravity of allegations against Hussain, being the main perpetrator in

the violence, resulting in the death of several persons, could not be overlooked. The high court observed that about 11 FIRs were registered against him in connection with the riots and he was admittedly in custody in a related money laundering case and UAPA case. Hussain's counsel argued fighting elections was a complicated process, which required him to not only file his nomination by January 17 but also open a bank account


Harish Rao Slams Congress Government Over Farmers' Water Crisis

Hyderabad WUT | Jan. 21

Former Minister Harish Rao has sharply criticized the Congress government for its failure to provide irrigation water to farmers, leading to widespread protests across the state. Rao pointed out that the situation has become so dire that farmers are forced to take to the streets to demand water for their fields.Highlighting the inefficiency of Water Minister Uttam Kumar Reddy, Rao noted that even in Reddy's own home district of Suryapet, farmers are struggling to access irrigation water.



Despite lavish promises and campaign advertisements claiming the release of water to irrigate over 336,000 acres across several constituencies, including Tungaturthi, Suryapet, and Kodad, no water has reached the farmers.Rao expressed frustration with the government's broken promises, criticizing the release schedule of irrigation

BRS Party Forms Study Committee to Investigate Farmer Suicides and Agricultural Crisis

In response to the increasing farmer suicides and worsening agricultural conditions in Telangana, the Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS) has announced the formation of a 9-member study committee. The committee, led by former Agriculture Minister Niranjan Reddy, will embark on a twoweek tour across all districts in the state to assess the severity of the issue.

The committee's focus will be on examining the rising number of farmer suicides and the ongoing agricultural crisis, with a detailed report to be submitted to the state government, Agriculture Minister, Agriculture Commission, and BRS Party President KCR. After the extensive study, the committee aims to identify the primary causes behind the alarming trend of farmer suicides and the agricultural sector's decline in the past year. **BRS** Working President



KTR expressed deep concern over the surge in suicides during the one-year tenure of the Congress government, which had made several promises to the farming community. KTR highlighted that over 400 farmers have already taken their own lives, citing the government's failure to fulfill its farm loan waiver promises,

A women's group at Bhadrachalam in Kothagudem district has been making strides towards self-reliance and financial stability by baking healthy millet snacks.

The members of Srirama Joint Liability Group with the assistance of Bhadrachalam Integrated Tribal Development Agency (ITDA) recently started a unit making ragi and jowar biscuits. ITDA supplied equipment and offered training in Hyderabad to make the biscuits.

The group has been making about five kilograms of biscuits every day. The products are being sold with the brand name Bhadradri Millet Magic in Kothagudem and Bhadrachalam and efforts are on to market them in Khammam as well informed the



Today that there has been an increase in demand for ragi and jowar biscuits and to meet the demand they are planning to purchase a larger oven with which nearly 600 biscuits could be baked per batch.

The ingredients used in making the biscuits are completely healthy and no artificial preservatives are used. Ragi flour, jowar flour, butter, ghee, and jaggery are used to make bis cuits. The consumer base includes traders from Bhadrachalam and the res-

idents. The biscuits are also being shipped to consumers in London as the consumers who tasted the biscuits during their visit to Bhadradri Temple were impressed with their quality and wanted them dispatched to their place, she explained. Another team leader of the group T Lalitha said they are planning to sell the biscuits by setting up a stall at Bhadradri Temple and Khammam collectorate.

The biscuit unit was started following advice from former ITDA project officer Prateek Jain.

The group initially was engaged in making sanitary pads with brand name 'Giri sanitary pads' under the supervision of Bhadradri Srirama Sanitary Napkin Unit. It was set up seven years ago with a project cost of Rs 13.45 lakh. The sanitary pads are being supplied to girls hostels under the Bhadrachalam ITDA also to hostels in Mulugu, Eturnagaram and Nalgonda, she added.

SCCL to mine coal from Odisha mines next year, says Bhatti

Hyderabad WUT | Jan . 21

Deputy Chief Minister Mallu Bhatti Vikramarka announced on Monday that the Singareni Collieries Company Limited (SCCL) will begin coal production from the Naini coal blocks in Odisha by March 2026, marking a significant milestone in the company's efforts to expand its operations beyond Telangana. The development follows years of planning to diversify and enhance the national reach of the state-owned mining corporation.

Speaking at the third National Mining Ministers' Conference in Konark, Bhatti shared that SCCL intends to establish a 1,600-megawatt coal-based power project near the Naini mining block. He also called on Odisha's

Chief Minister, Mohan Charan Manji, to allocate land for the proposed power plant to support the initiative. Initially, SCCL had planned to transport the

coal extracted from the Naini coal block to the 800 MW Singareni Thermal Power Plant (STPP) located in Jaipur, Mancherial district, approximately 1,000 kilometers away. However, to reduce operational costs and logistical challenges, Bhatti stated that the Telangana government decided to construct a pithead power plant directly at the Naini coal

block. The Naini coal block, allocated to SCCL by the Union Coal Ministry in 2015, is located in the Mahanadi coalfield and features an opencast mine with a production capacity of 10 million tonnes per



year. The lease for the mining area spans 912.79 hectares.

SCCL's mining activities had been delayed for several years due to strained relations between the BRS-led Telangana government and the BJP-led Central government, which hindered the transfer of forest land required for mining operations. However, the issue was resolved when Union Coal Minister G.

Kishan Reddy intervened, leading to the approval for the transfer of 643 hectares of forest land in Odisha in July 2024.

Bhatti also highlighted the increase in revenue from mining activities for the Telangana government, which rose from Rs. 1,958 crore in 2014 to Rs. 5,440 crore in the 2023-24 fiscal year. The state government has also initiated the auctioning process

for 32 major mining blocks, including those for limestone and manganese, with the goal of completing the process by 2025-26. Furthermore, Bhatti acknowledged the efforts of Union Minister G. Kishan Reddy for successfully organizing the national conference. He noted that the Telangana government has conducted a comprehensive mineral availability audit using Differential Global Positioning System (DGPS) and Electronic Total Station surveys. The state currently has 2,552 mining leases in operation, and the district mining foundations have generated Rs. 5,537 crore from auc-

After Musk-Ambani Tussle, India Bets Satellite Spectrum Policy Can Attract Many Companies

New delhi WUT | Jan . 21

India's decision to allocate satellite spectrum, rather than auction it. will give consumers more choice, the telecoms minister said on Monday, playing down concern by Mukesh Ambani's Reliance Jio that it could lose out to Elon Musk's Starlink. Starlink has long wanted to launch in India and has in recent months clashed with billionaire Ambani's company over how the country should grant spectrum for satellite services. Reliance had urged an

auction but the Indian government sided with Musk who wanted it to be allocated administratively, in line with global trends. Analysts say an auction, requiring much more investment, would likely deter foreign rivals. Ambani said he wanted a level playing field and has been worried that his telecom company, which spent \$19 billion in airwave auctions, now risks losing broadband customers to Starlink and potentially even data and voice clients later as technology ad-

vances. "My job as telecoms minister is to make sure that you have as many choices as possible," Jyotiraditya Scindia told Reuters during an interview at his ministry's office in New Delhi Asked if there was merit in Reliance's concerns, he said, without naming any company: "Technology is never constant", adding that companies need to keep evolving. Scindia noted that current satellite technology for communications requires devices to have the sky in their sight, and smartphones cannot use that technology for indoor services that

are provided by terrestrial networks. "The minute you come

into this building, you're done," he said. India is one of the world's biggest telecom markets with 942 million users and stiff competition among Reliance and rivals Bharti Airtel and Vodafone Idea. Data prices are among the cheapest in the world and internet connectivity has risen rapidly.

Deloitte predicts India's satellite broadband service market will be worth \$1.9 billion by 2030, making it lucrative for players like Starlink, Amazon and Ambani. Scindia said Starlink and Amazon Kuiper's applications for a licence to launch satellite broadband services in the country were still under review. Musk has a reputation for disrupting markets.

In Kenya, he priced Starlink at \$10 per month, versus \$120 in the United States, prompting a complaint by Kenya's Safaricom last year.

A former aviation minister, Scindia is also overseeing many more telecom initiatives for Prime Minister Narendra Modi.

India's government owns a stake in Vodafone Idea, and the company in November disclosed it still had around \$24 billion in dues owed to the government. Scindia repeatedly declined to answer in the interview if there were any plans for relief on the outstanding dues. The Indian government is, however, working towards reviving state-run telecom player, Bharat Sanchar Nigam Limited (BSNL), which lost market share amid fierce competition over the years, he said. SG RAISES CONCERNS OVER HALAL CERTIFICATION OF NON-MEAT PRODUCTS IN SUPREME COURT

The top law officer made the submissions during hearing of pleas challenging a notification prohibiting the manufacturing, storage, sale and distribution of food products with halal certification within Uttar Pradesh barring items produced for export. body can have any objection. But your lordships would be shocked, as I was shocked, that even cement and iron bars used are to be halal certified," Mehta submitted before a bench of Justices B.R. Two other members of the gang, Islam and Gullu from Uttar Pradesh, are absconding. The gang targeted senior citizens, women and illiterate individuals at ATM kiosks. Under the pretext of assisting with transactions, they would observe the victims' PIN, and swap their ATM cards with similar-looking ones.

The gang then used the stolen cards to withdraw money from nearby ATMs or make purchases through POS machines. They were suspected of involvement in 18 offences, 10 in Telangana, two each in Andhra Pradesh and Karnataka and four in Odisha.In an incident that took place in the Bahadurpura on December 22, 2024, the gang duped a victim and withdrew Rs 2.03 lakh. Following a complaint, the Bahadurpura police registered a case and launched an investigation. Acting on information, the police arrested the suspects and seized the stolen money, ATM cards, vehicles and other items used in the crimes. The arrests were made under the supervision of Ande Srinivasa Rao, additional deputy commissioner of police, task force, Hyderabad, and inspector S. Raghav.



Everyone has been told to be flexible, Axar Patel highlights ahead of England T20Is



Openers are the only ones with a fixed slot in the Indian T20 line-up and the batting order that follows will be made up of "multiple floaters", new vice-captain Axar Patel said on Monday while spelling out the team's strategy ahead the five-match series against England.

India will start their campaign against England in a five-match T20I series at the Eden Gardens on Wednesday. Asked about being a floater in batting order, the all-rounder replied: "...it's not just about me; it applies to everyone in the team.

"Right from the start of 2024, we had decided to have a fixed opening slot, and from No. 3 to No. 7, everyone has been told to be flexible based on the situation, combinations, and match-ups." Axar, who is now a part of the team management for the series, spoke in a manner that reminded one of Rohit Sharma's interaction before the 2023 ODI World Cup where he called for flexibility in the middle-order.

"There is no fixed position where a particular batter will always play...it's the same for everyone in that range (between Nos 3 to 7), depending on who is having a great day, which we assess during practice sessions.

"In T20 cricket, it's all about utilising the right batter in the right situation." There is not much that changes for Axar as Suryakumar Yadav's deputy except for the fact that he will now also be a part of certain hard calls that are taken by the team management.

"It's been only one day. Yes, we (skipper Surya, head coach Gautam Gambhir and myself) have had a discussion. There is an extra responsibility on the leadership group. There is not much of a change. Obviously, we have a settled T20 side, there is not much pressure."

Kohli could not make it for Delhi's upcoming away clash against Saurashtra, beginning in Rajkot on January 23, due to a neck sprain but he has communicated to DDCA that he is available for the team's last league match of the Ranji Trophy."Virat has conveyed to DDCA president (Rohan Jaitley) and team management that he is available for the game against Railways," Delhi head coach Sarandeep Singh said. The BCCI has made playing domestic cricket mandatory for its contracted cricketers unless there is a fitness issue following the series loss in Australia earlier this month. Kohli last played a Ranji Trophy match in November 2012 when Delhi took on Uttar Pradesh in Ghaziabad. Thanks to BCCI's directive, the last two rounds of Ranji Trophy will be star-studded affairs. Kohli's India and Delhi teammate



Rishabh Pant will play his first Ranji game in six years when he takes the field in Rajkot. He too could be seen alongside Kohli in the Railways game. After the Champions Trophy squad announcement on Saturday, India captain Rohit Sharma confirmed his availability for Mumbai's match against Jammu and Kashmir at home. Other India stars including Shubman Gill, Yashasvi Jaiswal and Ravindra Jadeja will also be seen in action in the next round of Ranji Trophy for their respective sides.

The clamour for Rohit and Co to play red-ball cricket had grown after India lost their second successive Test series. After being blanked 3-0 by New Zealand at home, India lost the Border-Gavaskar Trophy 1-3 in Australia.

Both Rohit and Kohli had a series to forget in Australia. While Rohit decided to bench himself for the final Test in Sydney due to poor form, Kohli was caught in the slip cordon off balls outside the offstump as many as eight times in the series.

Samson to miss Kerala's Ranji match against Madhya Pradesh after selected for India duty



Sanju Samson will miss Kerala's sixth-round Ranji Trophy match against Madhya Pradesh, beginning here on January 23, as he has been included in India squad for the fivematch T20I series against England.

India will face England from January 22 at Kolkata and the rubber will culminate on February 2 at Mumbai. Unless Samson does not get released from India squad, the wicketkeeper batter will also miss the final Group C match against Bihar, starting on January 30.However, the 30-year-old has a chance to play for Kerala in the knockout phase as the state team is currently

Wet weather again threatened the proceedings in Sarawak, but the African nation made the most of their chances once it was confirmed there would be play, albeit a reduced contest of 13 overs each.

In another match of the day, Australia beat Bangladesh by two wickets in a tense Group D match and all but secured their progression to the next stage. England coach McCullum vows a 'watchful' strategy against India despite 'Bazball' reputation

Credited with introducing the ultra-aggressive 'Bazball' brand of batting, England coach Brendon McCullum on Monday sprang a surprise by promising to "play very watchful style of cricket" in the limited overs series

KTR Launches BRS Labor Department's Diary, **Slams Congress Over Policy Failures**

Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS) Working President K. Taraka Rama Rao (KTR) recently attended the diary launch program of the BRS Labor Department at Telangana Bhavan. During his speech, KTR emphasized that the BRS Labor Department would continue to oppose the anti-worker policies of the Congress government, highlighting that the fighting spirit of the department has not waned despite BRS losing power. KTR praised Chief Minister K. Chandrashekar Rao (KCR) for his support to laborers, particularly porters. He noted that KCR resolved the

porters' issues within the first 15 days of taking office, increasing their wages from ₹8 to ₹26. KTR also recalled how KCR provided significant support to migrant workers during the COVID-19 pandemic, offering them financial aid, food, and transport back to their hometowns, even though many of these workers were not from Telangana.

Highlighting KCR's unique approach to labor welfare, KTR pointed out that KCR had sanctioned thousands of houses for beedi workers as the Union Labor Minister in 2004. In 2005, he succeeded in creating a committee to address issues faced by unorganized



workers. KTR also referenced KCR's initiatives to increase the wages of safai workers and Anganwadi teachers, as well as his efforts to increase salaries for Asha workers and other municipal staff. KTR strongly criticized the Congress leadership

for misleading the public about KCR's fiscal policies. He pointed out that, under KCR's leadership, Telangana's per capita income rose from ₹1.14 lakh in 2014 to ₹3.56 lakh, and the state's debt was turned into an investment. KTR further noted

that the state's revenue surplus increased from ₹369 crore in 2014 to ₹5,944 crore, while Telangana's overall development-including infrastructure and irrigation projects-had been funded through loans seen as long-term investments. Responding to Congress allegations about the state's debt, KTR highlighted KCR's key achievements, such as building the Damaracherla power plant, various irrigation projects,

and welfare schemes for farmers, which have laid the foundation for future prosperity. KTR also took a jab at Congress leader Revanth

Reddy, questioning the allocation of a ₹1.4 lakh

crore loan taken under his leadership, accusing him of failing to deliver on promises made to the people of Telangana. He challenged Congress leaders to explain how they would address the issues of workers, including the establishment of an auto welfare board and other worker benefits. In closing, KTR urged the BRS Labor Department to elect new leaders in all 33 districts to take up the cause of workers and hold the Congress government accountable for its unfulfilled promises. He assured that the BRS leadership would continue supporting the legal fight for workers' rights.

HMDA Visits Kokapet Areas to Review Water Supply



HMDA commissioner Sarfaraz Ahmad and Water Board MD Ashok Reddy visited Kokapet and Neopolis on Monday to plan for future water needs in these areas which are growing rapidly. They inspected sites for building reservoirs and water infrastructure. At Neopolis, they reviewed land allocated for a balancing reservoir and pump house. The plan is to bring water from the Godavari Phase-2 project to the Khanapur reservoir and distribute it to nearby areas using gravity. Officials were asked to finalise the required plans for this.

The team also visited the Khanapur balancing reservoir. Ashok Reddy suggested proposals to build more reservoirs and water treatment plants here to meet future demands. Ashok Reddy also inspected the water conduit from Gandipet to Asifnagar filter beds. He directed officials to install fencing along the maintenance roads and repair any leakages immediately. He also asked to remove any encroachments on the conduit with the help of the vigilance team. At Kokapet, Ashok Reddy reviewed the construction of pressure filters at the Water Board's reservoir site. He directed the team to complete them by February 15.

Coal sector will create 5 lakh jobs: Kishan Reddy

Union coal and mines minister G. Kishan Reddy said even though the use of coal in power generation had almost plateaued, thanks to the shift to renewable energy sources, the coal sector would still create five lakh new jobs in the next few years and urged states to focus on skill development and capacity building. Addressing the 2nd national conference of coal ministers at Konark in Odisha, Kishan Reddy said that the country needed 2 billion tonnes of coal per year, with demand set to peak by 2040. He said that thermal power met around 72 per cent of demand, and coal production has increased by 76 per cent compared to 2014, to reach 997 million tonnes in 2024. The government has set a target to produce 1.5 billion tonnes of coal by 2030. Do-



tional Mineral Exploration Trust (NMET) had funded 329 projects so far to promote mine exploration, Kishan Reddy asked the states to make use of the funds to promote mineral exploration and set up similar trusts

Kishan Reddy said that the Centre has started a mining surveillance system to check illegal mining with the help of advanced technology to prevent illegal mining and sought the cooperation of states to check it. The transport bidding of mines has generated Rs.2.69 lakh crore revenue to the states in 2024 in the form of royalty as against Rs.55,636 crore in 2015, he noted. Kishan



HYDRAA's Silence on Bathukamma Kunta Lake Baffles People

HYDRAA's Continued Delay in Rejuvenating Hyderabad's Lakes Draws Public Criticism

Hyderabad WUT | Jan. 21

Hyderabad's lakes, including the historically significant Bathukamma Kunta and Sunnam Cheruvu, which were initially earmarked for rejuvenation under the Hyderabad Disaster Response and Assets Monitoring and Protection Agency's (HYDRAA) initiative, remain in a state of neglect, leaving residents and environmentalists baffled. Despite earlier assurances from HYDRAA regarding the rejuvenation of several lakes in the city, including those located in key areas like Kukatpally and Khajaguda, no substantial progress has been witnessed on the ground. HYDRAA, tasked with the responsibility of reviving these water bodies, had submitted proposals to the state government with the

12 lakes across the city. Among the lakes listed for rejuvenation are Sunnam Cheruvu in Guttala Begumpet, Nalla Cheruvu in Kukatpally, and Thoutanikunta at Khajaguda. However, despite these submissions and several public briefings, the agency's promises have not been materialized into visible action. There has been no noticeable improvement or development on-site at any of these locations, raising serious concerns about the efficiency of the agency and its ability to deliver on its commitments. Bathukamma Kunta, one of the most prominent lakes in Hyderabad, has



juvenation efforts, which began on November 13 of last year. The project was halted unexpectedly due to a legal dispute. Sudhakar Reddy, a local individual, filed a petition in the High Court claiming ownership of the land surrounding Bathukamma Kunta, effectively stalling the rejuvenation process. This legal intervention delayed the agency's work for several weeks, despite the critical importance of the lake in the city's urban landscape. After weeks of legal proceedings, the Telangana High Court delivered a ruling on January 7, 2025, rejecting Sudhakar Reddy's claim and re-

affirming that the land surrounding Bathukamma Kunta was indeed public property. The ruling was seen as a victory for the preservation of the lake and its potential for community revitalization. The court's decision cleared the way for HYDRAA to resume its rejuvenation efforts. However, more than two weeks have passed since the judgment, and there is still no sign of the agency taking concrete steps to restart the restoration work at the site.Locals are growing increasingly impatient and frustrated by the inaction. "We had high hopes that after the court's ruling, the work would resume immediately. But now, over two weeks have passed, and nothing has changed. There hasn't been a single worker seen at the site," said Mohd. Arif, a local resident.

Many are disappointed by the lack of urgency displayed by the agency, especially given the court's favorable ruling and the widespread community support for the lake's rejuvenation. The Bathukamma Kunta lake itself has a long history, with many locals believing that it was originally constructed by the Nizam of Hyderabad for his cavalry. Over time, the lake became culturally significant as it became a traditional spot for local women to immerse Bathukammas during the Bathukamma festival, which celebrates the harvest season. The lake holds sentimental value for the local community, which has been advocating for its restoration to enhance the city's landscape and preserve its cultural heritage.
