
Polavaram Capacity Reduction Opposed in LS



YSR Congress MP Midhun Reddy voiced strong opposition to the proposed reduction in the capacity of the Polavaram project, urging the government not to compromise its original design. US Deports 205 Illegal Indian Immigrants in **Military Aircraft**

n a move highlighting the priority of the Trump administration to deport illegal immigrants, an American C-17 Boeing Globemaster military transport aircraft took off from San Antonio, Texas, with 205 illegal Indian immigrants on board to transport them back, according to global news agency reports that cited US officials. According to media reports, the flight is expected to land in Amritsar on Wednesday morning.

The deportation comes just a few days ahead of the forthcoming visit of Prime Minister Narendra Modi to the United States, where he will hold talks with United States President Donald Trump. Media reports cited sources to claim that India had verified the Indian nationality of all 205 persons who are being deported.

This is perhaps the first time, as per reports, that the US has deployed its military aircraft for such a deportation exercise to India when it had earlier utilised chartered or commercial aircraft.

KTR Slams Congress Government Over BC Reservation Promise

BRS working president KT Rama Rao (KTR) on Tuesday criticized the Congress government for allegedly misleading the Backward Classes (BCs)



by failing to deliver on their promise of a 42% reservation bill. He accused the government of making hollow announcements without taking any concrete legislative action, contrary to the commitments made during the Kamareddy BC Declaration meeting.

KTR stated that the Congress government had merely issued a statement on reservations, calling it "historic," without introducing

a legally binding bill to ensure 42% reservations for BCs. "We expected the government to bring a meaningful bill, but instead, they have resorted to deception. BCs will never accept this," he

M Kharge, Akhilesh Yadav Wanted Bigger Tragedy At Maha Kumbh: Yogi

New delhi WUT | Feb. 5

Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath on Tuesday launched a sharp attack on Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge and Samajwadi Party chief Akhilesh Yadav, alleging that they and some "Sanatan-opposing elements" wanted a larger disaster to unfold at the Maha Kumbh stampede.

The stampede happened on January 29, the occasion of Mauni Amavasya, one of the most auspicious days of the Hindu calendar. According to official figures released by the UP government, at least 30 people lost their lives and



60 were injured in the predawn stampede at the Sangam area in Prayagraj. The chief minister's remarks came in response to statements made by Mr Kharge and Mr Yadav in Lok Sabha regarding the

Speaking to reporters in Prayagraj, Yogi Adityanath said, "While the entire nation and the world are witnessing this grand Sanatan Dharma event with pride, there are some elements conspiring against it, spreading false-

hoods and setting new standards of deception." "The statements made by Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge and Samajwadi Party president Akhilesh Yadav in Parliament today draw attention to this sinister agenda," he added.

The SP chief demanded that the Uttar Pradesh government call an allparty meeting to discuss the arrangements of the Maha Kumbh and hand over disaster management and the "lost and found centre" to the Army.

"The government is continuously reeling out the Budget numbers... Please also give the numbers of those who died in the Maha Kumbh," he said. The former Uttar Pradesh chief minister also demanded disciplinary action against officers who have tried to cover up the "mismanagement" in the arrangements for the Kumbh. "The figures for the deaths in the Maha Kumbh accident, treatment of injured, availability of medicines, doctors, food, water and transport should be presented in Parliament," he said.

Indian embassy in Libya facilitates return of 18 Indian nationals from Benghazi

New delhi WUT | Feb. 5

The Indian embassy in Libya has facilitated the return of 18 Indian nationals from Benghazi after being stranded in the city for several weeks. The Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) said this on Tuesday. It is learnt that the Indians were lured to the Libyan city by fake recruitment agents. "The Embassy of India in Libya facilitated the return of 18 Indian nationals from Benghazi, Libya. They would be arriving in India tomorrow," MEA spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal said in a post on X.

"They had gone to work in Libya & had been stranded for several



weeks. The Embassy worked closely with the local authorities and assisted the Indian workers with required authorization and travel documents," he said. Jaiswal said the embassy remained in touch with the Indians. "While their case was being looked into, the Embassy remained in constant touch with them to ensure their well-being, assisting them with articles of daily living," he said. "Three other Indian nationals from the same group, assisted by the Embassy, had returned to

Hyderabad Tops Breast Cancers in India

Hyderabad WUT | Feb. 5

Hyderabad has the highest incidence rate of breast cancer in the country, with an age-adjusted incidence rate of 48 per one lakh population, according to data from the Population Based Cancer Registry (PBCR) The city also has the highest incidence of paediatric cancers in south India, occurring among children in the age group of 0-14 years. They constitute 2.44 per cent of the total cancer load in both sexes with a higher percentage among boys (3.2 per cent) than girls (1.8

per cent). On the positive side, the city also had the lowest total mortality as a per-



centage to incidence for all cancers: in males, 35.4 per cent and in females 27.7 per cent. The study revealed that on average, one out of 16 males and one out of 10 females in Hyderabad get cancer in their lifetime, considering one lives up to the age of 64 years. Tobacco and alcohol were among the biggest contributors to the development of cancer.

On World Cancer Day, the Nizam's Institute of Medical Sciences (Nims) released data from the Population Based Cancer Registry (PBCR) for Hyderabad on Tuesday. During the period of the study, from (2014 to 2016, 11,596 new cancer cases were registered in Hyderabad. Of these, 5,143 were male patients

Design Flaws Exposed in Kaleshwaram Barrages: IIT



The rush for constructing the three Kaleshwaram project barrages and getting it into operational mode by the then BRS government appears to have resulted in cutting of corners in both investigations and designing of the barrages. All three barrages — at Medigadda, Annaram and Sundilla —followed the same design provided by the Central Designs Organisation (CDO) of the irrigation department, and were inaugurated in 2019, three years after contracts were signed for their construction. All developed problems including leaks, seepages, forming of cavities under their foundations, and in the case of Medigadda, partial sinking of Block 7 of the barrage resulting in serious cracks in some of the piers of the block.

According to a report by IIT Roorkee which reviewed the designs of the Medigadda barrage, several shortcuts appear to have been taken in designing, and some design calculations left much to be desired. The end result was the eventual serious damage that occurred to the barrage on October 21, 2023, just four years into the operation of the barrage that was supposed to have been designed with a lifespan of a 100 years.

One of the problems at all the barrages was that the shooting velocities of water, once released from the under the gates, exceeded the design parameters resulting in downstream protection structures, whose repeated

failures over five flood.

He urged opposition MLAs who had not participated in the caste census to submit their details, reiterating the Congress government's commitment to BC welfare. "Inspired by Rahul Gandhi's vision of social justice through proportional resource allocation, Telangana has set an example for the nation," he asserted.

As per the Telangana caste survey, BCs constitute 56.33% of the state's population. Revanth Reddy pointed out that the last caste census in India was

conducted in 1931 before Independence and stressed the need for updated data to formulate effective policies.

"For any policy to be implemented, data is essential. The findings of this caste survey will drive socio-political changes in Telangana," he said. He also reaffirmed that while the survey was completed in the state, similar exercises would soon be undertaken nationwide.

The Chief Minister emphasized that the Congress government had fulfilled its electoral promise of conducting a caste census within a year of coming to power, marking a significant step toward social jus-

BRS MLC Kalvakuntla Kavitha Demands Clarity on BC Reservation Increase and Caste Census

Hyderabad WUT | Feb . 5

BRS MLC Kalvakuntla Kavitha raised critical questions in the Legislative Council regarding the government's stance on increasing reservations for BCs in local body elections. During a discussion on the caste census, she expressed disappointment that the government merely repeated statements made by Cabinet Sub-Committee Chairman Uttam Kumar Reddy, instead of providing new answers. Kavitha pointed out that the Congress party had promised an increase in



BC reservations during the assembly elections and demanded that the government clarify whether elections will be held once that promise is fulfilled. She also voiced concerns over the separation of BCs and BC Muslims in the population data, suspecting it may be aimed at under-

estimating their population.

Addressing the issue of population data, Kavitha questioned the government's claim of lacking accurate data, citing the 2011 census and estimated population growth of 13.5% over the last decade. According to her estimates, Telangana's

population should now stand at approximately 4.18 crore. However, the government's survey shows a decrease in the population of SCs, STs, BCs, and OCs, which Kavitha found contradictory

Kavitha also highlighted large-scale complaints from citizens, who reported that enumerators had not visited their homes to conduct the survey. She called on the government to take immediate steps to ensure that these individuals' details are properly collected in the next round of surveys.

Telangana Government Tables Caste Survey 2024 Report in Assembly

The Telangana Government has tabled the Caste Survey 2024 report in the Assembly today (Tuesday). Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy highlighted the lack of official data on weaker sections in India, noting that since 1931, no enumeration of these communities has been conducted. As a result, the implementation of the BC quota has faced challenges.Congress leader Rahul Gandhi had



promised a caste census during the Bharat Jodo Satra, and upon Congress coming to power, this promise was fulfilled by adopting a resolution in the Assembly. The caste census process was completed swiftly,

with the report now presented in the Assembly. Enumerators meticulously collected data from villages and Tandas, with 150 houses identified as a unit for data collection. A dedicated team of 76,000

Hyderabad Tops Breast Cancers in India

Hyderabad records the highest age-adjusted incidence rate of breast cancer in India, at 48 per one lakh population, as per the Population-Based Cancer Registry (PBCR). The city also has the highest pediatric cancer incidence in South India, accounting for 2.44% of total cancer cases in both sexes, with a higher prevalence in boys (3.2%) compared to girls (1.8%). Despite these alarming figures, Hyderabad shows the lowest total cancer mortality rate as a percentage of incidence: 35.4% in males and 27.7% in females. According to the data, one in 16 males and one in 10 females in the city are at risk of developing cancer before the Tobacco and alcohol

oping cancer before the age of 64 years.

Tobacco and alcohol remain major contributors to cancer development. Among males, 42.2% of cancer cases were tobacco-related, while the rate was 13.51% among females.

2016, 11,596 new cancer cases were reported in Hyderabad, including 5,143 male and 6,453 female patients. Among women, breast cancer was the most common (35.5%), surpassing cervical cancer (8.7%). Ovarian cancer (6.9%), corpus uteri cancer (5.5%), and lung cancer (4.1%) followed. Among men, mouth cancer was most prevalent (13.3%), followed by lung cancer (10.9%), tongue cancer (7.9%), stomach cancer (5.7%), and prostate cancer (4.7%). Prostate cancer has shown a significant rise in rankings

Dr. Sadashivudu Gundeti, head of medical oncology at NIMS, highlighted urbanization, pollution, and obesity as key factors contributing to the rise in breast cancer cases. He emphasized the need for robust screening measures, early detection, and targeted therapies, noting that cancer risk increases with age. The cumu-

lative risk of developing cancer after the age of 74 years is one in nine for males and one in seven for females.

Dr. N. Bheerappa, di-

rector of NIMS, outlined the financial resources allocated for cancer treatment, including ₹4 crore for cancer drugs, ₹138 crore from the Chief Minister's Relief Fund for treating underprivileged patients, ₹30 crore from CSR funds for medical equipment, and additional treatment support through the Aarogyasri scheme. Doctors urged citizens to lead healthier lifestyles, avoid processed and sugary foods, and undergo regular screenings after 40 years of age. They emphasized the importance of personalized care and targeted therapies for effective cancer management. The findings were released on World Cancer Day by NIMS, underlining the critical need for awareness and action in combating the growing cancer burden in Hyderabad.

Talasani Criticizes House Conduct, Warns of BC Rights Movement

Akhilesh Yadav Accuses **UP** Government of Hiding Maha Kumbh Stampede Death Toll



WUT | Feb. 5

Samajwadi Party chief Akhilesh Yadav has accused the Uttar Pradesh government of concealing the number of deaths from the stampede at the Maha Kumbh congregation in Prayagraj. Speaking in the Lok Sabha during the debate on the Motion of Thanks on the President's Address, Yadav demanded strict action against those involved in what he termed as "mismanagement" of the event.

Yadav criticized the government's claim of organizing a "digital Kumbh" while allegedly hiding the actual number of fatalities. He called for an allparty meeting to address the arrangements for the Maha Kumbh and suggested that disaster management and the "lost and found center" be handed over to the Army for better coordination.

"The government is continuously sharing Budget numbers. Why not also share the numbers of those who died in the Maha Kumbh?" Yadav questioned, demanding transparency about the fatalities, the treatment of the injured, and the availability of essential resources like food, water, medicines, and transport during the event. Yadav also alleged

that the government instructed seers to postpone the shahi snan—a ritual holy bath performed during an auspicious planetary alignmentbreaking with traditional Sanatan Dharma practices. He claimed the authorities later reversed the decision under public pressure but ignored the sanctity of the specific

timing (muhurat).

Further accusing the government of insensitivity, Yadav alleged that JCB machines and tractor trolleys were used to clear bodies after the stampede. "People came to earn blessings but left with the bodies of their loved ones," he said. He criticized the Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister for delaying his response to the tragedy, claiming that he expressed grief 17 hours after the President and Prime Minister. "The government showered flower petals from helicopters while bodies lay in mortuaries. What kind of Sanatan traditions are these?" Yadav re-

marked. The Samajwadi Party chief demanded that the figures related to the deaths, injuries, and other arrangements during the Maha Kumbh be presented in Parliament and called for disciplinary action against officials involved in the alleged cover-up.

US Deports 205 Illegal Indian Immigrants Using Military Aircraft

New delhi WUT | Feb. 5

In a move underscoring the Trump administration's aggressive crackdown on illegal immigration, a United States C-17 Boeing Globemaster military transport aircraft departed from San Antonio, Texas, carrying 205 illegal Indian immigrants back to India. This unprecedented deportation effort, as reported by global news agencies citing US officials, is expected to culminate with the aircraft landing in Amritsar on Wednesday morning.

This operation marks the first time the United States has utilized a military aircraft for deportation to India, deviating from previous practices that relied on chartered or commercial flights. The deployment of military resources reflects the administration's emphasis on border security and strict enforcement of immigration laws. While the US has conducted similar deportations to countries in Latin and South America, this represents a new phase in US-India cooperation on

immigration matters.

The Indian government reportedly verified the nationality of all 205 deportees prior to their return. This verification process ensures that individuals on the deportation list are indeed Indian nationals, a key requirement stressed by New Delhi in its dealings with the US on such matters.

This deportation exer-

cise comes at a strategically significant time, just days ahead of Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi's scheduled visit to the United States. According to reports, Prime Minister Modi is expected to meet President Donald Trump at the White House shortly after completing a threeday visit to France from February 10-12. Although the Indian government has not officially confirmed the dates, the White House announced that the visit would take place in Feb-

The timing of this deportation has raised speculation about its political implications, particularly as it coincides with discussions on immigration policies, trade,



and economic cooperation between the two na-

A spokesperson from the US Embassy, while not directly confirming details of this specific deportation, commented on the broader immigration policy: "The United States is vigorously enforcing its border, tightening immigration laws, and removing illegal migrants. These actions send a clear message: illegal migration is not worth the risk."

Reports indicate that the United States Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) had drawn up a list of 14.5 lakh illegal immigrants slated for deportation,

including approximately 18,000 Indian nationals. Over the past year, the US deported more than 1,100 Indian nationals through both chartered and commercial flights, signaling its intent to

tackle illegal migration

systematically.

The Indian government has maintained its position of supporting only lawful migration through formal agreements. External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar has repeatedly emphasized that India does not condone illegal immigration. However, he has also stressed the importance of verifying the identity and nationality

of individuals before ac-

cepting deportees.

"India has always been open to the legitimate return of Indian illegal immigrants," Jaishankar stated, while cautioning against relying solely on reported numbers. He added, "These numbers become operative only if their identities as Indians are verified. Verification and validation are critical steps in this process."

Jaishankar's remarks align with India's broader policy of encouraging migration through agreements like the Migration and Mobility Partnerships, signed with several countries to ensure streamlined and lawful

movement of people. Last month, Jaishankar met with the newly appointed US Secretary of State Marco Rubio. The bilateral discussions covered a range of topics, including economic cooperation and concerns related to irregular migration. A joint statement issued after the meeting highlighted the Trump administration's desire to work with India to address these issues while advancing mutual economic interests.

President Trump, addressing concerns about the presence of illegal Indian immigrants in the US, stated that he expects India to "do what is right" in addressing the issue. The President's remarks reflect a broader strategy of strengthening bilateral relations while resolving contentious issues like immigration. The deportation operation not only underscores the US administration's stricter immigration policies but also represents a unique moment in US-India relations. The use of a military aircraft for such an exercise signals the level of priority accorded.

Dubey Moves Privilege Motion Against Rahul

BJP MP Nishikant Dubey on Tuesday requested Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla to initiate privilege proceedings against Leader of Opposition in Lok Sabha Rahul Gandhi for alleged breach of privilege by "ridiculing" the country and "lowering the prestige of our Republic". Gandhi while participating in debate on the Motion of Thanks on the President's address had on Monday alleged that China was "sitting inside" Indian territory because Make-in-India had "failed". He had also alleged that foreign affairs minister S. Jaishankar was sent to Washington to secure an invite for Prime Minister Narendra Modi for Trump's inauguration ceremony.

In a letter to Birla, Dubey said, "Rahul Gandhi not only shamelessly distorted the historical and substantive facts but also made an attempt to ridicule our country and lowering the prestige of our Republic". "I request your good self to initiate

privilege proceedings against him on an urgent basis. I also wish to emphasise that since the Parliament records and proceedings are the testimony to his incessant callous/irresponsible attitude," he wrote.

Dubey alleged that the LoP was distorting the historical and substantive facts as Rahul raised six issues in his Parliament speech on Monday, including China capturing vast land in the Eastern Regions of India and appointment of Chief Election Commissioner (CEC) and other Election Commissioners. He accused Rahul of misusing Article 105 of the Indian Constitution, which advocates for freedom of speech in the Parliament, and said that the LoP failed to authenticate whatever he spoke. "To the best of my knowledge, this 'erudite' person has neither authenticated his gibberish canards nor apologised for using the pious forum of the Parliament to defame our country and the elected government," the letter said.

POLAVARAM CAPACITY REDUCTION OPPOSED IN LS

YSR Congress MP Midhun Reddy voiced strong opposition to the proposed reduction in the capacity of the Polavaram project during a debate in the Lok Sabha, urging the central government not to compromise the original design of the project. Highlighting its importance to Andhra Pradesh, he pointed out that the Polavaram project was initially designed to deliver 194 TMC of water, which would provide irrigation and drinking water

to 7.5 lakh acres. However, the recent budget proposals have suggested reducing its capacity to 115 TMC, which, he warned, would significantly limit its effectiveness, reducing the irrigation potential to just 3.2 lakh acres. He described this reduction as a grave injustice to the farmers and the people of the state, asserting that the YSR Congress and Telugu Desam MPs would come together to

fight this decision. Midhun Reddy reminded the government of the division agreement, which



WELL-BEING FOR THE ELDERLY, BAT-TLING NEURODEGENERATIVE DIS-

Staying positive and resilient while facing and experiencing a neurodegenerative disorder can be challenging for the individual as well as their caregivers. While it becomes important to have a cure to numb the symptoms, it is also crucial to look at the factors that will lead to a positive outlook toward the illness and life. According to the World Health Organization, there are more than 55 million individuals globally living with a neurodegenerative disorder, with 60% of them in low and middle-income countries.

Newer strategies and counselling to help elderly individuals battle such challenges tend to overshadow the power of social support as an en-

couragement of positive health while facing the challenges of neurodegenerative disorders like dementia and Alzheimer's. Several studies have concluded that social support has facilitated coping, adjustment and adaptation to chronic illnesses (Cotter et al, 2018), and has significantly reduced the risk for a range of diseases, health issues and all-cause mortalities. (Joshi et al, 2024) Social Health Social health includes two elements: social support and social isolation. Social isolation is explained through the number of social interactions and the individual's interaction with their social environment. When people interact, they exchange something, and this 'something' is

called social support,

which is embedded in social relationships (Murata et al, 2019).

Social support is the subjective component, varying among individuals, which is the extent to which an individual feels that their social needs are met. It can be defined as having four or more relatives or close friends with whom one can discuss their personal matters, essentially, be comfortable with, and could be called upon for help. Related to this, systematic reviews show that better social health results in older individuals having better control over their cognitive functions. It was also stated that poor social health increases the likelihood of an individual's risk of dementia (Joyce et al, 2021), including other disabling and life-shortening disorders.

Infra company staff granted anticipatory bail



Justice K. Sujana of Telangana High Court granted anticipatory bail to two accused in an alleged financial fraud committed by the directors of Pudami Infra Projects. The judge was dealing with a pre-arrest petition filed by Shaga Shyamsunder Reddy and Koyyada Lingaswamy. A complaint was filed alleging that the directors and established a company that promised unusually high returns on investments. They allegedly approached the complainant and induced him to invest in their company by promising to return double the amount deposited and registering a plot as security. The complainant, believing their promises, became the deputy general manager (DGM) and was responsible for bringing in customers. He, along with 16 other DGMs and 150 marketing staff, collected a total of Rs 36 crore from customers. The company, through its Vanasthalipuram branch, collected Rs 7.09 crore from the complainant's customers alone. However, the company paid only part of the amount back to customers and registered plots, leaving an outstanding due of around Rs 22.37 crore. Despite repeated requests from the complainant and other DGMs, the directors failed to return the remaining amount to the customers. On receipt of the complaint, the police registered cases against the petitioners and arrayed them as Accused No. 12 and 14. At this, the petitioners filed a criminal petition. The petitioners contended that they were initially customers and were later employed as DGMs to mobilise customers. Counsel for the petitioners also argued that the petitioners were not involved in the financial matters of the company and did not intentionally induce customers to deposit money. As a matter of fact, the petitioners were also victimised by the directors and had lodged a complaint against them.

Hussainsagar boat fire: Driver succumbs to injuries

M. Ganapathi, a 22-yearold driver and firecracker operator, tragically passed away from the severe injuries he sustained during a firecracker explosion that occurred on January 26 at the Bharata Mata Maha Harathi celebration, which took place at Hussainsagar. The explosion took place while he was aboard a boat, and he suffered life-threatening burns, with over 95% of his body affected by the flames. Despite the best efforts of medical staff, Ganapathi suc-

cumbed to his injuries at 10:05 AM in a private hospital, leaving behind a grieving family and raising concerns about the safety measures taken during such events. Ganapathi was originally from East Godavari and had worked as a minitruck driver, in addition to being a firecracker operator. On January 26, he had traveled to Hyderabad after being hired by the event's organizer, Vasudeva Reddy, who is also known by the alias Sukumar Reddy, a resident of Andhra Pradesh. Ganapathi's primary responsibility was to de-

Alongside Ganapathi,

other materials necessary for the event. As part of his duties, he was aboard the ill-fated boat when the fire broke out, leading to the catastrophic explo-

two other boat drivers, Palle Pranith and Dubasi Sunil, were also injured in the explosion. Fortunately, both of them are reported to be out of danger, though they remain under medical care as they continue to recover from their injuries. Initial reports from the police categorized the incident as a fire accident under FIR No. 9 of 2025. However, following Ganapathi's death, the investigation was revised,

and the case was updated

to reflect charges of "death due to negligence."

Subsequently, the event organizer, Vasudeva Reddy (alias Sukumar Reddy), has been booked under charges of causing death due to negligence. The investigation is being carried out by Sub-Inspector M. Hanumanth Rao, who is leading the efforts to hold those responsible for the tragic incident accountable. The revision of the case to a charge of negligence underscores the serious concerns regarding the lack of adequate safety protocols during such public events.

Ganapathi's untimely and heartbreaking death has prompted both emotional and legal reactions, highlighting the need for a closer look at how public events involving hazardous activities, like firecracker displays, are managed. Safety standards and the enforcement of rules are now being questioned, especially in light of the tragic outcome that has left a young life lost and families devastated. The case continues to unfold, with authorities pursuing further investigation into the specific details surrounding the negligence that led to such a devas-

Telangana HC Freezes Activity on 72 Acres of Kongara Kalan Land

The Telangana High Court on Tuesday found missing, an essential file regarding the exclusion of 72 acres of prime land in Kongara Kalan village of Rangareddy district from the prohibitory list, and sought an explanation from the government. The court also froze all activity on the land in Survey No. 249 of Kongara Kalan. Justice C.V. Bhaskar Reddy of the High

Court directed the principal secretary of revenue and the Rangareddy district collector to submit all the details about the deletion of the land from the prohibition list and issuing of pattadar passbooks to private parties.

The judge was dealing with a petition filed by local resident K. Praveen Goud, who complained that the then Rangareddy collector in November 2019 had reportedly issued a letter to delete 72 acres of land from the prohibitory list, out of an

extent 1,026 acres and 19 guntas in Survey No. 249, situated at Kongara Kalan. He submitted that the land was notified as a reserve forest and the collector had no authority to de-notify the land.

Based on the collector's letter of 2019, the Rangareddy collectorate administrative officer, on June 19, 2024, issued a memo for deletion of the land. Following this, pattadar passbooks were issued to private parties and transaction took place on the

Relief for advocate in dispute

Hyderabad WUT | Feb. 5

Justice B. Vijaysen recently directed the police to refrain from interfering with the personal liberty of advocate Avunoori Ramakanth Rao, a senior member of the Sircilla Bar Association, in relation to a crime registered at the Sircilla police station. The ruling followed a plea by Rao, who claimed he was being harassed and falsely implicated by the police under the influence of a private respondent. The petitioner's counsel, E. Venkata Siddhartha, explained that the issue began as a civil dispute that had been under litigation in various courts since 2019. However, the police allegedly transformed this civil matter into a criminal case, exerting pressure on Rao and his clients to settle the ongoing dispute.Justice Vijaysen, while considering the facts, criticized the police for overstepping their authority. The court emphasized that the investigation should not infringe upon the personal liberties of individuals, particularly advocates, unless due process of law was strictly

followed. The judge issued clear instructions to the police inspector not to interfere with Rao's personal liberty under the guise of an investigation. The court's ruling highlighted the crucial role of protecting the professional and personal freedoms of advocates and underscored the need for police to act within their legal boundaries. This decision sets a precedent for ensuring that legal practitioners are not unjustly targeted or harassed through the misuse of criminal proceedings in civil matters.

Neymar takes 89 percent pay-cut as he returns to his first club Santos

Twelve years after leaving

Brazil for Europe, Neymar

has returned to his boyhood club Santos, marking a significant chapter in his footballing journey. The Brazilian star, who once seemed destined to be his country's greatest player since Pele, arrives back at Santos as a global celebrity with immense wealth but a career plagued by injuries. At his peak, Neymar was among the finest players in the world, known for his dazzling skills and artistry on the field. His former Barcelona coach, Luis Enrique, once described him as someone who "understands football as art." However, despite his undeniable talent, Neymar never fully realized his potential, often overshadowed by Lionel Messi and Kylian Mbappe at club level. His long-held dream of winning the Ballon d'Or re-

debut on Wednesday—his 33rd birthday—against Botafogo-SP in the São Paulo state championship. Santos coach Pedro Caixinha confirmed the news, stating, "He will play on Wednesday."

Even before stepping onto

the pitch, Neymar's presence has already made an impact. His return was followed by a 3-1 victory over São Paulo on Saturday, with forward Guilherme acknowledging the superstar's influence. "He played a big part in this victory," Guilherme said after scoring twice. "He passed on so much positive energy. This is praise from an idol, not just anyone." Despite his impressive career, Neymar's legacy re-

mains a tale of what could have been. He surpassed Pele as Brazil's all-time top scorer in September 2023, but his World Cup journey has been riddled with heartbreak.

In 2014, playing on home soil, Neymar suffered a fractured back in the quarterfinal against Colombia. Four years later, he was fit but unable to prevent Brazil's quarter-final exit at the hands of Belgium. The 2022 World Cup saw him hampered by an ankle injury, though he did score a brilliant goal against Croatia in the quarter-finals before Brazil's elimination on penalties. With the 2026 World Cup in North America on the horizon, Neymar sees his return

to Santos as a chance to regain form. "Now I need to play again," he said. "Only a club like Santos can provide the love I need to prepare for the challenges ahead."

Neymar's move to Al Hilal in Saudi Arabia in 2023 made him one of the highest-paid athletes in history, earning a reported €100 million per season. However, his stint was short-lived—after just five matches, he suffered a serious knee injury while playing for Brazil. A comeback in October saw him play two more matches before another setback with a hamstring tear.

His most successful club years remain with Barcelona, where he won the Champions League, La Liga, and Copa del Rey in 2015, finishing third in the Ballon d'Or rankings behind Messi and Cristiano Ronaldo. His record €222 million move to Paris Saint-Germain in 2017 was intended to elevate him to the pinnacle of world football, but persistent injuries and the rise of Mbappe saw him struggle to be the main star.

Trump to make unprecedented Super Bowl visit

In a historic first, US President Donald Trump will attend the Super Bowl this Sunday at the Caesars Superdome in New Orleans, marking the first time a sitting president has been present at the NFL's biggest annual event. The White House confirmed the development on Tuesday.

The Kansas City Chiefs will face the Philadelphia Eagles in the championship clash, while Fox, this year's official broadcaster, is set to air a pre-recorded interview with Trump during the pregame coverage.

While no sitting president has attended the Super Bowl before, past leaders have been involved in ceremonial roles. George H.W. Bush participated in the coin toss at the 2002 and 2017 Super Bowls, while Ronald Reagan conducted a coin toss remotely from the White House in 1985.

Trump's history with the NFL has been marked by tensions, particularly over the league's handling of player protests. In 2017, he criticized NFL athletes who knelt during the national anthem to protest racial injustice, leading to widespread controversy.

NFL Commissioner Roger Goodell reaffirmed the league's commitment to di



versity and inclusive hiring practices on Monday, a stance that conflicts with Trump's policies. "We are going to continue these efforts because they make the NFL better," Goodell stated.

In a notable change, the NFL has confirmed that the "End Racism" slogan—displayed in previous Super Bowls—will not be featured this year. Instead, messages reading "Choose Love" and "It Takes All of Us" will be displayed in the end zones.

NFL spokesperson Brian McCarthy stated that the decision was influenced by recent national tragedies, including wildfires in California, a terrorist attack in New Orleans, and multiple aviation accidents across the country.

The Super Bowl remains one of the most-watched events in the United States, and Trump's presence is expected to add further significance to this year's edition.

Akbaruddin Owaisi Urges Government to Raise BC Reservation to 50%



IMIM Floor Leader Akbaruddin Owaisi has A IMIM Floor Leauer Andrews Called on the Telangana government to increase reservations for Backward Classes (BC) in local bodies to 50%. Speaking during a special session in the Assembly on the BC census report, Owaisi pointed out that since the 50% ceiling had already been exceeded with 54% reservations in local bodies, there should be no hindrance in implementing the increase.

Owaisi raised concerns over inconsistencies in population figures reported in various government surveys. While the state government claimed to have surveyed 3,54,77,554 people, he highlighted that according to the Unique Identification Authority of India (UIDAI) in March 2023, Telangana's population stood at 3,80,90,000. He also cited previous records, including the 2011 Census, which recorded 3,50,31,674 people, and the Samagra Kutumba Survey (SKS) of 2014, which listed 3,66,37,160 people. Questioning the reliability of the data, he demanded the state government table the full survey report instead of just presenting its

Responding to Owaisi, Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy stated that the government was prepared to table three out of the four volumes of the caste survey, but the fourth volume would remain confidential due to data privacy regulations. Addressing discrepancies in population figures, he noted that the 2014 SKS survey recorded the BC population at 51%, whereas the new state government report found it to be 56.33%. The OC population, which was recorded at 21.55% in 2014, was found to be 15.79% in the new report. The ST population increased from 9.8% in 2014 to 10.45% in 2024, while the Muslim population was reported to have grown from 11% to 12.6%.

Revanth Reddy dismissed the 2014 SKS as a "Faltoo Document," arguing that it was neither officially tabled in the Assembly nor made available on government websites. He accused the previous BRS government of using the SKS survey for electoral gains, stating that they submitted the data to the Limca Book of Records but not to the Cabinet or Assembly. Criticizing the survey, he questioned, "Will the Limca Book do justice to BCs?"

The Chief Minister cited central government data, stating that Telangana's population grows by 1.20% annually and that the difference between births and deaths has stabilized. He acknowledged that 3 lakh households were missed in the survey, meaning nearly 16 lakh people were left out. Advising Owaisi not to be misled, he said, "Don't fall into the trap of the association of lies."

Owaisi presented financial data showing that between 2014-2018, the government allocated ₹6,607.48 crore for BCs but spent only ₹417.57 crore, a mere 6.32%. He urged the government to pass legislation mandating the full utilization of allocated funds, similar to the SC Sub-Plan model, ensuring unspent funds are carried forward.

During a separate discussion on SC sub-classification, Owaisi questioned why the one-man commission report by retired Justice Shameem Akhter was not tabled in the Assembly. He reminded the Congress of its Chevella SC/ST Declaration, which promised to raise SC reservations to 18%, but noted that the state government settled for 15%, as recommended by the commission. He also criticized the commission's use of 2011 Census data instead of the 2024 caste survey and suggested reclassifying SC sub-groups into four categories instead of three.

Owaisi called on the government to fulfill its election promise of implementing Ambedkar Abhaya Hastham for 12 lakh Dalits and to ensure that the ₹33,123 crore budget allocation for SCs is fully utilized. He urged the government to introduce legislation to ensure fool-proof implementation of SC sub-classification in the state.

Telangana Moves Ahead with SC Sub-Categorization

In a historic move, the Telangana government has become the first in India to implement the sub-categorization of Scheduled Castes (SCs) based on a judgment delivered by the Constitution Bench of the Supreme Court. The verdict, handed down on August 1, 2024, in the case of Punjab State Government vs. Davinder Singh, paved the way for a scientific reclassification of SC castes.

The Telangana government, led by Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy, expressed its gratitude to the Supreme Court for the judgment and committed to the implementation of SC classification in the same legislative session on August 1, 2024. This was followed by the creation of a Cabi-



September 2024, under the chairmanship of Minister Uttam Kumar Reddy. The committee, consisting of senior ministers and members of parliament, was tasked with studying the Supreme Court's verdict and providing a path forward. After detailed discussions and consultations, including field visits to

states like Punjab, Haryana, and Tamil Nadu to examine SC sub-categorization practices, the committee recommended the establishment of a one-member Judicial Commission for an indepth study.

On October 11, 2024, Dr. Justice Shamim Akhtar was appointed to head the Commission, tasked with providing a report within

60 days. Due to the complexity of the matter, the deadline was extended until February 10, 2025. The Commission visited 10 districts in Telangana from December 2024 to January 2025, receiving a total of 8,681 petitions, and gathering extensive data from various government departments.

The Commission's 199-

page report, submitted to

February 3, 2025, outlined the classification of 59 SC castes into three groups: Group I (Most Backward/Neglected) – 15

the state government on

castes, 3.29% of the SC population, 1% reservation

Group II (Moderately Benefited) -18 castes, 62.75% of the SC population, 9% reservation Group III (Better Benefited) -26 castes, 33.96%of the SC population, 5% reservation

The Commission also proposed a preferential model for filling vacancies in government jobs and educational institutions, suggesting that unfilled vacancies in Group-I be filled by Group-II, and those in Group-II be filled by Group-III. If vacancies remain unfilled, they should be carried forward.

Additionally, the Commission recommended introducing a "creamy layer" concept to exclude public representatives and certain service members from receiving benefits under the second-generation reservation.

The Telangana government has accepted the first three recommendations but rejected the suggestion regarding the exclusion of the creamy layer from reservations. The government has committed to implementing further steps as per the Commission's recommendations, with hopes that these measures will benefit the SC communities that have long awaited classification. The state government continues to focus on ensuring social, economic,

and educational empowerment for all SC subcastes as part.

There are growing concerns about whether the upcoming cabinet discussions will reflect the government's administration and the steps it




plans to take for the welfare of the people. Ponnala Lakshmaiah has expressed his con-
