Indian National Stabbed To Death in Canada; Suspect Held

An Indian national was stabbed to death in Canada's Rockland near Ottawa, said the Indian Embassy in Canada on Saturday. According to the Indian Embassy, the local police have taken a suspect into custody. The Embassy confirmed that they are in contact with victim's family and they are providing all possible assistance to them. "We are deeply saddened by the tragic death of an Indian national in Rockland near Ottawa, due to stabbing. Police have stated a suspect has been taken into custody. We are in close contact through a local community association to provide all possible assistance to the bereaved kin," said the Indian Embassy in a post on X.The details about the incident are still awaited.

Al saves life after doctors lose hope



Doctors declared his condition hopeless, but artificial intelligence (AI) gave him a second chance. Manipur group rejects Meitei-Kuki peace talks

The Coordinating Committee on Manipur Integrity (COCOMI), an influential umbrella organisation of social bodies in Manipur's Imphal Valley, rejected the Kuki-Meitei peace talks facilitated by the Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) in New Delhi on Saturday (April 5, 2025).

The organisation said it declined to participate in the "so-called" peace initiative as it was "stagemanaged" by the MHA through a "misleading narrative" from Union Home Minister Amit Shah that Manipur's crisis was merely an ethnic conflict between the Meitei and Kuki-Zo communities allegedly triggered by a court directive on Scheduled Tribe status for the Meiteis.

"This narrative conveniently ignores the far more dangerous and deeprooted realities that CO-COMI has consistently highlighted since the beginning of this crisis," the organisation's convenor, Laikhuram Jayenta stated.



He said the conflict is an ongoing proxy war enabled and perpetuated by the Centre through the patronage of Chin-Kuki extremists nurtured since 2005 under the guise of the Suspension of Operations (SoO) agreement. Mr Jayenta said the CO-COMI made it clear in previous engagements with MHA officials that the people of Manipur consider the Centre an active party to the conflict, not a neutral mediator. "Without acknowledging this fundamental truth, any so-called peace initiative is a hollow exercise designed solely for political optics," he said, adding that the Centre has repeatedly employed symbolic gestures to create a facade of resolution, with no sincere or substantive

steps to address the root

causes of this crisis. "The latest meeting, hastily convened with a handful of individuals from both sides, is yet another tactical manoeuvre to fabricate an illusion of progress, conveniently timed to furnish talking points for the Home Minister's parliamentary address," the COCOMI said. The organisation accused the Centre of not undertaking a single genuine measure to resolve the crisis that began in May 2023. "Instead, it has persistently evaded responsibility, refused to confront the actual drivers of conflict, and continues to embolden separatist elements through false hopes and covert support," it said.

Shah appeals to 'Maoist brothers' to lay down arms

Union home minister Amit Shah on Saturday made an appeal to the Maoists to lay down arms and join the mainstream, saying that 'No one feels happy if a Naxal is killed'. Mr. Shah, for the first time, addressed the Naxals as 'brothers', calling them as 'one of us', while assuring them of their security and safety if they shun the path of violence and join the main-



stream. "The era of firing and bomb blasts in Bastar is gone. Bastar has already embraced the path of development. I appeal to the Maoists, those who are armed and those who are not armed, to lay

down weapons and join the mainstream. No one feels happy when a Naxal is killed. You people are one of us", Mr. Shah said while addressing the closing ceremony of 'Bastar Pandum', a 45-day long

tribal culture festival, in Dantewada in south Bastar in Chhattisgarh. Reiterating his resolve to end Maoism by March 2026, Mr. Shah said that the Maoists cannot stop development of Bastar with guns and warned that those who still wielded weapons will be dealt with by the security forces. "Whatever happens, the entire country will be Naxal-Mukt (free) by March 2026", he said.

6.9-magnitude quake hits off Papua New Guinea coast: USGS

A strong 6.9-magnitude earthquake struck Saturday morning off the coast of Papua New Guinea's New Britain Island, the United States Geological Survey (USGS) said. The shallow quake, at a depth of 10 kilometers (six miles), triggered a tsunami warning which was later downgraded by the US Pacific Tsunami Warning Centre. "Based on all available data the tsunami threat from this earthquake has now passed," the centre said, adding that "no tsunami was observed" at the nearest monitoring site.

The earthquake struck at 6:04 am local time (2004 GMT) and was centred about 194 kilometres (120 miles) southeast of the nearest major town Kimbe. Marolyn Simbiken, a

receptionist at Kimbe's Liamo Reef Resort, said so far she had not seen any damage. "We did feel the earthquake here," she told AFP. "But there's not big damage. Nothing was damaged here and there was no evacuation." Walindi Plantation Resort worker Barbara Aibilo she felt a "slight shake". Several smaller quakes, with preliminary magnitudes ranging from 4.9 to 5.3, struck afterwards near the same patch of sea, according to the USGS. Earthquakes are common in Papua New Guinea, which sits on top of the seismic "Ring of Fire" -- an arc of intense tectonic activity that stretches through Southeast Asia and across the Pacific basin. Although they seldom cause widespread damage in sparsely populated areas, they can trigger destructive landslides.

Hyderabad police grants conditional permission for shobha yatra

The Hyderabad police here on Saturday granted permission with certain conditions for Sri Rama Navami Shobha Yatra to be taken out by BJP MLA T Raja Singh on April 6 from Aakashpuri Hanuman Temple in Dhoolpet to Hanuman Vyayamshala in Ramkoti. In an order addressed to Raja Singh, Hyderabad Additional Commissioner of Police, Law and Order, Vikram Singh Mann has made it clear that no inconvenience should be caused to the general public and

also no obstructions should be caused for free flow of traffic.

There should be no explicit and implicit violation of any law and the organizers must not create traffic problems. They should ensure that the yatra must be kept on the extreme left on the road and the other half of the road should remain free for regular traffic movement. The organizers should not deviate from the permitted route and they should not halt in the middle of the road for delivering speeches. They should not use DJs, sound mixers, high sound generating equipment, mobile mikes and loud speakers in the procession and also after the public meeting in Hanuman Vyayamshala. Bursting of fire crackers is strictly prohibited along with sprinkling of vermilion, turmeric, 'gulal', flowers or other objects on passers-by under any circumstances. The persons in yatra should not carry any sticks, swords, knives, fire arms, inflammable material or any other weapons. Sticks used for carrying flags or decorations should not be more than two feet in length and should be of split

Trump Tariff Hikes "Hurt The Vulnerable And The Poor": UN

Increased global trade tariffs will hurt the most vulnerable and poor people, the UN's trade and development agency said Friday, after US President Donald Trump's measures sparked global alarm.

The ensuing trade turbulence "hurts the vulnerable and the poor", said UNCTAD Secretary-General Rebeca Grynspan in a statement.



"Trade must not become another source of instability. It should serve development and global growth," Grynspan said. Trump unveiled a barrage of import duties against

Wednesday, prompting China to retaliate in kind and raising the risk that other countries will follow, hurting the world economy. "Global trade rules must evolve to reflect today's challenges, but they must do so with predictability and development at their core, protecting the most vulnerable," Grynspan added.

Russian Strike Kills 18 in Ukrainian President's Home City

Russian ballistic missile strike on Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky's home city of Kryvyi Rig killed 18 people on Friday, among them nine children, authorities said. The missile struck a residential area near a children's playground and wounded more than two dozen others, according to the head of the city's military administration. Unverified videos on social media appeared to show bodies lying on a street, while

another showed a plume of smoke rising into the evening sky.

"18... that is how many people were killed by the Russians when they launched a missile at Kryvyi Rig. Among them were nine children," Dnipropetrovsk regional governor Sergiy Lysak said on Telegram. He said 61 people were injured in the attack, among them 12 children. "This is the kind of pain you wouldn't wish on your worst enemy," Lysak added. 'New Railway Projects Will Improve Connectivity Infrastructure': PM Modi ous and safe borders, con-

Prime Minister Narendra Modi said on Saturday that his government's nod to four multi-tracking railway projects will improve connectivity infrastructure, boost convenience, reduce logistics costs and strengthen supply chains. He was reacting to the Union Cabinet's approval for four projects of the Ministry of Railways involving a total cost of about Rs 18,658 crore, a government press note said. The four projects covering 15 districts in three states of

Maharashtra, Odisha and Chhattisgarh will increase the existing network of Indian Railways by about 1,247 km.

PM Modi said the Cabinet's nod to Vibrant Villages Programme-II is an "exceptional news" for ensuring a better quality of life in bor-

der villages. He said, "With this approval, we are also expanding the scope of the villages covered compared to Vibrant Villages Programme-I." The objective of the programme is to create better living conditions and adequate livelihood opportunities to ensure prospertrol trans-border crimes and assimilate the border population with the nation and inculcate them 'as eyes and ears of the border guarding forces', crucial for internal security. With a total outlay of Rs 6,839 crore, the programme will be implemented in select strategic villages in Arunachal Pradesh, Assam, Bihar, Gujarat, Jammu and Kashmir, Ladakh, Manipur, Meghalaya, Mizoram, Nagaland, Punjab, Rajasthan, Sikkim, Tripura, Uttarakhand, Uttar Pradesh and West Bengal till 2028-29, a statement

Fake videos, photos triggered UoH controversy, claims Congress govt

Even as the Supreme Court raised concerns over the destruction of green cover and biodiversity in Kancha Gachibowli, the State government has said that the entire controversy was triggered by "fabricated videos and photos on social media networks" which it said, had spread "fake news" that the government seized the lands of the University of Hyderabad.

Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy held a review meeting at the Secretariat on the cases pending in the court regarding the Kancha Gachibowli lands. Deputy Chief Minister Bhatti Vikramarka, Ministers Seethakka, Ponguleti Srinivas

Reddy, Chief Secretary A Santhi Kumari, DGP Jitender, PCCF RM Dobriyal, TGIIC MD Vishnuvardhan Reddy and other officials were present. According to a statement from the CMO, the officials briefed the Chief Minister that though ISB, Gachibowli Stadium, IIIT, private buildings, residential apartments and University of Hyderabad buildings were constructed in survey number 25, no disputes or concerns came to light during the construction of these institutions. There were no such controversies on wildlife conservation and environmental issues at that time, they said, adding that the

people "created fake videos and photos using artificial intelligence and circulated them widely on social media". A video of a woman thrashing her mother-inlaw in Madhya Pradesh has gone viral with her husband now fearing for his and his mother's life in light of the grisly Meerut murder. The elderly woman is seen being dragged by her daughterin-law at their Gwalior home allegedly after she tried to save her son from being thrashed by his in-

Vishal Batra, who runs a car spare shop, and his mother Sarla Batra have complained to the police that their in-laws barged into their house and attacked them over what they alleged was a "small issue". Mr Batra later told reporters that his wife has been insisting on sending his mother to the old-age home - which he refused.

Ms Batra claimed her daughter-in-law called her father on April 1 afternoon after which he reached their house in Adarsh Colony with some goons. CCTV video showed Vishal Batra inside his house when his father-in-law entered the house and abruptly slapped him. He tried to hit back, but some others barged inside and started beating him.

His wife, who was on the first floor, came downstairs and dragged away her mother-in-law, who was seen trying to save her son. The video showed her dragging the woman by her hair and landing some punches on her arms.

RLD Leader Resigns Over Party's Support For Waqf Bill, Says "Many More Will"

New delhi WUT | Apr . 6

RLD's Uttar Pradesh gen-

eral secretary Shahzeb Rizvi has resigned from the post and the party, citing disagreement with its support for the Waqf bill in Parliament.

The Rashtriya Lok Dal (RLD) is a constituent of the BJP-led National Democratic Alliance (NDA).

Confirming his resignation to PTI, Mr Rizvi on Friday said he was "angry with (RLD) national president Jayant Chaudhary's decision to support the Waqf bill." He claimed "many more leaders will leave the party in the coming days".

Mr Rizvi has not yet decided his future, indicating that he would consult with his supporters before making any deci-

He asserted that "more than 2,000" RLD workers would resign with him. Accusing Mr Chaudhary of disregarding the sentiments of Muslim voters, Mr Rizvi said, "If the RLD has 10 MLAs in western Uttar Pradesh today, then Muslims have

contributed a lot to this."



Expressing "disappointment" with the decision to support the Bill, he argued that Mr Chaudhary "has strayed from the path shown by Chaudhary Charan Singh".

Alleging that Mr Chaudhary "has betrayed Muslims by supporting the Waqf bill", Mr Rizvi said, "Muslims gave a lot of votes to Jayant Chaudhary but he supported the Waqf bill. This is against the sentiments and rights of Muslims." Parliament approved the Waqf (Amendment) Bill, 2025, early on Friday after the Rajya Sabha gave its nod to the contentious legislation following an over 13-hour debate.

The Bill was passed in the Rajya Sabha with 128 members voting in favour and 95 opposing it. It was passed in the Lok Sabha early on Thursday, with 288 members supporting it and 232 against it.

Parliament Passes 16 Bills During Budget Session

Lok Sabha and Rajya Sabha passed 16 bills during the Budget session of Parliament which concluded on Friday.

The session, which commenced on January 31 had a inter-session break, saw the two Houses passing some significant legislations including the Waqf Amendment Bill.

Productivity of Lok Sabha and Rajya Sabha during Budget Session was approximately 118 per cent and 119 per cent respectively, according to an official statement by the Ministry of Parlia-

mentary Affairs. The Budget Session 2025 of Parliament which commenced on Friday, the 31st of January adjourned sine-die on Friday. In between both Houses were adjourned for recess on Thursday, the 13th of February to reassemble on Monday, the 10th of March to enable Department related Standing Committees to examine and report on the Demands for Grants relating to various Ministries/Departments.

The Union Minister of Parliamentary Affairs and Minority Affairs Kiren Rijiju held a press conference on Friday after the end of the Budget Session. The Minister of State (Independent Charge) for Law and Justice & Minister of State

for Parliamentary Affairs, Arjun Ram Meghwal and the Minister of State for Information and Broadcasting and Parliamentary Affairs, L Murugan were also present on the occa-

sion.

Mr Rijiju informed that the first part of the Budget Session yielded a total of 9 sittings of Lok Sabha and Rajya Sabha. In the second part of the Session, there were 17 sittings of both Houses. During the entire Budget Session, in total, there were 26 sittings.

This being the first Session of the year, the President addressed both Houses of Parliament assembled together in terms of Article 87(1) of the Constitution on January 31. Motion of Thanks on the President's Address in Lok Sabha was moved by Ramvir Singh Bidhuri and seconded by Ravi Shankar Prasad. It engaged the Lok Sabha for 17 Hours 23 minutes against allotted time of 12 Hours. 173 Members participated in the discussion, as per the ministry. In Rajya Sabha the Motion of Thanks was moved by Kiran Choudhary and seconded by Neeraj Shekhar. It engaged the Rajya Sabha for 21 Hours 46 minutes against allotted time of 15 Hours. 73 Members participated in the debate. The Motions of Thanks on President's Address was discussed and adopted after reply

from the Prime Minister by the two Houses during the first part of the Session.

The Union Budget for 2025-26 was presented on February 1. General Discussion on the Union Budget was held in both Houses in the first part of the Session. This engaged the Lok Sabha for 16 Hours 13 minutes against the allotted time of 12 Hours, and 169 Members took part in the debate and in the Rajya Sabha for 17 Hours 56 minutes against the allotted time of 15 Hours, and 89 Members participated in the discussion.

During the second part of the Budget Session, Demands for Grants of individual Ministries of Railways, Jal Shakti and Agriculture & Farmers Welfare were discussed and voted in Lok Sabha. In the end the demands for grants of the remaining Ministries/ Departments were put to the Vote of the House on March 21. The related Appropriation Bill was also introduced, considered and passed by Lok Sabha on March 21 itself. is going to be touched. "The issue is very simple and straight. Whether the intention of the 'Waqif' who created the Waqf for noble purposes is being

executed properly by the 'Muttawali', who is the manager, or not. A Waqf is not a religious body at all. It is a legal or a statutory body... The 'Muttawali' is just a superintendent or a man-

ager. He does not have any rights over the property, because once a Waqf has been created, the property vests in Allah, peace be on him," Mr Prasad said, adding that the Bill will empower Muslim women and help widows and the marginalised from the com-

munity. The senior BJP leader pointed out that areas near the Dak Bungalow locality in Patna - the city he is from - have a lot of Waqf land but five-star

hotels and showrooms have come up there. He also said India has the highest number of Waqf properties in the world and asked how many hospitals, universities and training centres have been

built there. "Is the manager using the property the way the person who dedicated it intended or is he stuffing his pockets? That is the question. And a drama is being created over this... Let me tell you, people from my state and the entire country are going to appreciate (this Bill). People were dismayed to learn that so much property is being misused," he

Israel expands ground

Israeli forces have launched a ground offensive in Gaza City, the military said Friday, expanding their operations as rescuers reported at least 30 killed across the Palestinian territory since dawn. Since renewed military operations last month ended a shortlived truce in its war with Hamas, Israel has pushed to seize territory in the Gaza Strip in what it said was a strategy to force militants to free hostages still

in captivity. Israel has also escalated attacks on Lebanon, where a US envoy was visiting on Friday, hours after a predawn strike on the port city of Sidon killed a Hamas commander. In Gaza City, the Israeli army said ground troops were operating in the Shujaiya area "in order to expand the security zone" established by the military inside the Palestinian territory. "The situation is very dangerous, and there is death coming at us from every direction," Elena Helles told AFP via text message, saying her family were trapped in her sister's house in Shujaiya. Others fled the area following an Israeli evacuation order on Thursday, AFPTV footage showed. The civil defence agency said Israeli military operations across Gaza killed at least 30 people on Friday. A single strike on Khan Yunis killed at least 25 people, a

medical source at the southern city's Nasser Hospital told AFP. Ahmed al-Aqqad, whose family owned the bombarded building, told AFP more bodies may be buried "under the rubble, but we cannot get them out due to the lack of necessary equipment".

stop the bloodshed," said

relative Diaa al-Aqqad. Defence Minister Israel Katz said on Wednesday that the military would bolster its presence inside Gaza to fight militants and "destroy... terrorist infrastructure", with unspecified "large areas" to be "incorporated into Israeli security zones". Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu said the army was dividing Gaza and "seizing territory" to force Hamas to free the remaining Israeli hostages taken captive during the October 2023 attack that sparked the war. Out of 251 people abducted during the Hamas attack on Israel, 58 remain hostage in Gaza including 34 the military says are dead. Hamas's armed wing, the Ezzedine Al-Qassam Brigades, on Friday warned that the offensive was putting hostages' lives at risk. "Half of the living Israeli (captive) are located in areas that the Israeli occupation army has requested to be evacuated in recent days," spokesman Abu Obeida said.

Russian Strike Kills 18 in Ukrainian President's Home City

Kyiv WUT | Apr . 6

A Russian ballistic missile strike on Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky's home city of Kryvyi Rig killed 18 people on Friday, among them nine children, authorities said. The missile struck a residential area near a children's playground and wounded more than two dozen others, according to the head of the city's military administration. Unverified videos on social media appeared to show bodies lying on a street, while another showed a plume of smoke rising into the evening sky.

"18... that is how many people were killed by the



Russians when they launched a missile at Kryvyi Rig. Among them were nine children, Dnipropetrovsk regional governor Sergiy Lysak said on Telegram. He said 61 people were injured in the attack, among them 12 children. "This is the kind of pain you wouldn't wish on your worst enemy," Lysak added. Russia's Ministry of Defence said it "delivered a precision

strike with a high-explosive missile at a restaurant" in the city "where commanders of formations and Western instructors were meeting".

In separate drone attack on Kryvyi Rig, Lysak said one additional person was killed and three others injured. US President Donald Trump has been pushing for a speedy end to the more than threeyear war since taking office, but his administration has failed to broker a ceasefire despite talks with both sides. Zelensky said the attack showed Russia had no interest in stopping its full-scale invasion, launched in February 2022. "There is only one reason

why this continues -- Russia does not want a ceasefire and we see it. The whole world sees it," he said. The Ukrainian leader was born in Kryvyi Rig, an industrial city which had a pre-war population of around 600,000 people. Russian President Vladimir Putin rejected a joint US-Ukrainian proposal for an unconditional and full ceasefire in March, while the Kremlin has made a US-proposed truce ent on the West lifting certain sanctions. US Secretary of State Marco Rubio said earlier on Friday that Trump was not "going to fall into the

trap of endless negotiations" with Russia over the invasion. "We will know soon enough, in a matter of weeks, not months, whether Russia is serious about peace or not," he said. 'War crime' Kryvyi Rig, in Ukraine's central Dnipropetrovsk region, is about 60 kilometres (37 miles) from the front line, and has regularly been targeted by Russian drones and missiles. Oleksandr Vilkul, the head of the city's military administration, said the missile landed near a

children's playground. Five apartment buildings were damaged, interior minister Igor Klymenko said. He said police had blocked off the area to maintain order. "The police are documenting the consequences of Russia's war crime and accepting statements from the victims," Klymenko added. Social media video from the scene showed a car in flames, while people could be heard shouting. Andriy Kovalenko, a Ukrainian official tasked with countering disinformation, described the missile involved in the attack as an "Iskander". The Iskander is a Russian ballistic missile system that can have a range of up to 500










CAN YOU REALLY TRUST TRUMP'S 'MAGIC POTION'?

Anthony Scaramucci, a Wall Street stalwart, knows Donald Trump up close and personal. What stands out most to him is Trump's "cruel" nature. Yet, as he repeats ad nauseam in his podcasts, Trump has incredibly sharp political instincts. According to Scaramucci, Trump always follows his gut - something instilled in him by his mentor, the ultra-aggressive New York lawyer Roy Cohn. And Scaramucci should know he briefly served as White House Director of Communications under Trump. Still, as the world grapples with the fallout from Trump's April 2 announcement of sweeping reciprocal tariffs, one has to wonder: are Trump's instincts right this time? Trump has dominated

American politics for the better part of a decade, but these new tariffs fly in the face of economic, business, and political logic. It's hard to see how they serve his political future. Consider the context of Trump's self-declared "Liberation Day". Here's what veteran Republican strategist Karl Rove wrote in The Wall Street Journal on April 3: "The problem for Republicans is that Mr. Trump was elected to stop inflation. A March 28 CBS News poll found that 64% of Americans already think Mr. Trump isn't focused enough on 'lowering prices', while 55% say he's focused too much on raising tariffs." Rove added, "Most Amer-

icans believe Mr. Trump's economic policies are either making them 'financially worse off' (42%) or 'about the same' (35%). Fifty two percent feel his

policies are making food and groceries prices go up, only 22% say go down. Fifty-one percent think his policies are making the stock market fall, compared with 23% saying his policies are making it rise. Only 33% believe his 'policies are making the US job market' create jobs, while 48% say they are making it 'lose jobs'...Americans are skittish about tariffs: 56% oppose them, with 72% believing they'll raise prices in the short run compared to 5% who think they'll reduce prices. Over the long term, only 29% say they'll lower prices. They'll certainly remember Mr. Trump saying he 'couldn't care less' if US automakers raised prices because they had to pay more for imported parts."Estimates suggest that under Trump's tariff regime, new car prices

No differential med college fee: HC

he Telangana High Court restrained several medical colleges from demanding differential fee and halting students from attending classes under the pretext. A panel of acting Chief Justice Sujoy Paul and Justice Renuka Yara, hearing a writ appeal filed by Advaita Shankar and others, challenging the dismissal of their writ plea by a single judge. The students argued that their admission was based on a fixed fee structure, and the sudden demand for additional payment midway through the course was arbitrary and financially burdensome. Senior counsel S. Ravi, appearing for the petitioners, pointed out that the single judge earlier granted an interim order allowing students to pay a partial fee while their writ petition was under consideration. After the writ petition was dismissed, this protection was lifted. Senior counsel emphasised that enforcing the fee hike at this stage would cause severe hardship. The panel directed the respondent institutions to file their response. To protect the interests of the appellants, the panel directed the respondents to permit students to continue their studies without any hindrance and barred them from collecting any additional fees until further hearing. Contempt Notice for Agri Officials Justice T. Madhavi Devi ordered notice to the principal secretary, agriculture and cooperation, and the commissioner of cooperation & registrar of cooperative societies in a contempt case pertaining to implementation of a pay fixation order. The judge was dealing with a contempt case filed by B. Aruna, joint registrar of cooperative societies and managing director of Telangana State Cooperative Union. Earlier, the petitioner had filed a writ plea challenging the rejection of her claim for pay fixation on par with her batch-mates from April 21, 1990. The judge found that the petitioner was granted seniority on par with her batch-mates and was thus entitled to seek pay parity and consequential benefits. The petitioner alleged that despite the categorical directions passed by the judge in the writ plea, the respondent authorities had failed to comply with

HC Sets Aside SBI's E-Auction Notice

In a significant legal development, Justice T. Vinod Kumar delivered a judgment that critically assessed the actions of the State Bank of India (SBI) in conducting an e-auction of properties belonging to a company. The judge determined that the bank had violated the law as prescribed and declared by the Supreme Court. This judgment carries substantial implications for future cases involving similar circumstances.

The crux of the judgment revolves around the powers of company directors during the liq-

Kumar clarified that even though the directors' powers are suspended during liquidation, they retain the ability to challenge the actions of secured creditors. This challenge is permissible if the actions of the secured creditors negatively impact the liquidation process or the interests of other creditors. The case in question involved Shra Energy Private Limited, which had filed an application challenging the authority of the SBI to initiate the sale of a property located in Patancheru. The petitioner argued that their offer to pay Rs 30 crore under a

uidation process. Justice

one-time settlement scheme was more favorable compared to the Rs 25 crore bid received during the e-auction. In its defense, the SBI contended that since it was not part of the liquidation process, it had the independent authority to proceed with the sale of the property under the provisions of the Sarfaesi Act (Securitisation and Reconstruction of Financial Assets and Enforcement of Security Interest Act).

curity Interest Act).

However, the court disagreed with the bank's stance. Justice Kumar ruled that because the official liquidator had assumed the role of the company, the secured creditor (SBI) was obli-

gated to issue a notice to the borrower, who in this case was the official liquidator. The judge dismissed the bank's argument that the non-issuance of notice was not a fatal flaw in the auction process.

Aligning with the offi-

cial liquidator's perspective, the judge emphasized that the right to submit objections or avail remedies under the Sarfaesi Act had been effectively nullified due to the lack of notice. This judgment underscores the importance of adhering to legal procedures and the rights of all parties involved in liquidation processes.

Engineering student dies of suspected cardiac arrest during college cricket match

A final-year B.Tech student, identified as 21-year-old Vinay Kumar from Khammam district, tragically passed away on Friday, April 4, while participating in a cricket match at CMR Engineering College in Medchal. The incident, captured on CCTV, is suspected to be the result of a cardiac arrest. The event occurred in the evening as the college hosted a cricket tournament on its campus. Vinay, who was fielding at the time, suddenly collapsed on the field. Fellow students and college staff immediately responded, rushing him to a nearby medical facility. However, upon arrival, doctors pronounced him deceased. Preliminary medical assessments suggest a cardiac arrest as the likely cause of death. Vinay's family, who have been informed of the tragic incident, have not expressed any suspicion regarding the circumstances. Local police have initiated an investigation into the matter.

Man ends life in Hyderabad after incurring debts in cricket betting

In yet another incident, a 26-year-old private employee ended his life near his residence at Suchitra junction near Jeedimetla on Friday midnight after losing money in cricket betting. Rajveer Singh Thakur was staying with his uncle after he lost his parents in an accident three years ago. Apart from using his salary for cricket betting Thakur used to avail loans from persons known to him and invested it in the betting. As a result, he slipped into severe financial problems. Unable to cope up allegedly with mounting debts, Thakur ended his life near the railway tracks between Suchitra junction and BHEL. Upon receiving information, the police rushed to the spot and the body was handed over to the family members after an autopsy at the Gandhi hospital. The Secunderabad railway police registered a case under the provisions of BNS and took up investigation. In a similar incident, a 29-year-old person committed suicide on the railway tracks between Gundlapochampally and Medchal on March 22. He took the drastic step after sharing the location to his friends. K Someshwara Rao, a resident of Gundlapochampally, lost Rs.3 lakh through betting in the last three years.

Al saves life after doctors lose hope

Doctors declared his condition hopeless, but artificial intelligence (AI) gave him a second chance. In a seminar on 'Reducing Cancer Mortality – The Role of Technology', experts shared how a rare blood disorder patient was saved by a treatment model developed by AI. The session was jointly organised by the Federation of Telangana Chambers of Commerce and Industry (FTCCI),

Administrative Staff College of India (ASCI) and Swastava Cancer Care (SCC) on Saturday.

Bhavesh Mishra, dep-

uty secretary, ITEC, shared the case of Joseph Coates, diagnosed with POEMS syndrome—a rare and often fatal blood disorder. Doctors had given up hope, offering him two grim choices: "Die at home or die in hospital." However, an unconventional treatment combining chemotherapy, immunotherapy

and steroids — formulated not by a doctor but by an AI model — led to a dramatic turnaround. Within a week, Coates began recovering, and in four months, he was ready for a stem cell transplant.

"Drug repurposing isn't new, but machine learning has revolutionised the process," Mishra said. "AI is accelerating discovery and offering new hope for patients with rare diseases. But it must be used responsibly." He added that the Telangana government

RR beat PBKS by 50 runs in IPL, Yashasvi Jaiswal shines with 45-ball 67 runs

Rising star Yashasvi Jaiswal's timely return to form with a sparkling fifty and fiery blows from Jofra Archer spoiled Punjab Kings' homecoming as Rajasthan Royals secured a handsome 50run win in the IPL here on Saturday.

Once Rajasthan built a tall 205 for four around Jaiswal's stroke-filled 67, it was never going to be easy for Punjab, and they were limited to 155 for 9. Nehal Wadhera played a lone hand with a 41-ball 62 for them.

Archer (3/25), seamer Sandeep Sharma (2/21) and spinner Maheesh Theekshana (2/26) also bowled with precision, while Kumar Kartikeya and Wanindu Hasaranga provided fine support.

In fact, Punjab's chase never got the desired lift-off. Archer set the tone for target-defence with a ripping start, dismissing Priyansh Arya (0) and the inform Shreyas Iyer (10) in successive overs —



just when the latter looked threatening while slamming two terrific shots off the English pacer. Arya went for a big swing but got it all

swing but got it all wrong, exposing his stumps to be castled emphatically. The inform Iyer, who was yet to be dismissed in the tournament with scores of 97* and 52* from two innings, looked in sublime touch.

He crunched a drive over extra cover and followed it up with another gorgeous shot through the offside. But Archer had the last laugh, hurrying Iyer with sheer pace as the batter's effort to go inside-out resulted in him getting bowled. Sandeep added to the early damage by removing Marcus Stoinis (1), while left-arm spinner Kartikeya, introduced into the attack next, struck another blow by dismissing Prabhsimran Singh (17).

From a precarious 43/4 after the Power Play, Punjab Kings' hopes were revived through a fighting 88-run fifth-wicket partnership between

Wadhera and Glenn Maxwell (30 off 21) that came off just 52 balls.

Having impressed as an Impact Sub with a 25-ball 43 not out on debut against Lucknow Super Giants the other day, Wadhera continued his form with a counter-attacking 33-ball fifty.

He took the attack to Hasaranga and Kartikeya during his knock studded with three sixes and four fours, while Maxwell provided solid support as the pair brought the equation down to a gettable 85 required from the last six overs. With Wadhera in charge, the chase was heading in the right direction until Theekshana pulled things back, dismissing Maxwell (30 off 21 balls). Wadhera soon fol-

Shutting the noise around him, Jaiswal and skipper Sanju Samson (38 off 26 balls) gave RR their best start of the season with an opening stand of 89 after PBKS skipper Iyer opted to bowl.

Lockie Ferguson (2/37) dismissed both Samson and Jaiswal against the run of play in the middle overs, and Nitish Rana (12) also got out cheaply as RR lost three wickets in the 11-15 overs phase.

The dangerous Shim-

ron Hetmyer (20 off 12 balls) also could not get going after an explosive start.

But Riyan Parag (43 not out off 25 balls) provided the late fireworks with three sixes and as many fours to lift Royals past the 200-mark for the first time at this venue.

Unstoppable DC break 15-year jinx at Chepauk, beats CSK by 25 runs in IPL

Delhi Capitals' juggernaut continued unabated in the ongoing IPL as they rode on KL Rahul's exemplary batting and some disciplined bowling to register their third successive win in the ongoing IPL with a 25-run victory over Chennai Super Kings here on Saturday. This was DC's first win at Chepauk in 15 years, even as CSK's struggles continued this season.

Batting first, DC posted 183 for six after Rahul mixed his trademark elegance with brute force during a 51-ball 77. The stylish Rahul struck six fours and three sixes while anchoring the innings. Tristan Stubbs chipped in with an unbeaten 12-ball 24 before Matheesha Pathirana (1/31) bowled a brilliant final over to prevent DC from finishing their innings on a high.

However, CSK were stopped at 158 for five in their allotted 20 overs, much to the disappointment of their home crowd that had flocked to the venue to pack the stands.

Vijay Shankar top-scored for CSK with 69 off 54 balls, while MS Dhoni remained not out on 30 in 26 deliveries.

CSK lost three wickets inside the powerplay, leaving the rest of the batting to play catch-up on a challenging wicket.

With the in-form Mitchell Starc (1/27) steaming in and Mukesh Kumar (1/36) keeping it tight at the



other end, CSK found the going tough and both bowlers enjoyed early success, the Australian left-arm speedster laying a trap for Ruturaj Gaikwad (5) and the Indian pacer sending back Rachin Ravindra (3) after the Kiwi got a leading edge while trying to flick it through midwicket.

Devon Conway (13), one of the crowd favourites who replaced Jamie Overton in this match, too fell cheaply after getting a leading edge while trying to work the ball over midwicket. Young leg-spinner Vipraj Nigam (2/27) was the successful bowler on that occasion, as CSK slipped to 41 for three in the sixth over.

After taking a fine catch to dismiss Shivam Dube, Tristan Stubbs dropped a sitter off Vijay Shankar, when the batter was on 27 and looking to accelerate with the promoted Dhoni at the other end.

Dhoni, whose decision to bat at number 9 against Royal Challengers was not well-received by fans, walked in at the fall of the fifth wicket but he was not able to get those big hits going, as the DC emerged winners.

Earlier, the Capitals suffered a jolt at the start of their innings thanks to an excellent first over from Khaleel Ahmed (2/25), who had bighitting opener Jake Fraser-McGurk caught after putting him under pressure with four dot balls.

Credit to Khaleel for plotting Fraser-McGurk's dismissal by banging the ball on the good length instead of allowing him to play in the 'V', something the young Australian is good at.

Notwithstanding the early jitter, DC managed to score 51 runs in the power play and that was largely because of the enterprise shown by Abhishek Porel (33 off 20 balls), who collected 19 runs from leftarm fast-medium bowler Mukesh Choudhary's first over.

Playing this game in place of Rahul Tripathi, Choudhary struggled to get his length right and was bowling either too full of too short, and Porel took full advantage of some wayward bowling.

Khaleel returned to bowl another

fine over and Choudhary too did much better in his second over. KL Rahul broke the shackles with a six over deep square leg off Khaleel before CSK skipper Ruturaj Gaikwad introduced spin in the form of the seasoned Ravichandran Ashwin in the sixth over, hoping for a wicket.

The much-needed breakthrough, however, came in the next over as Porel ended up giving an easy catch to Matheesha Pathirana after driving Ravindra Jadeja uppishly in the left-arm spinner's first over. It was a soft dismissal, and Porel would be frustrated with it as he was looking good for a big one after having settled down nicely. Axar Patel began his innings with a six over long-on off Jadeja but, like Porel, the DC skipper too got

On either side of Axar's dismissal, Rahul struck two sixes off Noor Ahmad and Jadeja respectively, before reaching his 38th IPL fifty off 33 balls.

UoH 'relocation' sparks outcry among student community

University already an eco-park, say students; warn of much stronger protest

The reported proposal of the State government to relocate the University of Hyderabad (UoH) campus, which over the past half-acentury has painstakingly built itself as an Institute of Eminence, is met with staunch opposition from

various quarters. As per reports in a section of media, the State government is reported to be toying with the idea of shifting the UoH to the proposed Future City and develop the present campus, where angry protests have disrupted the government plan to auction 400 acres of adjoining Kancha Gachibowli land for commercial exploitation, as an eco-park. This purported move has drawn widespread condemnation with the university

community stating that if



that happened, they would be gearing up for another round of protest that would be much stronger than last week's agitation that halted the deforestation of Kancha Gachibowli land.

Present and former students of the university condemned the plan, stating that it was vengeance against students' recent vehement protest against land auction in Kancha Gachibowli.

As per the plans cited by a section of media, the Kancha Gachibowli and the UoH campus covering 2,000 acres is to be turned into one of the largest ecoparks. This requires the shifting of the UoH campus, for which the govern-

ment proposed to allocate a mere 100 acre.

Speaking to 'Telangana Today', UoH Students Union president Umesh Ambedkar accused the government of diverting attention from the main issue. "When students are fighting over the university's original land of 2,300 acres, how can the government come up with a proposal to shift the campus itself? For the last 50 years, several crore rupees were spent on building the university. Any move to shift the campus will meet with much stronger protest from the university community," he

UoH Students Union general secretary Nihad Sulai-

man found the government's plan to be absurd. "The university is already an eco-park. We will staunchly oppose any move to shift the campus," he said.

For the last several weeks,

the university community has been up in arms against the State government's move to deforest and auction 400 acres of land in Kancha Gachibowli, abutting the UoH campus. After a rap from the Supreme Court, which stopped all works in the land, the government is said to be considering a proposal to shift the entire UoH campus to a new 100 acres site in the proposed Future City in the city outskirts. UoH former general secretary Suman Damera said the university campus was

"I wonder what is the need to deforest 100 acres of land and now come up with an eco-park plan? With thousands of crores, the university, which now achieved the institution of eminence, has been built over a period of 50 years. It appears to be a deliberate move to destroy the public education system in Telangana," said Damera, who is currently working as assistant professor in Mizoram University.

UoH Registrar Dr Divesh Nigam said neither there was a proposal sent to the varsity nor discussion on campus shifting was held. "Even if the proposal is sent, we will discuss it in the university's executive council. We will also take guidance from the Ministry of Education on the matter and make a decision," he added.

Three-pronged strategy mooted to prevent and control bird flu: Centre

The Department of Animal Husbandry and Dairying (DAHD) under the Ministry of Fisheries, Animal Husbandry and Dairying held a high level meeting in New Delhi to discuss the recent outbreaks of Avian Influenza (Bird Flu) in the country. Currently, six active outbreak zones remain in Telangana, Jharkhand and Chhattisgarh. The active epicentres in Telangana were Ranga Reddy, Nalagonda and Yadadri Bhuvanagiri

Chaired by Alka Upadhyaya, Secretary DAHD, the meeting brought together scientific experts, poultry industry representatives and policymakers to review the current situation of avian influenza and explore strategies to contain the disease and prevent its spread. A three-pronged strategy to



prevent and control bird flu has been decided by DAHD in consultation with the stakeholders. It encompasses stricter biosecurity measures wherein poultry farms must enhance hygiene practices, control farm access and follow stringent biosecurity protocols to minimize the risk of infection, strengthened surveillance and mandatory registration of poultry farms to enhance disease tracking and control all poultry farms must register with state animal husbandry departments within a month. The government has urged poultry industry stakeholders to ensure 100 per cent compliance with this directive.

Speaking at the meeting,
Alka Upadhyaya emphasized, "Protecting our poultry sector is critical for food security and rural livelihoods.
Strict biosecurity, scientific surveillance, and responsible industry practices are essential in our fight against Bird Flu." Additionally, Secretary DAHD stated the need for

developing a predictive modelling system for early warning and environmental surveillance which would enable proactive disease detection and response, minimizing the risk of outbreaks and protecting the poultry industry. DAHD has permitted the use of the H9N2 (Low Pathogenic Avian Influenza) vaccine, developed by ICAR-NIHSAD, Bhopal, which is now available commercially. A national study will evaluate the vaccine's effectiveness of LPAI vaccination. The meeting also extensively discussed the possibility of allowing the use of a vaccine against Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza (HPAI) in India. Representatives from the poultry industry urged the government to explore vaccination as a strategy to prevent further economic losses in the sector.

Hyderabad police grants conditional permission for shobha yatra

The Hyderabad police here on Saturday granted permission with certain conditions for Sri Rama Navami Shobha Yatra to be taken out by BJP MLA T Raja Singh on April 6 from Aakashpuri Hanuman Temple in Dhoolpet to Hanuman Vyayamshala in Ramkoti. In an order addressed to Raja Singh, Hyderabad Additional Commissioner of Police, Law and Order, Vikram Singh Mann has made it clear that no inconvenience should be caused to the general public and also no obstructions should be caused for free flow of traffic.

There should be no explicit and implicit violation of any law and the organizers must not create traffic problems. They should ensure that the yatra must be kept on the extreme left on the road and the other half of the road should remain free for regular traffic movement. The organizers should not deviate from the permitted route and they should not halt in the middle of the road for delivering speeches. They should not use DJs, sound mixers, high sound generating equipment, mobile mikes and loud speakers in the procession and also after the public meeting in Hanuman Vyayamshala. Bursting of fire crackers

is strictly prohibited along with sprinkling of vermilion, turmeric, 'gulal', flowers or other objects on passers-by under any circumstances. The persons in yatra should not carry any sticks, swords, knives, fire arms, inflammable material or any other weapons. Sticks used for carrying flags or decorations should not be more than two feet in length and should be of split bamboo. No provocative banners, placards and flexis hurt-

length and should be of split bamboo.

No provocative banners, placards and flexis hurting sentiments of other persons permitted. No provocative speeches, slogans or postures, which can hurt the feelings of any section of the public, shall be raised or dis-

played during yatra and no person under the influence of alcohol or any other narcotic drugs should be allowed in vehicles moving in yatra. Without written permission from the police, the organizers should not use any flying camera, drone or hot air balloon which is a hazard for public safety in a crowded area, he said. Adhering to instructions given by the police officers from time to time and providing young volunteers in sufficient numbers on all four sides of the procession were among the conditions laid down by the police for the successful conduct of the yatra.

Shabbir Ali, senior Congress leaders to approach Supreme Court against Waqf Bill

Senior Congress leader and Advisor to the Telangana Government Mohammed Ali Shabbir announced on Saturday that he, along with other national leaders, would approach the Supreme Court of India to challenge the controversial Waqf (Amendment) Bill, 2025, passed by the Parliament earlier this week.

Shabbir Ali participated in a crucial strategy meeting in New Delhi hosted by Indian Muslims for Civil Rights (IMCR). The meeting was also attended by Supreme Court senior advocate and former Union Minister Salman Khurshid, former Rajya Sabha MP Mohammed Adeeb, former MP Danish, and TPCC Secretary Mohammed Jaweed Ahmed and others. The gathering deliberated on the legal and polit

ical roadmap in light of the Bill's passage in both Lok Sabha and Rajya Sabha.

"We have unanimously decided to challenge the Waqf Bill in the Supreme Court. Our petition will be filed on Monday. Although the law will come into effect once it receives the President's assent and is published in the Gazette, we will move the court based on the final version of the Bill as passed by Parliament," said Shabbir



termed the Waqf Amendment Act as a direct assault on the religious and constitutional rights of Muslims and a serious infringement on the autonomy of Waqf institutions.

Shabbir Ali highlighted that the Bill, while reviewed by a Joint Parliamentary Committee, saw all recommendations made by opposition MPs being rejected, thereby making the consultation process ineffective. "This is not how democracy functions. Consultation does not mean bulldozing opposition

voices," he remarked. He expressed serious concern over provisions in the Bill that allow the inclusion of non-Muslim members in Waqf Boards and give state governments excessive control over the management and classification of Waqf properties. He warned that these changes would facilitate state-led encroachment on mosques, dargahs, graveyards, Eidgahs, and other centuries-old Waqf institu-

tions - especially in states like Telangana, where tens of thousands of acres are registered as Waqf land.

"The Muslim community is now left with two clear options: fight the Bill legally in the Supreme Court and resist it democratically through peaceful agitations," said Shabbir Ali. He assured that the Congress party would leave no stone unturned to ensure the repeal of the Waqf Amend-

dangerous precedent for all religious and linguistic minorities in India. He said that the Act vio-

ment Act, which he called a

lated Article 26 of the Constitution, which gives every religious denomination the right to manage its own religious affairs, and that Congress would not allow the BJP-led government to use legislative tools to disempower Muslims.
