2 Terrorists, Linked **To 2023 Pune Terror Conspiracy, Arrested** In Mumbai



The National Investigation Agency (NIA) has arrested two operatives of the banned terrorist outfit ISIS, who were part of a sleeper module involved in the fabrication and testing of Improvised Explosive Devices (IEDs) in Pune, Maharashtra.

The arrests were made in connection with a 2023 terror conspiracy case. The accused, Abdullah Faiyaz Shaikh alias Diaperwala, and Talha Khan, were intercepted at Mumbai's Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj International Airport Terminal 2 by the Bureau of Immigration.

The two had been hiding in Jakarta, Indonesia, and were taken into custody by the NIA upon arrival in

According to the NIA, the two had been on the run for over two years and were wanted in connection with Case RC-05/2023/NIA/MUM. Non-bailable warrants had been issued against them by the NIA Special Court in Mumbai, and a cash reward of Rs 3 lakh each was announced for information leading to their arrest. CONT:P5

The heli ambulance operated by AIIMS, Rishikesh had gone to Kedarnath to res cue a pilgrim suffering from respiratory distress when its tail rotor broke, forcing the pilot to make an emergency landing, District Tourism Development Officer Rahul

Chaubey said. Two doctors and a pilot were on board the heli ambulance when it made an emergency landing, said Mr Chaubey, who is also the nodal officer for the Heli Service. All of them are safe, he said.



Centre Unleashes Diplomatic War Against Pak Over Terror

New delhi WUT | May. 18

Saturday announced the formation of seven teams to launch a full-scale diplomatic offensive against Pakistan on the international stage. Opposition leaders Shashi Tharoor of the Congress, Supriya Sule of the NCP(SP) and DMK's Kanimozhi will join members of the ruling alliance in leading the three all-party delegations to key partner countries to convey India's message of zero tolerance against terrorism following Operation Sindoor. BJP's Ravi Shankar Prasad and Baijayant 'Jay' Panda, Shiv

Sena's Shrikant Shinde and JD(U)'s Sanjay Jha will lead the remaining four teams.

The government picked MPs from different parties to present India's "antiterrorism national consensus" globally, including to the UN Security Council members. Anurag Thakur, Aparajita Sarangi, Manish Tewari, Amar Singh, Rajiv Pratap Rudy, Samik Bhattacharya, Brij Lal,

Sarfaraz Ahmad, Priyanka Chaturvedi, Vikramjit Sawhney, Sasmit Patra, Salman Khurshid, Anand Sharma, Tejasvi Surya, John Brittas, Ghulam Nabi Azad, and Bhubaneswar Kalita will be part of the seven delegations. All the Opposition parties have supported and welcomed the delegation. The Congress struck a discordant note, accusing the government of "playing games" with a "mischievous mindset" by announcing names of the heads of delegations from outside the four MPs suggested by the party. The government has retained only Anand Sharma out of the four names given by

the Congress A statement issued by the parliamentary affairs ministry on Saturday said, "The allparty delegations will project India's national consensus and resolute approach to combating terrorism in all forms and manifestations. They will carry forth to the world the country's strong message of zero tolerance against terrorism."In a post on X, parliamentary affairs minister Kiren Rijiju said, "In moments that matter most, Bharat stands united. Seven all-party delegations will soon visit key partner nations, carrying our shared message of zero tolerance for terrorism." CONT:P4

Ukraine War Talks Yield POW Swap, But No Truce Europe

Istanbul WUT | May. 18

Russia and Ukraine agreed a large-scale prisoner exchange, said they would trade ideas on a possible ceasefire and discussed a potential meeting between Volodymyr Zelensky and Vladimir Putin in their first direct talks in over three years on Friday. But coming out of the highly anticipated talks in Istanbul, which lasted just over 90 minutes, there were few signs of more significant progress toward ending the threeyear war.

Kyiv was seeking an 'unconditional ceasefire" to pause a conflict that has destroyed large swathes of Ukraine and displaced millions of people. Mos-



cow has consistently rebuffed those calls and the only concrete agreement appeared to be a deal to exchange 1,000 prisoners each. The two sides said they would "present their vision of a possible future ceasefire", according to Russia's top negotiator, Vladimir Medinsky. They did not agree any

suspension of the fighting. "Overall, we are satisfied with the results and ready to continue contacts," Medinsky said. Ukraine's top negotiator, Defence Minister Rustem Umerov, said

the "next step" would be a meeting between the two presidents. Russia said it took note of the request. "We understand that if we want to make progress, we need to have this meeting of leaders," Ukrainian foreign ministry spokesman Georgiy Tykhy said later, praising the prisoner swap as a "great result". Turkish Foreign Minister Hakan Fidan, who presided over the meeting, said the sides had "agreed in principle to meet again" and would present ceasefire ideas "in writing". Fidan sat at the head of a table in front of Turkish, Russian and Ukrainian flags at Istanbul's Dolmabahce Palace for the talks -- with Russian and Ukrainian delegations facing each **CONT:P4**

CM Revanth Vows to Empower 1 Crore Women Through SHGs

Empowering one crore women to become millionaires, boosting Telangana's economy, Says CM Revanth reddy.

Vice President Jagdeep Dhankhar Draws Parallel Between Op Sindoor, Osama Bin Laden's Killing

New delhi WUT | May. 18

Vice President Jagdeep Dhankhar on Saturday drew similarities between Operation Sindoor and the killing of Osama bin Laden by US forces in Pakistan.

Describing attacks on nine terror sites in Pakistan as the "deepest-ever cross-border strike" by India, the vice president recalled the September 11, 2001 terror attacks in the United States. Without naming bin

Laden, he said that on May 2, 2011, a global terrorist who planned, supervised, and executed September 11 attacks inside the US was "dealt with" by the US forces "similarly".

"Bharat has done it. And done it to the knowledge of the world," he said addressing an event of Jaipuria institutions here. He said that a new "global benchmark" has been set. While maintaining the spirit of peace, the objective has been to strike at terrorism. For the

Plan To Increase Ranbir Canal

Hyderabad WUT | May. 18

After putting the Indus

Waters Treaty (IWT) in abeyance following the Pahalgam terror attack, the Centre is planning to double the length of the 60-km Ranbir canal in Jammu and Kashmir on the Chenab river, to optimise the water resource for domestic use. The present length of the canal is 60 km, which, according to sources, will likely be doubled. Till now, India has been using limited water from Chenab, mostly for irrigation, but with the



IWT in abeyance, there is scope for expanding its use, especially in the power generation sector, sources said. India was planning to ramp up its current hydropower capacity of around 3,000 megawatts on the rivers that were earlier being used by Pakistan and a feasibility study to that effect is on the cards. **CONT:P4**

Israeli Strikes Kill 146 Palestinians In Gaza In 24 hours

New delhi WUT | May. 18

Israel's airforce killed at least 146 Palestinians in new attacks on Gaza over the past 24 hours and injured many more, local health authorities said on Saturday, as the country appeared set to press

ahead with a new ground offensive.

Israeli strikes since Thursday have seen one of the deadliest phases of bombardment since a truce collapsed in March. The latest strikes came as U.S. President Donald Trump ended his Middle East tour on Friday with

no apparent progress towards a new ceasefire. "Since midnight, we have



In a novel initiative aimed at preventing illegal bamboo harvesting and empowering rural artisans, Mulugu District Forest Officer (DFO) Rahul Kishan Jadhav has launched a bamboo craft training programme for local communities. Rather than taking punitive measures against those involved in illicit cutting, the forest department is offering free training to individuals skilled in traditional bamboo craftsman-

As part of the initiative, raw materials and meals are provided free of cost. The training aims to help participants convert raw bamboo into dec-



orative, marketable products. Speaking to Deccan Chronicle, Forest Range Officer D. Shankar said 20 hectares of forest land rich in bamboo have been earmarked for the project under the DFO's direction. crafted by our trainees were presented to them. They were impressed and even requested more items," Shankar added.

Moluguri Poojitha, a

trainee with BSc and BEd qualifications, shared her experience: "Though I struggled to find a job earlier, this training has allowed me to express my creativity through bamboo craftsmanship." Another participant, Shanigarapu Harika from the Medara community, said her family has a legacy of working with bamboo. "Earlier, we made only household items. This training helped us gain confidence to try new decorative designs. We have already started receiving orders," she said.

DFO Rahul Kishan Jadhav emphasized that the programme's primary goal is to generate rural employment. He noted that the department is seeking state-level support to promote and sell the products. During a recent visit by Telangana Governor Jishnu Dev Varma, Panchayat Raj Minister Seethakka showcased the bamboo items, which were well received.

"We are planning a state-level exhibition in Hyderabad to highlight the work of rural artisans. Additionally, talks are underway with e-commerce platforms like Amazon and Flipkart to provide wider market access," the DFO added.

The Damagundam Reserve Forest in Vikarabad district, home to Telangana's state animal—the chital or spotted deer-is fast turning into a killing ground, with at least six deer reportedly killed in just the past week by packs of stray dogs.

The situation has taken a grim turn as some of the deer, in a desperate attempt to escape attacks, sought refuge at the historic Sri Ramalingeswara Swamy temple located within the forest—only to meet their end there. "People come here to worship, but these deer come here to die," lamented a



deeply disturbed Stayananda Swami, popularly known as Damagundam Swami, who runs an ashram

near the temple. On Saturday, the carcass of a male chital was discovered floating in the temple's sacred tank (gundam), while another injured deer was found hiding in the waterbody. "We keep informing the forest de-

These attacks, though currently peaking, are not a recent phenomenon. A Deccan Chronicle report from 2022 had already highlighted the growing threat to wildlife in the Vikarabad forests under the headline "Vikarabad forests turn unsafe for state animal". When contacted, forest

department officials expressed helplessness, stating that the responsibility of managing stray dogs lies with local civic bodies. "As per law, stray dogs can only be sterilised and released back into the area they were captured from. There is little the forest department can do beyond that," an official explained.

Tensions flared within Dalit communities over an alleged protocol violation involving Peddapalli MP Gaddam Vamsikrishna during the ongoing Saraswati Pushkaralu. Dalit leaders, convening in Hyderguda, accused the Devadaya Department of caste-based discrimination by excluding the MP from official invitations and omitting his photograph from event materials.

Leaders issued a 24-hour ultimatum to the state government, demanding an unconditional apology and proper protocol acknowledgment by inviting the MP before the Pushkaralu concludes on the 26th. Failing this, they warned of statewide protests and a siege of the Commissioner of Religion's office.

They also plan to raise the issue in Parliament, seeking suspension of responsible officials. National Dalit Rights Forum (DBF) Secretary P. Shankar, speaking from Siddipet, condemned the incident and de-



manded cases under the SC/ST Atrocities Act against Devadaya officials. A formal complaint was submitted to SC/ST Commissioner Bakki Venkataiah, who has reportedly issued a notice to the Chief Secretary.

High Court Advocate Diwakar Poole, along with leaders Bitla Venkateswarlu and Raju Vastad, extended support, stressing that such incidents contradict Ambedkar's principles and threaten the dignity of Dalit representatives. District-wide protests are set to begin, with legal and constitutional measures underway to ensure justice and systemic reform.

"Level Of Anger Between India And Pak Was Not A Good Thing": Trump

New delhi WUT | May. 18

US President Donald Trump, who has made repeated claims that his administration brokered a "ceasefire" between India and Pakistan, on Friday described it as a "big success" and said the level of anger between the two neighbours "was not a good thing.'

"We are very happy with what happened with, I hope it continues, and I think it will, but what happens with India and Pakistan. That was a big success. If you had seen the level of anger between the two, that was not a good thing," Trump said during a gaggle with the press on Air Force One on May 16 as he was returning to Washington from his Gulf trip.

This is the seventh time since May 10 that Trump has claimed that the US

brokered the "ceasefire" between New Delhi and Islamabad.

Trump, who visited Saudi Arabia, Qatar, and the United Arab Emirates during his four-day visit to the region, repeated his claim that he "helped settle" the tensions between India and Pakistan when he addressed US troops at the Al Udeid Air Base on Thursday in Doha, Qatar, the largest US military base in the Middle East. India carried out precision strikes under 'Operation Sindoor' on terror infrastructure early on May 7 in response to the April 22 Pahalgam terror attack that killed 26 people.Following the Indian action, Pakistan attempted to attack Indian military bases on May 8, 9 and 10. The Indian forces launched a fierce counterattack on several Pakistani

After a short suspension, access to both TRT World and Global Times' X accounts has been restored in India. The Indian government

This follows after the call given in recent times for a boycott on Turkish products and services after Turkish origin military equipment such as Asisguard Songar model drones were found to have been deployed against India by Pakistan during its attack on civilian and military infrastructure of India in the wake of Operation Sindoor launched by India, targeting nine key terror camps in Pakistan and Pakistan-occupied Kashmir (PoK), avenging the April 22.

Israeli Strikes Kill 146 Palestinians In Gaza In 24 hours

Israel's airforce killed at

least 146 Palestinians in new attacks on Gaza over the past 24 hours and injured many more, local health authorities said on Saturday, as the country appeared set to press ahead with a new ground offensive. Israeli strikes since Thursday have seen one of the deadliest phases of bombardment since a truce collapsed in March. The latest strikes came as U.S. President Donald Trump ended his Middle East tour on Friday with no apparent progress towards a new ceasefire.

Plan To Increase Ranbir Canal Length

New delhi WUT | May. 18

After putting the Indus Waters Treaty (IWT) in abeyance following the Pahalgam terror attack, the Centre is planning to double the length of the 60-km Ranbir canal in Jammu and Kashmir on the Chenab river, to optimise the water resource for domestic use. The present length of the canal is 60 km, which, according to sources, will likely be doubled. Till now, India has been using limited water from Chenab, mostly for irrigation, but with the IWT in abeyance, there is scope for expanding its use, especially in the power generation sector, sources said. India was planning to ramp up its current hydropower capacity of around 3,000 megawatts on the rivers that were earlier being used by Pakistan

and a feasibility study to that effect is on the cards. It is learnt that the cost

of the expansion of the canal network will be borne by the Central government, and if needed, the Union home ministry may allocate additional funds to the J&K government. The exercise for desilting the Ranbir canal, along with other similar systems in Jammu and Kashmir, is under consideration for execution in a phased manner. The main aim of the desilting is to increase their water-carrying capacity to increase the irrigation cover in the Union territory. Already the process of desilting has started on Kathua, Ravi and Paragwal canals, the official said. The Ranbir canal is one

of the two major canals of the Jammu district, which takes off from the left bank of the Chenab river. It was initially con-

structed by the erstwhile ruler of Jammu and Kashmir state and was completed in the year 1905. Being a major source of surface water irrigation, it catered to the Kandi belts of Jammu district, primarily the areas abutting Akhnoor Road, Bishnah, R.S. Pura and Arnia belts, among others. The canal was designed initially for net irrigated land of 16,460 hectares. As per the Indus Waters Treaty 1960, Ranbir Canal is to carry 1,000 cusecs for irrigation purposes and 250 cusecs for hydropower use, besides

water withdrawal for silt extraction from April 15 to October 14 every year. Meanwhile, the chief minister of Jammu and Kashmir Mr Omar Abdullah has called to revive the stalled Tulbul Navigation Barrage on the

He claimed this project will allow the people of J-K to use Jhelum River water for navigation and improve power generation during winters.Brokered by the World Bank in 1960 after nine years of negotiation, the IWT governed the distribution and use of the Indus river and its tributaries between India and Pakistan. Celebi to Legally Challenge **Termination of India Agreements**

New delhi WUT | May. 18

Turkiye's Celebi Hava Servisi AS on Friday announced that it will pursue all available administrative and legal remedies to challenge the termination of various licence and concession agreements in India after the Bureau of Civil Aviation Security (BCAS) revoked the security clearance for its Indian subsidiaries, citing national security concerns. The decision has led to the suspension of operations of several Celebi entities, including Celebi Airport Services India Pvt Ltd (CASI), Celebi GH India Pvt Ltd (CGHI), Celebi Nas Airport Services India Pvt Ltd, Celebi Delhi Cargo Terminal Management India Pvt Ltd, and Celebi GS Chennai Pvt Ltd (CGSC).Celebi, which has been active in the Indian aviation sector for over 15 years and employs more than 10,000 people, was offering ground handling and cargo services at nine airports including Delhi,

Mumbai, Ahmedabad, Bengaluru, Hyderabad, Chennai, Goa (Mopa), Kannur, and Cochin. In a filing to Turkiye's stock exchange, the company confirmed that four major concession and licence agreements have been unilaterally terminated by Indian airport authorities. These include the cargo terminal concession agreement between Celebi Delhi Cargo Terminal Management India Pvt Ltd and Delhi International Airport Ltd (DIAL), valid until 2034, in which Celebi holds a 74 percent stake; the ground handling licence agreement between CGHI and Ahmedabad International Airport Ltd (AIAL), valid until 2032, where Celebi owns 61 percent; the bridge mounted equipment service and ground handling concession agreements between Celebi Nas and Mumbai International Airport Ltd (MIAL), valid until 2036 and 2029 respectively, with Celebi holding 59 percent stake; and the ground handling concession agreement between CASI and DIAL,

valid until 2030, where Celebi holds a 99.9 percent share.Celebi Hava Servisi AS asserted that none of its subsidiaries have engaged in any activity that violates Indian laws or national security regulations and described the allegations as unfounded. The company reiterated its intent to challenge the BCAS decision through all possible legal and administrative channels and seek annulment of the agreement terminations. The move to revoke Celebi's clearance came days after Turkiye backed Pakistan and condemned India's strikes on terror camps across the border, leading to speculation over geopolitical motives. Meanwhile, Civil Aviation Minister K Rammohan Naidu stated that national interest and public safety remain paramount and non-negotiable. The Ministry of Civil Aviation said it is actively coordinating with airport operators to ensure a smooth transition of services and is working to retain Celebi's existing workforce

"Kashmir Has Been Used As Weapon To Unite Pak": Ex Army Chief

New delhi WUT | May. 18

The role of the Director General of Military Operations is in focus after the recent ceasefire between India and Pakistan was declared following a call between officers holding the rank in both countries.

The position, which also involves planning and overseeing military operations, was equally important - if not more so - when India and Pakistan fought the Kargil war in 1999. The man occupying the post at the time was Nirmal Chander Vij, who went on to become the Army chief in 2005 and was instrumental in the decision to construct a 740-km fence along the Line of Control.

In an exclusive interview with NDTV on Friday, General Vij (retired) said that, after Operation Sindoor during which India struck terror bases in Pakistan, including the headquarters of the Lashkar-e-Taiba and Jaish-e-Mohammed - Islamabad has been sent a clear message that its nuclear bluff will not work anymore and that India will go to any ex-

tent to make sure its national integrity is safeguarded. General Vij also said his experience has taught him that Pakistan is incorrigible and lying is part of its ethos. State-Sponsored Terror Asked about the recent hostilities, the former Army chief, who has written a new book, 'Alone In The Ring -Decision-Making In Critical Times', said, "In many ways, I think this book has turned out to be prophetic. Because I have written that our western neighbours are so incorrigible and so untrustworthy that you really cannot say anything about them for sure. And despite all the efforts by India to maintain peace, they have been indulging in terrorism promoted by the state.'

General Vij recalled his interactions with General Tauqir Zia, who was the Pakistani DGMO during the Kargil war, and said that's when the country's propensity for lying and obfuscating became very apparent to

"You could make out that telling lies is a part of their very ethos and ecosystem... Once, I told him, after point 5140 was captured (during the Kargil war), that we have found lots of maps which were duly marked, all he could say in reply was 'ahmaq', which means 'fool' or 'stupid'. That's the problem with them... they will not speak the truth," he said. The former Army chief said that despite the understanding being reached with Pakistan, India will maintain a state of alertness for "quite some time", until it's clear what line the other side will adopt. This, he said, was also important since PM Narendra Modi has made it clear that any act of terror originating in Pakistan will be seen as an act of war. On Operation Sindoor, which was carried out in response to the Pahalgam terror attack, in which 26 people were killed, General Vij said some very important messages had been sent out to Pakistan.

"All along, we have been worried about nuclear responses. Our anti-terror operations were restricted to an extent. Even during the Kargil war, we didn't cross the Line of Control... Now, the PM has said your nuclear

The effort includes the participation of a diverse group of parliamentarians such as Anurag Thakur, Aparajita Sarangi, Manish Tewari, Amar Singh, Rajiv Pratap Rudy, Samik Bhattacharya, Brij Lal, Sarfaraz Ahmad, Priyanka Chaturvedi, Vikramjit Sawhney, Sasmit Patra, Salman Khurshid, Anand Sharma, Tejasvi Surya, John Brittas, Ghulam Nabi Azad, and Bhubaneswar Kalita. In addition to elected representatives, the delegations will be supported by seasoned former diplomats like Pankaj Saran, Harsh Vardhan Shringla, Jawed Ashraf, and Syed Akbaruddin, who will provide strategic diplomatic guidance to enhance the impact of India's message abroad. The initiative, while largely welcomed across the political spectrum, did generate a minor controversy with the Congress party expressing displeasure.



INDIA MUST BUILD A TRULY CIRCULAR ECONOMY

Hyderabad WUT | May. 18

By 2030, India is poised to become the world's thirdlargest economy. Yet, amid this remarkable ascent lies a growing mountain - of garbage. India generates 1,60,038 tonnes of waste per day (TPD), but only half of this is treated. A staggering 29,427 TPD is dumped in landfills, while nearly 51,000 TPD disappears unaccounted for. These numbers speak not just of poor waste management but also of an economic model that's still stuck in a linear loop of "take, make, dispose." The circular economy (CE) — a model that designs out waste and pollution, keeps products and materials in use and regenerates natural systems — is no longer a theoretical ideal. It is a practical necessity. Yet, while India has signalled bold ambitions to embrace circularity, the path remains strewn with policy bottlenecks, capacity

gaps and systemic inertia. Promise and Problem India's policy discourse on circularity has expanded in recent years. From the Extended Producer Responsibility (EPR) rules to flagship forums like CITIIS 2.0 and the 12th Regional 3R and CE Forum hosted in Jaipur, the government has sent strong signals about its intentions. In 2024 alone, CITIIS projects worth over Rs 1,800 crore were signed, with 18 cities selected for 'Lighthouse Projects' to integrate CE into urban planning. However, these efforts re-

Into urban planning.
However, these efforts remain isolated. The Central Pollution Control Board reports that 31.7% of India's municipal solid waste remains untraced. Delhi, India's capital, presents a grotesque symbol of this failure. The Ghazipur landfill alone emits 15.3 Gg (greenhouse gas) of methane annually —1-3% of India's total landfills emit methane — posing grave health and environmental

What plagues India's transition is not a lack of ambition but fragmented execution. State and municipal capacities for waste collection, segregation and treatment remain disjointed. While cities like Pune and Bengaluru have piloted decentralised waste solutions, most continue to rely on antiquated systems. The informal sector, a key player in waste collection and recycling, remains largely outside formal policy frameworks, leading to resource leakage and missed synergies. Amid the circular conversation, one sector demands urgent attention — India's 5.93 crore Micro, Small, and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs). These businesses employ over 25 crore people and accounted for 30.1% of the country's

7 Cattle Checkposts Set Up In Khammam

hammam police have established seven checkposts at state and district borders to curb the illegal transportation of cattle to Hyderabad from Andhra Pradesh. This move comes after intelligence revealed that some individuals were using routes through the district to smuggle cattle. The checkposts have been set up at Paladugu in Wyra mandal, Basvapuram Cross Road in Konijerla mandal, Hanuman Thanda in Kalluru mandal, Venkatagiri Cross Road in Khammam Rural mandal, Subled Cross Road in Tirumalapem mandal, Sigarenipally Toll Plaza in Kusumanchi mandal and Vallabhi in Mudigonda mandal.

Khammam police commissioner Sunil Dutt, in a video conference with police officials, said round-the-clock surveillance would be maintained at these checkposts. Police personnel and staff from the animal husbandry department have been deployed to oversee the operations. The special checkposts aim to prevent any law and order problems caused by illegal cattle transport. Police have warned of strict action and legal cases against those involved. The commissioner also directed officials to step up monitoring ahead of Bakrid next month. He warned that stringent action would be taken against anyone spreading communal disharmony through social media posts. A special monitoring cell has been formed to identify and act against such offenders.

2 Terrorists, Linked To 2023 Pune Terror Conspiracy, Arrested In Mumbai

Hyderabad WUT | May. 18

The National Investigation Agency (NIA) has arrested two operatives of the banned terrorist outfit ISIS, who were part of a sleeper module involved in the fabrication and testing of Improvised Explosive Devices (IEDs) in Pune, Maharash-

"They had conspired to commit terrorist acts with the aim to disturb India's peace and communal harmony by waging a war against the Government of India in furtherance of the ISIS agenda to establish Islamic rule in the country through violence and terror," the agency stated. Abdullah Faiyaz Shaikh had rented a house in Kondhwa, Pune, which was used as a hub for assembling IEDs.

The NIA said that during 2022 and 2023, the accused not only fabricated IEDs but also conducted training workshops in bomb making and even carried out a controlled explosion to test one of their devices.

The investigative agency, which has been actively working to dismantle ISIS-linked networks operating in India, had previously



filed a chargesheet against all ten accused under various provisions of the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act, Explosive Substances Act, Arms Act, and the Indian Penal Code. In addition to Abdullah Faiyaz Shaikh and Talha

Khan, the other eight accused currently in judicial custody include Mohammed Imran Khan, Mohammed Yunus Saki, Abdul Kadir Pathan, Simab Nasiruddin Kazi, Zulfikar Ali Barodawala, Shamil Nachan, Akif Nachan, and

Shahnawaz Alam.
The NIA said that investigations in the case are ongoing. The arrests were made in connection with a 2023 terror conspiracy case.

The team now stands at 17 points from 12 matches, occupying the top spot on the points table, just ahead of Gujarat Titans, who have 16 points. With two league matches remaining, RCB needs just one more win to mathematically secure their spot in the playoffs.

Their remaining fixtures include a home game against the already-eliminated Sunrisers Hyderabad on May 23, followed by an away clash with Lucknow Super Giants on May 27. The side, led by Faf du Plessis and driven by consistent performances from key players including Virat Kohli, looks well-positioned to break their



long-standing quest for an IPL title. On the other side, the washed-out match marked a sorrowful end to Kolkata Knight Riders' campaign in the IPL 2025. While the team's game may have been called off, the fans ensured that the evening still belonged to Kohli. As the rain continued to fall, it failed to wash away the emotions and tributes that poured in for the Indian great. It was an evening where cricket took a backseat, and the love for a cricketer came to the fore a love that runs deep in Bengaluru's heart.
