Congress Govt to complete Devadula in two years, fast-tracks all pending irrigation projects: Uttam

Hyderabad WUT | May. 4

Telangana Irrigation and Civil Supplies Minister Capt. N Uttam Kumar Reddy on Saturday announced that the Congress government is committed to completing the J. Chokka Rao Devadula Lift Irrigation Scheme within the next two years. He said the project would bring permanent irrigation benefits to around six lakh acres in the united Warangal and Bhongir regions, transforming the agricultural landscape of drought-prone districts. The minister, accom-

panied by Revenue Minister Ponguleti Srinivasa Reddy and MLAs Kadiyam Srihari, Yashaswini Reddy, and Nayini Ra-

jender Reddy, inspected various works under the Devadula project in Dharmasagar mandal. He slammed the previous BRS regime, alleging that despite spending ₹1.81 lakh crore on irrigation over a decade, it failed to create significant ayacut due to inflated estimates and mismanagement. "The Congress government is now fixing the failures of the past by accelerating all pending works and ensuring that every rupee results in water reaching

farmers' fields," he said. Uttam reviewed progress on the 49.06 kmlong main tunnel under Phase-III Package-III and visited the Devannapet pump house. where Pump-02 has been commissioned, pumping water to Dharmasagar reservoir for 62 hours. Pumps 01 and 03 are scheduled for commissioning by May 31 and July 31, respectively. To address leakages and avoid interference with Mission Bhagiratha pipelines, 110 large

steel pipes from the Manjeera project are being installed and expected to be completed by month-end. The scheme requires an additional ₹3,312 crore to irrigate 5.57 lakh acres across nine districts. At Rajavaram, the minister inspected the EM-1 tunnel and pump house works, where two 4.3 MW pumps will lift 15.3 cumecs of water. Canal improvement and desilting works under RFMC Phase-II, sanctioned for ₹148.76 crore, are in progress.

Later, Uttam inspected desiltation and flood prevention works at the historic Bhadrakali tank in Warangal. Of the 11.5 lakh cum of silt targeted, 2.7 lakh cum has been removed. The government sanctioned ₹16.11 crore for silt

transportation and is implementing a ₹158 crore flood protection project. In a review meeting at Hanamkonda, the minister stated that Telangana had achieved a record in paddy procurement, buying

28.58 lakh MT worth ₹5,664 crore in the current Rabi season. He also defended the Con-

gress government's free fine rice scheme, calling it a dignified

Telangana May Cross 19,500 MW Power Demand in 2026

Telangana has already surpassed the Central Electricity Authority's (CEA) projected peak power demand for 2025. Against the estimate of 16,877 MW, the state recorded a peak demand of 17,162 MW. With rapid growth in industrial and other sectors, the actual power demand in 2026 could reach between 19,000 MW and 19,500 MW—well above the CEA's projected 18,135 MW, said principal energy secretary Sandeep Kumar Sultania. He di-

rected energy officials to prepare the grid network to meet the rising load. In a review meeting with TGSPDCL CMD Musharraf Faruqui and other officials, Sultania assessed the southern discom's five-year action plan, including power needs in upcoming industrial zones. He asked officials to increase infrastructure by 40 per cent to meet the projected 20 per cent demand spike in areas like Ibrahim Bagh, Gachibowli, Patancheru, Kandukur and Medchal areas within Greater Hyderabad.

Sultania said Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy and Deputy Chief Minister Mallu Bhatti Vikramarka are committed to ensuring quality power supply across the state and would extend full support to the power sector. Later, he held a meeting with electric charge point operators, urging them to accelerate the setting up of EV charging stations. With electric vehicle adoption rising rapidly, Sultania urged the charging point operators must set up 6,000 public charging stations by 2030.

Farmers in Jharasangam Trained on Biochar and **HDPS Cotton Cultivation for Sustainable Farming**

A farmer training programme promoting sustainable agriculture was held at Rythu Vedika in Jharasangam, Sangareddy district. Organized by Aranya Agricultural Alternatives, the session focused on innovative methods in cotton cultivation, including the use of biochar and the High-Density Planting System (HDPS). Aranya CEO Padma Koppula highlighted the



importance of biochar, a carbon-rich substance produced from agricultural waste. She explained that biochar enhances soil health by improving water reten-

tion, nutrient availability, and microbial activity. "It reduces the need for chemical fertilizers and sequesters carbon in the soil for centuries, making it an eco-

friendly solution," she said. Farmers were encouraged to integrate biochar into their composting practices for better crop outcomes and climate benefits. District Agriculture Officer K. Shiva Prasad introduced HDPS cotton cultivation, which involves planting more cotton seeds per acre at closer spacing. This method, he noted, significantly increases productivity and helps meet the rising national demand for cotton. Officials also acknowl-

edged the efforts of Nuziveedu Seeds, which is supplying biochar to farmers free of cost. A company representative shared that HDPS cotton has seen wide adoption, covering 35,000 acres across 59 districts this season, with yield improvements of 3 to 5 quintals per acre. The programme reflects a growing movement toward sustainable and high-yield agricultural practices in rural India, aiming to benefit both farmers and the environment.

In a representation submitted to TGCHE Chairman Prof V Balakista Reddy on Friday, SFI Telangana president S
