Man Alleged To Have Helped Terrorists In J&K Jumps Into River, Drowns



A man who gave food and shelter to terrorists in Jammu and Kashmir's Kulgam district drowned after he jumped into a river while escaping from the security forces. A video taken from a higher

ground shows the man, Imitiaz Ahmad Magray, 23, suddenly jumping into the rocky river after scanning the forested area briefly.


Magray was picked up by the police on Saturday, sources said. During questioning, he told the police that he gave food and logistics to terrorists hiding in the forest in Kulgam's Tangmarg, sources said.

The accused agreed to lead the security forces to the terrorists' hideout, sources said. On Sunday morning, while leading a joint team of the police and the army to raid the hideout, Magray in a bid to flee jumped into the Veshaw River, sources said. The moment of his escape was also captured on camera. There was no one near him when he decided to bolt The video showed the man trying to swim, but the strong current carried him away and he drowned. **CONT:P4**

aftermath of the Pahalgam terror attack, a former diplomat has warned that public mood should not dictate a war with Pakistan. Ajay Bisaria, former high commissioner to Pakistan, highlighted the key aspects of such an action and said its timing should not be based on what the people feel. "For any operation to succeed, you need three elements: speed, surprise, and secrecy. There is an issue of choosing our timing, and that should not be dictated by the public mood," said the former diplomat on an ANI podcast. 

#### Riyan Parag Hits Historic Six Sixes, But RR Lose Last-Ball Thriller to KKR



**Kolkata** WUT | May. 5

Rajasthan Royals' stand-in captain Riyan Parag created history on Sunday by becoming the first batter in IPL history to hit six consecutive sixes, but his sensational effort wasn't enough to take

his team over the line against Kolkata Knight Riders in a last-ball thriller.Parag's blistering 95 off just 45 balls (6 fours, 8 sixes) nearly pulled off a stunning chase after RR found themselves struggling at 71/5 within eight overs,

chasing a daunting target of 207 at Eden Gardens.

The 23-year-old's historic six-hitting spree came across two overs—five off Moeen Ali and one off Varun Chakravarthy—electrifying the crowd and keeping Royals' hopes alive. However, KKR's

experienced campaigners held their nerve in the final moments.

A well-executed final over by Vaibhav Arora and a crucial run-out by Rinku Singh ensured the Royals fell just short at 205/8, giving KKR a narrow 1-run victory. CONT:P4

### Strategic Europe Visit

#### India is Looking for Partners, Not Preachers: Jaishankar

The minister further said there should be "sensitivity and mutuality of interests" and a "realisation of how the world works", indicating that this is what India expects of Europe

As Prime Minister Narendra Modi gears up for his visit to three European nations—Norway, Croatia, and the Netherlandsfrom May 13 to 17, External Affairs Minister (EAM) S. Jaishankar has made pointed remarks about India's expectations from its Western partners. Speaking at the Arctic Circle India Forum ahead of the India-Nordic Summit, Jaishankar emphasized India's preference for "partners, not preachers." He stated, "When we look out at the world, we look for partners. We don't look for preachers, particularly preachers who don't practice at home what they preach abroad."The EAM's comments are seen as a veiled critique of European nations, reflecting New Delhi's growing assertiveness in global diplomacy. He stressed the importance of "sensitivity



and mutuality of interests" and called for a pragmatic understanding of global realities. "Europe has entered a zone of reality check. While some parts of Europe are still struggling, others have changed," he said. Underscoring India's balanced foreign policy, Jaishankar reiterated that New Delhi has consistently refrained from prescribing solutions in the Russia-Ukraine conflict. "We have not told one or the other party to do this or do that," he said. "That is important to remember because that is a courtesy not always granted to us. We often receive advice on what we should be doing."His remarks also included a broader critique of Western diplomatic behavior, reflecting India's push for equitable **CONT:P4**




ister Modi's leadership, what you desire will certainly happen," the Defence Minister said, alluding to what people across the nation have been talking about the need for a response to Pakistan.

#### US Eyes Sweeping Trade Reforms in India Under Proposed Bilateral Deal: GTRI

New delhi WUT | May. 5

As trade negotiations between India and the United States advance, Washington is reportedly preparing to push for extensive policy changes across several sectors of the Indian economy. According to a recent report published by the Global Trade Research Initiative (GTRI), the United States is seeking wide-ranging reforms in India's tariff structure, regulatory systems, and trade practices—changes that would potentially enhance market access and reduce barriers for American firms and exporters.

The GTRI report, released on Sunday, indicates that the proposed bilateral trade agreement between the two nations could be a vehicle for these sweeping changes, many of which touch on politically and economically sensitive areas in India such as agriculture, dairy, digital commerce,



and the importation of industrial goods.

In the agriculture sector, the United States has long been critical of India's minimum support price (MSP) programs, especially for staple crops like rice and wheat. These government-backed price guarantees, the US argues, distort market

barriers that disadvantage foreign producers. Washington is likely to demand that India scale back or reform these MSP schemes as part of the trade agreement. Additionally, the US is expected to push for a reduction in agricultural tariffs and the removal of long-standing restrictions on genetically modified (GM) crops and food products. These restrictions, which stem from concerns over food safety and envi-

prices and act as trade

ronmental impact, have effectively prevented the entry of many American agricultural goods into the Indian market.

However, India views these policy tools as crucial for ensuring food security and protecting the livelihoods of its millions of small and marginal farmers. "The MSP system is central to India's agricultural support framework and food procurement strategy," said Ajay Srivastava, founder of GTRI. CONT:P4

## Israel's Netanyahu vows response to Iran after Houthi attack on airport

New delhi WUT | May. 5

Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu has promised to respond to an attack from Yemen's Houthi rebels that hit Ben Gurion International Airport, adding that Iran would also face consequences from the

strike.
A ballistic missile

launched by the Iran-allied Yemeni rebel group hit the perimeter of the airport on Sunday, damaging a road and a vehicle and causing air traffic to stop, according to photos and footage verified by Al Jazeera. The Israeli military confirmed its defence system failed to shoot down the projectile on Sunday morning despite several



attempts to intercept it, tic adding that an investiga-

tion was under way. Eight people were injured, ac-

cording to paramedics. Israeli media reported that the advanced US-made THAAD system and Israel's long-range Arrow defence system failed to bring down the missile.

Writing on social media, Netanyahu said that attacks from the Houthis ultimately "emanate from Iran".

"Israel will respond to

the Houthi attack against our main airport AND, at a time and place of our choosing, to their Iranian terror masters," Netanyahu wrote.

The Israeli prime minister has been trying to drum up support for a joint attack with the United States against Iran, despite ongoing talks between Washington and Tehran.

Responding to Israel's threats, Iran's Defence Minister Aziz Nasirzadeh said that Tehran would strike back if the US or Israel attacked.

"If this war is intiated by

"If this war is intiated by the US or the Zionist regime [Israel], Iran will target their interests, bases and forces – wherever they may be and whenever deemed necessary," Nasirzadeh told Iranian state television.

Nasirzadeh also said that Yemen's Houthis made their own decisions when conducting attacks.

The rebel group, which has been carrying out attacks against Israel in stated opposition to its war and blockade on the Gaza Strip, claimed responsibility for the missile launched CONT:P4

#### Charlapalli Entry Closed After Panel Collapse

**Hyderabad** WUT | May. 5

Railway authorities closed the entrance to the Charlapalli railway station after some panels collapsed during heavy rain and winds late on Saturday, which caused inconvenience to passengers. No one was injured in the incident, but videos went viral and left passengers scared. A worker who was repairing the collapsed portion reportedly lost consciousness on Sunday. He was safely rescued, sources said. Otherwise, repair works were on at the terminal that was inaugurated with fanfare in January.

Passengers complained about a lack of information at the station. Jothi B, a homemaker who arrived at the station with her family at about noon, said, "We didn't know about the incident. After we got down at the station, we were stopped near the main exit



and had to walk all the way to the other side of the station with our luggage and kids in this summer heat." Another passenger, Ganesh M, said, "With the main entrance blocked, people struggled to find cabs and autorickshaws. Because the entrance was blocked, people who landed there are facing trouble. There's traffic on the other side, and it's very confusing."

Some passengers expressed frustration at the incident. One of them said. "So much money is being invested, but where is the

safety and comfort for the public? Incidents like this happen only in India." However, the incident did not affect railway operations. A railway staffer, who wished not to be named, told Deccan Chronicle, "The incident has not affected trains. There have been no delays." Passengers also pointed out that there are no clear signboards to guide travellers from the main road to the station. Many of the passenger shelters inside the station were incomplete, and few lifts are not in working condition.

# **Bandi Sanjay Rules Out Talks with Maoists**

**Karimnagar** WUT | May. 5

Union Minister of State for Home Affairs, Bandi Sanjay Kumar, firmly dismissed the possibility of peace negotiations with banned Maoist groups, stating that dialogue with such organisations is not a viable option. Speaking at the inauguration ceremony of a Hanuman statue in Kothapalli mandal of Karimnagar district on Sunday, the minister criticized both the Congress-led state government and the Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS) for suggesting a conciliatory approach towards the outlawed insurgent

"There is no question of holding talks with Maoists. They must first lay down their arms. surrender to the police, and adopt a lawful and



peaceful way of life," Kumar asserted during his address.

Taking a strong stance,

the minister lambasted Telangana Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddv and BRS chief K. Chandrashekar Rao for advocating a social lens to view the Maoist insurgency. He questioned the rationale behind framing violent extremist activities as social issues, especially when the Maoists have a history of deadly attacks on security forces, politicians, journalists, and civilians.

"These are the same Maoists who have planted landmines, assassinated BJP leaders, police officers, and journalists. Their actions have destroyed countless families. How can anyone call this a social issue? Tribals do not walk around with guns or plant explosives. The violence is being carried tremist groups," Kumar stated. He further challenged the Congress party's credibility on the issue by reminding the public that it was the Congress that had originally imposed the ban on Maoist outfits during its earlier tenure. "Now the same party talks about peace talks. If they truly believe in what they are saying, do they have the courage to lift the ban on the Maoists?" he asked.

In addition to his comments on Maoist insurgency, Kumar also addressed concerns about national security, urging the Telangana government to act decisively against illegal immigration. Referring specifically to illegal Rohingya migrants, he warned that inaction could turn Hyderabad into a safe haven for ter-

rorists. "The Centre has already directed all states to identify and deport foreigners staying without valid documents. The state must take this seriously," he said. The Union Minister also accused the Congress-BRS combine of attempting to divert public attention from governance failures. "Instead of focusing on the unfulfilled promises such as the implementation of the six guarantees and cracking down on corruption, both parties seem more interested in engaging with Maoists," he alleged. Kumar's remarks reflect the Centre's hardline stance on internal security issues and aim to underscore the BJP's position as tough on terrorism and insurgency, especially in regions historically affected by left-wing extremism.

#### Ration cards of 11 Telangana families cancelled for selling fine rice to kirana shop

Tandur revenue officials cancelled the food security card holders (ration cards) of 11 families for selling fine quality rice allotted to them, to the local kirana shop owner for Rs 16 per kg in Kuchulapur village in Tandur mandal in Mancherial district. The ration card of one Mahesh, who bought that rice on Saturday was also cancelled. Police booked cases against Mahesh. 

## Isro Lines Up Major Space Missions from May to July 2025

**Nellore** WUT | May. 5

The Indian Space Research Organisation (Isro) is all set for a series of high-profile missions between May and July 2025, marking advances in Earth observation, human spaceflight preparedness, and international collaboration in space research. Leading the line-up is the scheduled spaceflight of Group Capt. Shubhanshu Shukla of the Indian Air Force to the International Space Station (ISS) on May 29, 2025, as part of Axiom Space's Ax-4 mission. This mission marks a significant step in India's global space collaboration efforts and serves as a precursor to the country's own Gaganyaan crewed mission.

A decorated test pilot, Group Captain Shukla was shortlisted under Isro's Human Spaceflight Programme (HSP) and is among the top contenders

for Gaganyaan, which is India's first indigenous orbital crewed flight. His journey aboard the Ax-4 mission will offer vital hands-on training in spaceflight operations, launch protocols, microgravity adaptation, and emergency procedures, forming a crucial foundation for India's long-term human spaceflight ambitions.

The announcement was made by Union minister Dr Jitendra Singh, who chaired a high-level review meeting held recently on Isro's upcoming mission plans. Isro chairman Dr V. Narayanan provided detailed updates on several critical launches scheduled over the next three months. Among the major launches, Isro will lift off the PSLV-C61 rocket on May 18, carrying the EOS-09 Earth observation satellite. Originally slated for May 19, the launch has been advanced by a day.

#### "What You Desire Will Happen": Rajnath Singh's Big Hint Amid **Tension With Pak**

New delhi WUT | May. 5

Defence Minister Rajnath Singh today said it is his responsibility to work with the armed forces and give a "befitting reply" to those who cast an evil eye on India.

The comments came amid the tension with Pakistan following the terror attack in Jammu and Kashmir's Pahalgam that killed 26 tourists. India has said the terrorists have crossborder linkages.

"I want to assure you that under Prime Minister Modi's leadership, what you desire will certainly happen," the Defence Minister said, alluding to what people across the nation have been talking about the need for a response to Pakistan.

"As the defence minister, it is my responsibility to work with my soldiers and ensure the protection of the country's borders. And it is my responsibility to give a befitting reply, by working with the armed forces, to those who cast an evil eye on our country," Mr Singh said.

Mr Singh was speaking at an event in Delhi. He said people know Prime Minister Narendra Modi very well and are quite familiar with his working style, his determination and the way he has learned to "take risks" in his life. India has banned all Pakistani visas and suspended the Indus Waters Treaty, among other measures, as a response to the neighbouring country's policy of sending terrorists to attack Indian forces and civilians in Jammu and Kashmir.

# Israel's Netanyahu vows response to Iran after Houthi attack on airport

Mumbai WUT | May. 5

Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu has pledged a forceful response after a ballistic missile launched by Yemen's Iran-aligned Houthi rebels struck near Ben Gurion International Airport, injuring eight and disrupting air traffic. The attack has heightened tensions in the region, with Israel blaming Iran and hinting at broader military retaliation. The missile, which landed on a road within the airport perimeter early Sunday, damaged infrastructure and a civilian vehicle. Israeli air defense systems, including the U.S.-supplied THAAD and Israel's Arrow missile system, failed to intercept the projectile.



The Israeli military confirmed the failed interception and said an investigation is ongoing.Prime Minister Netanyahu, posting on social media, directly accused Iran of orchestrating the attack through its Houthi allies. "Israel will respond to the Houthi attack against our main airport AND, at a time and place of our choosing, to their Iranian terror

masters," he wrote. The Houthis, who claim their actions are in retaliation for Israel's war in Gaza, took responsibility for the attack and warned that Ben Gurion Airport is now a target. Houthi military spokesperson Yahya Saree said airlines should consider avoiding Israeli airspace as the group intends to impose an "air blockade." The strike led to a temporary suspension of operations at the airport, with major international airlines — including Lufthansa, Air France, Wizz Air, and Air India — cancelling or rerouting flights. Train services and road access to the airport were briefly halted.In Iran, Defence Minister Aziz Nasirzadeh warned of dire consequences if Israel or the United States retaliates. "If

this war is initiated by the US or the Zionist regime, Iran will target their interests, bases and forces wherever they may be," Nasirzadeh said on state television, while maintaining that the Houthis act independently.Israel's political and military leaders have presented a united front, warning of a harsh counterstrike. Defence Minister Israel Katz vowed, "Whoever attacks us, we will hit back sevenfold," invoking a biblical reference. Opposition and coalition leaders alike pointed to Tehran as the ultimate source of the attack. Meanwhile, tensions remain high in Gaza, where over 52,000 Palestinians have been killed in Israel's 18-month-long campaign, according to Palestinian officials.

Among the dead are at least 57 who reportedly starved under the Israeli blockade enforced since March.As Netanyahu continues to seek support for a joint U.S.-Israeli operation against Iran, U.S. forces have escalated air raids in Yemen. Following the missile attack, American warplanes struck multiple locations in Yemen's al-Jawf, Marib, and Saada governorates. A recent U.S. strike on a migrant detention center in Saada killed dozens, highlighting the intensifying humanitarian toll of the ongoing conflict. With both the Houthis and Israel exchanging threats and military actions, the region braces for what could be a major escalation involving multiple fronts.

# Man Alleged To Have Helped Terrorists

New delhi WUT | May. 5

A 23-year-old man from Jammu and Kashmir's Kulgam district drowned in the Veshaw River on Sunday security forces during a counter-terrorism operation. The man, identified as Imtiyaz Ahmad Magray, had allegedly confessed to support to terrorists operating in the forested region of Tangmarg in south Kashmir's Kulgam district.According to security sources, Magray was detained by the police on Saturday for interrogation. During questioning, he admitted to aiding tial items and facilitating their stay in the forest area. Acting on his disclosure, se-

However, in a sudden turn of events, and while traversing a rugged area near the Veshaw River, he broke away from the group and ran towards the riverbank. A video filmed from a higher vantage point shows Magray briefly scanning the terrain before leaping into the river in an apparent escape attempt. The video, which has since surfaced online, shows Magray struggling to swim in the strong current of the rocky river. Despite his efforts, he was quickly swept away by the water and is believed to have drowned. No security personnel were near him at the moment of his escape,

sources emphasized, and the entire sequence was captured on camera. The incident has sparked political and public debate in the region. While security officials have asserted that there was no foul play involved and condemned what they termed as "misinformation" being circulated about the incident, some local political figures have raised concerns. Peoples Democratic Party (PDP) president and former Chief Minister Mehbooba Mufti took to social media to express suspicion over the circumstances surrounding Magray's death. In a post on X (formerly Twitter), she stated:"Yet another body has been recovered from a river in Kulgam raising serious allegations of foul play. Local residents allege that Imtivaz Magray was picked up by the army two days ago and

now mysteriously his body has surfaced in the river."Security forces have responded by urging the public not to iump to conclusions or disseminate baseless claims, stating that the video evidence clearly shows Magray acting independently when he chose to jump into the river. They reiterated that no coercion or mistreatment occurred and emphasized that his death, though tragic, should not be attributed to the actions of the personnel involved. This is not the first incident involving local individuals accused of aiding terrorists in the region. Authorities continue to face challenges in counter-insur-

gency operations, especially in areas with known militant presence and logistical support networks. Investigations into the matter are ongoing, and officials.





#### TECH TRASH, GROWING E-WASTE CRISIS

**Hyderabad** WUT | May. 5

Have you ever wondered where your old smartphone goes after you toss it? That tiny device — filled with valuable metals and toxic chemicals — doesn't just vanish. More often, it ends up in landfills or is dismantled under hazardous conditions in developing countries.

With technology evolving rapidly, devices are being replaced at an alarming rate, fueling a growing e-waste crisis. E-waste, or electronic waste, includes discarded gadgets like smartphones, computers and TVs. While no universal definition exists, it generally covers expensive, durable products used for data processing, communication and entertainment.

As lifespans shrink due to rapid innovation, global e-waste surged to 62 million tonnes in 2022 and is projected to hit 82 million tonnes by 2030 (Statista, 2025). Poor recycling rates,

informal processing and weak regulations intensify the crisis, posing severe environmental and health risks.

Per Capita e-waste

Per capita production is the average amount of e-waste each person in a country produces. In 2022, the average per capita e-waste production was 7.8 kilograms. While Asia generated the largest quantity of e-waste overall, Europe and Oceania had the highest per capita rates, producing 17.6 kilograms and 16.1 kilograms per person, respectively. This shows that e-waste is not evenly distributed worldwide, and different regions handle it in different ways.

Within this vast waste stream, valuable metals such as gold, silver and platinum can be found in recoverable amounts. Valuable metals in e-waste were worth \$9.6 billion in 2022 and could reach \$13.6 billion by 2029. However, only 22.3% was properly recycled, while 48 million tonnes were informally handled, with 29%

likely ending up in landfills. Weak enforcement of laws, such as the 2016 Municipal Solid Waste Rules (Turaga & Bhaskar), allows illegal e-waste exports in low to middle-income countries, where workers, including women and children, face toxic exposure. Poverty forces many communities to rely on e-waste scavenging despite serious health risks.

## Justice Maturi Girija Priyadarsini Passes Away at 61

ustice Maturi Girija Priyadarsini of the Telangana High Court passed away on Sunday at the age of 61 after a prolonged illness. She is survived by her husband, Dr. K. Vijay Kumar, a retired public sector employee, and their sons, Nikhil and Akhil. Her last rites will be performed on Monday at Mahaprasthanam, Jubilee Hills. Justice Priyadarsini was appointed as a judge of the Telangana High Court on March 24, 2022. Due to health issues, she had been conducting online hearings in recent months. Acting Chief Justice Sujoy Paul, fellow High Court judges, and Telangana Judges Association leaders K. Prabhakar Rao and K. Murali Mohan expressed deep condolences to her family.Born to Maturi Appa Rao, a commercial tax officer in the Telangana region, Justice Priyadarsini pursued higher education after her marriage. She earned master's degrees in sociology, public administration, and political science from Andhra University, followed by an LLB from NBM Law College, Visakhapatnam, in 1995. She completed her LLM in labour and industrial law in 1997, standing first in Constitutional Law.Beginning her legal practice in Visakhapatnam, she handled civil, criminal, labour, and matrimonial cases, often taking on pro-bono work through the District Legal Services Authority. She joined judicial services as an Additional District Judge in 2008 and later served as Principal District Judge in Ongole, Adilabad, and Karimnagar. Under her leadership, the District Legal Services Authority of Prakasam and Adilabad districts topped national rankings between 2016 and 2019. Her passing marks a significant loss to the judiciary.

# Fire Breaks Out at Patny Centre in Secunderabad

**Hyderabad** WUT | May. 5

A major fire broke out on the fourth floor of the State Bank of India (SBI) administrative building at Patny Centre in Secunderabad on Sunday evening. Fortunately, no casualties were reported as the building was unoccupied at the time of the incident. The fire, which started



around 6:47 p.m., led to significant property damage. Burning debris from the SBI building fell onto an adjacent structure, gutting four parked vehicles. "We received the fire alert at 6.47 p.m. and responded immediately with eight fire tenders," said B. Venkat Swamy, Senior Fire abad. Over 30 firefighters, along with two Bronto skylifters and smoke exhausters, were deployed to bring the blaze under control.Firefighting efforts were hampered by strong winds and dense smoke, which made it difficult for personnel to access the fourth floor. The team used skylifters to enter the floor directly, while powerful

exhausters helped clear the smoke and improve visibility inside the building.Mahanakali police, assisted by senior officials, cordoned off the area, diverting traffic and keeping onlookers at a safe distance. Power supply to the building was cut off on the orders of Station House Officer K. Parashuram.It took more than three hours for the fire to be completely extinguished. Officials confirmed that several files and pieces of furniture were destroyed in the incident. Preliminary investigations suggest that a short circuit may have triggered the fire. A case of fire accident has been registered by the Mahankali police, and further investigations are underway.

# Supreme Court to Hear Pleas Challenging Constitutional Validity of Waqf (Amendment) Act, 2025 on May 5

**Hyderabad** WUT | May. 5

The Supreme Court is set to hear on Monday a batch of petitions challenging the constitutional validity of the Waqf (Amendment) Act, 2025. The hearing comes in the wake of the Central government's assurance to pause key provisions of the newly amended law, following intense scrutiny by a bench headed by Chief Justice of India Sanjiv Khanna.On April 17, Solicitor General Tushar Mehta, appearing for the Centre, told the bench—also comprising Justices Sanjay Kumar

that the government would not denotify waqf properties, including those recognized under "waqf by user", nor make any appointments to the Central Waqf Council or Waqf Boards until May 5. The government had opposed the court's suggestion for an interim order halting the denotification of waqf properties and a contentious provision allowing non-Muslims to be appointed to the Central Waqf Council and boards. The court, however, recorded the Centre's submissions and directed that waqf properties already reg-

istered or notified, including "waqf by user", should remain undisturbed until the next hearing. The bench had also granted the Centre a week's time to file a preliminary response to the batch of petitions. A total

of five petitions, now collectively titled In Re: The Waqf (Amendment) Act, 2025, are scheduled to be heard, including one filed by AIMIM chief and Hyderabad MP Asaduddin Owaisi.In a 1,332-page affidavit filed

on April 25, the Ministry of Minority Affairs defended the amendments and cautioned the court against issuing any blanket stay on the law. The Centre argued that the legislation, passed after "due deliberations" in Parliament, enjoys a presumption of constitutionality.Defending the provision on "waqf by user", the government stated that any interference by the court would effectively result in a "legislative regime by judicial order". The affidavit also noted that mandatory registration of waqf properties, including those recognized

through continuous religious use, dates back to 1923. The Waqf (Amendment) Act, 2025 was signed into law by President Droupadi Murmu on April 5, and the Centre formally notified it soon after. The Act has drawn criticism over several provisions, including expanded powers for waqf boards and the inclusion of non-Muslim members in key bodies. The Supreme Court's ruling on the issue could have significant implications for the administration of religious endowments and property rights across the

Riyan Parag Hits Historic Six Sixes, But RR Lose Last-Ball Thriller to KKR



ajasthan Royals' stand-in captain Riyan Parag created history on Sunday by becoming the first batter in IPL history to hit six consecutive sixes, but his sensational effort wasn't enough to take his team over the line against Kolkata Knight Riders in a last-ball thriller.Parag's blistering 95 off just 45 balls (6 fours, 8 sixes) nearly pulled off a stunning chase after RR found themselves struggling at 71/5 within eight overs, chasing a daunting target of 207 at Eden Gardens. The 23-year-old's historic six-hitting spree came across two overs—five off Moeen Ali and one off Varun Chakravarthyelectrifying the crowd and keeping Royals' hopes alive. However, KKR's experienced campaigners held their nerve in the final moments. A well-executed final over by Vaibhav Arora and a crucial run-out by Rinku Singh ensured the Royals fell just short at 205/8, giving KKR a narrow 1-run victory. Earlier, Andre Russell powered KKR to 206/4 with a fiery unbeaten knock of 57 off 25 balls, roaring back to form after a quiet season. His explosive finishalong with crucial contributions from other batters helped the Knight Riders plunder 85 runs in the final five overs. Despite Parag's heroics, clever captaincy from Ajinkya Rahane, including timely bowling changes and a sharp field adjustment in the last over, turned the tide. With RR needing 22 off the final over, Impact Player Shubham Dube struck two sixes and a four, but Arora held firm. The final twist came on the last delivery when Jofra Archer was run out at the non-striker's end trying to steal a third run. With this win, KKR move to sixth on the points table with 11 points from 11 matches, keeping their slim playoff hopes alive. They must now win all three of their remaining fixtures to stay in contention.

#### We have the desire to finish the season well, says Sunrisers head coach Vettori



unrisers Hyderabad head coach Daniel Vettori said that despite what was going on so far for his team, there would always be a desire to finish the season well.

"We understand that finishing the season well can give a lot of optimism to the franchise going forward. So, we know that it hasn't been the season that we're after, the expectations were quite high for the team coming in," Vettori said on the eve of the IPL league match against Delhi Capitals here on Sunday.

"Like I said before, at some stage, individually, they have delivered. It's just us putting that collective performance together," Vettori said. "It's been a consistent struggle throughout the season," he added.

"There are no fitness concerns from our end, I think Shami has trained and prepared as well as he can, and I know that he had high expectations coming into the tournament based on how well he bowled in the Champions Trophy," Vettori said. "The remaining four games could produce a dif-

ferent story, and we're able to talk positively about more players depending on what they're able to do but I think if I just take off the top of my head, I think Aniket Verma has been incredible this season," the SRH head coach said.

"The goal for us is obviously to put a performance together that incorporates all three disciplines, and that's what's been missing so far, but for me in particular, if we can field well, then I think that'll have a huge bearing on the game," he said.

# Prabhsimran, Arshdeep power Punjab to 37-run victory against Lucknow

Rishabh Pant lost the grip on his bat and the match simultaneously as Punjab Kings rode on heroics from the two 'Singhs' — Prabhsimran and Arshdeep — to literally push Lucknow Super Giants to the brink of elimination with a 37-run win in an IPL match here on Sunday.

It was Prabhsimran's 48-ball 91 that formed the cornerstone of Punjab Kings' unassailable 236 for 5 and any hopes of a remarkable chase was nipped in the bud by Arshdeep's (3/16 in 4 overs) now familiar Powerplay spell which summarily destroyed the opposition top-order.

This time, he got the three top run-getters — Mitchell Marsh (0), Aiden Markram (13) and the everdangerous Nicholas Pooran (6) — to swing the match decisively in Punjab's favour. Ayush



Badoni's (74 off 40 balls) effort was a good one albeit it came for a losing cause. LSG were finally restricted to 199 for 7 in 20 overs and even if they win their last three games and get to 16 points from 14 games, their net run-rate can make things difficult for them.

Punjab Kings are now placed second with 15 points from 11 games and one more win could possibly clinch a place in top four for them. But what is becoming an eyesore is LSG's Rs 27 crore worth skipper Pant's inexplicable ap-

proach which has fetched him a dismal 128 runs in 11 innings at a sub-100 strike-rate (99.22). On the day, he scored 18 off 17 balls and that he is completely out of sync was evident in the manner he tried to throw the proverbial kitchen sink at an Azmatullah Omarzai delivery. There was no control in his shot as the bat took off on parabolic curve towards square leg and the ball went towards deep point. Pant's misery was a testimony of LSG's wretched campaign that was lost at the auction table when

the owner decided to go with a sub-standard bowling attack based on a half-fit talented pacer Mayank Yadav. Mayank has already lost at least 10-15

yards of pace postrehabilitation under the watch of Nitin Patel at the National Cricket Academy. On Sunday, he went for 60 runs off four overs with half a dozen of sixes struck off his bowling. The pint-sized Prabhsimran packed a mean punch in his strokes as he blasted his way to a 48-ball 91 with the help of six fours and seven sixes.

The Punjab keeperbatter should have got his second IPL hundred but an ambitious switch hit off Digvesh Rathi saw him head back to the pavilion, nine runs short of what would have been a deserving milestone. Towards the end, Shashank Singh

scored 33 off 15 balls to take PBKS to what looked like an unassailable total. There were 16 sixes hit by Pujab Kings with 13 coming off

pacers. Prabhsimran was initially a passive partner as it was Australian Jos Inglis who launched the first attack with a hat-trick of sixes off Mayank Yadav, whose speed has decreased by at least 15 kmph post his intense rehab under Nitin Patel at the BCCI's erstwhile National Cricket Academy to recover from back injury. However, once Inglis was dismissed, Prabhsimran, along with skipper Shreyas Iyer (45 off 25

balls), took control of the game. They were only helped by some atrocious fielding from Avesh Khan, who would probably go down as the worst fielder in the 18-year history of IPL.

Adding insult to in-

jury, Prabhsimran took the tall MP fast bowler to the cleaners as he was pulled over mid-wicket for back-to-back maximums. Khan went for 57 in four overs and if around 15 runs due to his misfielding is added, he caused the maximum damage for his team. The duo of Prabhsimran and Iyer added 78 runs in 7.5 overs before Rathi, LSG's best bowler on view, became the first spinner in the current season to account for Punjab Kings skipper's wicket.

But Prabhsimran continued like a man possessed and LSG bowlers were guilty of feeding to his strengths throughout the innings.

# Knight Riders win thriller: Parag knock in vain, Rajasthan goes down fighting

Andre Russell roared back to form with a blistering unbeaten fifty as Kolkata Knight Riders resisted Riyan Parag's stunning 95 to edge out Rajasthan Royals by one run in an IPL thriller that kept the defending champions' slim playoff hopes alive here on Sunday. Russell, who had been under scrutiny for his indifferent form this season, smashed a 25-ball

57 as KKR smashed 85 runs in the last five overs to post a commanding 206/4. In reply, Rajasthan found them-

selves in tatters at 71/5 inside eight overs, and they needed 105 runs from the last 48 balls before stand-in skipper Parag kept their hopes alive through his knock off 45 balls (6×4, 8×6).

But smart bowling changes from skipper Ajinkya Rahane ensured that Parag got out five short of his maiden IPL century, before Vaibhav Arora held his nerves under pressure in the final over, keeping RR down to 205/8.

The Royals required 22 runs off the last over, but Impact Shubham Dube launched Arora for two sixes and a four to bring the equation down to three runs off the final delivery.

But a smart field switch by Rahane, placing Rinku Singh at long-off, proved decisive as his

KKR now have 11 points from as many games and have moved up to sixth on the points table but still need to win the remaining three matches to have a sniff at the play-offs. Before the tense finale, RR's chase began in ominous fashion. Vaibhav Suryavanshi (4) departed in the first over, and Kunal Singh Rathore followed for a duck, leaving the Royals reeling at 8/2 in the second

However, Parag injected urgency with three crisp boundaries and two sixes. Yashasvi Jaiswal (34 off 21 balls) unsettled Varun Chakravarthy with back-to-back fours as Royals recovered to maintain a healthy run-rate of just under 10 in the Power Play.

While Harshit Rana leaked 28 runs in two overs and Arora too was expensive, KKR turned to spin twins Moeen Ali and Chakravarthy, who turned the game around, sharing four wickets between them to reduce the Royals to 71/5. Moeen broke the rhythm of RR, dismissing Jaiswal. Rinku sprinted in from long-on and completed a sharp diving catch to give KKR the breakthrough. Rahane then made a smart call to bring back Chakravarthy from the other end and it paid off immediately. The mystery spinner bowled a game-changing over, striking twice in three balls, cleaning up Dhruv Jurel and Wanindu Hasaranga with

# **NEET-UG 2025 Held Smoothly Across TG**

The National Eligibility cum Entrance Test (NEET) UG 2025 was successfully conducted across Telangana on Sunday, with thousands of aspiring medical students appearing for the crucial exam under stringent security arrangements and monitoring. The examination, held from 2:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. at 190 designated centres across the state, saw an incident-free execution thanks to coordinated efforts by the National Testing Agency (NTA), the state health department, and the local police.At most centres, students and their parents began arriving well ahead of the scheduled gate closure time of 1:30 p.m. to avoid delays during the registration and biometric verification processes. # Crucial meeting on May 7 on Krishna river water sharing

**Hyderabad** WUT | May. 5

The Krishna Water Disputes Tribunal-II award, delivered way back in December 2010, has fuelled intense legal battles, rather than bringing resolution to the complex inter-State water sharing disputes.

The meeting of Irrigation Ministers from the Krishna basin States convened by the Ministry of Jal Shakti on May 7 is intended to facilitate gazette publication of the award and putting in place a stable water-sharing framework for the next two-and-half decades. But the conflict situation is unlikely to fade if the demand for an equitable share of water is not fulfilled. Following the formation of Telangana in

2014, the Tribunal's scope expanded in 2023 (with the issue of further terms of reference) to the water-sharing disputes between Telangana and Andhra Pradesh. A key issue is project-wise allocations from the erstwhile Andhra Pradesh's share of 811 TMC under KWDT-I and additional allocations. The tribunal is currently deliberating on these disputes, with a revised deadline set for July 31, 2025. Telangana's demand for a 70 per cent share is based on basin area conflicts with Andhra Pradesh's reliance on the existing 512:299 TMC allocation. Karnataka and Maharashtra also have stakes in protecting their shares, which could lead to a deadlock if concessions are not made. Decades of disputes, in-

cluding Telangana's claims of neglect under the undivided Andhra Pradesh and its accusations of unauthorised water use by Andhra Pradesh have eroded trust on each other. The KWDT-II award divided the Krishna river's water based on a 65 per cent dependability threshold, derived from 47 years of water flow data. The allocation granted 1,001 TMC (thousand million cubic feet) to Andhra Pradesh, 911 TMC to Karnataka and 666 TMC to Maharashtra, with a total dependable yield of 2,293 TMC. The previous KWDT-I ruling allowed Andhra Pradesh to utilise surplus water without formal claims, KWDT-II assessed surplus flow at 285 TMC and redistributed it among all three States.

winds and thunder, according to the Telangana State Development Planning Society (TSDPS).

The brunt of the rainfall

activity was recorded in parts of the Rangareddy district, particularly in Serilingampally, RC Puram, Patancheru, and Amberpet mandals. While rainfall in most areas ranged from 2 mm to 4.3 mm by Sunday afternoon, the sudden downpour led to a noticeable dip in day temperatures across the region. The India Meteorological Department (IMD), Hyderabad, has forecasted that thunderstorm activity is likely to continue in Hyderabad and nearby districts for the next 24 hours. According to the forecast, citizens can expect further spells of thunder, lightning, and strong winds, prompting authorities to advise precautions, particularly during evening hours. Residents in the affected areas reported brief power outages and traffic slowdowns due to reduced visibility and slippery roads. The weather department has urged the public to stay indoors during lightning episodes and to avoid taking shelter under trees or near electric poles. The sudden change in weather comes as a part of the broader pre-monsoon climatic shifts affecting several parts of Telangana.
