Qatar Airspace Closure Hits Hyderabad Flights

International flight operations from Hyderabad were temporarily hit following the closure of Qatar's airspace amid escalating regional tensions. Since Monday night, 18 international flights to and from Rajiv Gandhi International Airport (RGIA) have been cancelled. Most of the affected flights were operated by IndiGo and Kuwait Airways, particularly those flying via Doha. The disruption has left many passengers uncertain about their travel plans. The ceasefire between Israel and Iran has shown early signs of strain – and has triggered frustration, and a televised expletive, from United States President Donald Trump, who accused Israel of undermining the deal just hours



after its announcement. The ceasefire, brokered by the US and Qatar,

came into effect late Monday following days of intensive missile barrages between the two foes. Israel's last wave of strikes targeted Iranian military infrastructure near Isfahan, prompting retaliatory drone launches by

In order to strengthen operational readiness in counter-terrorism (CT) operations, the Indian Army, under emergency procurement (EP), has signed contracts to acquire very short-range air defence systems, remotely piloted aerial vehicles and loitering munitions, including vertical take-off and landing systems, among others crucial weapons and ammunition. These contracts, amounting to Rs 1,981 crore, were finalised against an overall sanctioned outlay of Rs 2,000 crore for the

Indian Army. Last month, the defence ministry had granted emergency procurement powers to the armed forces to buy to boost its firepower and replenish stocks used during Operation Sindoor

against Pakistan.

"Executed through fasttrack procedures under the EP mandate, the procurement aims to enhance situational awareness, lethality, mobility, and protection for troops deployed in counter-terrorism (CT) environments. The acquisitions were completed within compressed timelines to ensure rapid capability augmentation," the defence ministry said in a statement. The acquisitions also include integrated drone detection and interdiction systems, various categories of drones,

(₹6,000 crore), while splurging on the Kaleshwaram Lift Irrigation Scheme. According to him, these neglected projects could have significantly boosted irrigation coverage.

Congress Govt's Focus on Farmer Welfare Has No Match in History, Says Bhatti

Moradabad WUT | June. 25

Deputy Chief Minister Mallu Bhatti Vikramarka said on Tuesday that the Congress government in Telangana had created history by crediting Rs 9,000 crore directly into accounts of 70 lakh farmers under the Rythu Bharosa scheme, within just nine days. He said the Congress government was the only one in Indian history to do so in such a short span. He called it a moment worthy of being recorded in



history. Addressing Rythu Bharosa celebrations held at the Rajiv Gandhi statue near Secretariat on Tuesday, Bhatti said that this milestone was achieved as part of the collective decision of the people's government and cabinet under the spirit of Indiramma Rajyam (Indira Gandhi's governance model). He noted that in just three months since coming to power, the Congress government had waived Rs 21,000 crore in farm loans -unmatched by any other government in the country. He added that the government is also providing `12,000 annually to landless and poor agricultural labourers directly into their bank

Etala Demands CBI Probe, Blames KCR for Phone Tapping Scandal

Hyderabad WUT | June . 25

MP Etala Rajender has demanded a comprehensive probe into the illegal phone tapping scandal, accusing former CM KCR and intelligence officials of gross misuse of power. Addressing the media at Jubilee Hills Police Station, he expressed outrage that surveillance, meant for antinational elements, was instead used against public representatives. their families, and even judiciary officials.

He condemned the unauthorized phone tapping of political leaders, their families, personal staff, and even his wife, stating, "It is evil to deprive freedom. Tapping my wife's Jamuna Hatchery calls is disgraceful." He asserted that phone tapping occurred during key elections in Huzurabad, Munugode,



and Gajwel, to threaten or bribe supporters. "They monitored our every minute," he added.

Etala accused Prabhakar Rao, a promoted officer and not a direct IPS, of illegally heading intelligence and acting on KCR's instructions. He questioned why such a person was appointed post-retirement, violating norms. He also alleged that Rao oversaw tapping of judges, businessmen, and even cinema personalities, drawing parallels to the Emergency era of

"All officials admit they acted on Prabhakar Rao's orders," Etala said. He criticized the current Revanth Reddy-led government for not releasing reports on commissions probing phone tapping, electricity purchases, and Kaleshwaram project. "Why is the inquiry moving at a snail's pace?" he asked. Etala demanded swift action, warning, "If this government doesn't act, it is complicit. If you can't investigate, hand over the case to the CBI. Let the guilty be punished."

Congress Govt's Focus on Farmer Welfare Has No Match in History, Says Bhatti

Hyderabad WUT | June. 25

In a landmark achievement, Deputy Chief Minister and Finance Minister Mallu Bhatti Vikramarka on Tuesday announced that the Congress government in Telangana had created history by disbursing ₹9,000 crore directly into the bank accounts of 70 lakh farmers under the Rythu Bharosa scheme within just nine days. He said no other government in Indian history had executed such a massive financial transfer to farmers in such a short timeframe, calling it an achievement worthy of being recorded "in golden letters" in the country's history. Bhatti made the announcement during the Rythu Bharosa celebrations held near the Rajiv Gandhi statue close to the Secretariat. He declared



that the scheme reflects the values of Indiramma Rajyam—the pro-poor, pro-farmer governance model of former Prime Minister Indira Gandhiand showcased the collective will of the Congress-led cabinet. He highlighted that in less than three months since assuming power, the Congress government had already waived farm loans worth ₹21,000 crore-an unprecedented move that no other state government in India has matched so far. In another significant wel-

fare initiative, the gov-

ernment is now providing ₹12,000 annually to landless and poor agricultural labourers, directly credited to their bank accounts.

"No party has embraced the farming community with such genuine love and commitment as the Congress," Bhatti asserted. "Agriculture means Congress."

The Cabinet, in its Monday meeting, commended Bhatti for his pivotal role in the successful implementation of Rythu Bharosa. As the state's finance minister, he had closely supervised the

day-to-day mobilisation and release of funds, ensuring the disbursement target was met in just nine days, despite fiscal challenges. The ministers acknowledged his financial stewardship as instrumental in overcoming bottlenecks and achieving what seemed improbable within the limited timeframe.

Bhatti drew a stark comparison between the current government's swift execution and the previous BRS administration's performance under the Rythu Bandhu scheme. He criticised the BRS for offering token financial assistance while neglecting comprehensive support measures for farmers. Under BRS rule, disbursals under Rythu Bandhu—launched in 2018—often spanned three to five months per season. Though the amount was later raised from ₹4,000 to ₹5,000

per acre, its maximum seasonal outlay never exceeded ₹7,624 crore. In contrast, the Congress's Rythu Bharosa, introduced in January 2025 with an increased benefit of ₹6,000 per acre, has already outpaced the BRS-era scheme. For the ongoing kharif season alone, ₹8,285 crore has been disbursed—executed within just one week. Despite operating under severe financial pressure, the Congress government has maintained its focus on welfare. Alongside the Rythu Bharosa disbursal, the state also cleared ₹180 crore in pending medical reimbursement bills for state government employees—dues that had been lingering since the BRS regime. This move has earned the Congress further goodwill from the government workforce.

Jagadish Reddy Slams Godavari Talks, Warns of Danger to Telangana

Hyderabad WUT | June. 25

Former Minister and MLA G. Jagadish Reddy criticized the Telangana government for its inaction on the Godavari and Banakachera water issues, warning that Chief Minister Revanth Reddy's move to hold talks with Andhra Pradesh CM Chandrababu Naidu could harm Telangana's interests. He alleged that Naidu is conspiring to divert Godavari waters, potentially turning Telangana into a desert, and accused him of pushing a "fraudulent" Godavari-Cauvery riverlink project, which has already faced objections

from the Chhattisgarh



government.Jagadish Reddy said the Telangana cabinet has failed to seriously discuss these critical issues, despite the Godavari River being the lifeline of the state. He called on all parties to unite and demanded that the central government immediately convene an Apex Council instead of engaging in talks with Naidu. He expressed concern that Naidu wants to secure rights to 200 TMC of Godavari

waters before the expected formation of a new tribunal.

The BRS leader criticized the BJP, accusing it of colluding with Naidu, and claimed that Chandrababu has become a "breath of fresh air" for Prime Minister Modi. He also questioned the state's farmer celebrations, calling them a political stunt and asking whether farmers are truly benefitting. Reddy mocked the claim of constructing 20 lakh Indiramma houses in three years and alleged that political violence, previously absent under BRS rule, is now emerging from Revanth Reddy's AP allies.

Prashanth Reddy Slams Revanth's "Farmer Fest" as Election Gimmick

Former Minister and MLA Vemula Prashanth Reddy criticized CM Revanth Reddy, questioning the need to celebrate when farmers were being deceived. International flight operations from Hyderabad were temporarily hit following the closure of Qatar's airspace amid escalating regional tensions. Since Monday night, 18 international flights to and from Rajiv Gandhi International Airport (RGIA) have been cancelled. Most of the affected flights were operated by IndiGo and Kuwait Airways, particularly those flying via Doha. The disruption has left many passengers uncertain about their travel plans. "Due to the current situation, several flights to Doha and those transiting through Doha have been cancelled since last night," said Anuradha Chetti, CEO of RL Tours and Travels.

"More than 100 tickets had been booked, with several more scheduled for the first week of July. While this has caused confusion, flights on alternate routes are operating normally." She added that the summer break for most international students has limited the impact on student travel. Anil Kumar, founder and MD of Vimaan ClickAtrip, said, "We didn't have bookings for yesterday or

today, but two of our passengers are scheduled to travel to the US via Doha in two days. People heading to Dubai in the coming weeks are now worried this situation might extend to them as well." Kiran Surikuchi, a traveller from Dubai to Hyderabad, said, "My family is flying to Hyderabad on Sunday. Airports in the UAE have resumed operations, and while there are some delays, flights are mostly running on time. Everything feels quite normal here." In a statement, IndiGo stated that its operations across most Gulf countries have now stabilised. "Flights into, out of, and through Gulf nations are operating as scheduled. However, with Iranian airspace still restricted, some flights are being rerouted, leading to longer travel times," the airline said.

By Tuesday, IndiGo's website displayed 16 scheduled flights to Gulf destinations. However, key Doha-bound flights 6E 1318 and 6E 1316, scheduled to depart at 8.40 am and 2.25 pm respectively, remained cancelled. Air India had one scheduled departure for the day. After temporarily suspending flights to the Middle East.

Indian Army Buys Missiles, **Drones Under Emergency**

New delhi WUT | June. 25

In order to strengthen operational readiness in counter-terrorism (CT) operations, the Indian Army, under emergency procurement (EP), has signed contracts to acquire very short-range air defence systems, remotely piloted aerial vehicles and loitering munitions, including vertical take-off and landing systems, among others crucial weapons and ammunition. These contracts, amounting to Rs 1,981 crore, were finalised against an overall sanctioned outlay of Rs 2,000 crore for the Indian Army. Last month, the defence ministry had granted emergency procurement powers to the armed forces to buy weapons and ammunition to boost its firepower and replenish stocks used during Operation Sindoor against Pakistan.

"Executed through fasttrack procedures under the EP mandate, the procurement aims to enhance situational awareness. lethality, mobility, and protection for troops deployed in counter-terrorism (CT) environments. The acquisitions were completed within compressed timelines to ensure rapid capability augmentation," the defence ministry said in a statement. The acquisitions also include integrated drone detection and interdiction systems, various categories of drones, low-level lightweight radars, quick reaction fighting vehicles and heavy and medium and night sights for rifles. "These procurements reflect the Ministry's commitment to equipping the Indian Army with modern, mission-critical, and completely indigenous systems to meet emerging security challenges.

"We Overcame Dark Chapter Like Emergency As Our Nation...": Amit Shah

New delhi WUT | June. 25

Home Minister Amit Shah on Tuesday slammed Congress for the imposition of Emergency in 1975 and said, "We overcame a dark chapter like the Emergency because our nation never bows down to dictatorship". Addressing a programme on 50 years of Emergency at Pradhanmantri Sangrahalaya in Delhi, Mr Shah said that the Emergency was imposed by former Prime Minister Indira Gandhi as she saw a threat to her power, and there was no external danger or internal unrest. "Today is the eve of the 50th anniversary of the Emergency... There may arise a question why something that happened 50 years ago is being dis-

cussed now... When 50

years of any national

event are completed, good or bad, its memory fades away in society. If the memory of an event like the Emergency that shook the democracy fades away, then that is harmful to the nation," he said. "Today, we are the world's largest democracy, and the reason we overcame a dark chapter like the Emergency is that our nation never bows down to dictatorship. The world has witnessed the birth of democracy on this soil. India is the mother of democracy," he added. Amit Shah said the first non-Congress government was formed in the country in the general elections held after the Emergency. "At that time, no one would have liked the

Israel-Iran ceasefire off to rocky start, drawing Trump's ire after fanfare

New delhi WUT | June. 25

The ceasefire between Israel and Iran has shown early signs of strain - and has triggered frustration, and a televised expletive, from United States President Donald Trump, who accused Israel of undermining the deal just hours after its announcement. \ The ceasefire, brokered by the US and Qatar, came into effect late Monday following days of intensive missile barrages between the two foes. Israel's last wave of strikes targeted Iranian military infrastructure near Isfahan, prompting retaliatory drone launches by Tehran. After a rocky start, it was holding later Tuesday with the missiles and drones silent in both di-

rections for the first time in nearly two weeks. Iran violated the ceasefire, "but Israel violated it too", Trump told reporters earlier in the day on the White House's South Lawn as he departed for the NATO summit.

"So I'm not happy with them. I'm not happy with Iran either. But I'm really unhappy if Israel is going out this morning." "I've got to get Israel to

calm down," he said. "Israel, as soon as we made the deal, they came out and dropped a load of bombs, the likes of which I've never seen before." As he prepared to head to a NATO summit in The Hague in the Netherlands, Trump's anger flared on the White House Lawn: "We have two countries that have been fighting so long and so hard that they don't know what the f*** they're doing." A day earlier, Trump boasted on his Truth Social app that "the Ceasefire is in effect!"

"ISRAEL is not going to attack Iran. All planes will turn around and head home, while doing a friendly 'Plane Wave' to Iran. Nobody will be hurt," Trump wrote.

Trump's unusually public display of anger at Israel saw the US leader apparently trying to force his ally to call off warplanes in real time on Tuesday.

Earlier the same morning, he had posted on Truth Social: "ISRAEL. DO NOT DROP THOSE BOMBS" - without it being clear which bombs he was referring to. "IF

MAJOR VIOLATION. **BRING YOUR PILOTS** HOME, NOW!" Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu seemed to quickly accede, with his office saying in a statement on Tuesday that Israel still carried out one more attack near Tehran after Trump's appeal, but is refraining from "further

strikes".

Israeli Defence Minister Israel Katz had said earlier on Tuesday that he had ordered the military to mount new strikes on targets in Tehran in response to what he claimed were Iranian missiles fired in a "blatant violation" of the ceasefire.

Iran denied launching any missiles and said Israel's attacks had continued for an hour and a

half beyond the time the ceasefire was meant to

For his part, Iranian Foreign Minister Abbas Araghchi said that his country would not fire at Israel if it was not fired upon, but that a "final decision on the cessation of our military operations will be made later". Despite the rocky start,

Trump voiced support for the ceasefire itself, clarifying he is not seeking regime change in Iran, after some mixed messaging in recent days, and insisting that the ceasefire remains in effect. If it holds, the truce would be a big political win for Trump in the wake of his risky gamble to send US bombers over the weekend to attack three nuclear facilities in Iran that Israel and the

United States claim were being used to build an atomic bomb in secret.

US intelligence and the United Nations' nuclear watchdog had previously recorded no indication Iran was developing a nuclear weapon. Reporting from Tehran,

Al Jazeera's Ali Hashem said Iranian officials appeared to welcome Trump's remarks, viewing them as a potential opening for diplomatic engage-

"It might give the impression that Trump is serious about this ceasefire," Hashem said.

Iran's President Masoud Pezeshkian signalled that his country is ready to resolve issues with the US, during a phone call with Saudi Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman.

Israel has Refrained from Additional Attacks: Israeli PMO

New delhi WUT | June. 25

The Israeli Prime Minister's Office on Tuesday evening noted that after a conversation between US President Donald Trump and Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu, Israel has "refrained" from further attacks on Iran. This statement comes shortly after US President Donald Trump expressed strong disapproval of Israel and Iran "violating the ceasefire" he announced earlier in the day. In a series of posts on social media X, the Israeli Prime Minister's Office said, "Pursuant to the conversation between President Trump and Prime Minister Netanyahu, Israel has refrained from additional attacks. In the conversation, President Trump expressed his great appreciation for Israel,

which achieved all of its objectives for the war, as well as his confidence in the stability of the ceasefire."

The Israeli PMO further stated that shortly before the ceasefire came into effect, Iran launched a barrage of missiles towards Israel, which claimed the lives of four citizens in Be'er Sheva. It added that hours before a scheduled ceasefire, Israeli forces conducted a major strike in Tehran, eliminating hundreds of Basij and Iranian security forces personnel. The social media post reads, "The ceasefire was set for 07:00 this morning. At 03:00, Israel forcefully attacked in the heart of Tehran, struck regime targets and eliminated hundreds of Basij and Iranian security forces personnel." "Shortly before the ceasefire was due to take effect, Iran launched a barrage of missiles, one of which took the lives of four of our citizens in Be'er Sheva. The ceasefire took effect at 07:00," the post added. According to a statement released by the Prime Minister's Office, despite the ceasefire taking effect at 7 am, Iran continued its attacks, launching one missile at Israeli territory at 7.06 am and two additional missiles at 10.25 am. In response to these violations, the Israeli Air Force destroyed a radar installation near Tehran, the statement said. "At 07:06, Iran launched one missile at Israeli territory, and two additional missiles at 10:25. These missiles were either intercepted or fell in open areas, and caused neither casualties nor damage. The social media post reads, "In response to Iran's violations, the Air Force destroyed a radar installation near Tehran," the post added. Meanwhile, Trump made posts on his social media handle Truth Social and also conveyed his unhappiness over ceasefire violations in his interaction with the media. "ISRAEL. DO NOT DROP THOSE BOMBS. IF YOU DO IT IS A MAJOR VIOLATION. **BRING YOUR PILOTS** HOME, NOW! DON-ALD J. TRUMP, PRES-**IDENT OF THE** UNITED STATES," he said in a post. A pregnant woman had to be carried in a makeshift palanquin, called 'doli' in local parlance, on Monday due to lack of an approach road to her hamlet in Shahapur in Maharashtra's Thane district, the issue highlighting the critical gaps in health infrastructure in rural areas barely 100 kilometres from Mumbai, the country's financial capital. A video of 21-year-old Sangita Ravindra Mukane being carried in a doli over a distance of more than one kilometre from her native Chafewadi village to an ambulance parked at Gaidand Road at around 1:30pm went viral on social media. "She had gone into labour and needed urgent medical attention. She had to be carried in a doli as

there is no approach road to Chafewadi, which means ambulances have to wait at Gaidand Road. We are in 2025 but this is the condition of areas so close to big urban centres," said local activist Prakash Khodka. "Despite repeated ap-

peals, the Nadgaon gram panchayat, of which Chafewadi is a part, has done nothing about constructing a road. Due to the delay, she suffered a seizure before reaching the ambulance, after which she was rushed to Thane Civil Hospital, where doctors have said her condition is stable," Khodka added. The lack of a road put her life in danger or else she could have been treated at the primary health centre here itself, he pointed out. DGCA Flags Maintenance Lapses At Delhi and Mumbai Airports

The report card of Delhi and Mumbai airports is not all that impressive after a comprehensive survey conducted by the Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA). The DGCA teams have found multiple cases where the maintenance of aircraft was not carried out as per work order and reported defects reappeared many times on the aircraft indicating ineffective monitoring and inadequate rectification action on the defects. Following the air crash in

Ahmedabad, the DGCA had initiated a focused assessment of the aviation ecosystem to strengthen safety measures across the sector. As part of this initiative, surveillance covered multiple critical areas such as flight operations, airworthiness, ramp safety, air traffic control (ATC), communication, navigation and surveillance (CNS) systems, and preflight medical evaluations. Throughout the surveillance, ground activities and aircraft movements were closely

monitored to check the compliance of regulatory requirements and to identify weak areas for improvement.

Two teams led by the Joint Director General of DGCA carried out comprehensive surveillance during night and early morning hours at major airports including Delhi and Mumbai. Without giving the names of the airport, the DGCA said during inspection, the ground handling equipments such as baggage trollies, baggage freight loader, etc were found unserviceable and line maintenance stores, tool control procedures were not fol-

lowed. At one place, a domestic flight of a scheduled carrier was held up due to worn tyres and it was released only after the required rectification was carried out, the DGCA said. The audit report said that during maintenance of aircraft, the work order was not followed. "The unserviceable thrust reverser system and Flap Slat Lever were not locked; during maintenance, safety precautions were not taken by Aircraft Maintenance

Engineering (AME) as per Aircraft Maintenance Manual (AMM), and at places, AME was not attending to the snag rectification. Besides, defect reports generated by the aircraft system were not found recorded in the technical logbook," the DGCA said. In the flights, several life vests were not properly secured beneath their designated seats. The corrosion-resistant tape on the right-hand side winglet's lower blade was found to be damaged.Similarly at an airport, centre line marking of the runway was observed to have faded, the rapid exit taxiway, green centre light were not unidirectional, the DGCA report said. It added that the number of vehicles in the ramp area were found without speed governors. These vehicles were withdrawn by cancelling there Air Vehicle Pilot and drivers Airside Driving Permit were suspended. "A simulator was checked and found not matching with the aircraft configuration. Also the software was not updated to the current version," the report said. The DGCA said that it





ISRAEL'S ATTACKS ON IRAN A THREAT TO GLOBAL PEACE

Hyderabad

It is with reckless abandon that one man who is clinging to the Prime Minister's office by fighting wars has opened a new front in attacking Iran. Benjamin Netanyahu sees this as means to stop what Israel considers its biggest existential threat — a nuclear-armed Iran. The theocratic leaders of Iran may have spoken of nuclear bombs as a way of annihilating the Jewish state, but Iran may be some way from making the bomb and which process the Israelis may have hastened now with their attack.

Any war to stop Iran's nuclear proliferation is an illegal and excessively ambitious attempt to forestall that nation's programme.

The Israeli actions also brought about an end to what appeared to be a promising way to resolve the nuclear issue through a US-Iran dialogue. With that avenue shut-

ting, it needs no guessing that however weak Iran may have seemed in all the time that Israel has attacked it with bombs, missiles and drones, it is still capable of proceeding with its enrichment plans.

The Israeli attack and Iranian counterattack, which led to loss of life in Iran, including that of scientists running the nuclear programme as well as those who died in Israel when some of Iran's missiles got through the air defence shield, represent a dramatic escalation. International attention should focus on who can best stop Netanyahu now and that man is not Donald Trump. The US President, after having appeared to cheer Israel on, still boasts he can bring about a deal with Iran in a day but what he says about his magical capacity feels like so much hot air The blame for starting Israel's surprise air strikes of Friday targeting Iran's nu-

clear infrastructure at key fa-

that shattered the relative peace after Iran's proxy Hezbollah had gone quiet in Lebanon lies squarely with Netanyahu whose party's coalition was set to lose its majority in Parliament. And to keep his government safe he may have had to keep starting wars, this time by dragging Iran into a conflict that could have grave implications for the embattled Middle East region.

The IAEA reporting Iran on not fulfilling conditions to keep its nuclear programme from progressing away from peaceful purposes and into harmful nuclear proliferation may have been the cue on which Israel acted, after keeping the US President in the loop. The gross violation of international laws could not have been starker than in Israeli action, which may have been anticipated for months but which still shocked a world that believes in a rules-based order.

Delhi High Court Allows Actor Rajpal Yadav To Travel To Australia



The Delhi High Court has allowed actor Rajpal Yadav's plea to travel to Melbourne, Australia between June 27 and July 5 for the promotion of upcoming film "Mera Kale Rang Da Yaar".

On June 23, Justice Rajneesh Kumar Gupta perused the invitation letter and tickets while observing Mr Yadav was previously allowed to travel abroad by the trial court. As a rider, Mr Yadav was directed to furnish Rs 1 lakh in fixed deposit receipt, keep his cell phone operational and inform the investigating officer of any other contact details.

"Passport of the applicant lying deposited with the trial court is directed to be released on the condition that the passport shall be deposited back once he is back in India," the court said, posting the matter on July 8.

In June last year, the high court temporarily suspended Mr Yadav's conviction in a cheque bounce case subject to him adopting "sincere and genuine measures" to explore the possibility of reaching an amicable settlement" with the opposite party. At that time, Mr Yadav's counsel said it was a genuine transaction where production of a movie was financed but the movie bombed at the box office, resulting in huge financial losses. Mr Yadav, the counsel said, had already suffered imprisonment for about three months in other related civil execution proceedings. The court then observed the petitioners, including Mr Yadav, were "not hardened criminals".

The matter is presently under consideration in the Delhi High Court Mediation Centre.

Minor Girl Gets Lover, Kin Murder Her Singer-Mom

Hyderabad WUT | june. 25

Anjalu, a 39-year-old singer and granddaughter of revolutionary leader Chakali Ilamma, was allegedly murdered by her teenage daughter's boyfriend and his minor brother in Shapur Nagar, Jeedimetla, on Monday evening. According to Jeedimetla inspector G. Mallesh, Anjali, associated with the Telangana Jagruti, had been living with her two daughters, aged 16 and 13, at Plot No. 299. Police said the 16-year-old girl had developed a relationship with one P. Shiva, 19, an intermediate student from Nalgonda, through social media. When Anjali opposed her daughter's request to marry Shiva, considering that she was a minor, the teenager al-

cording to Balanagar ACP P. Naresh Reddy, the girl and Shiva had eloped four days before the murder. After a missing complaint was filed, the girl was traced to Nalgonda and brought back. Shiva was booked for kidnapping but released with a notice. "The girl felt betrayed and wanted revenge. She called Shiva and his younger brother to their home. The minor waited outside while Shiva and his brother went inside. Seeing Anjali seated, they pushed her and smothered her with a scarf while holding her down," said inspector G. Mallesh. Police believe that after the murder, the daughter pretended to sleep. Around 10 pm, the younger daughter woke up and found their

mother on the floor. She called a relative, who then called an ambulance. The police reached the scene around 11.30 pm. A neighbour, Praveen Kumar, said, "They moved here five months ago. We had no idea something like this could happen. We saw police and ambulances suddenly arrive." Another neighbour added, "She used to walk her daughters to school. Nothing seemed unusual. We still can't believe what happened."

At Andhra Bhavan in Suraram, members of Telangana Jagruti gathered to pay their last respects. Anjali's sister Shobha said, "She was brave, and always fought for women's rights and was a part of the mahila mandal out of her own interest. Seeing her like this is heartbreaking." returned after their first attempt failed. "When they realised she was still alive, my niece called them again. They came back and struck her with an iron rod." Shobha also pointed to police inaction. "They kept waiting for a court order to get my niece medically examined. Had they acted faster, Shiva may not have gotten out so soon." The police have taken Shiva (A1), his brother (A2), and the minor girl (A3) into custody. They were able to recover CCTV footage installed on the opposite building which showed the minor waiting outside and the two boys stepping out after the murder. A case has been reg-

Remembering Shyam Benegal: Celebrating the Hyderabad auteur through his cinematic legacy



The mega plan to jointly produce the F-414 engines in India was announced during Prime Minister Narendra Modi's visit to Washington, DC in 2023, though the programme suffered from several slippages because of protracted negotiations on

the sharing of advanced

interview with PTI Videos, HAL Chairman and Managing Director Sunil said crucial negotiations with GE Aerospace on the transfer of technologies for the engines were concluded and both sides are now focusing on the commercial aspects of the project.

"We are now discussing the ToT (transfer of technologies) principles. (We will have) 80 per cent transfer of technology. Those discussions are more or less over," he said. "Now we will be getting into the commercials. So, in this financial year, we should be able to conclude

this deal," he said. The for-

duction of the premier engines, which are powering combat jets in several countries including the US, Sweden and Australia, is seen as very significant considering the long-held US policy of maintaining strict controls over domestic military technologies Sunil said the GE engines will be used in the Tejas Light Combat Aircraft Mark 2 variant and the initial prototypes of fifth-generation Advanced Medium Combat

ndia's top shooters will be seen in action as the National Selection Trials 3 & 4 for Group 'A' athletes commence at the Trishul Shooting Range, Maharana Pratap Sports College, Raipur, Dehradun, from Tuesday.

These trials will help shape the Indian shooting team for the 16th Asian Shooting Championships 2025 in Kazakhstan in August and the ISSF World Cup in Ningbo, China in September.

At the same time, we must be more clinical, more professional, and finish whatever chances come our way. We can be much better, I know," Chettri explained. But that isn't to say Chettri was not delighted with the result. The Blue Tigresses began their hunt for the ticket to Australia next year in the best manner, already boosting their goal difference in a group where only the toppers will qualify — and it might come down to the final day when India take on the hosts Thailand on July 5.

"I know the first match is always difficult. But at the same time, we showed character and scored goals, many more in the second half, so I'm really

(Bahrain) and Ali Al Obaidli (Qatar). Earlier in the morning, Gupta carried far too many guns for Chawla, scoring a lopsided 5-2 victory. After taking the opening frame comfortably, he had runs of 47 and 30 to take a quick 3-0 lead in the best-of-nine frame encounter. Looking down the wrong

Land Dispute, Fund Crunch Delay Kancha Gachibowli Forest Restoration

Hyderabad WUT | June. 25

With less than a month remaining for the Supreme Court's next hearing on the Kancha Gachibowli forest issue. restoration work remains sluggish due to government inaction, funding shortfalls, and jurisdictional hurdles. Despite stern warnings issued by the apex court on May 15, no substantial efforts have been made to reverse the ecological damage caused by widespread tree felling earlier this year. The Supreme Court had

taken suo motu cogni-

sance of the destruction and directed the Telangana government to submit a detailed restoration plan based on the recommendations of the Central Empowered Committee (CEC). The next hearing is scheduled for July 23, and the court has warned of stringent consequences, including imprisonment of officials, if no progress is shown.

However, effective restoration continues to be hampered as the land is currently under the control of the Telangana State Industrial Infrastructure Corporation (TGIIC), limiting the



Forest Department's access and authority. While both departments have conducted symbolic plantation drives, largescale afforestation and protective fencing are yet to begin. Officials admit that meaningful restoration has yet to start. "Protection of wildlife remains our immediate concern. With a high population of spotted deer, peacocks, and other species, we've initiated limited conservation measures from outside

the area, in coordination with TGIIC," a senior Forest Department official told Telangana Today. "We will proceed as per the Supreme Court's directives." Funding constraints have further stalled progress. With wildlife relotion.

cation not feasible, the department is considering in-situ conservation techniques such as fencing the degraded zone measures that require substantial financial backing and government clearance, both of which are still pending. Satellite imagery comparisons between November 2024 and April

2025 have revealed the stark scale of ecological damage, showing dense greenery replaced by barren land and construction activity. The visual evidence has further highlighted the State's apathy towards restora-

Though a draft plan has been prepared to replant native species, officials caution that long-term success hinges on consistent maintenance and monitoring. The Forest Department plans to submit the restoration draft before the July 23 hearing, after which further action will depend on the Supreme Court's orders.

Revanth Reddy Insulted KCR, Cheated Farmers: Harish Rao

18 Held in Gold Scam, Fake Cop Heist; Monda Market Police Recover Rs 43.21 L

In a sensational breakthrough, Monda Market police arrested 18 members from two criminal gangs involved in a staged gold deal and a subsequent fake police robbery, recovering Rs 43.21 lakh cash, 59 grams of gold, multiple vehicles, and 23 mobile phones. The case began with a

complaint by Hariram of Bowenpally, who was duped into a fake gold purchase deal by the prime accused, Radheshyam. Under the pretext of buying 1 kg of gold at a 5% discount, Radheshyam confirmed the cash's presence at Hariram's office and tipped off his associates. Soon after, four men, in-

cluding a real constable, Keshavulu, impersonated



Rachakonda SOT officials and raided the premises, assaulted Hariram, and fled with the cash and phones in a car and on bikes.


