recorded, an 8.8 mag-

nitude quake struck off the coast of Russia's Kamchatka Peninsula at 11:25am local time on Wednesday, sparking widespread tsunami alerts across the Pacific region. Despite its strength, there have been no reported casualties as of Wednesday evening, and many advisories have since been downgraded or lifted. Tsunami waves generated by the earthquake reached areas as far as Japan, Hawaii, and the U.S. West Coast. Authorities in countries across the Pacific Rim, including Chile, Peru, Mexico, Indonesia, and New Zealand, issued evacuation orders affecting over two million people. Prime Minister Narendra Modi, in a powerful address to the Lok Sabha on Tuesday, declared that no global power influenced India to halt Operation Sindoor, rejecting Opposition claims that New Delhi succumbed to U.S. pressure. Modi affirmed that India stood firm in the face of Pakistan's nuclear threats and gave a fitting response with a decisive military operation, which he described as a "vijayotsav" (victory celebration).

Responding to the twoday debate on Operation Sindoor, Modi revealed that on the night of May 9, the U.S. Vice-President attempted to reach him for



an hour amid intelligence of a possible Pakistani retaliation. However, Modi, engaged in a meeting with Indian Army officials, said he returned the call only later, warning the U.S. that if Pakistan attacked, "it would cost them heavily" and India would respond with "a bigger attack."

Union Home Minister Amit Shah today launched a scathing attack on the Congress party during a fiery address in the Rajva Sabha, asserting that the terrorists behind several high-profile attacks during the UPA era had been eliminated under the Modi government's recent counter-terror operations—Operation Sindoor and Operation Mahadev.In a sharp political offensive during participation in debate on Operation Sindoor,

Shah accused the Congress, particularly former Home Minister P. Chidambaram, of shielding Pakistan-backed narratives for the sake of "vote-

bank politics". He alleged that the UPA government was reluctant to take strong action against terrorists and instead relied on diplomatic paperwork. "Under Operation Sindoor, many key terrorists like Hafiz Muhammad. Jaishankar highlighted Congress's "mistakes" in the Rajya Sabha regarding the handling of the treaty while emphasising how essential the agreement

"The Indus Water Treaty in many ways is a very




unique agreement. I cannot think of any agreement in the world where a

country has allowed its major rivers to flow to the next country without having rights on that river," he said. He added, "To recall the history of this event... Yesterday, I heard some people are uncomfortable with history. They prefer that historical things be forgotten.

harlal Nehru over his statement in Parliament back in 1960 regarding the treaty. Listen to Gurukul Students, Not Do Padayatras: Harish

Hyderabad WUT | July. 31

Former Minister T. Harish Rao has strongly criticized the Congress government and Chief Minister Revanth Reddy for turning a blind eye to the protests by Gurukul students, who are marching to resolve issues plaguing their institutions. He urged the ruling party to prioritize the legitimate concerns of students over electoral gains through political paday-

Rao lashed out at the Congress leadership, saying, "Instead of abusing questioners and the opposition, Revanth Reddy should answer the Gurukul students who are demanding basic needs like food and clean drinking water." He termed the silence of the Congress government in the face of the students' anger as "inhumane and irrespon-



Calling the current state of affairs a "shameful legacy of Indiramma rule," Rao recalled how students were once forced into DCM vans by the police simply for demanding justice. "This government has a wicked history of pushing students from classrooms to streets," he said.

He further questioned whether the government would only act after the National Human Rights Commission intervenes in cases of food poisoning and other systemic failures in Gurukul schools. "Open your eyes now. The Gurukul system is deteriorating under your rule. Put a stop to this decline," Rao warned.

Rao challenged the government to take immediate steps by meeting the students at the Alampur intersection, where they are seeking to submit a representation to the District Collector. He mocked the ruling party's ongoing political padayatras, saying, "Congress, which is launching padayatra dramas for electoral benefits, should first address the padayatras of these Gurukul students fighting for their future."

Third Power Discom for Free Power: CM Revanth

Telangana to Launch Third Power Discom for Welfare Schemes, Aims ₹13,992 Cr Sector Overhaul

Hyderabad WUT | July. 31

In a significant overhaul

of Telangana's power sector, Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy on Wednesday directed the establishment of a third power distribution company (discom) dedicated solely to managing all government-funded electricity schemes across the state. The new entity will operate alongside the existing Southern and Northern discoms, handling flagship initiatives such as 24x7 free electricity to farmers, 200 units of free power to low-income households, and free electricity for government schools and colleges.

Revanth made the announcement during a review meeting at his

Deputy CM Bhatti Vik-

residence with Deputy Chief Minister Bhatti Vikramarka and top officials from the energy department. He stressed that the new discom must have statewide jurisdiction exclusively for welfare-related electricity supply, a move that he said would reduce pressure on existing discoms and improve their national performance rat-

ramarka revealed that the government currently provides 24x7 free power to more than 29,000 agricultural pump sets, costing the exchequer ₹11,500 crore annually. Additionally, 50.71 lakh low-income families receive 200 units of free electricity each month, incurring an annual subsidy of ₹2,293 crore. Free

electricity is also ex-

tended to 29,018 government educational institutions at an annual cost of ₹198 crore. In total, the government is spending ₹13,992 crore each year to subsidize electricity for agriculture, poor households, and educational facilities. Highlighting the finan-

cial strain on discoms, Revanth Reddy urged officials to restructure high-interest loans, some taken at rates as high as 10%, to bring down the interest burden. "Restructure these loans to secure lower rates," he instructed.

The CM also outlined a renewable energy push, directing officials to install solar power systems across all government offices, including schools and colleges. He instructed district collectors to identify suitable buildings and to act swiftly. He further ordered the immediate solarization of the state secretariat, including solar rooftop sheds for vehicle parking, solar fencing, and panels to meet the building's energy demands. Revanth emphasized

fast-tracking the Indira

Solar Giri Jala Vikasam scheme, which aims to provide 2.10 lakh Scheduled Tribe farmers with solar-powered agricultural pump sets over the next three years. The goal is to bring six lakh acres of tribal land under sustainable irrigation.

The announcements mark a major step toward financial reform, operational efficiency, and clean energy expansion in Telangana's power sector.

BJP Chief Slams Cong Govt for Neglecting Bhadrachalam, Misusing Temple Lands

Hyderabad WUT | July. 31

BJP Telangana State President N. Ramchander Rao strongly criticized the Congress-led state government for its negligence toward Hindu temples, particularly the historic Sri Seetha Ramachandra Swamy temple in Bhadrachalam. Speaking to the media after offering prayers at the temple, he alleged that both current and previous state governments have failed to treat Bhadradri Ram with due reverence, even during major festivals like Ram

Rao emphasized that the Central Government, under the leadership of then Union Culture Minister G. Kishan Reddy, had allocated ₹98 crore for the development of Bhadrachalam as part of the Ramayana Circuit. Of this, ₹42-48 crore has already been released, and the remaining amount is ex-



pected after submission of the Detailed Project Report (DPR). He reiterated that the BJP and the Centre are committed to preserving and promoting the temple's cultural heritage, and he plans to raise the issue with the current Union Culture Minister.

He condemned the increasing attacks on Hindu temples, citing recent incidents at Hyderabad's Mutyalamma and Peddamma temples. The decision was taken at a meeting convened by Revanth Reddy at his residence on Wednesday. AICC Telangana incharge Meenakshi Natarajan and TPCC president B. Mahesh Kumar Goud attended the meeting. The Chief Minister also held detailed discussions on the party's ongoing and upcoming programmes, including the state-wide padayatra and the Delhi campaign. The Telangana Assembly had passed the

in March this year, but the Centre is yet to clear them. Party sources said the CM finalised an action plan for the state government delegation's Delhi tour from August 5 to 7 to put pressure on the Centre for speedy clearance of the quota Bills. The plan includes seeking an appointment with President Droupadi Murmu on August 7 to submit a memorandum requesting her intervention. The padayatra will be led by Meenakshi Natarajan, in which TPCC president B. Mahesh Kumar Goud, ministers of respective districts, MLAs, MPs and MLCs of respective constituencies will participate. The padayatra will cover one Assembly constituency in each of the ten erstwhile districts of Telangana. In the first phase, from July 31 to August 4, six districts will be covered. The second phase will begin after the Delhi tour from

August 8.

Telangana Eyes Rs 1,500 Crore From Centre's Special Assistance

Hyderabad WUT | July. 31

Telangana's municipal administration and urban development (MA&UD) department is eyeing an incentive of Rs 1,500 crore under the Central government's Scheme for Special Assistance to States for Capital Investment (SSASCI) 2025-26. The Central government offers special assistance in two parts to states to encourage reforms in urban planning. Under the first part, the Centre earmarked Rs 13,000 crore for reforms related to governance, finance, and urban land and planning. Under the second part, Rs 5,000 crore is earmarked for Ease of



Doing Business (EoDB). As this amount is allocated for all states, the state government must meet the multiple criteria set by the Central government to secure the maximum share. To obtain financial incentives from the Central government, the state government has expedited the work. As part of this task, the state government's National Institute of Urban Management (NIUM), in collaboration with the Commissioner and Director of Municipal Administration

(CDMA), hosted a stakeholder consultation workshop on urban planning reforms under SSASCI 2025-26 on Wednesday.

Senior officials from the Union ministry of housing and urban affairs (MoHUA), along with key members from Telangana's municipal ecosystem, participated in the workshop. The event was presided over by T.K. Sreedevi, secretary, municipal administration and urban development department, and directorgeneral, NIUM. The workshop focused on enabling states to effectively meet SSASCI reform milestones and access corresponding capital investment incen-

Congress Betraying BCs, BJP Rising in South Telangana: Ramchander Rao

BJP Telangana State President, during his tour of southern districts including Mahabubabad, Khammam, and Nalgonda, came down heavily on the Congress government for allegedly betraying OBCs by diluting BC reserva-

Speaking at a massive gathering in Manukota, he claimed that 50 GHMC divisions under BC reservation had lost actual BC representation due to the Congress government allotting 35 of those to AIMIM candidates. "This is a political conspiracy to benefit one party at the cost of OBCs," he said. He accused the Congress of attempting to hike Muslim reservations from



4% to 10%, which he termed unconstitutional and religiously motivated. "There is no provision to allot religious political reservations within the 42% BC quota," he stated, demanding a law or ordinance for any such move. He criticized Revanth Reddy for continuing KCR's broken promise of 50% BC reservations and slammed the Congress-BRS nexus on national security matters, alleging they belittled Operation Sindoor and the sacrifices

of Indian soldiers. Recalling BJP's historic support for the Mandal Commission, he asserted BJP's unwavering stand with OBCs and warned against communal appeasement.

He also condemned the Congress for failing to deliver on poll promises unemployment allowance, job calendar, Rythu Bandhu restoration, and timely pensions. "Revanth Reddy deserves a Bhaskar Award for deceiving people," he mocked. Highlighting increasing public trust, he predicted BJP's rise in Manukota and across southern Telangana. "Communist cadres are now looking to BJP. We will make Khammam our bastion," he declared.

Minister Ponnam Prabhakar Slams BJP Chief Over Fertilizer Lies

Telangana Minister Ponnam Prabhakar strongly criticized BJP State President N. Ramachandra Rao for making uninformed statements regarding the fertilizer crisis in the state. 

Thakur: Indira Sought US Intervention in 1971 to Stop War With Pak

Former Union minister and BJP MP Anurag Thakur claimed in the Lok Sabha on Wednesday that Prime Minister Indira Gandhi had sought US intervention to stop the 1971 war with Pakistan. Another BJP MP, Nishikant Dubey, accused the Leader of the Opposition, Rahul Gandhi, of using "distorted and inaccurate facts" when referencing Indira Gandhi's conduct of that war, and urged Speaker Om Birla to reprimand him for his "habitual delinquency." During Zero Hour, Thakur asserted that although Indian soldiers won the 1971 war on the battlefield, the outcome was lost at the negotiating table, and yet someone else was declared the "Iron Lady." "If you dig a little deeper in history, the layers start unravelling," he said, reading from a December 5, 1971

Nixon to persuade Pakistan to desist from "wanton aggression and military adventurism." "It appears as though a supplicant was pleading before the US President," he added.

"The nation must decide whether the government of that day was iron or an irony."

Congress members protested as Thakur questioned whether Indira Gandhi had trusted India's armed forces or instead "pleaded with the US to halt the war." He accused her family of "bending and begging" Washington to ask Pakistan to end hostilities and contrasted this with Gandhi's recent challenge to the Modi government to match Indira Gandhi's wartime courage. Sep arately, in a letter to the Speaker, Dubey demanded a show-cause notice for Rahul Gandhi's "questionable utterances," and sought permission to raise the matter in the House.

In one of the most powerful earthquakes ever recorded, an 8.8 magnitude quake struck off the coast of Russia's Kamchatka Peninsula at 11:25am local time on Wednesday, sparking widespread tsunami alerts across the Pacific region. Despite its strength, there have been no reported casualties as of Wednesday

closures of shops and emergency evacuations. Tsunami waves generated Russia confirmed that by the earthquake reached tsunami waves over 5 meters struck the town of countries across the Paci-

Severo-Kurilsk, causing significant flooding and damaging port infrastructure. Mobile phone videos from Kamchatka captured violent tremors, and footage verified by BBC showed parts of Yelizovo Airport's ceiling collaps-

ing. Despite the chaos, the

Russian government reported no deaths and praised emergency responses.

The quake occurred

along the Pacific Ring of Fire—a geologically volatile region known for frequent seismic activity. This event is tied as the sixth most powerful earthquake in recorded history. Russian authorities and scientists have warned of potential aftershocks and noted the eruption of the Klyuchevskoy Volcano shortly after the tremor. Globally, tsunami alerts triggered temporary shutdowns of Pacific ports in Peru, evacuations in the Galápagos Islands, and advisories as far afield as French Polynesia, where authorities warned of waves up to 4 meters in height.

By Wednesday night, most nations, including Japan, the U.S., and island states like Tonga, Fiji, and the Cook Islands, downgraded or lifted tsunami warnings. Authorities continue to monitor the situation for aftershocks and residual wave activity.

GSLV-F16 Rocket Carrying NISAR Satellite Lifts Off



NEW DELHI WUT | July. 31

Marking ISRO's maiden collaboration with NASA, a GSLV rocket on Wednesday blasted off from this spaceport to place the NISAR earth observation satellite, jointly developed by the two space agencies, in an intended orbit. The 51.7 metre tall three stage GSLV F-16 rocket soared into the skies at the end of a 27.30 hour countdown, carrying the 2,393 kg satellite. The launch vehicle majestically lifted-off from the second launch pad at this spaceport, situated about 135 km east of Chennai. The GSLV rocket is

slated to place the satellite in the Sun Synchronous Polar Orbit after a near 19-minute journey, and at an altitude of 745 km. NISAR has been developed for microwave imaging purpose globally and it carries L-Band radar provided by NASA and S-band designed by ISRO with a capability to acquire fully polarimetric and interferometric data. The mission objective is to study land and ice deformation, land ecosystems and oceanic regions in the areas of common interest to the scientific communities of the United States of America and India.

At least 22 killed at Angola fuel price hike protests, authorities say

New delhi WUT | July 31

At least 22 people were killed and 197 others were injured in violence that erupted during protests against a fuel price hike this week, Angola's government has said.

The unrest broke out on Monday when minibus taxi associations launched a three-day strike against a government decision to increase the price of diesel by one-third, part of efforts to curb costly subsidies and shore up public

Looting, vandalism and clashes with police started in the capital, Luanda, and then spread to six other provinces.

Sporadic gunfire was heard across Luanda and several other cities on



Monday and Tuesday as people looted shops and clashed with police. President Joao Lourenco's cabinet met on Wednesday and received an update on the security situation and police re-

sponse. A presidency statement said there had been 22 deaths, 197 people injured and 1,214 arrests. Sixtysix shops and 25 vehicles had been vandalised, and some supermarkets and

warehouses looted, the statement said.

The statement added that the army was deployed to restore order as the riots "triggered a climate of widespread insecurity". Interior Minister Manuel

Terrorism handled with iron fist under Modi Govt: Shah in RS

Union Home Minister Amit Shah today launched a scathing attack on the Congress party during a fiery address in the Rajya Sabha, asserting that the terrorists behind several high-profile attacks during the UPA era had been eliminated under the Modi government's recent counter-terror operations—Operation Sindoor and Operation Mahadev.In a sharp political offensive during participation in debate on Operation Sindoor,

Shah accused the Congress, particularly former Home Minister P. Chidambaram, of shielding Pakistan-backed narratives for the sake of "votebank politics".He alleged that the UPA government was reluctant to take strong action against terrorists and instead relied on diplomatic paperwork. "Under Operation Sindoor, many key terrorists like Hafiz Muhammad,

Mudassar, Mohamad Hamza, Mohammed Hazar, Abdul Malik and others have either been killed or incapacitated," Shah told the Upper House, adding that several of them were so severely injured "they won't be able to commit another terror attack in the future."Hitting out at Chidambaram for questioning the nationality of the slain militants, Shah retorted: "Why does Chidambaram need proof? Who is he trying to save—Pakistan or Lashkar?"He went on to accuse the Congress of "placing national security second to appearement politics."Referring to the April 22 terrorist attack in Pahalgam, the Home Minister disclosed that the three Lashkar-e-Taiba commanders involved identified as Suleimani, Afghan, and Jibran—were neutralised in Operation Mahadev conducted on Monday.He cited forensic evidence and eyewitness testimonies linking the trio to the attack, and attributed the plot to Lashkar's proxy outfit, The Resistance Front (TRF)."Unlike the past, we did not wait. I reached Srinagar the same day," Shah recalled."Congress kept sending dossiers, but under Prime Minister Modi's leadership, we gave a direct response. Only fear ensures peace with terrorists."In an apparent swipe at Chidambaram, Shah questioned the Congress' credibility on national security."He says Operation Sindoor wasn't decisive. Was 1965 or 1971 decisive then? Why did terrorism rise so drastically under Congress?" he asked, pointing to what he termed a history of inaction and weak responses under previous governments. The Opposition, led by the Congress and other INDIA bloc constituents, staged a walkout during Shah's reply, demanding Prime Minister Narendra Modi's presence in the House to answer questions related to Operation Sindoor.

New delhi WUT | July. 30

Prime Minister Narendra Modi, in a powerful address to the Lok Sabha on Tuesday, declared that no global power influenced India to halt Operation Sindoor, rejecting Opposition claims that New Delhi succumbed to U.S. pressure. Modi affirmed that India stood firm in the face of Pakistan's nuclear threats and gave a fitting response with a decisive military operation, which he described as a "vijayotsav" (victory celebration). Responding to the two-

day debate on Operation Sindoor, Modi revealed that on the night of May 9, the U.S. Vice-President attempted to reach him for an hour amid intelligence of a possible Pakistani retaliation. However, Modi, engaged in a meeting with Indian Army officials, said he

returned the call only later, warning the U.S. that if Pakistan attacked, "it would cost them heavily" and India would respond with "a bigger attack."

"Goli ka jawab gole se denge (bullets will be answered with artillery)," he said. Modi detailed the operation's strategic success, stating that Pakistan's military and terrorist infrastructure was severely damaged. "Terrorist bases in Bahawalpur and Muridke were razed to the ground. Many of Pakistan's airbases are in ICU," he said, adding that India struck with precision and efficiency, neutralizing threats within 22 minutes of the April 22 terror attack. He added that India's cutting-edge technology — including Made-in-

India drones and mis-

siles — played a crucial

role, showcasing India's

self-reliance and military

and drones — none hit targets. Our air defense destroyed them mid-air." The Prime Minister noted that only three out of 193 UN member nations supported Pakistan, indicating overwhelming global alignment with India. Modi also cited intercepted communications and Pakistani social media posts that exposed the shock and panic in Islamabad after India's strikes. Pakistan's Director General of Military Operations (DGMO) eventually reached out to his Indian counterpart pleading, "Bas karo, bahut maara... (Stop the attack, you've hit too hard)," Modi said.

"Operation Sindoor is still ongoing," the Prime Minister stated, making it clear that any future Pakistani misadventure would be met with even

more force. "Sindoor se leke Sindhu tak (from Sindoor to Sindhu), India has acted decisively."

Modi targeted the Con-

gress party, accusing it

of doubting the armed forces and echoing Pakistani propaganda. "After surgical strikes, Congress demanded proof. Now they are asking why PoK wasn't taken. First, they must answer who allowed Pakistan to capture it," he

said. He blamed the Congress era — particularly under Jawaharlal Nehru — for national security blunders, citing the loss of Aksai Chin and the signing of the Indus Waters Treaty, which the current government has now put in abeyance. The Prime Minister held Congress' "politics of appeasement" responsible for the growth of

terrorism during its ten-

ure. He emphasized that

his government, in 11 years, has reined in cross-border terrorism significantly, thanks to strong leadership and defense reforms.

Modi also took a swipe at Congress MPs Shashi Tharoor and Manish Tewari, suggesting they were gagged by their party for projecting India's stand globally. "Perhaps some leaders were barred from speaking because their truth made the Congress nervous," he remarked. Modi's 102-minute speech, met with repeated applause from the treasury benches, projected a bold and confident India - one that has redefined norms in warfare, diplomacy, and defense self-reliance. The Prime Minister closed with a message of unyielding resolve: "If Pakistan dares again, it will be met with a re-

sponse they will re-



FROM LOCAL TO GLOBAL, BHARAT'S HANDCRAFTED ASCENT

Hyderabad WUT | July. 31

Heritage in Bharat is no longer a memory preserved, it is a movement in motion. It has become a source of identity, empowerment, and economic renewal. Nowhere is this transformation more visible than in the handloom sector. On Republic Day, the launch of the e-Pehchaan card marked a quiet revolution. What began as a digital registry for 35 lakh weavers has since grown into a dynamic movement, bringing 35,000 new weavers into the fold. This is more than inclusion, it is revival. The loom is returning to homes, and a new generation is taking it up with pride. While in the handicrafts sector, over 30 lakh artisans have been registered under the Pehchaan card, ensuring formal identity and access to government support.

Before 2014, support through the MUDRA scheme reached just 1.25 lakh weavers. Today, over 3 lakh have benefitted. A clear shift from tokenism to meaningful empowerment. The loom is no longer just a symbol of tradition. It is a tool of aspiration, enabling small businesses and opening pathways to global markets. Handicrafts have witnessed a similar resurgence. Exports have risen from ₹29,000 crore in 2014 to over ₹49,000 crore, as artisans step confidently onto the world stage. With 313 GI tags, two editions of Bharat Tex, and a growing global footprint, traditional crafts have been repositioned as drivers of economic value and cultural prestige.

Today, a Banarasi weaver or a Kutch embroiderer is not just preserving a legacy, she is defining contemporary luxury and powering

exports. At the centre of this transformation is Samarth, the government's flagship skilling programme launched in 2017. More than 4.3 lakh individuals predominantly women, rural youth, and traditional artisans have been trained to meet industry standards. 9 Held With Drugs, Two Absconding

he excise department's Special Task Force (STF) nabbed nine persons on Saturday night for allegedly heading to a rave party at a service apartment in Kondapur. Acting on a tipoff, an STF team intercepted two high-end cars near Central Park in Kondapur. The accused were en route to a service apartment, located in JV Hills and booked through Airbnb. The operation led to the seizure of 2.08 kg of dry ganja, 50 grams of OG Kush (a hybrid variety of ganja), 11.57 grams of psychedelic mushrooms, 1.91 grams of charas, and four LSD blotters. Additionally, officials seized two high-end cars, two two-wheelers, 11 mobile phones, and other evidence from the scene. According to excise officials, the accused have been identified as Kenger Rahul (procured drugs via the dark web), Unnati Emmanuel alias Anil alias Praveen Kumar alias Manne (peddler), Appikatla Ashok Naidu (organiser), Sammela Sai Krishna, Nagella Leela Manikanta, Hilton Joseph Rolf, Adapa Yashwant Sridutta, Thota Kumaraswamy and Nandam Sumanth Teja. A case has been registered against 11 individuals, the nine arrested and two absconding: Srinivas Choudhary alias Vasu and Akhil.

4 Held with 262 SIM Cards in Cyber Fraud Bust in Ramagundam

In a joint operation with the Telangana Cyber Security Bureau (TGSCB) and the Department of Telecommunications (DoT), the police uncovered a large-scale cyber financial fraud and arrested four individuals in Jannaram. under the Ramagundam Police Commissionerate, on Wednesday. During the raid, officers seized 262 SIM cards (Jio, Airtel, Vodafone), along with routers, a laptop, SIM panels, and several mobile phones. Briefing the media, **Deputy Commissioner** of Police A. Bhaskar



said that, acting on credible information about suspicious SIM usage, police raided a rented house near Raghavendra Theatre in Jannaram mandal headquarters, leading to the arrests. The accused were identified as: Y. Kamlesh, 24, a polytechnic student from Andhra Pradesh; Bhavu Bapaiah, 43, a labourer from

Lakshmipur village in Mancherial district who previously worked at a restaurant in Cambodia; his brother, Bhavu Madhukar, 32; and Gotla Rajesh, 40, Bapaiah's brother-in-law from Jammikunta mandal in Karimnagar district. The main suspect, Palavalasala Sai Krishna (alias Jack), is believed to be operating from abroad

and allegedly orchestrated the operation. He reportedly recruited the four by promising high salaries and a share of the illicit earnings. Ramagundam Police Commissioner Amber Kishor Jha and DCP Bhaskar commended the police teams and telecommunications officials for their swift action in dismantling the racket. The arrested persons have been booked under relevant sections of the BNS, IT Act, and the Indian Telegraph Act. Further investigation is under way, with a focus on national and international call links tied to the op-

She sustained a serious leg injury and was rushed to a nearby hospital, where she is undergoing treatment. Meanwhile, Shankar fled the scene leaving Lavanya unattended. Further probe is on.

Forest Officials Seek Power To Protect forests, Control Multhanis' Illegal Activities And Tiger Poaching

Hyderabad WUT | July. 31

Once known as Adavula Jilla ("district of forests"), Adilabad is now struggling to protect its forests and biodiversity. Serious efforts are needed amid rising wood smuggling, even as podu cultivators say, "Kothadi kottam... kottu kunnadi vadalam." Some members of the Multhani (also spelled Multani) community have allegedly been involved in teakwood smuggling in Nirmal and Adilabad districts. The Multhanis are often described as a nomunity with origins in present day Pakistan, believed to have migrated to Telangana during the Nizam period and settled over time in the Ichoda area.

Forest officials and staff say they are now fearful after recent attacks allegedly by Multhani groups on forest and police teams attempting to raise plantations on encroached forest land at Keshavapatnam in Ichoda mandal. Adilabad divisional forest officer Prashanth Bajirao Patil said weapons are needed for self-protection against



wood smugglers and to
curb poaching of tigers
and other wildlife in the
erstwhile Adilabad district. He alleged that a
local timber smuggler,
who intends to contest upcoming local body elections, provoked villagers

against forest staff. He added that establishing a special police station at Sirichelma would help control teakwood smuggling and protect the forests.

According to the DFO, Multhani-dominated areas

show a heightened crime rate and a diminished fear of law. He said Adivasis originally lived in several villages where Multhani families later settled, "hijacking" those villages. He estimated that about 1,600 hectares of forest land have been encroached and that dense forests remain mainly in the Pembed (Pembi) and Khanapur areas, which also face threats. He said Multhani settlement in the Ichoda region grew notably in the 1970s, and that some now view the area as their "Ghad" and resist legal processes.

Statistics indicate rampant tree felling in Ichoda, Indravelli, Khanapur, Jannaram, and Kadam mandals, parts of which fall under the Kawal Tiger Reserve, over the past 15 years. The podu land issue is now a major challenge in Multhani-dominated areas. Recently, officials inspected forest land allegedly encroached in Compartment No. 174 at Babjipet in the Sirichelma Forest Range, Ichoda mandal. It was found that each Multhani family holds an average of 17 acres of podu land. Forest officials say they are of-

fering alternative livelihoods if families surrender the land.

Local leaders of major political parties are reportedly supporting Multhani groups, eyeing an estimated 5,000 votes in the Boath Assembly constituency. The Multhani population is said to be around 6,500 in Adilabad district. Some political leaders are accused of using Multhani workers in illegal teak smuggling by advancing money for supplies. Officials said many Multhani families applied for pattas under ROFR when the state

government invited applications from tribals and non tribals before the last Assembly elections during the BRS regime. In the past, Multhani groups allegedly hijacked heavy vehicles at knifepoint on NH-44, loaded them with teak timber, and dumped the wood at predetermined locations. According to sources, six forest staff have died so far in attacks with sharp weapons by wood smugglers in the old Adilabad district. Some members of the Vaddera community in the Kadam area are also reportedly involved.

IndiGo's Q1 net profit dips 29 per cent to Rs 2,176 crore

InterGlobe Aviation, the parent company of budget airline IndiGo, on Wednesday reported a 29 per cent quarter-onquarter (QoQ) decline in its consolidated net profit to Rs 2,176 crore for the June 2025 quarter (Q1 FY26) from Rs 3,067 crore in the January-March quarter of FY25.

On year-on-year (YoY) basis, the airline posted a 20.26 per cent drop in its profit from Rs 2,729 crore in the same period previous year (Q1

FY25), according to its stock exchange filing. Revenue from operations declined 7.47 per cent to Rs 20,496 crore in the April–June quarter, from Rs 22,152 crore in the preceding

quarter. However, on a YoY basis, it rose 5 per cent from Rs 19,570 crore in the corresponding quarter of the previous fiscal.

The company's expenses rose 10 per cent in the June quarter to Rs 19,232 crore, up from Rs 17,445 crore in the same period previous year, which affected its

However, compared to the previous quarter, expenses remained almost unchanged, coming in at Rs 19,928 crore, the company stated in its regulatory filing. Commenting on the results, Pieter Elbers, CEO, said, "The June quarter was shaped by significant external challenges that created headwinds for the entire aviation sector." Elbers added that despite these industry-wide disruptions, we reported a net profit of Rs 21,763

million (Rs 2,176.3

crore) with a net profit

margin of around 11 per cent for the quarter ended June 2025. While the revenue environment saw moderation, demand for air travel held strong as we served more than 31 million passengers during the quarter, reflecting a growth of around 12 per cent on a YoY basis, as per Elbers. Asian Paints Q1 net profit dips 6.2 per cent amid soft domestic demand

Asian Paints on Tuesday announced a consolidated net profit of Rs 1,117.05 crore for the first quarter (Q1) of FY26, down 6.24 per cent year-on-year (YoY) from Rs 1,186.79 crore in the same period previous year (Q1 FY25). The company's consolidated revenue from operations slipped marginally by 0.34 per cent YoY to Rs 8,938.55 crore from Rs 8,969.73 crore, according to its stock exchange filing.

Asian Paints said its do-




mestic decorative business recorded a volume growth of 3.9 per cent in Q1 but faced a 1.2 per cent drop in revenue. The company attributed this to a soft demand environment caused by macroeconomic uncertainties, the early onset of the monsoon, and a shift in product mix.

Stokes Opens Up After Injury Forces Him Out of Fifth Test vs India

ngland captain Ben Stokes has been ruled out of the fifth and deciding Test against India with a shoulder injury in a devastating blow for the home side. The England and Wales Cricket Board said vice-captain Ollie Pope would lead the side in the match at The Oval starting Thursday, with England 2-1 up in the five-Test series. All-rounder Stokes has struggled with various fitness issues during the four Tests against India during which he has sent down 140 overs -- the most he has bowled in any series.

The 34-year-old, who is leading wicket-taker on either side with 17 scalps, has injured his right shoulder -- his bowling arm -- and it is understood he will need up to 10 weeks to recover. "I am obviously disappointed to not be able to finish the series," an emotional Stokes told a pre-match press conference on Wednesday. He added: "I have got a decent tear of one of the (shoulder) muscles I can't pronounce.



Bayern Munich Signs Luis Diaz From Liverpool On Four-Year Deal

ayern Munich have signed Colombian winger Luis Diaz from Liverpool on a four-year contract, the Bundesliga club said on Wednesday. Financial details of the transfer were not revealed but British media reported Bayern paid around 75 million euros (\$86.67 million) for the 28-year-old Colombia international. Diaz's contract with Liverpool ran until June 2027. He moved to the Merseyside club from Portuguese side Porto for around 50 million euros in January 2022. "Three years and a half that I'll treasure forever. I arrived with all the dreams in the world, and I am leaving proud of everything we achieved together," Diaz posted on Instagram. "I have met incredible people, fabulous colleagues, coaches who helped me a lot, and extraordinary fans. Liverpool is, indeed, a special team, and I will keep everyone in my heart... "It would have been the perfect goodbye if we hadn't lost one of ours in such a tragic way," Diaz added, referring to former Liverpool teammate Diogo Jota, who was killed in a car accident earlier this month.

India Refuses to Play Pakistan in WCL Semifinal Citing Pahalgam Terror Attack, Sponsors Back Out Too

New delhi WUT | July. 31

India Champions have officially declined to play their World Championship of Legends (WCL) semifinal match against arch-rivals Pakistan, scheduled for Thursday at Edgbaston Cricket Ground. The decision comes in the wake of the recent Pahalgam terror attack and the subsequent Indian military response through 'Operation Sindoor', prompting a nationwide sentiment against sporting ties with Pakistan.



The Indian team, comprising cricketing greats like Shikhar Dhawan, Yuvraj Singh, Irfan Pathan, Harbhajan Singh, and Suresh Raina, had reportedly made it clear earlier that they would not take the field against Pakistan under the current cir-

cumstances. This stance mirrors their earlier refusal to participate in the groupstage fixture against Pakistan during the

same tournament. In a strong show of support, major tournament sponsor Ease-MyTrip publicly withdrew its association from the highprofile Indo-Pak clash. Co-founder Nishant Pitti posted on social media, "Terror and cricket cannot go hand in hand. Some things are bigger than sport. Nation first, business later." He added that the company would not support events that aim to normalize ties with countries accused of promoting terrorism.

ACB Nabs Assistant Engineer Taking Rs 10,000 Bribe

n assistant executive engineer in the Vigilance and Quality Control wing of the panchayat raj department was caught redhanded by the Anti Corruption Bureau (ACB) accepting a bribe in Jagtial on Wednesday. The accused, S. Anil Kumar of the Jagtial sub-division, was arrested at his office by the Karimnagar ACB unit. He had demanded ₹10,000 from contractor Venkatesham of Korutla to prepare quality control inspection reports for three projects.

According to ACB deputy superintendent of police P. Vijay Kumar, Anil Kumar accepted a ₹3,000 advance two days earlier and then demanded the remaining ₹7,000. He was apprehended while taking the second installment at his office.

Authorities recovered the bribe money from Anil Kumar, and a chemical test confirmed contact with the cash. He has been arrested and will be presented before the Special Judge for SPE & ACB cases in Karimnagar. Deputy superintendent Kumar urged citizens to report any instances of bribery by public servants via the toll free number 1064 or through social media. He assured that the complainant's identity will remain confidential.

Hydra Cracks Down on Musi River Land Grab

HYDRA Clears 9.62 Acres of Illegal Encroachments Along Musi Riverbed

Hyderabad WUT | July. 31

In a major crackdown on illegal encroachments, HYDRA (Hyderabad Urban Development Authority) on Tuesday cleared approximately 9.62 acres of encroached land along the Musi Riverbed, spanning from Chaderghat Bridge to Osmania Hospital Mortuary in the Old City.

Acting on multiple complaints from local residents, HYDRA teams removed illegal structures and temporary sheds that had been used for parking heavy vehicles like lorries



and buses, and for running unauthorized businesses. Residents had also raised concerns about anti-social activities taking place in the area.

The encroachers were identified as Tikaram Singh, who occupied 3.10

acres, Poonamchand Yadav with 1.30 acres, and Jayakrishna, who had encroached on 5.22 acres. All three had reportedly leveled portions of the riverbed, dumped soil, and constructed sheds, which were later rented

out for commercial use. One section was even used to operate a nursery business, further damaging the fragile river ecosystem.

HYDRA officials confirmed that land was being filled and levelled to create flat surfaces for temporary construction and rental activity. Local residents welcomed the action and expressed relief and appreciation for the swift response. The authority stated that strict monitoring will continue to prevent future encroachments and preserve the Musi River zone.

Metro Pillar Markings Begin in Old City

Hyderabad WUT | July. 31

Marking a significant milestone in Hyderabad Metro Rail's long-delayed Old City corridor, pillar markings officially commenced at Chandrayangutta on Wednesday. This development signals the beginning of visible groundwork for the 7.5kilometre stretch from MGBS to Falaknuma, a project that has been pending for years. According to metro rail officials, the distance between each concrete pillar is expected to be around 30 feet. Once all markings are completed, the construction of these pillars will begin in earnest. The route—designed to pass through several densely populated

areas—has already seen the demolition of nearly 400 of the 1,100 properties earmarked for acquisition. The rest are currently under various stages of acquisition, clearance, or demolition. To avoid major traffic disruptions in this congested part of the city, the engineering teams are employing a two-phase strategy: demolition of structures using heavy machinery is done during the night, while property clearing is conducted during the daytime. A number of electric poles and overhead power lines along the route also need to be removed or relocated, which is part of the ongoing utility-shifting exercise.

Commercial taxes dept detects new GST fraud via fake bills

Hyderabad WUT | July. 31

Commercial Taxes Department here unearthed a major Goods and Services tax (GST) evasion scam by a city-based company named. Keshaan Industries LLP, the company, was found indulging in 'unprecedented tax fraud' by allegedly generating high-value tax invoices

for the supply of copper materials without any corresponding movement of goods.

"This sophisticated form of tax evasion raising invoices without actual supply of good is the first of its kind to be detected in Telangana. It represents a dangerous new trend in GST-related fraud. The company fraudulently availed Input Tax Credit

(ITC) of approximately ₹33.20 crores through such bogus transactions, thereby reducing its output tax liability," said the Commercial Taxes Department in a press release here on Wednesday, July 30. After receiving information, officials conducted coordinated inspections at the company's corporate office located on SP Road,

Hyderabad; a godown at Bansilalpet, Secunderabad; and its factory units in Kalakal Automotive Park and Muppireddypally villages in Medak District. The company despatched empty vehicles from Telangana to Maharashtra, even as documentation falsely indicated the transportation of substantial consignments. Keeshan LLP is believed

to have indulged in GST fraud via fraudulent invoices which are suspected to exceed Rs 100 crores. The fraud came to light through analysis of vehicle movement data, including toll gate records obtained from the National Highway Authority of India (NHAI). "These records indicated that numerous vehicles passed through key toll point.
