'Nuke India' Scribbled on US School Shooter's Gun

A shooter who opened fire at a Minneapolis Catholic school, killing two children, had "Nuke India" written on one of the guns, according to video footage of the alleged arsenal used by him. The shooter, identified as Robin Westman, 23, from Minnesota, opened fire in the Annunciation Catholic School on Wednesday, killing two children aged 8 and 10 and injuring 17 people. Westman then allegedly killed himself. Video footage circulating online allegedly showed Westman displaying his ammunition, rifles, and guns. "Nuke India" was written in white on one of the guns. Journalist Laura Loomer said in a post on X that the Minnesota shooter had "Mashallah" and "Nuke India" written

on his gun.

CM Revanth Orders Intensified Relief Operations in Flood-Hit Districts

Flash floods damage roads, rail tracks and crops; thousands shifted to relief camps

Six Districts Witness Heaviest Rain in 50 Years, 1,400 Rescued

Kamareddy and Medak districts of Telangana recorded the heaviest rainfall in the last 50 years, triggering flash floods that damaged roads, bridges, rail tracks, and crops, state government officials said on Thursday. In just 24 hours, Argonda station at Rajampet mandal in Kamareddy recorded 44 cm of rain, while 23 other locations received over 20 cm, including 10 stations in Kamareddy, six in Medak, four in Nirmal, and the rest in Nizamabad and Siddipet.

Modi Set for Talks with Putin, Xi at China Meet

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Thursday embarked on a two-nation visit to Japan and China, where he will attend the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) Summit in Tianjin and hold talks aimed at advancing India's strategic and economic interests.

At the 25th SCO Heads of State meeting (August 31–September 1), Modi said he looks forward to engaging with Russian President Vladimir Putin, Chinese President Xi Jinping, and other world leaders. Stressing India's "active and constructive" role in the grouping, he



highlighted New Delhi's initiatives in innovation, health, and cultural cooperation during its presidency, and reaffirmed India's commitment to tackling shared regional challenges.

Before arriving in China, Modi will be in Japan on August 29–30 for the 15th Annual Summit with Japanese Prime Minister Shigeru Ishiba. The discussions will focus on strengthening the India— Japan Special Strategic and Global Partnership, particularly in economic cooperation, investments, and collaboration in new and emerging technologies such as AI and semiconductors.

US Tightens Stay Rules For Foreign Visa

The United States Department of Homeland Security (DHS) has proposed to tighten rules governing stay duration of international students, exchange visitors, and foreign media representatives in the country. If the rules are finalised, the long-standing system of Duration of Status (D/S) for F, J, and I visas will be replaced with a fixed admission period, the grace period for students will be reduced and additional restrictions will be implemented. At present,



people who receive F (academic students), J (exchange visitor) and I (foreign media representative) visas are admitted for as long as they remain in the programme or assignment they are approved of. The Duration of Status allowed students to stay in the US for the entire length of their education without having to re-apply to immigration authorities. Students under CONT:P4

Rising Ganga Floods Varanasi Ghats; Aarti Moved To Rooftops

With water level in the

Ganga river rising steadily, normal activities on the ghats of Varanasi have been disrupted, including the 'aarti' ritual and cremations, officials said on Thursday. After a slight drop in the past few days, the water level on Thursday morning crossed the warning mark of 70.262 metres to reach 70.91 metres, nearing the danger level at 71.262 metres, they said. According to the managers of 'Ganga Seva Nidhi', the organisation that conducts



the famed 'aarti' in Varanasi, floodwaters have submerged the lower parts of the Dashashwamedh Ghat, forcing the organisers to hold the daily ritual on the roofs of the adjoining buildings. Similarly, due to waterlogging, cremations at the Harishchandra and Manikarnika ghats are also being carried out on rooftops. The floodwaters have submerged the Sheetla Mata temple at Dashashwamedh Ghat. In

view of the rising water level and the possibility of flooding, the district administration has instructed the concerned departments to remain on high alert. District Magistrate Satyendra Kumar said the municipal officials have been directed to ensure cleanliness in the relief camps and regular spraying of anti-larvae and foam in the waterlogged areas. The Varuna river, a tributary of the Ganga, is also in spate, with water entering several localities, including Shakkar Talab, Purana Pul, Nakkhi Ghat, Pulkohana and Deenday-

BJP Hits Out at Rahul, Tejashwi for 'Shameful' Rally Remarks

used against Prime Minis-

ter Narendra Modi's late mother. Calling the incident "politics at its lowest," the BJP accused the INDIA bloc leaders of crossing all limits of "insult, hatred, and vulgarity."

In a post on X, the BJP alleged that "from the platform of Rahul Gandhi and Tejashwi Yadav's journey, extremely indecent language was used




against the revered late mother of Prime Minister Modi Ji. Such depravity has never been seen before in politics." The party further charged that the leaders not only allowed such remarks but also humiliated the people of Bihar by previously sharing the stage with Tamil Nadu Chief Minister M.K. Stalin and Telangana Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy, who, it claimed, had earlier insulted Biharis.

"Tejashwi and Rahul have made such filthy language be used on their

platform that it is not even possible to repeat it. This is a mistake for which even if they beg for forgiveness a thousand times, the people of Bihar will not forgive them," the BJP stated, terming the episode "extremely shameful."

Pocharam Holds, Where KLIS Failed

The century-old Pocharam dam at Nagireddypet on the border of the undivided Nizamabad and Medak districts proved that construction quality can stand not just the test of time, but also hand way more load than designed. Earlier this week, the dam handled 1.82 lakh cusecs of water, more than double its 70,000 cusecs capacity. Tuesday's breach to the dam's bund was but a blip and the structure withstood the massive battering it received.

The performance of the 103-year-old Pocharam dam, which has a spillway over the top for release of excess water, managed to weather the worst storm in its history and showed its construction quality stood in contrast to the plight of the three barrages of the Kaleshwaram lift irrigation scheme at Medigadda, Annaram, and Sundilla. The KLIS barrages have had quality issues with respect of not

just their construction but even their planning and design. There are fears that storing water at the barrages would further erode their stability, the barrages have been taken out of service until a possible rescue and rehabilitation plan can be drawn. With regard to the breach at the Polavaram dam, T. Srinivas, irrigation department's engineer-in-chief (operation & maintenance) told Deccan Chronicle on Thursday: "The repairs to the breached bund section of about a five-metre span will be completed in the next two or three days. There is no danger to the main structure itself. The amount of water that came was unprecedented but the Pocharam dam is safe." Quality related problems of the KLIS barrages was pointed out by Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy who, as part of his aerial survey of flood-hit areas, briefly stopped over at the Yellampalli reservoir on Thursday. Answering a question from a

reporter, Revanth Reddy said the Kaleshwaram project barrages had similar quality problems and issues and if water is stored at them, the problems may get exacerbated. "They have the same quality problems. If water is stored at the barrages as demanded by Harish Rao or K.T. Rama Rao, and because of the problems, if something untoward happens, who will be answerable? Entire villages downstream will be washed away, there will be huge loss of lives," Revanth Reddy said. Earlier in the day, after the floods at the Pocharam dam had receded and water stopped flowing over the dam, and the actual extent of the damage could be inspected. Irrigation minister N. Uttam Kumar Reddy said "happy to share with all, our 103year old Pocharam reservoir has bravely withstood a massive flood inflow of 1,82,000 cusecs, far beyond, its maximum flood discharge of 70,000 cu-

He stressed that officials must ensure there is no loss of life, property, or crops during natural calamities.

The Chief Minister, accompanied by Irrigation Minister N. Uttam Kumar Reddy and TPCC president, MLC B. Mahesh Kumar Goud, conducted an aerial survey of floodaffected regions in Peddapalli, Kamareddy, and Medak districts. Due to weather conditions, the helicopter landed at Medak district police office, where he later held a review meeting.

During the meeting with Medak District Collector Rahul, MP Raghunandan Rao, and MLA Mynam-



pally Rohith, the CM instructed the Chief Secretary to prepare proposals for compensation on a war-footing basis, covering crop loss, property damage, and lives lost. He emphasized that documentation of damages through photos and videos must be preserved for district records.

Revanth Reddy also suggested permanent flood management measures such as constructing highlevel bridges. He urged officials to regularly record rainfall statistics and create awareness among people about safety precautions.

On the issue of urea shortages, he noted that farmers were purchasing stocks in advance and advised officials to promote the use of nano urea to prevent scar-

Later, the CM visited a photo exhibition of floodhit areas and appreciated the district administration's relief efforts. At the Police Parade Grounds, he received a Guard of Honour. District Collector Rahul Raj and SP D.V. Srinivasa Rao welcomed him, while former MLA Mynampally Hanumanth Rao, additional collector Nagesh, and other officials were also present.

In just 24 hours, Argonda station at Rajampet mandal in Kamareddy recorded 44 cm of rain, while 23 other locations received over 20 cm, including 10 stations in Kamareddy, six in Medak, four in Nirmal, and the rest in Nizamabad and Siddipet. To tackle the crisis, 15 SDRF teams, five NDRF teams, and about 100 Army personnel from the TASA unit Hyderabad have been deployed in flood-hit areas. Over 500 people have been rescued, including 350 SC Women's Degree College students in Ramayampet and 80 students from a girls'

hostel. Around 53 families from low-lying areas and 375 villagers near Sardhana were shifted to rehabilitation camps.

Tragedy struck when two persons were swept away while crossing Rajpet bridge in Medak, and another person died in a wall collapse. A car with two occupants was washed away in Neelakatta vagu, Domakonda. Infrastructure has been

badly hit: the Hyderabad-Nagpur National Highway (NH44) caved in at three places, forcing diversions. Railway tracks were damaged at Rameshwarpally in Kamareddy and Shamnapur on the Akkanpet-Ramayampet line, halting train services. Officials reported damage to 85 roads, 23 culverts, 15 bridges, and 47 submerged stretches, with barricades placed for public

Telangana Floods: Power Staff Risk Safety for Supply

Electricity staff waded to

neck-deep water in several areas to restore power supply which were disrupted by relentless rain and floods. Under the northern discom limits, 15 substations were submerged and power staff restored supply in 14 as last reports came in. Of the 108 power poles affected, including 19 almost uprooted and others leaning dangerously, 87 were repaired. NPDCL CMD K. Varun Reddy, along with senior officials, visited the affected zones in Nizamabad, Karimnagar, and Jagtial to oversee restoration efforts. Power workers braved floodwaters, swimming across a lake with ropes in Gundaram to repair lines and restore electricity. In Medak, under the southern discom, extensive flood damage was reported in areas like Haveli Ghanpur, Papannapet, Ramay-



ampet, and Nizampet. The floods damaged 971 electric poles and 262 transformers, disrupting over 175 feeders. Additionally, breached tanks and overflowing reservoirs caused widespread road and rail disruptions. Flood waters entered several substations. Districts such as Nalgonda, Gadwal, Yadadri, Sangareddy, and Narayanpet also reported damages. Overall, across the discom's jurisdiction, 39 33 kV feeders, 296 11 kV feeders, 280 distribution transformers, and 1,357 electric poles were damaged. Chief Engineer, rural zone, Bala Swamy, said the damage could worsen. Southern discom CMD Musharraf Alo Faruqui lauded the heroic commitment of power department staff to restore electricity.

GHMC Prepares 74 Artificial Ponds for Smooth Ganesh Idol Immersion

GHMC Readies 74 Artificial Ponds Across Hyderabad to Ease Ganesh Idol Immersions This Year

HYDERABAD Wakeup telangana

The Greater Hyderabad Municipal Corporation (GHMC) has set up 74 artificial ponds across the city to facilitate Ganesh idol immersions this year, in addition to the 20 major lakes—including Hussainsagar, Saroornagar, IDL, Safilguda and Sunnam—traditionally used for the purpose.

According to officials, each immersion site has been assigned designated in-charges, sanitation staff, cranes, and personnel deployed in three shifts, ensuring smooth and safe management of the festival. The arrangements are aimed at decentralising immersions, easing the burden on major lakes, and ensuring better crowd control. Of the 74 artificial ponds, the GHMC has created: 27 portable prefabricated tanks



measuring $20 \text{ m} \times 10 \text{ m}$ with a depth of 1.5 m, designed for idols up to 5 feet.

20 temporary excavation ponds, dug to a depth of 5–6 feet for medium-sized idols.

27 baby ponds, mostly near existing lakes, suitable for smaller idols.

rected urgent desilting works at Gangaram Cheruvu, stressing that the removal of silt and waste must be taken up on a war footing. He instructed that all debris, including horse dung and other waste material, be cleared promptly and the entire work completed within a week. For public safety, Borkhade asked police authorities to deploy sufficient forces at dark spots and sensitive areas to prevent untoward incidents. He also highlighted the importance of maintaining procession routes in good condition. Engineering officials were instructed to repair potholes immediately, undertake BT road layering (DDM works) on immersion routes, and ensure that roads remain smooth for idol processions. "Tejashwi and Rahul have made such filthy language be used on their platform that it is not even possible to repeat it. This is a mistake for which even if they beg for forgiveness a thousand times, the people of Bihar will not forgive them," the BJP stated, terming the episode "extremely shameful."

LoC Gunfight: Two Infiltrating Terrorists Killed

The Indian Army on Thursday announced that two unidentified militants were killed during an ongoing anti-infiltration operation along the Line of Control (LoC) in the Gurez sector of north Kashmir's Bandipora district. The joint action was carried out by the Army and Jammu and Kashmir Police following intelligence inputs about a possible infiltration attempt. According to the Srinagar-based Chinar Corps, alert troops detected suspicious movement in the Naushehra Nard area and challenged it. The militants opened indiscriminate fire, prompting retaliatory action by security forces. In the ensuing exchange, both infiltrators were neutralized. Security forces said the operation remains in progress to ensure no further threat pertwo security personnel lost their lives in separate incidents in Jammu and Kashmir. Havildar Ikbal Ali of the Army made the supreme sacrifice in Kupwara district while performing his duties. The Chinar Corps paid homage to his bravery, saluting his dedication to the nation and extending condolences to his family. Meanwhile, the Border Security Force (BSF) reported the martyrdom of Constable Rajib Nunia on August 27 during operational deployment along the International Boundary in Akhnoor sector, Jammu. The BSF honoured his service, noting his unwavering commitment and expressing solidarity with his family. Both sacrifices were deeply mourned by the armed forces, highlighting the continuing challenges in safeguarding India's frontiers.

United Nations says children make up 50 percent of gang members in Haiti

The United Nations has sounded the alarm over Haiti's escalating gang crisis, reporting that children now comprise nearly half of the members of armed groups in the Caribbean nation. On Thursday, UNICEF Executive Director Catherine Russell said child recruitment into gangs has surged at a "staggering" pace. "Children are being forced into combat roles, used as couriers, lookouts, or exploited for domestic labor," she warned. According to UN data, child participation in gangs jumped by 700 percent in the first three months of 2025 compared with the same period last year.

The surge has also



rights abuses. In 2024, the UN documented over 2,000 grave violations against minors, marking a 500 percent increase from the previous year. Officials fear the numbers will continue to climb as gangs expand their dominance across the country.

Prince, is now estimated to be 90 percent under gang control, leaving major roads blocked, government services crippled, and food and fuel prices soaring. Nationwide, the violence has displaced nearly 1.3 million people, half of them children and

October 2024 and June 2025 alone, close to 5,000 Haitians were killed in gang-related violence.

The crisis intensified following the 2021 assassination of President Jovenel Moïse, which created a power vacuum and enabled criminal groups to

consolidate control. Gangs, often citing political corruption as justification, have grown into heavily armed organizations whose influence now rivals that of the state.

International efforts to

stem the violence have

largely faltered. A Kenya-led UN mission, authorized in October 2023, has struggled due to inadequate funding and logistical challenges. At the UN Security Council this week, the United States and Panama announced plans for a new draft resolution to establish another international security force, though questions remain about its scope and coordination.

Meanwhile, Haiti's government has turned to private security firms, including Erik

Prince's Vectus Global. sparking concerns over foreign involvement and the country's troubled history with outside interventions.

Despite urgent appeals,

the UN reported in August that its crisis response plan for Haiti was less than 10 percent funded. Humanitarian agencies warn that without immediate support, conditions for children and displaced families will deteriorate further.

Compounding the crisis, Haitians fleeing the violence have faced shrinking options abroad. The United States recently announced plans to revoke protections for Haitians living in the country, raising the prospect of deportations even as instability worsens at home.

Bhagwat Pitches for Maximum Three Children, Minimum Three Languages

RSS chief Mohan Bhagwat on Thursday dismissed speculation that his recent "retire at 75" remark was aimed at BJP leaders, clarifying it was only a reference to late Sangh leader Moropant Pinglay's witticism. Stressing there can be "matbhed" (differences of opinion) but no "manbhed" (differences at heart) with the BJP, he rejected claims that the RSS was delaying the announcement of the next BJP president. "If it were for us, would it have taken this long? Take your time... we don't have to say anything," Bhagwat quipped, drawing ap-Speaking on the final day



of a three-day lecture series marking 100 years of the RSS, Bhagwat asserted that Hindu Rashtra was a reality that needed no formal declaration. He also reiterated support for caste-based reservations "till beneficiaries no longer feel the need" and batted for a three-child policy citing declining birth rates.

On foreign policy, Bhagwat said the RSS would not dictate how the Modi government deals with global leaders, including US President Trump, but

would support decisions taken independently. He backed the 130th Constitution Amendment Bill to disqualify ministers facing serious criminal charges after 30 days, despite opposition protests. Addressing concerns over demographics, Bhagwat blamed forced religious conversions and illegal immigration for imbalance, urging citizens to stop employing undocumented migrants. He also said renaming of cities and roads should reflect local sentiment, but retained names of national heroes, irrespective of religion, must stay. On the language debate, he said all Indian languages are national, while one common link language must evolve organically.

Polish Army Pilot killed as F-16 jet crashes during airshow preparation

A Polish Army pilot was killed on Thursday after his F-16 fighter jet crashed during preparations for the Radom Air Show, prompting organisers to cancel the highprofile international aviation event. The General Command of the Armed Forces confirmed the aircraft, belonging to the 31st Tactical Air Base near Poznan, went down at Radom airport in central Poland around 19:30 local time (17:30 GMT). No civilians were injured. Defence Minister Władysław Kosiniak-Kamysz, who arrived at the crash site, paid tribute to

ish Army pilot died in the crash of an F-16 aircraft an officer who always served his country with dedication and great courage. I pay tribute to his memory.'

Eyewitness videos circulating on social media showed the jet nose-diving and exploding into flames during a practice session. Firefighters rushed to the scene, but the pilot – a member of NATO's elite "Tiger Demo" team - was not seen ejecting before impact. The tragedy led to the cancellation of AirSHOW Radom 2025, which was scheduled for this weekend. The incident drew con-

dolences from NATO allies. Italy's Defence General Staff expressed "profound sorrow," while Latvia's defence minister, visiting Polish troops earlier the same day, said he was "deeply saddened" and offered sympathies to the pilot's family and comrades.

Poland purchased its first U.S.-made F-16s in 2003, integrating them as a core part of NATO's defence framework. The country has been upgrading its fleet and ramping up military spending since Russia's 2023 invasion of Ukraine.

Despite strained relations following the Pahalgam terror attack, India has alerted Pakistan about a potential flood situation in the Tawi river, which flows through the Jammu region. Sources said the information was shared with Pakistan "on humanitarian grounds" to help save lives and livestock. The alert was sent on Sunday morning through India's High Commission in Islamabad to the Pakistan Foreign Office, bypassing the established Indus Waters Treaty (IWT) mechanism, which has remained suspended since the Pahalgam attack. Earlier, it was the duty of IWT Commissioners to exchange such information and warnings. India issued the alert at 10 am on Sunday regarding the developing flood emergency on the Indian

side. This was the first official contact between the two countries since Operation Sindoor. Following the alert, Pakistani authorities also issued flood warnings in their regions. Heavy rainfall in Jammu and Kashmir has triggered flood-like conditions in the Union Territory, with the Tawi river rising to dangerous levels. Several villages near the India-Pakistan border in Punjab were also affected as water levels in the Ujh and Ravi rivers and rivulets swelled following heavy rains in Jammu, Kashmir, and Himachal Pradesh since Saturday night. In Punjab, the Pathankot district administration declared a holiday in all educational institutions on Monday due to incessant rains, while similar orders were issued for schools in Jammu division. Northern India, including Jammu, Kashmir, and

Punjab, has been experiencing continuous heavy rainfall. The Indian Meteorological Department (IMD) issued a red alert on Monday for these regions, advising people to shift to safer places. "Sudden water level rise and above-normal flood situations are expected in the Jhelum, Chenab, and their tributaries across Poonch, Rajouri, Reasi, Kishtwar, Ramban, Doda, Jammu, Udhampur, Kathua, and Samba districts in the next 24 hours," the Central Water Commission (CWC) flood alert stated on Sunday. Jammu and Kashmir recorded over 190 mm of rainfall. The IMD also warned of "isolated very heavy rainfall" over Jammu and Kashmir, Himachal Pradesh, and Punjab on August 25-26, with Himachal Pradesh likely to experience heavy rain for the next seven days. Residents were advised to stay indoors.

Student, Exchange, and Media Visa Rules **HYDERABAD** Wakeup telangana

The United States Department of Homeland Security (DHS) has proposed sweeping changes to the visa system governing international students, exchange visitors, and foreign media representatives, a move that could end the decades-old practice of admitting such visa holders under "Duration of Status" (D/S). If implemented, the new rules would replace D/S with fixed admission periods, reduce grace times for students, tighten transfer and programme change options, and subject visa extensions to more rigorous review. DHS has justified the proposal on grounds of national security and the prevention of fraud in the student visa system, but education groups and immigration experts warn that it could create uncertainty and additional hurdles for foreign nationals in the United States.

At present, individuals holding F visas (for academic

students), J visas (for exchange visitors), and I visas (for foreign media representatives) are admitted for as long as their approved programme or assignment continues. This flexible system has allowed students to complete their education, pursue additional courses, or transfer between institutions without repeatedly reapplying to immigration authorities. Journalists and exchange visitors have similarly been able to remain in the U.S. for the full length of their assignments. Under the new proposal, however, this flexibility would be curtailed. Students and exchange visitors would instead be admitted for up to two years, extendable to a maximum of four years if they meet specific DHS criteria, while foreign media representatives would be restricted to an initial period of 240 days, with the option to apply for further extensions in increments of the same duration.



Importantly, extensions for J-1 visa holders would now be subject not only to programme sponsor approval but also to adjudication by DHS, adding another layer of oversight to a process that was previously overseen primarily by the Department of

For students, the changes go further by introducing strict rules on transfers and programme changes. Currently, F-1 students can transfer between institutions or switch programmes with approval from their Designated School Official (DSO). Under the new rules, students would be required to complete at least one academic year at their institution before being eligible to transfer. Moreover, transfers would only be permitted upward in education level, meaning a student

moving from a bachelor's degree to a master's, or from a master's to a PhD. Students would not be permitted to pursue another degree at the same or lower level without reapplying for a new visa Graduate-level students would also be barred from changing programmes midway, closing off opportunities for academic pivots. For language training students, DHS has proposed a strict 24-month limit on study, inclusive of vacations and breaks, in sharp contrast to the more flexible system under D/S.


Foreign journalists on I visas, who are currently admitted for the duration of their employment, would also be impacted significantly. DHS proposes restricting their admission to 240 days, after which they would need to file for an extension in equal increments. While extensions would be available, this shift would end the long-standing practice of admitting foreign correspondents for the full length of their professional.







NDA'S V-P PICK APPEARS ACCEPTABLE

The ruling BJP may have pulled an acceptable name out of a hat in picking Chandrapuram Ponnusamy Radhakrishnan from Tamil Nadu as the vicepresidential candidate of the NDA. The veteran politician who was twice elected as MP from western TN ticks many boxes in these particularly politically polarised times. Coming as he does from an RSS Pracharak background, he may be the olive branch offered by the PM at a time when the ideological parent organisation has been speaking about the retirement age of 75. As the PM is fond of quoting from Tamil classics, his choice quotation Yadhum oore Yyavaram khelir ('Every place is our native, Every one is our companion') is seemingly apt for 'CPR', a moderate and accessible

face from a state that is getting ready for the polls to be held next summer. The TN ruling party DMK, diametrically opposed to the BJP, also welcomed his nomination, which it had to lest it be seen as opposing a fellow Tamil. However, it came up with a political riposte to the strategically shrewd NDA nomination by calling for a Tamil politician to be picked as the I.N.D.I.A. bloc choice to oppose Radhakrishnan, who was named after the scholarly Vice-President Dr Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan from the state who also went on to serve as President.

The NDA, enjoying a sufficient majority while commanding around 423 votes in an electoral college of 782 MPs (including nominated Rajya Sabha members), should get him elected against anyone the Opposition may name as it is compelled to field a Vice-

Presidential candidate, ostensibly for ideological reasons but also to test the political temperature. There is no basis for any conjecture that CPR as the NDA candidate would have any influence on the Tamil Nadu political scene in which the DMK is firmly ensconced now. But the ruling dispensation would like to send the message that Tamil Nadu is not necessarily being singled out for step motherly treatment even as the BJP hopes to enhance its support in the state. The plus point in such a candidature is Radhakrishnan's experience as the Centre's representative in Raj Bhavans in Jharkhand, Maharashtra, Hyderabad and Puducherry might help him to be a capable chairman of the Rajya Sabha, which had seen a tumultuous and argumentative period with the garrulous Jagdeep Dhankhar in the chair and whose resignation has ne-

8 Bullets Seized From Passenger At RGIA

irport security officials at Rajiv Gandhi International Airport (RGIA), Shamshabad, seized eight live bullets from the checked-in baggage of a passenger on Thursday and handed him over to the RGIA police. The passenger, Sukhdeep Singh, 32, of Bhawanigarh in Punjab, was travelling to Amritsar from Hyderabad via Delhi. Security personnel detected the ammunition during baggage screening. The rounds included four 0.2 mm, two 0.7 mm, one 7.52 mm and one 7.62 mm.

Police said Singh failed to produce a valid licence for arms or ammunition. He claimed the bullets were inadvertently left in his possession from a 2023 incident in Punjab, which is now under verification. Preliminary inquiries revealed Singh had travelled to Nanded on August 22 to visit a gurdwara and later decided to return to Punjab by air due to heavy rains in his native place. He came to Hyderabad to board a connecting flight when the ammunition was detected. Singh, along with the seized ammunition, was handed over to the RGIA police, who booked him under Section 25(1B)(a) of the Arms Act, 1959. An FIR has been registered and further investigation is underway.

HC Takes up Issue of Rock Blasting, Asks Approves It

The Telangana High Court has sought clarity from the state government on which authority is empowered to grant permission for blasting operations within Hyderabad city limits, particularly in the Jubilee Hills

A division bench comprising Chief Justice Aparesh Kumar Singh and Justice G.M. Mohiuddin on Thursday posed the query while hearing a suo motu public interest litigation (PIL). The PIL was registered based on a year-old news report highlighting large-scale blasting near Nyay Vihar, the



residential complex of High Court judges, as well as a communication from a sitting judge addressed to the Chief Jus-

The bench directed Additional Advocate-General Mohd Imran Khan to inform the court within two weeks about the competent authority responsible for regulating the use of

explosives in city areas. The judges noted that there appeared to be a "gray area" regarding jurisdiction. While the Hyderabad City Police Act, 1348 Fasli, indicates that the city police commissioner is authorised to issue permissions for blasting and explosives use, in practice such approvals appeared to be

originating from else where." This discrepancy prompted the court to seek official clarification. Observing the potential risks involved, the bench underlined that unregulated or unauthorised blasting in densely populated urban localities such as Jubilee Hills could endanger public safety and damage nearby properties. The court emphasised the need for a clear regulatory framework to ensure accountability and to prevent misuse of explosives within the city. The matter has been posted for further hearing after the state government files its

HC asks TG to regularise Anganwadis for the petitioners, argued

The Telangana High Court, using its extraordinary jurisdiction, directed the state government to regularise anganwadi workers and supervisors grade-II staff of the Integrated Child Development Services, who have been working on contract basis from 1985.

Justice Nagesh Bheempaka passed the order while disposing of a matter of 2013, filed against a fresh recruitment notification that year for appointment of anganwadi workers and supervisors grade-II. Contract workers Meerabai and others had approached the High Court complaining that they were appointed 1985 and later on. Due to the ban imposed at the time on appointments, the petitioners were appointed on contract through an agency. Bobbili Srinivas, counsel

that fresh notification for appointments was issued in 2013 against the petitioners' posts. Despite having the required educational qualifications and serving for more than one decade, the government did not consider them for appointment. Exercising its extraordinary jurisdiction, the court allowed the petitioners' request for regularisation. The court viewed that the government having utilised the services of the petitioners for decades could not subject them to a fresh selection process to compete against the same vacancy in which they are working. In view of the settled law laid down by the Supreme Court in the Uma Devi case, the petitioners would be entitled for counting their service, prior to regularisation, for pension and retirement benefits, the court said.

Hyderabad High Court Stays Human Rights Panel Order on Release of Student Certificates

A two-judge panel comprising Chief Justice Aparesh Kumar Singh and Justice G.M. Moinuddin issued the interim order while hearing a writ petition filed by Sultan-ul-Uloom Educational Society and Sultan-ul-Uloom College of Pharmacy. The management had challenged the commission's August 21 directive, which not only instructed the college to release the certificates of certain students

but also asked the Hyderabad district collector to take action in line with the recommendation. Senior counsel Tarun Reddy, appearing for the petitioners, submitted that the human rights commission had acted without jurisdiction under the Protection of Human Rights Act, 1993. He argued that disputes relating to the return of academic certificates by educational institutions did not constitute violations of "human rights" within the meaning of the Act and hence could

not be adjudicated by the commission. He further contended that the order was not only beyond the scope of the commission's statutory powers but also suffered from procedural impropriety, as it was passed on the very date the complaint was lodged.

The petitioners pointed out that the commission had issued summons directing the chairman and principal of the college to appear before it on August 28. However, without waiting for their appearance or providing

them any opportunity to respond, the commission simultaneously passed directions recommending that the certificates be released and that the district collector take necessary steps. This, the petitioners argued, was contrary to the fundamental principles of natural justice, which mandate notice and a fair hearing before any adverse order can be passed.

After hearing the submissions, the High Court bench observed that while the commission had indeed issued notices to the management, it had already made recommendations before objections could be filed or replies submitted, thereby making the process premature. The court refrained from making any determination on the larger question of jurisdiction—namely, whether withholding stu-

tion of jurisdiction—namely, whether withholding student certificates could amount to a human rights violation under the law—but noted that the procedural lapses in the commission's action re-

quired interim intervention.

Granting temporary relief to the petitioners, the bench directed that the order of the human rights commission, along with the consequential direction to the district collector, be kept in abeyance. The court further granted the petitioners one week's time to file objections before the commission. It directed that further proceedings be conducted only after such objections are considered and a reasoned order is passed.

The matter arose after students complained that the college management had withheld their academic certificates, a practice that often hampers career prospects by preventing students from applying for higher studies or employment. The Telangana Human Rights Commission, treating the grievance as a human rights violation, acted swiftly by ordering the release of the certificates and recommending administrative action through the district collector. The institution's

management, however, viewed this as unlawful interference and moved the High Court seeking relief.

With the High Court's stay order, the commission's directive will remain suspended until the objections are filed and duly examined. The bench made it clear that its present order addressed only the issue of premature action and that the broader question of jurisdiction remained open for consideration at a later stage.



CBI arrests Airtel sales manager in Assam for illegal SIM card racket linked to cyber scams

The CBI has arrested a territory sales manager (TSM) of Airtel from Silchar, Assam for alleged unauthorized sale of SIM cards used to commit various cyber crimes including digital arrest scams, officials said Thursday. The CBI raided five locations in Cachar, Assam on Wednesday and arrested three persons including TSM Debashish Doley and middlemen Mahim

Airtel on queries regarding the arrest of Doley. In a major crackdown on digital arrest scams in May this year, the CBI had booked 39 point-ofsales (PoS) operators who sold 1,100 "ghost SIM cards" to cyber criminals operating from Southeast Asian countries targeting Indian citizens.

During investigation, the CBI found that Doley colluded with the middlemen Barbhuiya and Purkayastha to issue unauthorized SIM cards without the knowledge of the persons in whose name SIM cards were of-

ficially issued.

According to the modus operandi adopted to sell a "ghost

SIM card", when a customer seeks a SIM, the point-of-sale person gets an e-KYC done and issues a SIM. Scamsters lie to the customers that their e-KYC had failed and they should try again. The SIM generated for

the first time was handed over to the customer while the second one – the "Ghost SIM" – was sold to cybercriminals without the genuine customers knowing that a SIM generated in their name was being used by scammers, the officials said.

These "ghost SIM cards" were then used not only to deceive the victims, but also to create mule bank accounts to receive the money, which were later closed to avoid detection or reveal the money trail, they said.

"These sales were done by violating the laid down guidelines and procedures. These SIM cards were sold illegally in bulk to various middlemen at high cost and later these cards were used in commission of various cyber crimes," a CBI spokesperson said in a statement. Aimed at curbing the sale and misuse of unauthorized SIM cards being sold through distributors/ PoS agents, the CBI crackdown resulted in seizure of incriminating evidences like mobile phones, electronic devices and copies of KYC documents, etc, she said. "This action underscores

the government of India's resolute commitment in combating cyber crimes and in bringing its perpetrators to face the law and also special focus in dismantling the infrastructure which facilitates such crimes," the spokesperson

GHMC Plans Rs 2.828-Cr Road Lease Under CRMP II

he GHMC has proposed leasing out 1,142.54 km of main roads to private agencies under the Comprehensive Road Maintenance Programme (CRMP) Phase II for five years, at a cost of Rs 2,828 crore in instalments. The proposal will be placed before the GHMC standing committee meeting on Saturday, along with other projects. The lease, covering 2025-2030, will be offered zone-wise in packages, following the terms adopted in earlier phases. Another proposal before the committee seeks approval for a request for proposal (RFP) to construct a multi-level parking facility at Charminar Old Bus Stand on a Design, Build, Finance, Operate and Transfer (DBFOT) basis, with a 15-year concession period and a possible five-year extension on performance.



Centre Extends Chief Secretary K. Ramakrishna Rao's Tenure Till March 2026

¬ he Centre has approved the extension of Chief Secretary K. Ramakrishna Rao's tenure by seven months, until March 2026. Rao, who assumed charge on April 30, was originally scheduled to retire on August 30. In a departure from the usual practice, the Centre sanctioned a seven-month extension at one stretch; typically, extensions are for three or six months. According to officials, Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy had appealed to the Centre for the Rao's continuation on July 30, citing his administrative experience and ability to steer the state through crucial policy

Notably, in the 10-year history of Telangana, no Chief Secretary has been given an extension in service, barring Rajiv Sharma, the first CS of the newly-formed state in 2014. Sharma was granted a six-month extension, but in two separate phases of three months each. In contrast, Rao's case is unprecedented, with the Centre approving seven months in a single stretch. The decision has fuelled speculation over the Chief Minister's growing clout with the Union government. Observers suggest that Rao's extension reflects Revanth Reddy's persuasive influence at the Centre.



TG's First Man-Made Beach Coming Up At Kothwalguda

elangana is set to develop its first man-made beach at Kothwalguda, with a detailed project report under preparation. Spread across 35 acres, the beach will be built at an estimated cost of Rs 225 crore by the Telangana State Tourism Development Corporation (TSTDC). TSTDC chairman Patel Ramesh Reddy said the project will feature floating villas, luxury hotels and adventure sports, including sailing, bungee jumping, skating and water sports. Other attractions will include a wave pool, fountains, theatres, restaurants, shacks, cycling tracks and play zones for children. Officials expressed confidence that the project will become a global attraction and scale up Hyderabad's tourism profile. "This will not be just water, sand and shacks. It is envisioned as a project that will place Hyderabad on the global tourism map," said a senior TSTDC official. The location was chosen due to land availability and easy access via the Outer Ring Road. At present, the nearest beach to Hyderabad is Suryalanka in Andhra Pradesh, 320 km away. Telangana's first man-made beach will be just 20 km from Gachibowli.

Telangana Seeks Rs 1,000 Cr Flood Relief from Centre On Thursday, Srinivas

Revenue minister Ponguleti Srinivas Reddy on Thursday said Telangana had had requested Rs 10,000 crore in flood relief from the Centre following incurred severe losses due to torrential rain and floods in August-September last year, but had so far received only Rs 300 crore. Srinivas Reddy said a Central team had toured the flood-affected districts of Khammam, Warangal, and Nalgonda for three days in September last. Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy had submitted a detailed report to the visiting delegation, estimating the total damage at Rs 10,320 crore. He had also requested an immediate release of Rs 2,000 crore for urgent rehabilitation and relief.

Reddy held a review meeting to assess the current rain and flood situation in Medak, Kamareddy, and Adilabad districts. He noted that these districts had recorded unprecedented rainfall in recent days, but swift government action had helped minimise casualties and property loss. He said monitoring and relief efforts began on Wednesday afternoon. Rescue operations were in full swing, with drones being used to deliver food to stranded people. Srinivas Reddy stated that the state government had released Rs 1 crore each to all districts a week ago and said that additional funds would be sanctioned for the severely affected areas. National highways, R&B, and Panchayat Raj roads blocked by floods had

been cleared, and temporary restoration of damaged roads was being taken up on a war footing. Several mandal and district headquarters had suffered infrastructure damage, and immediate restoration had been ordered. He said the revenue and police departments were working round the clock. The minister also held a video conference with collectors of Medak, Kamareddy, Sircilla, and Nirmal to coordinate district-level measures. NDRF and SDRF teams had been deployed across the state, and helicopters were on standby for emergency rescues. The Minister assured assistance for farmers and those whose houses had been damaged. He pointed out that some areas in Medak and Sangareddy had received 700 mm of rainfall in just one hour.

Elderly man duped of Rs 33.4 lakh in digital arrest scam

Later, another caller impersonating the noted police officer Daya Nayak demanded Rs 15 lakh for fund verification, followed by repeated extortions under different pretexts. Over multiple transactions, the victim transferred a total of Rs 33.4 lakh, believing the conmen.

The scammers also issued fake documents in the names of the Supreme Court and Income Tax Department to gain trust. Based on the complaint, the Hyderabad Cybercrime Police have registered a case and are investigating the matter.
