India, EU To Ink Free Trade Deal By Dec

The European Union on Wednesday announced a new strategic agenda with India to "take bilateral ties to the next level" and ink a free trade agreement (FTA) by the end of the year. The announcement comes at a time when the US has been persuading the EU to impose steep tariffs on India for buying Russian oil. But the EU has instead decided to "invest in a common future with India". A joint communication released by the EU identified "significant untapped potential in trade and investment, outlining strategies to strengthen commercial ties, particularly finalising the ongoing negotiations on an FTA, and proposes reinforcing supply chains. The EU also looks to strengthen defence ties with India, with the two sides "launching negotiations for a security of information agreement to facilitate CONT:P4

This, he said, would drive growth in Telangana's economy, create employment for youth, and encourage investment in the recreation, hospitality, and tourism sectors. "The Musi will not just be a riverfront; it will become the epicentre of Hyderabad's economic transformation," he said.

The Chief Minister announced that the Musi rejuvenation project would be closely linked to other major initiatives, including Bharat Future City,

the Regional Ring Road, Ring Rail, the bullet train corridor, Metro Rail expansion, and new radial roads. Together, these projects would redefine Hyderabad's infrastructure and global competitiveness. Calling on villagers in the notified area of Bharat Future City to cooperate, Revanth Reddy dismissed farmers' protests against land acquisition as politically motivated. He said awareness campaigns would be launched to involve farmers, civic groups, and local representatives in development efforts. He also hinted that compensation packages had already been extended and asserted that works on the new city project would begin soon.

Operation Sindoor Brought Pakistan to Its Knees: Modi

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Wednesday lauded the Indian armed forces for the success of Operation Sindoor, which he said "brought Pakistan to its knees within the blink of an eye." Speaking at a public gathering in Dhar, Madhva Pradesh, on his 75th birthday, the Prime Minister referred to a recently surfaced video confession of a top Jaishe-Mohammed (JeM) commander.

In the video, the JeM leader admitted that Indian missile strikes on May 7 destroyed the group's Bahawalpur headquarters, killing several members of terror chief Maulana Masood Azhar's family. The commander, Masood Ilyas Kashmiri, broke down as he described the devastating blow, saying, "We embraced terrorism to protect Pakistan's borders, but Azhar's family was torn apart by Indian forces in Bahawalpur."

Addressing the crowd, Modi said: "Just yesterday, the nation and the world saw another Pakistani terrorist crying and revealing his ordeal. This



PM Modi Marks 75th With Global Greetings, Mega Launches

NEW DELHI: Prime Minister Narendra Modi celebrated his 75th birthday on Wednesday with wishes flowing in from across India and the globe. Leaders, dignitaries, celebrities, and citizens joined in expressing admiration for his leadership and vision, making the day both political and personal in significance. World leaders including US President Donald Trump, Russian President Vladimir Putin, Italian Prime Minister Giorgia Meloni, Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu, and Australian Prime Minister Anthony Albanese conveyed greetings. Putin described India-Russia relations as "exceptionally trusting since the Soviet era," while Netanyahu praised Modi as a "good friend." (CONTINUE: P4)

Operation Sindoor targeted nine JeM bases, including Markaz Subhan Allah, the outfit's central

hub. According to intelligence inputs and JeM communications, at least ten members of Azhar's family were killed in the strikes. The Prime Minister asserted that safeguarding India's sovereignty and security remains the nation's top priority, and praised the armed forces for their decisive action.

TGPSC Appeals HC Order on Group-I Mains Re-evaluation

The Telangana Public Service Commission (TGPSC) has filed a Writ Appeal in the Telangana High Court challenging a recent single-judge order directing re-evaluation of Group-I Mains answer scripts, warning that failure to comply would result in cancellation of the entire examination. In its appeal, the Commission described the September 9 ruling as "perverse, contradictory and based on assumptions rather than evidence." TGPSC stressed that its rules explicitly bar reevaluation, permitting only recounting of marks within 15 days of result declaration, making the court's order legally unsustainable.

The Commission also highlighted self-contradictions in the order, which



required re-evaluation within eight months while simultaneously threatening cancellation of the Mains if it was not done. TGPSC rejected allegations of irregularities, saying attendance was recorded via biometrics, forged mark list claims were false, and the distribution of candidates across centres was random and fair. It emphasized that the entire process was conducted with full transparency and strict adherence to prescribed guidelines.

Addressing evaluator selection, TGPSC stated only those demonstrating consistency in mock eval-


uations were chosen. It also noted that professors writing books cannot be disqualified. The Commission strongly objected to the judge's remarks questioning its evaluation methods, citing Supreme Court rulings that courts cannot dictate procedures of professional bodies like PSCs. It further argued that revealing confidential material in sealed cover jeopardized the examination's integrity.

TGPSC has requested the High Court to set aside the single-judge order entirely, arguing it undermines the examination process and gives undue weight to grievances over established records. The appeal is expected to be heard by a division bench shortly, and the outcome is likely to have far-reaching implications for the conduct of future competitive exams in the state.

Teenmar Mallanna Launches

NEW DELHI Wakeup telangana MLC Teenmar Mallanna on Tuesday announced the launch of a new political outfit, the Telangana Rajyadhikara Party, at an event held at Taj Krishna Hotel. Speaking on the occasion, Mallanna said he regards September 17 as a landmark day for the Backward Classes (BCs) and stated that the party was formed to provide a political platform for the BC community, which constitutes a majority in Telangana.

Mallanna was suspended



from the Congress on March 1 for alleged antiparty activities, after he criticised and burned the caste survey report released by the state government in February. A well-known Telugu jour-

nalist since the early 2000s, Mallanna rose to prominence with his satirical takes on socio-political issues. He joined the Congress in November 2023, ahead of the Telangana Assembly elections.

Former US President Donald Trump has identified 23 nations, including China, Afghanistan, India, and Pakistan, as major drug transit or illicit drugproducing countries, warning that the manufacturing and trafficking of narcotics and precursor chemicals from these regions endanger the United States and its citizens. In a Presidential Determination submitted to Congress, Trump placed

these countries on the "Majors List" of drug transit and production nations. The list includes Afghanistan, The Bahamas, Belize, Bolivia, Burma, China, Colombia, Costa Rica, the Dominican Republic, Ecuador, El Salvador, Guatemala, Haiti, Honduras, India, Jamaica, Laos, Mexico, Nicaragua, Pakistan, Panama, Peru, and Venezuela. According to the White House, the designation



into the US. The State Department clarified that inclusion on the list does not necessarily indicate a lack of cooperation or enforcement but reflects

geographic, economic, and commercial factors that facilitate drug transit or production. Of the 23, five countries-Afghanistan, Bo-

livia, Burma, Colombia, and Venezuela—were cited for "failing demonstrably" to meet international counternarcotics commitments or to take adequate steps against drug trafficking. The US urged them to intensify their efforts.

Trump sharply criticized China, labeling it the "world's largest source" of precursor chemicals used in illicit fentanyl production. He accused Chinese suppliers of fueling global epidemics of synthetic CONT:P4

KTR Hits Out at Revanth Reddy, Says Congress Should Trade 'Hand' for 'Bulldozer'

BRS Working President KT Rama Rao launched a scathing attack on Telangana Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy, accusing him of running the state with "dictatorial arrogance, corruption, and no vision." Speaking to the media at Telangana Bhavan on Wednesday, Rama Rao said the state had descended into chaos, with youth, farmers, and ordinary citizens protesting for justice.

Rama Rao criticized the Congress government for surviving on "media management" instead of governance, suggesting it should replace its 'Hand' symbol with a bulldozer. "This regime is not building anything; it is demolishing institutions, hopes, and people's faith," he



said, predicting that Telangana would soon deliver a verdict against the government. He highlighted delays in fee reimbursements, halted Aarogyasri hospital services, and ongoing protests by ASHA workers and ration dealers as evidence of mismanagement. On the Group-1 exam fiasco, Rama Rao said students were unable even to hold peaceful meetings, calling it "dictatorship in its purest form" and alleging jobs were sold for Rs. 3

crore each. Rama Rao also attacked the government over the Regional Ring Road (RRR) project, claiming the alignment was altered to protect the lands of Revanth Reddy and others, putting thousands of farmers at risk. He accused the Chief Minister of nepotism, pointing to contracts awarded to his relatives, and blamed him for the Hyderabad Metro Rail crisis, saying harass-

Cantonment MLA Appeals to Defence Mini for GHMC Merger and Pending Funds

Cantonment MLA Shri Ganesh on Wednesday submitted a memorandum to Union Defence Minister Shri Rajnath Singh during his Hyderabad visit, urging the merger of the Cantonment Board with the Greater Hyderabad Municipal Corporation (GHMC) for better governance and public convenience. Highlighting the administrative difficulties caused by the delay, Shri Ganesh requested that if the merger could not be finalized immediately, elections for the Cantonment Board



should at least be conducted without further

postponement. The MLA emphasized that the absence of elections has stalled local administration, leaving residents' issues unresolved and causing significant hardship. Alongside the merger appeal, Shri Ganesh sought support for the welfare of economically weaker sections residing in the Cantonment

constituency. He requested that lands occupied by poor families be regularized and converted to freehold ownership, fulfilling the long-cherished dream of homeownership for these residents. Additionally, the memorandum urged the central government to release ₹1,000 crore in pending Army charges owed to the Cantonment Board, which is facing financial constraints. Ensuring timely fund release, Shri Ganesh noted, would enable the Board to efficiently deliver civic services and address the administrative and public grievances in the Cantonment area.

BRS Exposes ₹1,100 Crore Grain Scam, Vows Recovery from Congress

Former MLA and senior BRS leader Peddi Sudarshan Reddy, who exposed the first grain scam before the Congress government took office, accused the party of massive corruption in civil supplies. He said the struggle will continue until Congress leaders return the money illegally taken.

The BRS alleged that in 2022-



23, 35 lakh metric tons of grain purchased under global tenders

were used by state leaders in a ₹1,100 crore scam, with illegal proceeds reportedly sent to Delhi before parliamentary elections. Despite repeated Assembly warnings by BRS leaders, including KTR and Harish Rao, the Congress failed to deny alle-

BRS filed Public Interest Litigation No. 34/24 in the High Court with 755 pages of evidence. The government has delayed responding 18 times over 20

months. While the cabinet partially confiscated EMDs of defaulting tender agencies, BRS termed it insufficient and vowed to recover every rupee misappropriated, holding CM Revanth Reddy, Civil Supplies Minister Uttam Kumar Reddy, and officials accountable. The party also demanded strict action against all officers involved and urged central agencies like ED, CBI, and Vigilance to probe the scam thoroughly.

He acknowledged the efforts of the Sathya Sai Trust in establishing hospitals that provide child heart surgeries across India and thanked them for setting up a facility in Siddipet to support pregnant women and children. Kaleshwaram Secures Telangana's Water, Opposition Misleads Public: BRS

The Kaleshwaram project ensures that Telangana will not face water scarcity, even during severe droughts. Despite claims by Congress leaders that the collapse of two pillars out of 85 could endanger the project, experts say the concerns are exaggerated.

The total cost of Kaleshwaram stands at ₹93,769 crore. Medigadda Barrage, including land acquisition, cost ₹4,000 crore, of which only ₹1,500 crore was spent on cement construction. Recently, two pillars in the seventh block collapsed; restoring them is estimated at ₹300 crore. L&T, the company that built the barrage, has committed to rebuilding them at its own expense, raising questions about where public funds were actually wasted.

Critics of the current government highlight that Revanth Reddy's administration spent ₹3 crore on a commission that yielded no tangible results. When Akbaruddin Owaisi asked about Medigadda repairs in the Assembly, the government did not respond. Similarly, questions on how Godavari water will reach Hyderabad if Kaleshwaram fails were left unanswered.



Kaleshwaram stands as a testament to Chief Minister KCR's vision. Unlike Polavaram, which started decades ago and is still incomplete, Kaleshwaram's foundation stone was laid in 2016 and completed in just six years. The project diverts Godavari waters, flowing at 80-100 meters above sea level near Medigadda, to Hyderabad, located at 535 meters above sea level, through 15 chain-link reservoirs, 19 substations, 21 pump houses, hundreds of kilometers of tunnels, and thousands of kilometers of drainage canals.

With the Kondapochamma Sagar tank supplying Hyderabad, the city is secure from drinking water shortages for the next 50 years. Revanth Reddy is inaugurating projects delivered by the BRS government, while Rakesh Reddy's efforts to clarify misconceptions and counter misinformation about Kaleshwaram have been widely appreciated.

BRS congress both parties indulging in vote Bank politics: Kondapalli

Telangana Liberation Day was celebrated in grand style at Parade Grounds, Secunderabad, under the auspices of the Central Government. Union Defence Minister Rajnath Singh attended as the chief guest, paid tribute at the Martyrs' Monument, unfurled the national flag, and received the salute of Central Forces. Union Ministers G. Kishan Reddy, Gajendra Singh Shekhawat, Bandi Sanjay Kumar, BJP Telangana President N. Ramchandra Rao, MP Etala Rajender, and other senior leaders joined the event.

Speaking on the occasion, Rajnath Singh recalled the events of September 17, 1948, when the Indian Army, under the leadership of Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel, launched "Operation Polo" to end the Nizam's rule and crush the Razakar militia. He said the army's advance from Vijayawada, Nag-



pur, and Bombay liberated Hyderabad, ending 13 months of atrocities and granting true freedom to the people of Telangana.

The Defence Minister strongly criticized Congress and BRS, accusing them of

"suppressing this history out of fear of the MIM" and denying generations of students the truth about Telangana's liberation. "It is a shame," Singh said, "that this day of independence has been hidden from textbooks, colleges, and official

programs, even though states like Karnataka and Maharashtra mark Hyderabad Mukti Diwas officially."

He alleged that political parties compromised with history for vote-bank politics, while the BJP government under Prime Minister Narendra Modi took the bold step three years ago to commemorate Telangana Liberation Day officially. He also recalled that Union Home Minister Amit Shah first organized the event on behalf of the Centre, ensuring rec-



ognition for Telangana martyrs.

Rajnath Singh noted that while the country celebrated independence on August 15, 1947, the Nizam resisted merger with India, sought support from Pakistan, and unleashed the Razakars, who committed atrocities including massacres, loot, and assaults on women. He said this dark history must never be forgotten.

Pledging BJP's commitment, Singh assured that in the coming years, Hyderabad Liberation Day will be celebrated as a state festival across every village and government institution in Telangana. Carbon Tax to Hurt Steel Exports to EU: Official

NEW DELHI Wakeup telangana

Steel secretary Sandeep Poundrik on Wednesday said that the European Union's (EU's) Carbon Border Adjustment Mechanism (CBAM) will impact Indian exports to the region, and the industry has to take measures to address this concern. The CBAM is designed to impose a carbon price on imports from countries with lower environmental regulations, initially covering iron and steel, aluminium, cement, fertilisers, electricity and hydrogen. The secretary said that the Indian steel industry is still predominantly using the blast furnace (BF-BOF) route, where the pollution or emission is higher. "In fact, the new capacities which are being added are still in the BF-

BOF route. So, that's an area of concern for the industry. There is capacity being added or existing in the electric blast furnace route, which is less carbon intensive. But, CBAM will impact Indian exports to Europe, and Indian industry will have to take measures to address that," he said.

The tariff is pegged to the carbon price in the EU emissions trading system (EU-ETS), which in 2026 is assumed at Rs 5,200 per tonne of CO2 equivalent, with a five per cent annual rise as free allowances in the EU are phased out. The limits of carbon emission, which are proposed in the CBAM, will definitely affect exports, the senior ministry official said in a session at 'FT Live Energy Transition Summit India' in the national capital.

cooperation, focusing on boosting production and technological capabilities, securing supply chains,

and driving innovation." "Closer cooperation on the Indo-Pacific, addressing hybrid threats, space security, and intensifying engagement on Russia's war against Ukraine, shadow fleets, and sanctions are other areas of focus," the EU said. **European Commission** (EC) President Ursula von der Leyen said, "Now is the time to focus on reliable partners and double down on partnerships rooted in shared interests and guided by common values. EVMs Set to Get Better Visibility

Starting from Bihar assembly polls, the Electronic Voting Machines (EVMs) will, for the first time, have colour photographs of the candidates along with their serial number displayed more prominently as the Election Commission of India (ECI) has revised the guidelines for the design and printing of EVM ballot papers to enhance their clarity and readability. The guidelines under Rule 49B of the Conduct of Elections Rules, 1961, have bee revised accordingly. ECI officials said the move is in line with the 28 initiatives already taken by the Commission in the past six months to streamline and improve

election processes and enhance convenience for voters.

"Henceforth, photographs of candidates will be printed in colour on the EVM Ballot Paper. The candidate's face will occupy three-fourths of the photo space for better visibility. Serial number, the name and photograph of the candidate shall be printed on the left-hand side and symbol on the right-hand side in the candidate panel. Serial numbers of candidates/NOTA will be printed in the international form of Indian numerals. The font size will be 30 and in bold for clarity. Photographs of the candidates shall be printed in colour (unless the candidate has provided only

black and white photo-

graphs). The candidate's face should occupy 3/4th of the space in the photograph," the ECI guidelines said.

The practice to use pho-

tographs on EVMs started 10 years ago with an aim to avoid confusion in constituencies where several candidates shared the same name or have similar sounding names. However, till now black and white photos were used. To ensure uniformity, the names of all candidates/NOTA will be printed in the same font type and font size large enough for easy readability. The EVM Ballot Papers will be printed on 70 GSM paper. For Assembly Elections, pinkcoloured paper of specified RGB values shall be used.

strengthen India's research and innovation ecosystem through wellstructured initiatives like the iDEX," said Debendra Pradhan, co-founder & CEO, Coratia Technologies.

The deep-tech robotics startup will supply and maintain its indigenously developed Underwater Remotely Operated Vehicles (UWROVs). The frugal design delivers advanced capabilities at significantly lower cost, marking India's first costefficient underwater robotics breakthrough, a statement from Coratia Technologies said.

"Induction of indigenous UWROVs not only reduces costs and reliance on foreign suppliers but also combats trade restrictions and tariff uncertainties. We're here to unlock new possibilities for defence preparedness

and supporting India's blue economy," Biswajit Swain, co-founder & CTO of Coratia Technologies,

Donald Trump has identified 23 nations, including China, Afghanistan, India, and Pakistan, as major drug transit or illicit drugproducing countries, warning that the manufacturing and trafficking of narcotics and precursor chemicals from these regions endanger the United States and its citizens. In a Presidential Determination submitted to Congress, Trump placed these countries on the "Majors List" of drug transit and production nations. The list includes Afghanistan, The Bahamas, Belize, Bolivia, Burma, China, Colombia, Costa Rica, the Dominican Republic, Ecuador, El Salvador, Guatemala, Haiti, Honduras, India, Jamaica, Laos, Mexico, Nicaragua,



Pakistan, Panama, Peru,

and Venezuela. According to the White House, the designation highlights the role these nations play in sourcing and transporting narcotics into the US. The State Department clarified that inclusion on the list does not necessarily indicate a lack of cooperation or enforcement but reflects geographic, economic, and commercial factors

that facilitate drug transit or production. Of the 23, five countries—Afghanistan, Bolivia, Burma, Colombia, and Venezuela-were cited for "failing demonstrably" to meet international counternarcotics commitments or to take adequate steps against drug trafficking. The US


China, labeling it the "world's largest source" of precursor chemicals used in illicit fentanyl production. He accused Chinese suppliers of fueling global epidemics of synthetic drugs like methamphetamine and nitazenes, pressing Beijing to take stronger measures against traffickers. On Afghanistan, Trump

noted that despite the Taliban's announced ban on

narcotics, drug stockpiles and methamphetamine production continue, with revenues funding transnational crime and terror-

He said Taliban members still profit from the trade, and the country remains on the list for failing to uphold drug control obligations.


The administration also linked narcotics trafficking to broader national security threats, stressing that fentanyl and synthetic opioids have created a public health emergency in the US, now the leading cause of death among Americans aged 18 to 44. Trump's determination underscored Washington's concern that transnational organized crime networks are exploiting weak enforcement and chemical flows abroad to worsen America's overdose crisis.







AMID GLOBAL FLUX, SELF-RELIANCE THE WAY FOR INDIA

The Trump-Putin Alaska meeting does not appear to have brought significant benefits to India. Although the meeting was held to resolve the Russia-Ukraine war issues, at a time when both the US and Russia are considered friendly nations by India, it is disappointing that there seems to be no indication of any change in the US tariff policies affecting India.

It appears the meeting was primarily aimed at securing economic advantages for Russia and the US in the coal and oil sectors, rather than resolving the Ukraine crisis. The ceasefire promise vanished from Trump's lips. When Russia insisted on a resolution, President Donald Trump predictably reverted to his usual habit of altering statements, which was diplomatically unsurprising to those familiar with his approach. With Trump and Putin revealing such tactics in Alaska, it is hard not to wonder if Ukraine is being sacrificed as a pawn. The emerging cordial atmosphere between the US and Russia might be seen by Prime Minister Narendra Modi as a potential relief for the economic pressures on India. Since India has always considered Russia a trustworthy friend, there is nothing wrong with the Prime Minister thinking along those lines. Reality of Alaska Summit However, the reality of the Alaska summit was quite different! While it may help restore US-Russia relations, it will clearly not improve ties with

India. Since Trump assumed the American presidency, efforts have been under way not only to enhance ties with Russia but also to boost Russia exports. Meanwhile, imports of Chinese oil from Russia are rising more than those from India —a fact no one can deny! While the US troubles India with tariffs, it simultaneously strengthens relations with Russia and ignores China's assertive actions — making it obvious that Washington looks down on India. America's double standards are evident: Trump repeatedly claims responsibility for a ceasefire between India and Pakistan, yet hosts grand dinners with Pakistan's Army Chief, showing excessive friendliness and granting wide publicity to such

HC Issues Warrants Against Rajanna Sircilla Collector In **Land Acquisition Case**

he Telangana High Court has issued warrants against the Rajanna Sircilla district collector for failing to comply with its earlier directions in a land acquisition dispute. Justice N.V. Shravan Kumar issued the warrants while hearing a petition filed by Velupula Yellaiah, whose house (No. 3-79) and land at Cheerlavancha village, Thangalapally mandal (erstwhile Sircilla mandal), Rajanna Sircilla district, were acquired in 2009. An award was passed in 2013 granting what was described as a meagre amount, allegedly without following due rules and procedure. The petitioner later filed an appeal. B. Arjun Rao, counsel for the petitioner, submitted that the petitioner, now 88 years old, was entitled to compensation under the Right to Fair Compensation and Transparency in Land Acquisition, Rehabilitation and Resettlement Act, 2013, as the earlier award violated provisions of the Land Acquisition Act, 1894. On June 30, 2025, the court had directed the collector to pay ₹7.07 lakh to the petitioner. However, the order

was not complied with. On September 3, Justice Shravan Kumar again directed the district collector and other officials to comply within two weeks, warning that they would otherwise have to appear before the court on September 17. Despite this, the collector neither complied with the order nor appeared in court.

HC Issues Warrants Against Rajanna Sircilla Collector Over Land Case

The Telangana High Court on Thursday issued bailable warrants against the Rajanna Sircilla district collector and the deputy collector of Land Acquisition for failing to comply with its earlier directions in a long-pending land acquisition dispute. Justice N.V. Shravan Kumar, while hearing a petition filed by 88-yearold Velupula Yellaiah, took serious note of the officials' non-compliance with repeated court orders. The petitioner's house (No. 3-79) and land at Cheerlavancha village, Thangalapally mandal, were acquired in 2009. An award passed in 2013 allegedly granted a meagre sum without following



due process. Arguing on behalf of Yellaiah, counsel B. Arjun Rao submitted that the petitioner was entitled to compensation under the Right to Fair Compensation and Transparency in Land Acquisition, Rehabilitation and Resettlement Act, 2013, as the earlier award violated the provisions of the Land

Acquisition Act, 1894. Taking note of the plea, the High Court on June 30, 2025, directed the collector to pay ₹7.07 lakh in compensation. However, the order was not implemented. On a subsequent hearing, Justice Shravan Kumar reiterated the directive and warned that failure to comply within two weeks would compel

the officials to appear before the court on September 17. Despite the clear warn-

Supreme Court Cancels Chhota Rajan's Bail In 2001 Murder Case **HYDERABAD**

The Supreme Court on Wednesday cancelled the bail of gangster Chhota Rajan, which was granted to him by the Bombay High Court in October 2024 in the 2001 murder of Jaya Shetty. Chhota Rajan, originally

Rajendra Sadashiv Nikalje, had been convicted and sentenced to serve life imprisonment in the said murder case in May 2024. Subsequently, on appeal, he was granted bail by the High Court.

A bench of Justices Vikram Nath and Sandeep Mehta issued the ruling on a plea filed by the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) that had sought cancellation of Chhota Ranjan's bail.

The Additional Solicitor General (ASG), SV Raju, appearing for CBI, submitted that Rajan has been convicted in four cases, which include two mur-

The top court also noted that Chhota Rajan had been on the run from authorities for a period of 27 vears.

Chhota Ranjan's counsel defended his client's case, claiming that there was no evidence against Rajan in the case..

The Court was of the view that the accused, Rajan, is a person with multiple convictions, and thus it was not inclined to grant relief to him.

"The man has four convictions; why suspension of sentence for such a man?" the top court asked Rajan's counsel. In response to the argu-

ment that Rajan has been acquitted in many cases, the Court stated that the reason for these acquittals is that witnesses against him did not come forward.



Welfare with Development, No Compromise: CM Revanth

Says, No Compromise on Krishna, Godavari Waters

Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy on Wednesday reiterated that his government was determined to balance welfare and development despite financial challenges, while addressing the Praja Palana Dinotsavam at Public Gardens, held to mark Hyderabad State's merger with the Indian Union in 1948. Beginning and ending his speech with "Jai Telangana," he drew a parallel between September 17, 1948, and December 7, 2023, calling both milestones in Telangana's democratic jour-

ney. He accused the previous BRS regime of authoritarianism and declared that the Congress government had restored democracy in the spirit of the armed struggle. On water resources, he assured that Telangana would not compromise on its rightful share, revealing a legal strategy to secure 904 TMC ft of Krishna waters and pledging to dedicate the Srisailam Left Bank Canal to the people by December 2027. Revanth highlighted welfare initiatives rolled out in the past 18 months: waiver of ₹20,616 crore in farm loans benefiting 25.35 lakh farmers,

under Rythu Bharosa within nine days, free power to 29 lakh farm motors at a subsidy cost of ₹16,691 crore, and a network of 7,178 procurement centres purchasing every grain of paddy with a ₹500 bonus on fine rice. Telangana produced 2.9 crore tonnes of paddy last year and is on track to cross 2.8 crore tonnes this year, he added.

The Chief Minister also emphasized social welfare and women's empowerment, citing the Indiramma Illu housing scheme with ₹22,500 crore sanctioned for 3,500 houses per constituency and Telangana's distinction as the only state to

provide free fine rice to 3.1 crore people. < He praised the Indira Mahila Shakti initiative, which enabled women's groups to profitably manage fuel stations and marts, with plans to expand such models. On education and jobs, he announced model schools, sports and skill universities, and filling of 60,000 government posts in 20 months. Revanth vowed to make Hyderabad drugfree, citing global recognition for Telangana Police. Concluding, he said governance rests on freedom, equality, and justice, with the goal that "every poor person must smile."

Reflecting on past welfare measures, he observed that earlier governments distributed land and funds to alleviate poverty, but such resources are now limited. "Except education, there is no weapon for poverty alleviation," he said, underlining education's central role in social development.

The Chief Minister further announced that education would feature prominently in the government's upcoming 'Telangana Rising 2047' vision document. He encouraged educationists to form sub-committees aligned with their interests and provide inputs to help draft a forward-looking framework.

"Transforming education is key not just to employability but to the overall development of Telangana," Revanth Reddy said, calling on all stakeholders to contribute ideas and collaborate in shaping a skilled, capable workforce for the future.

Focus on Welfare & Development: Minister Ponnam


