HC Adjourns Hearing on Kaleshwaram Commission Report to Nov 12

The Telangana High Court on Tuesday adjourned the hearing on the petitions filed over the Kaleshwaram Commission report to November 12. The state government sought additional time to file its counter-affidavit. The court directed former Chief Minister K. Chandrashekar Rao, former minister T. Harish Rao, former chief secretary S.K. Joshi, and senior IAS officer Smita Sabharwal to file their reply counters after the government submits its counter. The interim orders in the case have been extended until November 12.

Cabinet okays 4 multi-tracking railway projects worth Rs 24,634 crore

The Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs (CCEA), chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, on Tuesday approved four multi-tracking railway projects with an investment of Rs 24,634 crore across four states.

The four projects covering 18 districts across Maharashtra, Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat, and Chhattisgarh will increase the existing network of Indian Railways by about 894 kms.

The projects include Wardha-Bhusawal - 3rd and 4th line - 314 kms (Maharashtra); Gondia-Dongargarh - CONT:P4

T'gana People Will Reject Congress at Ballot: KTR

BRS working president K.T. Rama Rao on Tuesday predicted a decisive defeat for the Congress in the upcoming Jubilee Hills by election and local body polls, accusing the government of betraying public trust and mismanaging the state. He said the Congress' latest "betrayal" was the hike in RTC bus fares, alleging that Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy was laying the groundwork to privatise the Telangana State Road Transport Corporation (TGRTC). "The government is attacking the poor and middle classes through fare hikes and



rates. Why can't RTC own its electric buses instead of depending on private owners?" Rama Rao asked.

Highlighting public discontent, the BRS leader said people were angry with the Congress for neglecting Hyderabad's development. "In the past 22 months, not a single bridge or road has been built. The government

cannot even maintain existing roads," he said, adding that citizens were ready to teach the ruling party a lesson.

Rama Rao recalled that in

the previous Assembly elections, Congress had failed to win even one seat in Hyderabad, indicating BRS' strong urban support. Expressing confidence, he said BRS candidate Maganti Sunitha would win the Jubilee Hills seat with a comfortable majority.

He also criticised the government's "hasty" move to allot land for a Muslim graveyard in Jubilee Hills, which was later rejected by the Army, calling it a clear example of Congress' desperation before the polls.

Naveen Yadav Booked for Voter ID Distribution

Congress leader and Jubilee Hills Assembly ticket aspirant V. Naveen Yadav has been booked for allegedly influencing voters by distributing voter ID cards, violating the model code of conduct and the Representation of the People Act, 1951.

The action follows a complaint lodged by BJP MP M. Raghunandan Rao with the Telangana Chief Electoral Officer (CEO) on Monday. Rao demanded Yadav's disqualification if he filed a nomination.

On Tuesday, the CEO referred the complaint to the Election Commission of India (ECI) and directed Hyderabad police to register a case after finding prima facie evidence. Jubilee Hills election officer G. Rajinikanth Reddy had lodged a **CONT:P5**

Revanth Targets 25K Majority in JH Bypoll

Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy has reportedly set an ambitious target for the Congress to secure a majority of over 25,000 votes in the upcoming Jubilee Hills Assembly bypoll scheduled for November 11.

He has instructed party leaders to finalise the candidate selection process within the next two to three days, with a panel of four names — V. Naveen Yadav,

Bonthu Rammohan, M. Anjan Kumar Yadav, and C.N. Reddy — already forwarded to the party high command for approval. Sources said Revanth Reddy personally assessed the electoral strengths and grassroots support of each aspirant before sending the list. On Tuesday, he held a key strategy meeting with



AICC Telangana incharge Meenakshi Natarajan and TPCC president B. Mahesh Kumar Goud to discuss campaign strategies and finalise the party nominee.

Among the contenders, Revanth is said to favour Naveen Yadav,

Rammohan, and Reddy, while Anjan Kumar Yadav is being considered as a fourth option due to his recent defeat in the 2023 Musheerabad Assembly election and his son's elevation to the Rajya Sabha earlier this year.

Naveen Yadav, who previously contested from Jubilee Hills twice — as an

AIMIM candidate in 2014 and as an Independent in 2018 — joined the Congress in November 2023. Rammohan, the first GHMC Mayor (2016-2021), shifted from the BRS to the Congress in February 2024, while C.N. Reddy, a former BRS corporator from Rahmat Nagar, joined the party around the same time.

During the review meeting, Revanth Reddy analysed past electoral data, noting that BRS leader Maganti Gopinath had won the constituency with margins of 9,242 votes in 2014, 16,004 in 2018, and 16,337 in 2023.

Expressing confidence in a Congress victory, the Chief Minister predicted that a significant portion of the BRS vote base would likely move toward the ruling party in the forthcoming bypoll.

Rain-triggered landslide hits bus in Himachal; 15 killed

At least 15 passengers

were killed and three rescued as a private bus was hit by a rain-triggered landslide in Himachal Pradesh's Bilaspur, the home district of BJP national President J.P. Nadda, on Tuesday, officials said. The area has been witnessing intermittent rainfall since Monday. The bus was trapped under a massive landslip near Bhallupul in Jhanduta subdivision. As per reports, three children have been rescued alive and are being treated at the government hospital in Barthin and at AIIMS Bilaspur. Around 35 passengers were travelling in

wav from Marotan to Ghumarwin. State officials and machinery have been deployed to clear the debris, and a rescue operation has been underway to trace the missing passengers. Officials said 15 bodies have been recovered so far from the mangled remains of the bus.

Eyewitnesses said the mountain came crashing down on the bus, and the chances of survival for passengers are bleak. Chief Minister Sukhvinder Sukhu expressed grief over the incident and extended his condolences to the bereaved. He said that he is in constant touch with the district administration and has issued directives to

An unusual incident disrupted proceedings at the Supreme Court on Monday morning when a man dressed in a lawyer's robe attempted to throw an object at Chief Justice of India (CJI) B. R. Gavai. According to eyewitnesses, the individual shouted slogans inside the courtroom, declaring, "Sanatan Dharam ka apmaan nahi sahega Hindustan" ("India will not tolerate disrespect towards Sanatan Dharma"). Security personnel quickly intervened and escorted him

out, causing a brief pause in the hearing before normal proceedings resumed. Reports from lawyers present said the object appeared to be either a shoe or a roll of paper, though there was no confirmation. Despite the commotion, CJI Gavai remained composed and immediately restored order. Turning to the next advocate in line, he remarked, "Don't get distracted. We are not distracted by this."

SC Asks EC for Details of 3.66 Lakh Excluded Bihar Voters

The Supreme Court on Tuesday directed the Election Commission (EC) to provide details of 3.66 lakh voters excluded from the final electoral roll following Bihar's Special Intensive Revision (SIR) exercise. A bench comprising Justices Surya Kant and Joymalya Bagchi said the information should be submitted by Thursday, October 9, ahead of further hearings on petitions challenging the SIR pro-

The EC informed the apex court that most of the names added to the final list are of new voters, with only a few older names reinstated after the draft roll. Senior advocate Rakesh Dwivedi, representing the poll panel, stated that no complaint or appeal has been received so far from any excluded voter. Justice Bagchi emphasized that the court's orders had enhanced transparency in the electoral process. He noted that while the draft electoral roll had removed



about 65 lakh names due to deaths, migration, or duplication, the final list showed a net increase of 17.87 lakh voters compared to the draft. The bench stressed the need to clarify the identity of the "add-ons' to avoid confusion in the democratic process. "If names are deleted, please follow Rule 21 and the SOP, and make the data available in electoral offices," Justice Bagchi said. The EC's final electoral roll,

published on September 30, shows a reduction of nearly 47 lakh voters from 7.89 crore before the SIR, bringing the total to 7.42 crore. Of these, 21.53 lakh new voters were added, while 3.66 lakh names were removed. The draft list, issued on August 1, had already excluded 65 lakh names.

Announcing the Bihar Assembly poll schedule on October 6, the EC stated that elections will be held in 121 of the 243 constituencies on November 6, with the remaining 122 seats going to polls on November 11. Counting of votes is scheduled for November 14. The Supreme Court's call for detailed data highlights the judiciary's focus on ensuring transparency and accountability in the electoral process, particularly in the wake of extensive voter revisions in Bihar.

Telangana Govt Confident of 42% OBC Reservation

Telangana Chief Minister Revanth Reddy on Tuesday held a crucial meeting at his residence to discuss the Backwards Classes (BC) reservation issue, the Chief Minister's Office (CMO) said. The meeting was attended by Deputy Chief Minister Mallu Bhatti Vikramarka, State Congress in-charge Meenakshi Natarajan, PCC President Mahesh Kumar Goud, Ministers Ponnam Prabhakar, N. Supreme Court Chief Justice Targeted Urgent Investigation and Arrest Demanded

Allegations have emerged that Supreme Court Chief Justice Justice R.B. Gavai was directly threatened in a serious incident involving Supreme Court advocate Rakesh Kishore. Citizens and legal observers are demanding immediate investigation and arrest of the accused. The matter involves attempted assault, intimidation, and related legal violations that require urgent attention in the public and national interest. According to reports, the incident occurred in Kajuraho, Madhya Pradesh, following the desecration of a deity's idol at a local temple. The accused advocate allegedly attempted to assault Justice Gavai, issued threats in the courtroom, and made statements that invoked caste and religious sensitivities. These actions have prompted calls for criminal cases, including SC/ST atrocity violations, attempt to murder, and sedition, to be registered and prosecuted promptly.

prosecuted promptly. Given the seriousness of the attack on a sitting Chief Justice, the act is being viewed as a direct affront to the Constitution of India and the dignity of the judiciary. Authorities, including the state government and the Supreme Court Bar Council, are urged to take immediate steps to secure the victim, collect evidence, and ensure a thorough and independent investigation.

The public demand is clear: swift justice must be delivered, responsible parties must be held accountable, and legal safeguards must be reinforced to protect the integrity of the highest judicial office.

BRS leader Manne Krishank booked in 26th case ahead of local body polls

BRS social media convener Manne Krishank has alleged political vendetta after the Congress government filed yet another police complaint against him, which is the 26th since the party came to power.

The complaint, lodged at Borabanda Police Station, accuses Krishank of posting provocative comments on social media after the government hastily allocated 2,500 sq.yards of land for a Muslim cemetery in Alkapuri Colony of Jubilee Hills, just 48 hours before the election code was to be announced. However, the land was later taken over by the Defence authorities, claiming own-



ership. In his post on X earlier, Krishank accused Congress leader Faheem Qureshi of orchaestrating the land allocations, to cover up his land encroachment in the area. In response to the complaint by the Congress leaders on Tuesday, he said not on him, but a case should be booked against Congress leaders for cheating Muslims of Jubilee Hills. He questioned whether the move was a political

drama to woo Muslim voters in Jubilee Hills. He suspected that the police had acted in a biased manner by reviving old and dismissed cases from the Telangana movement period to brand him a "habitual offender" as part of a larger conspiracy to open a suspect rowdy sheet against him and intimidate opposition voices. "The Congress government is misusing the police machinery to silence criticism," he said.

They argued that the Waqf Board had denied ownership and that the land had never been classified as a graveyard prior to 1950. Hanumantha Naidu, one protestor, said, "Only three or four graves existed from 1938. The government has no right to use this as justification for the allotment."

Many women living in apartments such as Brigade Citadel and Kalpatharu voiced anger, citing disruption to their community. "We bought homes worth crores and now have to see dead bodies here? This land was a peaceful spot where peacocks roamed," said one resident.

The demand for a Muslim graveyard in Jubilee Hills emerged following the death of BRS MLA Maganti Gopinath. Authorities initially planned 2,500 square yards at Rehmat Nagar, but litigation forced them to shift the allotment to Erragadda the previous day, triggering the protests.

Kishan Assures Full Cotton Procurement In Telangana

Union minister for coal Reddy has assured cotton farmers in Telangana that the Centre will procure every kilogram of cotton they produce, guaranteeing a smooth and transparent procurement process this season. Reddy said he had personally requested Union Textiles Minister Giriraj Singh to ensure that farmers do not face any inconvenience during procurement operations. Highlighting last year's performance, he said the Cotton Corporation of India (CCI) had procured nearly 80 per cent of Telangana's total cotton output, reinforcing the Centre's commitment to safeguarding cultivators



even amid declining global prices. He emphasised that all payments will be credited directly to farmers' bank accounts to eliminate middlemen and ensure transparency. To streamline operations, a new mobile app has been launched to allot time slots for farmers to bring their produce to ginning mills, reducing congestion and waiting time. Kishan Reddy urged the Telangana government to educate farmers on reducing moisture content in cotton and suggested using MGNREGA funds to build drying platforms to improve quality and pre-

vent rejections. He pointed out that highdensity cotton planting could potentially triple farmers' income and questioned the state's delay in adopting improved seed varieties recommended by the Centre. "Farmers should maintain moisture levels below 12 per cent. Produce with slightly higher moisture should not be rejected outright but handled with guidance," he said. Reddy said the Centre had allocated sufficient funds, technology and infrastructure for operations across 122 procurement centres. "Modern moisture-measuring machines have been installed to ensure fair assessment," he said, appealing to farmers not to sell their produce to private traders at lower

KTR demands immediate formation of welfare board for auto drivers

BRS Working President KT Rama Rao on Tuesday called on the Congress government to immediately establish a welfare board for autorickshaw drivers in Telangana, accusing the State administration of betraying its promises. He pointed out that before the elections, the Congress party had assured several welfare schemes for auto drivers, including annual assistance of Rs 12,000 and in-

surance coverage, but "even after so many months, not a single driver has received any support."

Rama Rao cited Andhra Pradesh as an example of effective governance, where auto drivers are already receiving these benefits. "Why is Telangana lagging behind?" he asked, urging the State government to act without further delay. He also revealed that each driver in Telangana is now owed Rs 24,000 in pending welfare payments, highlighting the

severity of the financial neglect.

The demand came during Rama Rao's visit to Nampally Satish, an auto driver from Adavipadira village, who attempted suicide due to extreme financial distress. Satish, currently undergoing treatment at Ashwini Hospital in Yellareddypet, had consumed poison after failing to support his family. Rama Rao consoled the family and personally extended Rs 25,000 in financial assistance. "No family should



face such desperation due to government apathy," he said. Condemning the State government's silence despite being provided with details of over 93 auto drivers who had lost their lives due to economic hardship, Rama Rao questioned, "Is the death of 93 drivers not enough for

them to act? How many more schemes, construct new lives must be lost before they take responsibility?" He further criticised the Congress government for discontinuing the accident insurance scheme introduced during the previous BRS administration, which has left nearly 8 to 8.5 lakh drivers without any insurance cover-

Rama Rao also slammed the State government for borrowing over Rs 2.3 lakh crore but failing to implement any major welfare

roads, or launch new development projects. He accused the administration of ignoring the six major guarantees promised to the people, describing it as a betrayal of public trust. He warned that the lack of timely support is pushing many drivers into debt traps, forcing them into extreme distress and, in some cases, life-threatening situations.

Assuring auto drivers that the BRS would continue to stand by them, Rama Rao

urged auto unions and drivers across the State to unite and collectively demand that the Congress government fulfil its promises. He emphasised that the party would continue to highlight the plight of drivers and hold the government accountable for its inaction.

Rama Rao further announced that the BRS would organise awareness campaigns across districts to inform drivers of their rights and the promised welfare schemes.

Telangana High Court extends protection from arrest to KCR, Harish

Chief Justice Aparesh Kumar Singh and Justice GM Mohiuddin of the Telangana High Court on Tuesday extended the interim protection earlier granted to former Chief Minister K Chandrashekhar Rao, former Irrigation Minister T Harish Rao, former Chief Secretary SK Joshi, and senior IAS officer Smita Sabharwal in the writ petitions challenging the Justice PC Ghose Commission report on the Kaleshwaram Lift Irrigation Project.

The Court expressed displeasure over the delay in filing counteraffidavits by the State, noting that ample time had already been granted, and fixed October 7 for completing the pleadings. The Advocate General, appearing for the State, sought two more weeks to file the

counters. While allowing the request, the bench cautioned that the pleadings must be completed on the next date of hearing and granted the petitioners two weeks thereafter to file their replies, if necessary. The interim protection earlier granted to the petitioners will continue till the next date of hearing on November 12.

Ponguleti Briefs Kharge on Indiramma Housing Progress

The minister said that of the 4.5 lakh houses sanctioned for this year, construction of about 3.5 lakh houses is progressing at various stages under the scheme. Kharge, who is recuperating in Bengaluru, enquired about the implementation process, payment mechanisms, beneficiary selection, and the per-unit cost of houses under the Indiramma Housing Scheme.



Srinivas Reddy said that Telangana was the only state where the government has allocated Rs.5 lakh for each house, enabling beneficiaries to construct dwellings of not less than 400 sq. ft. He said that while other states depend largely on Central funds, Telangana has gone a step further by enhancing financial assistance to ensure better housing standards for the poor. The minister said that due to the lack of housing initiatives over the past decade, demand

for Indiramma houses has risen sharply. In the first phase, the government aims to construct 4.5 lakh houses across all Assembly constituencies, allocating 3,500 houses per constituency at an estimated cost of `22,500 crore. Beneficiary selection has been completed, and over two lakh houses are already under various stages of construction. Srinivas Reddy said Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy personally participated in the housewarming ceremonies of

several completed Indiramma houses last month. He added that payments to beneficiaries are being made directly into their bank accounts every Monday based on the progress of construction. The selection process is being carried out transparently, solely based on economic criteria, without any political bias.

The Multi-Signatory Accounts feature will enable multi-signatory or joint accounts on UPI that require authorisation from one or more signatories to perform UPI payments seamlessly.

Signatories can conveniently use any UPI app to manage linked bank accounts, making the process more convenient and hassle-free, and enhancing transaction speed.

This feature is fully interoperable, allowing initiators to use any UPI or bank apps, while signatories can approve

through any UPI or bank

The Small Value Transactions using Wearable Glasses via UPI Lite will allow users to complete hands-free and secure transactions by simply scanning a QR, authenticate and complete payments through voice on Smart Glasses, without needing a phone or entering a PIN.

UPI Lite is designed for small-value, highfrequency payments with enhanced success rates and minimal dependency on core banking infrastructure.

The solution is aimed at everyday payments such as retail, food, and transit, encouraging greater digital payment penetration. This new facility marks the first time UPI is extended to the wearable ecosystem, representing a step towards 'ambient payments' by enabling seamless digital payments.

Cabinet okays 4 multi-tracking railway projects worth Rs 24,634 crore

The Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs (CCEA), chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, on Tuesday approved four multi-tracking railway projects with an investment of Rs 24,634 crore across four states. The four projects covering 18 districts across Maharashtra, Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat, and Chhattisgarh will increase the existing network of Indian Railways by about 894 kms.

The projects include Wardha-Bhusawal - 3rd and 4th line - 314 kms (Maharashtra); Gondia-Dongargarh - 4th line - 84 kms (Maharashtra and Chhattisgarh); Vadodara-Ratlam - 3rd and 4th line -259 kms (Gujarat and Madhya Pradesh) and Itarsi-Bhopal - Bina 4th line – 237 kms (Madhya Pradesh), according to an official statement. The projects will enhance connectivity to around

3,633 villages with a population of about 85.84 lakh and include the two Aspirational Districts of Vidisha and Rajnandgao.

The new lines will provide seamless connectivity for movement of people, goods, and services and significantly improve the operational efficiency and service reliability for Indian Railways.

These multi-tracking pro-

posals are poised to streamline operations and alleviate congestion on the Indian Railway network. The projects are in line with PM Modi's vision of a New India which will make people of the region "Atmanirbhar" by way of comprehensive dewhich will enhance their employment opportunities, the statement said. The projects are planned in accordance with the PM-Gati Shakti National Master Plan with focus on enhancing multi-modal connectivity and logistics efficiency through integrated planning and stakeholder consultations. The project section also provides rail connectivity

to prominent destinations such as Sanchi, Satpura Tiger Reserve, Rock shelter of Bhimbetka, Hazara falls and Nawegaon National Park attracting tourists from across the country.

This is an essential route for transportation of commodities such as coal, container, cement, fly ash, foodgrain and steel. The capacity augmentation works will result in additional freight traffic of magnitude 78 MTPA (million tonnes per annum). The Railways being environment friendly and energy efficient mode of portation, will help both in achieving climate goals and minimizing logistics cost of the country,

Nitish govt's welfare schemes with Centre's support may offset anti-incumbency

For nearly two decades, Bihar Chief Minister Nitish Kumar has been one of the most enduring figures in the state. His tenure has been marked by a consistent emphasis on social justice, women's empowerment, and the upliftment of backward and marginalised communities. With the Union government's backing both financial and political – his government has rolled out a series of welfare schemes that have reshaped Bihar's social landscape.

As the state heads for another Assembly election, these welfare initiatives are expected to play a decisive role in shaping voter sentiment, where out of a total number of 7.4 crore voters, women comprise over 47 per cent and backward classes about 36 per cent. While most women electors have been supporting

the Nitish Kumar-led National Democratic Alliance (NDA) government for its efforts at helping their cause, the Union government has tried to fight anti-incumbency with a slew of its own initiatives. So far, 1.21 crore women in the state have received a total of Rs 12,100 crore under Bihar's Mukhyamantri Mahila Rojgar Yojana for starting a business, with more funds to be distributed as the model code of conduct does not apply to existing and running schemes. While launching the first instalment of the scheme on September 26, Prime Minister Narendra Modi stated how the two brothers – he and Nitish Kumar – are working together for the service, prosperity, and dignity of the women of Bihar. Starting with an initial financial support of Rs 10,000, the scheme can provide up to Rs 2 lakh, based on the success of the enterprise.

The Prime Minister shared how women in Bihar can now open shops selling groceries, utensils, cosmetics, toys, and stationery. They can also pursue livestock-related businesses such as cattle rearing and poultry farming. For all these ventures, necessary training will be provided. Women are also beneficiaries of Union government schemes like Jan Dhan Yojana, Lakhpati Didi, Mudra Yojana, Drone Didi campaign, Bima Sakhi campaign, and Bank Didi. Meanwhile, state initiatives like Mukhyamantri Balika Cycle Yojana, uniform and scholarship schemes for girls from backward and economically weaker families, have been supporting the youth. Moreover, the state government mandating 50 per cent reservation for women in local bodies has created a new generation of grassroots female leaders. This move not only gave women a political voice but also reshaped Bihar's governance culture. Nitish Kumar has also taken initiatives in setting up women's helplines and fast-track courts to address domestic violence.

India, Iran Strengthen Ties; Ambassador Iraj Elahi Bids Farewell

Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Iranian President Masoud Pezeshkian had met on the sidelines of the 16th BRICS Summit in Russia's Kazan in 2024, where the two leaders had discussed ways to further strengthen the bilateral ties. This was their first meeting since Pezeshkian assumed office in July, last year.

At least 15 passengers were killed and three rescued as a private bus was hit by a rain-triggered landslide in Himachal Pradesh's Bilaspur, the home district of BJP national President J.P. Nadda, on Tuesday, officials said. The area has been witnessing intermittent rainfall since Monday. The bus was trapped under a massive landslip near Bhallupul in Jhanduta subdivision. As per reports, three children have been rescued alive and are being treated at the government hospital in Barthin and at AIIMS



State officials and machinery have been deployed to clear the debris, and a rescue operation has been underway to trace the missing passengers. Officials said 15 bodies have been recovered so far from the mangled remains of the bus. Eyewitnesses said the mountain came crashing down on the bus, and the chances of sur-

vival for passengers are

bleak. Chief Minister Sukhvinder Sukhu expressed grief over the incident and extended his condolences to the bereaved. He said that he is in constant touch with the district administration and has issued directives to expedite relief and rescue operations.

The Chief Minister has ordered that the injured be immediately transported to hospitals and that adequate arrangements be made for their treatment.

Local administration,

police, and State Dis-

aster Response Force (SDRF) teams rushed to the spot to carry out rescue operations, which continued late into the night. Prime Minister Narendra Modi said he was saddened by the loss of lives in the mishap and announced an ex-gratia of Rs 2 lakh to the next of kin of those dead. BJP President Nadda expressed condolences to the bereaved families.



AMID GLOBAL FLUX, SELF-RELIANCE THE WAY FOR INDIA

The Trump-Putin Alaska meeting does not appear to have brought significant benefits to India. Although the meeting was held to resolve the Russia-Ukraine war issues, at a time when both the US and Russia are considered friendly nations by India, it is disappointing that there seems to be no indication of any change in the US tariff policies affecting India.

It appears the meeting was primarily aimed at securing economic advantages for Russia and the US in the coal and oil sectors, rather than resolving the Ukraine crisis. The ceasefire promise vanished from Trump's lips. When Russia insisted on a resolution, President Donald Trump predictably re-

verted to his usual habit of altering statements, which was diplomatically unsurprising to those familiar with his approach. With Trump and Putin revealing such tactics in Alaska, it is hard not to wonder if Ukraine is being sacrificed as a pawn. HC Sends Murder Convict Back To Jail

two-judge panel of the Telangana High Court dismissed a criminal appeal filed by an accused convicted for offences under Sections 302 and 307 of the IPC, which deal with murder and attempt to murder. The panel comprising Justice K. Surender and Justice J. Anil Kumar was dealing with the appeal filed by Kommu Anil. The appellant questioned his conviction for murder, in connection with the killing of four persons and injuries caused to two others in Karimnagar district in March 2012. He argued that there was no test identification parade and that the incident occurred in a sudden fight without premeditation, attracting Section 304 IPC, which covers culpable homicide not amounting to murder. The panel observed that the appellant stabbed six persons indiscriminately, killing four of them, and that the act was cruel and unusual. Holding that Exception 4 to Section 300 IPC, which applies to sudden fights without intent, did not cover the case, the panel dismissed the appeal and directed that the accused, who is on bail, be sent back to prison to serve the remaining sentence. A separate appeal by the state seeking to bar the accused's parole till his natural death was also dismissed, with the panel noting absence of any report from jail authorities that he misused bail or posed a continuing threat.

Congress Aspirant V. Naveen Yadav Booked for Voter ID Distribution

Congress leader and Jubilee Hills Assembly ticket aspirant V. Naveen Yadav has been booked for allegedly influencing voters by distributing voter ID cards, violating the model code of conduct and the Representation of the People Act, 1951.

The action follows a complaint lodged by BJP MP M. Raghunandan Rao with the Telangana Chief Electoral Officer (CEO) on Monday. Rao demanded Yadav's disqualification if he filed a nomination.

On Tuesday, the CEO re-

ferred the complaint to

the Election Commission



of India (ECI) and directed Hyderabad police to register a case after finding prima facie evidence. Jubilee Hills election officer G.
Rajinikanth Reddy had lodged a formal complaint with Madhuranagar police, enclosing

photographs and a report showing Yadav distributing voter ID cards. Madhuranagar police recorded the complaint, and Sub-Inspector G. Shiva Shankar has been assigned to investigate. Police said the cards distributed were e-cards generated through MeeSeva, not original **Electoral Photo Identity** Cards (EPIC), which only authorised election officials can issue. During the preliminary investigation, statements of eyewitnesses and circumstantial witnesses were recorded. Madhuranagar station house officer H. Prabhakar confirmed cases have been registered under Sections 170, 171, and 174 of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, and Sections 123(1) and 123(2) of the Representation of the People Act, covering offering gratification to influence voters, corrupt practices, bribery, and undue influence..

The Telangana High Court was not inclined to issue interim orders in a PIL challenging the state government's decision to impose Telugu as the mandatory second language in all schools in Telangana state. A division bench comprising Chief Justice Aparesh Kumar Singh and Justice G.M. Mohiuddin was of the view that there was no urgency to restrain the government, as counsel for the state government had submitted that the government was contemplating granting an exemption to students in Class 9 for the current academic year. The bench pointed out that no student was named as a petitioner in the PIL. Apart from that, the court

of the High Court had already had issued interim orders in the writ petition filed by some students, restraining the respective institutions from insisting that these students attend Telugu classes. The PIL was filed by Pramila Pathak of Hyderabad, questioning the implementation of the Telangana (Compulsory Teaching and Learning of Telugu in Schools) Act, 2018, and subsequent government orders issued in December 2024 mandating Telugu as a mandatory second language. The bench recorded the submission of special government pleader Rahul Reddy that exemptions had been granted to students of Classes 9 and 10 for the academic year 2024-25, and to Class 10 students.

HC Dimisses Writ Petition Seeking Considering a Building in Hyderabad as a Heritage Structure

In a significant ruling, the Telangana High Court has dismissed a writ petition seeking to declare a building in Begum Bazaar, Hyderabad — alleged to be the birthplace of former President of India Dr. Zakir Hussain — as a protected monument or heritage structure. Justice Laxmi Narayana Alishetty delivered the judgment while dealing

with the plea filed by Ghanshyam Bhati, who claimed that the authorities had failed to take steps to preserve the premises located at No. 15-6-214 to 220, Begum Bazaar.

The petitioner contended that Dr. Zakir Hussain, who went on to become the President of India, was born and lived in the said house for eight years, thereby making it a site of historical and cultural importance. He argued

that several newspaper reports had highlighted the building's heritage value, and even the Bahadurpura MLA had requested the concerned authorities to declare it a heritage site. Alleging that the building's owners were attempting to demolish the structure citing its dilapidated condition, Bhati urged the court to intervene and direct the government to preserve the property.

warranting heritage status. Further, they informed the court that no government notification had been issued under the 1981 Zoning Regulations to classify the structure as a heritage building.

Concluding that the petitioner had failed to provide sufficient evidence of the building's historical or architectural significance, the court dismissed the plea, ruling that he lacked the legal standing to seek such relief.

WFI suspends Olympic bronze medallist Aman

The explanation submitted by Sehrawat and subsequent clarifications from his support team were reviewed by the disciplinary committee, which deemed them unsatisfactory.

The committee also noted that Sehrawat had joined the preparatory camp in Porec, Croatia, 18 days before his scheduled bout on September 14, giving him ample time to maintain his weight and fitness levels in accordance with regulations.

US Student Visas for Indians Plunge Over 44%

he number of Indians securing US student visas has witnessed a dramatic plunge, diving by over 44 per cent in August 2025, according to data released on Monday. This marks the steepest drop among all countries and signals a major shift in global student mobility trends, with China now surpassing India as the leading source of US student visas. The International Trade Commission reported that the US issued a total of 313,138 student visas in August — a critical month for university admissions — which reflects a 19.1 per cent decline compared to the previous year.

India, which was the largest contributor of international students to the US last year, experienced a staggering 44.5 per cent reduction in visa issuances, which equaled 42,666. In contrast, China received 86,647 visas, more than double the number issued to Indian applicants, underscoring a significant geopolitical change.

Several factors under the Trump administration's immigration crackdown have fueled this sharp decline. Stricter visa policies targeting student inflows, increased H-1B visa fees affecting Indian technology workers, and tighter regulations around visa applications outside US consulate jurisdictions have all contributed to the downturn. Additionally, enhanced scrutiny of applicants with academic backlogs and escalating political tensions between the US and India have further strained longstanding educational exchange relations.



In a letter to the Chief Minister, Mirza urged the government to provide immediate compensation to the affected families and rehabilitate them. "Being the grandson of Prince Moazzam Jah, I feel deeply concerned and anguished as devastating floods struck the city dwellers," he wrote. He said the "sudden and large-scale" release of water from the reservoir on the night of September 26 had led to widespread flooding across multiple areas downstream, directly impacting over 10,000 families. "The absence of prior warnings, inadequate coordination between civic agencies, and failure of earlywarning systems have resulted in irreparable loss of property and livelihoods. This tragic incident has exposed serious lapses in flood management, disaster

preparedness, and administrative accountability," he

SLBC Tunnel Works to be Resumed by December 2027: Uttam

Telangana Irrigation and Civil Supplies Minister Capt N. Uttam Kumar Reddy on Tuesday reiterated the State Government's commitment to completing major irrigation projects with strict adherence to deadlines, technical transparency, and institutional accountability.

Speaking after a detailed review with senior officials at the Dr B. R. Ambedkar Telangana Secretariat, Uttam said the Thummidihetti barrage under the Pranahita-Chevella Sujala Sravanthi Project, the Srisailam Left Bank Canal (SLBC) tun-

rages under Kaleshwaram are top priorities. He noted that engineering teams were reviewing two alternative alignments for the Thummidihetti canal, with the final decision expected by October 22. One option involves a 71.5-km gravity canal with a 14-km tunnel from Mylaram, while the second diverts water via Yellampalli with an intermediate pumping station. Comparative analysis considering cost, hydraulic efficiency, topography, and energy requirements is underway, and the Cabinet will approve the preferred align-

nel, and Medigadda, An-

naram, and Sundilla bar-



On SLBC, Uttam reaffirmed the government's goal to complete the 43km tunnel by December 2027. Fortnightly progress reviews are being held, and aerial magnetic surveys by NGRI will map underground rock formations to guide alignment adjustments, ensuring safer and efficient tunneling. He described the tunnel as a

"lifeline project" for southern Telangana districts, connecting the Srisailam reservoir to drought-prone regions. Restoration of Medigadda, Annaram, and Sundilla barrages is being undertaken strictly as per NDSA recommendations, with a premier IIT and the State's Chief Design Organisation handling structural design, testing, and

Pre-monsoon assessments are complete, and postmonsoon verification will follow. Weekly progress reviews and detailed technical documentation will ensure accountability, with safety remaining the

rehabilitation planning.

top priority. The Minister also reviewed ongoing legal proceedings in KWDT-II, water allocation for Sammakka-Sarakka, investment-clearance applications for Seethamma Sagar, Modikuntavagu, Chanaka–Korata, and Chinna Kaleshwaram projects, as well as Devadula Project progress. Two held for attempting to rob man at Shalibanda
