#### **PM Modi to Launch Agriculture Projects** Worth Over ₹42,000 Cr

Prime Minister Narendra Modi will launch and lay the foundation of projects and schemes worth over ₹42,000 crore in the agriculture and allied sectors on Saturday. The Prime Minister will inaugurate two major schemes with a combined outlay of ₹35,440 crore. This includes the PM Dhan Dhaanya Krishi Yojana (₹24,000 crore), aimed at boosting agricultural productivity, promoting crop diversification and sustainable practices, enhancing post-harvest storage at panchayat and block levels, improving irrigation CONT:P4

#### **UK ex-PM Rishi Sunak Cleared for Paid Advisory Roles**

Britain's former prime minister Rishi Sunak has been cleared by a UK government watchdog to take on part-time paid advisory roles with tech giant Microsoft and AI firm Anthropic, both based in the US. Sunak, who is now a backbench Conservative Party MP for Richmond and Northallerton, had approached the Advisory Committee on Business Appointments under the government's "Business Appointment Rules Former Ministers".

# EC Sets 750g Rule for Biryani in Polls

**HYDERABAD** Wakeup telangana

As the Jubilee Hills Assembly bye-election approaches, the Hyderabad District Election Authority has laid out unusually detailed guidelines to ensure compliance with the Model Code of Conduct (MCC) — right down to the weight of a biryani plate. Each plate of mutton biryani served at campaign events must weigh exactly 750 grams and be priced at ₹180, while chicken biryani must cost ₹170 for the same quantity. Candidates are required to maintain bills and records as proof of expenditure, which must be submitted regularly to

Under Election Commission of India (ECI) norms, all expenses must be meticulously logged in an official register, with expenditure statements submitted every three days from the date of nomination.

The rules apply not only to catering services but also to food prepared and served by party volunteers, placing the full responsibility of compliance on the contesting candidates.

The fixed price list extends beyond non-vegetarian dishes. Egg biryani is capped at ₹135 per plate, vegetarian biryani at ₹115, veg meals at ₹80, and pulihora at ₹40. Snacks and beverages also have set prices — a large samosa is ₹10, a

small one ₹3, coffee ₹11. and tea ₹10. A plate of idli (four pieces) or wada (two pieces) is priced at ₹20 each.

Interestingly, despite inflation, the ECI continues to follow the 2014 price list, leaving many accountants juggling old rates with present-day

Additionally, there has been little upward revision in rates for hiring vehicles or function halls, further tightening campaign budgets.

With poll heat rising in Jubilee Hills, candidates are discovering that success in this high-profile contest may depend as much on keeping the biryani within 750 grams as on winning over the voters.

Supporting the Election Commission's Special Intensive Revision (SIR) drive, Union home minister Amit Shah on Friday said that the inclusion of infiltrators in the voters' list "pollutes the spirit of the Constitution" and asserted that the Centre would continue to follow its long-standing policy of "detect, delete and deport" in dealing with such cases. Delivering a lecture in memory of former editor-in-chief Narendra Mohan of a leading Hindi daily, on the topic "Infiltration (Ghuspaith), Demographic Change and Democracy," the home minister said that voting rights must be reserved exclusively for Indian citizens.

#### SC Reserves Order on TVK's Plea to Set Up SIT

The Supreme Court on Friday reserved its order on a plea filed by Tamil actor Vijay's political party, Tamilaga Vettri Kazhagam, and others, challenging the Madras High Court order directing that an SIT be constituted to probe the Karur stampede in which 41 people were killed. A bench comprising Justices J K Maheshwari and N V Anjaria heard submissions from senior counsels appearing for the party, victims, Tamil Nadu government and others.

On Tuesday, the CJIheaded bench agreed to hear BJP leader Uma Anandan's plea challeng-

ing the high court order refusing a CBI probe into the September 27 stampede. BJP leader from Tamil Nadu, G S Mani, has also filed a petition seeking a CBI probe into the stampede. The TVK has sought an independent investigation under the supervision of the Supreme Court, contending that a fair and impartial probe would not be possible if conducted solely by officers of the Tamil Nadu Police.

The plea has objected to the high court constituting a special investigation team (SIT) only with officers of the Tamil Nadu Police. It alleged the possibility of a pre-planned conspiracy by some miscreants that led to the stampede. The plea also took exception to the scathing remarks of the high court against the party and the actor-politician that they abandoned the place after the incident and did not express any remorse.

#### **Nobel Peace Prize Winner Dedicates Award to Trump**



Nobel Peace Prize laureate, Venezuelan opposition leader, Maria Corina Machado, said Friday that her compatriots were counting on the United States to help achieve freedom from the authoritarian rule of President Nicolas Maduro. "This immense rec-

#### Banakacharla Gets a Maharashtra Block — a project Telangana has

In a major development that could significantly bolster Telangana's opposition to Andhra Pradesh's proposed Banakacharla project, Maharashtra has written to the Union Jal Shakti Ministry challenging AP's plan to divert Godavari waters to the Krishna basin.

On October 8, the Maharashtra government told the ministry that if any lower riparian state such as Andhra Pradesh is allowed to use "flood" or "all waters" of the Godavari, then upper riparian states — including Maharashtra itself — reserve the same right. This stance directly complicates Andhra Pradesh's proposal to divert 243 tmc ft of floodwater annually from the Polavaram dam on the Godavari to the Banakacharla regulator on the Srisailam Right Main Canal of the Krishna river

staunchly opposed. While Maharashtra's letter did not name Telangana, it referred to Andhra Pradesh as "the then unified AP," making clear that any fresh use of Godavari waters must be reviewed in light of the interests of Maharashtra, Chhattisgarh, and Odisha — the upper riparian states.

Maharashtra cited the 1980 Godavari Water Disputes Tribunal (GWDT) award, which granted it rights over "all waters" at various projects in the state, including floodwaters. The state asserted that before appraising any flood-based project like Polavaram-Banakacharla, the Centre must first determine the upper riparian states' entitlement to floodwaters.



The minister said the Congress government was committed to ensuring prosperity for handloom weavers, who play a key

role in the scheme. He said the scheme requires 4.34 crore metres of fabric for the production of 64.69 lakh saris, of which 3.65 crore metres had already been woven by powerloom workers. So far, 33.35 lakh saris have been supplied to district warehouses under

weavers have gained six to eight months of steady employment under this programme, earning monthly wages between Rs 18,000 and Rs 22,000. Minister Nageswara Rao directed officials to complete the production and supply of sarees to district godowns by November 15 to ensure timely distribution. He also instructed them to expedite the handloom weavers' loan

TSCO's supervision.

About 6,900 handloom

waiver process, with verification to be completed soon so that funds could be credited directly to beneficiaries' accounts. Around 6,780 weavers will benefit from a loan waiver of up to Rs 1 lakh each.

The minister said the government had launched the Telangana Handloom label to promote quality handloom products under a unified state brand. Under the 'Nethanna Bhima' and 'Nethanna

Bharosa' schemes, Rs 48.80 crore has been allocated this year to provide incentives, which include Rs 18,000 to each weaver and Rs 6,000 to associated workers, in two instalments annually. Nageswara Rao said 13,371 weavers have registered under the Nethanna Bharosa scheme so far, while another 3,966 applications are under scrutiny. About 18,000 weavers are expected to benefit from the scheme.

# Harish Rao Demands Rescue of Gulf Workers

Former Minister Harish Rao has called on Telangana Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy and Union Ministers G. Kishan Reddy and Bandi Sanjay to take immediate action to bring back 12 Gulf workers from Jordan, who are stranded while seeking employment abroad. Rao described the situation as "shameful," highlighting that despite repeated appeals, both the central and state governments have ignored the plight of these migrant workers. The stranded individuals, hailing from Nirmal, Kamareddy, Nizamabad, Jagtial, and Siddipet, are facing severe hardships, including lack of money for survival, and

their employer has not granted permission for their return.

"The government has a responsibility to support its citizens

abroad," Rao said, noting that while migration had slowed during the BRS regime, it has now increased due to local employment shortages, forcing many to seek work in Gulf countries.

Rao also criticized the Congress party, accusing it of failing to fulfill promises regarding the welfare of Gulf workers and NRIs. "The advisory committee, NRI Welfare Board, and Gulf Welfare Board mentioned in the manifesto are inactive, and the toll-free helpline for migrant workers is still not functioning," he said. He urged the authorities to take immediate steps to ensure the safe return of the stranded workers and address the broader welfare needs of Gulf migrants.

### Congress Plays Caste Card to Regain Lost Ground in Jubilee Hills Bypoll

The Congress has launched an intensive caste-based campaign strategy to reclaim the Jubilee Hills Assembly seat, where a bypoll is scheduled for November 11 following the death of sitting BRS MLA Maganti Gopinath in June. The party has fielded V. Naveen Yadav, a Backward Classes (BC) leader from the Yadav community, in a calculated bid to consolidate the BC vote the largest share of the constituency's electorate. Of the 3.99 lakh voters in Jubilee Hills, 1.4 lakh belong to the BC community, while Muslims account for 1.12 lakh. Scheduled Castes number 28,000, Scheduled Tribes 12,000, and voters from

other states 35,000.

Among the general voters (66,000), Reddys constitute 13,500, Kammas 17,500, Kapus and Balijas 14,200, and Velamas and Marwadis about 12,000.

Christians and other minorities total around 22,000.

Within the BC segment, Munnuru Kapus dominate with 22,000 voters, followed by Yadavs

(15,000), Goudas (15,000), Vishwabrahmanas (13,000), Kummaris (9,600), and Rajakas and others (13,000). Among the Scheduled Castes, Malas (15,000) and Madigas (13,000) form key blocs. To strengthen its caste arithmetic, the Congress high command has appointed three ministers—

(15,000), Mudirajs

(12,000), Vadderas

(13,500), Padmashalis

Ponnam Prabhakar, Tummala Nageswara Rao, and Gaddam Vivek — as bypoll incharges. The trio has conducted a microlevel study of voter demographics to design a targeted outreach plan focusing on communitybased mobilization. The party has begun door-to-door campaigns and booth-level interactions to highlight welfare initiatives introduced by the Revanth Reddy government, aligning schemes with the aspirations of various caste groups. "Our campaign is focused on caste-based and community-specific outreach to secure a decisive swing in our favour," said party sources. The Congress' move is seen as an attempt to reverse its losses in the

2014, 2018, and 2023 As-

sembly elections, when

Jubilee Hills remained a BRS stronghold. The ruling party is banking on Naveen Yadav's BC credentials to counter the BRS candidate Maganti Sunitha, widow of the late MLA and a member of the Kamma community. The BJP, meanwhile, has not yet announced its candidate.

As per the final voter rolls released by the Election Commission, Jubilee Hills has 3.99 lakh voters, marking a 3.49% increase from 3.85 lakh in 2023. The revised list adds 6.976 new voters and deletes 663 names. With caste alliances, welfare politics, and micro-targeted mobilization shaping the contest, the upcoming Jubilee Hills bypoll is poised to be a battle of social coalitions and legacy loyalties.

#### Vinod Kumar slams Congress over BC reservations

Former MP B. Vinod Kumar criticized Congress for its "insincere" stance on BC reservations in Telangana following the High Court's stay on local elections GO No. 9. He said no one in the state believed Chief Minister Revanth Reddy's assurances, and people had already anticipated that elections would not be held during the Dussehra festival.

Vinod Kumar noted that



while Bhatti Vikramarka criticized both BJP and BRS, only BJP deserved scrutiny. He defended BRS, pointing out that KCR had already passed a BC reservation bill in the assembly in 2011, which remains pending at the Centre. He contrasted this with Congress' history,

citing the constitutional amendment for Indira Gandhi and the lack of action for BCs despite Supreme Court rulings, including the Krishnamurthy case.

He questioned why Rahul Gandhi and other Congress leaders had not raised BC reservation is-

sues in Parliament and criticized the party's "deceitful words." He also challenged BJP for not amending the Constitution to increase BC quotas, despite having amended it for other interests and bypassing Supreme Court orders on the BC caste census. Vinod Kumar called for Congress and BJP to include BC reservations in the Ninth Schedule, saying BRS would cooperate, and urged an end to political theatrics that exploit BC

#### Ram Koti Joins Telangana Jagruti, BC Fight Intensifies

Prominent Backward Classes (BC) leader Ram Koti from Mansurabad in LB Nagar constituency joined Telangana Jagruti on Friday, along with more than 350 activists, at the Jagruti office in Banjara Hills.

Telangana Jagruti President Kalvakuntla Kavitha led discussions with BC leaders and UPF representatives on key issues, including the 42% reservation for BCs in local bodies, the High Court stay on GO 9, and



the State Election Commission gazette suspending local body elections. Strategies and movement activities to secure BC reservations

were also deliberated.

Speaking at the event, Kavitha emphasized the need for persistent struggle: "Joining Jagruti is like celebrating Bathukamma; similarly, you must fight with determination." She criticized the current government for failing to deliver on promises to women and children, including the Rs. 2,500 monthly support for girls, the KCR kits for childbirth, and gold for poor children's marriages, and stressed the importance of fighting for BC rights and employment.

Maharashtra insisted that the total planned use of all projects — not just the current utilisation must be factored in to calculate available water. Crucially, Maharashtra also linked the issue to the Krishna Water Disputes Tribunal-I (KWDT-I), which governs water-sharing between Maharashtra, Karnataka, and Andhra Pradesh. Since Andhra intends to transfer Godavari water into the Krishna basin, both Maharashtra and Karnataka would gain a legitimate claim to por-

tions of the diverted flow. Citing precedent, Maharashtra recalled that when 80 tmc ft of Godavari water was diverted earlier to the Krishna delta, Karnataka and Maharashtra were allotted 14 and 21 tmc ft respectively, leaving 45 tmc ft for Andhra (including Telangana). Applying the same logic, the 243 tmc ft diversion under the new project would similarly need to be proportionally shared among the three states.

The move by Maharashtra thus places Andhra's Banakacharla project under fresh scrutiny — while offering Telangana a significant legal and policy breather in its ongoing battle to protect its rightful share of the Godavari's waters.

### Misty Mornings, Clear Skies for Hyderabad

The India Meteorological Department (IMD) Hyderabad has issued a yellow alert for several Telangana districts, forecasting thunderstorms, lightning and squalls until October 13. The alert covers Bhadradri-Kothagudem, Khammam, Mahabubabad and Mulugu districts, where thunderstorm activity is expected from after-

noon to night through the weekend. According to the IMD, these regions are likely to experience scattered heavy spells, while most other parts of the state, including Hyderabad, will remain largely dry until Monday. Lightning and squalls may occur in isolated pockets. Hyderabad experienced its first cool morning of the season on Thursday, with the University of Hyderabad recording 18.4°C and BHEL registering

19.8°C. Minimum temperatures in several districts, including Vikarabad, Sangareddy, Medak, Kamareddy, Adilabad, and Asifabad. ranged between 17°C and 19°C. Weather analyst T. Balaji said the state is currently experiencing a short cool spell. "More cold mornings are expected over the next few days before rainfall returns after October 14," he said. The IMD has urged residents in thunderstorm-prone areas to remain indoors during lightning activity and avoid open fields and elevated places. Hyderabad is likely to see misty mornings and clear skies through the weekend before intermittent rains make a comeback next

#### BJP Blames Congress For BC Quota Stay

The BJP blamed the Congress government for the High Court stay on 42 per cent BC reservations in local body polls, calling it proof of the administration's incompetence and deceit. It said the Congress had misled the public with false promises while implementing contradictory schemes like fare hikes and free bus travel for women. At a meeting of party leaders from GHMC and HMDA limits in Bhagyanagar, BJP Telangana president N. Ramchander Rao said both Congress and BRS had failed Hyderabad by neglecting basic civic infrastructure.<

"They promised a worldclass city but left it with



potholes, overflowing drains and flooding," he said. He recalled recent deaths of children who fell into open manholes and others electrocuted during the rains, describing them as tragic examples of civic collapse. He also accused Congress and BRS of "competing to ally with the Majlis party for vote-bank politics" and vowed that the BJP would expose their "secret deals" with AIMIM during the campaign. Rao said Hyderabad deserved better governance, accountability and infrastructure, not "empty slogans from corrupt parties."

### BJP Prepares for Jubilee Hills By-Poll, Targets Congress and BRS Governments

BJP President N. Ramchander Rao on Friday asserted that the people of Telangana are ready to support the party in the upcoming elections. Addressing party leaders from eight districts of Hyderabad under GHMC jurisdiction at the BJP office, Rao outlined strategies for the Jubilee Hills Assembly by-election. He emphasized the importance of collective work, boothlevel coordination, and un-

ified effort among leaders and activists to ensure a BJP victory.

Rao sharply criticized the previous BRS government, alleging it had promised to transform Hyderabad into a "World City" but instead turned it into a "City of Tragedy." He said the current Revanth Reddy-led government also failed in planning, citing the state's inability to address emergency needs during floods and heavy rains. Rao accused the Congress government of neglecting infrastructure

development, including poor maintenance of main roads, drainage systems, and city roads, asserting that both Congress and BRS have consistently ignored Hyderabad's development.

He highlighted public safety concerns, recalling incidents where children died due to open manholes and six people lost their lives to electrocution in Ramanthapur, attributing these tragedies to government negligence. Rao alleged that Congress and BRS were attempting to align with AIMIM purely for vote-



bank politics and called for exposing the "dark ties and secret agreements" between the three parties.

On public transport, Rao criticized the government's

contradictory policies, pointing out that while free bus travel for women was being announced, RTC bus fares were simultaneously increased, placing a financial burden on common citizens. He also condemned the BRS regime for neglecting RTC employees, saying unresolved issues and poor working conditions led to employee suicides during strikes.

Rao accused the Congress party of continuing an anti-Hindu agenda, citing recent attempts to allocate Defence Ministry land for a Muslim graveyard in Hyderabad while allegedly threatening the existence of Hindu temples. He argued that Hindus lack protection under the current administration and stated that neither Congress nor BRS has a moral right to comment on development in Jubilee Hills.

He underlined that the BJP candidate for the Jubilee Hills by-election would be announced in the next two to three days and called upon all party leaders and workers to ensure a BJP victory in the

constituency. Rao framed the victory as a gift to Prime Minister Narendra Modi, urging activists to work collectively and strategically to achieve this goal.

The party chief's remarks reflected BJP's intent to capitalize on public dissatisfaction with Congress and BRS, emphasizing governance failures, corruption, and neglect of citizens' safety and infrastructure, while positioning the BJP as the party capable of delivering development and accountable governance.

### Power Utilities Prepare To Meet Rising Demand In Telangana

HYDERABAD Wakeup telangana

With power demand rising steadily, Telangana's Southern Power Distribution Company Limited (TGSPDCL, southern discom) and Transmission Corporation (Transco) have launched an extensive upgrade drive to ensure an uninterrupted electricity supply during the upcoming summer. At a review meeting held at the corporate office, Southern discom CMD Musharraf Faruqui stressed the need for advance preparation, noting that peak demand is expected to increase from 19,500 MW to 20,000 MW next year, with Greater Hyderabad alone projected to touch 5,000 MW.

To meet this surge, the utilities



will install 3,866 new distribution transformers (DTRs) and upgrade 431 power transformers (PTRs) across the southern network. For the first time in Telangana, 1,000 kVA transformers will replace existing 500 kVA units operating beyond 70 per cent capacity, mainly in Greater Hyderabad. Additionally, high-capacity 16 MVA power transformers will be set up

at key substations in Jubilee Hills, Madhapur, Manikonda, Gachibowli and other high-load zones to handle growing urban demand efficiently and address space constraints.

Faruqui directed officials to coordinate closely with field engineers, conduct detailed assessments in high-demand areas and finalise implementation plans within a week. He instructed that repair and maintenance works begin by the end of October and all summer action plan works be completed before December. Transco directors Sampath Kumar and Latha Vinod, southern discom directors Dr Narasimhulu and Shivaji, and several chief engineers and superintending engineers attended the meeting.

### Adilabad's Mahua Laddus Become Popular After Modi's Endorsement

The Mahua Laddu of Adilabad has received remarkable boost in popularity and sales after an unexpected endorsement from Prime Minister Narendra Modi. Sales of the laddus surged several times over after the Prime Minister spoke about Mahua Laddus made by Adivasi women during his Mann Ki Baat address in March 2025. Adivasis consider the Mahua tree and its flowers sacred and refrain from cutting it. The laddus, prepared using jaggery, sesame, cashew nuts, cardamom (yala-



kulu), and dried Mahua flowers (ippa puvvu), have become a sought-after nutritious delicacy in Telangana for their distinctive taste and quality. Following the Prime Minister's mention, demand skyrocketed, with online orders pouring in from Hyderabad, Karimnagar, Warangal, and Vijayawada. The local Mahila Sangam, which

produces the laddus, is also supplying them to tribal hostels. Members of the Sangam expressed joy and pride over the Prime Minister recognising their work. Kumram Bagu Bai, president of the Adivasi Bheem Bai Sahakara Sangam, which has 14 women engaged in making Mahua Laddus, said that daily counter sales had risen from 7 kg to about 60 kg since the Prime Minister's remarks. "We now sell around 2,000 kg of Mahua Laddus every month," she said, adding that the laddus are supplied to 60 government hostels across the erstwhile Adilabad district to improve students' nutrition.

The laddus are sold under the brand Adivasi Aharam at ₹400 per kg, compared to ₹200 in 2019. Bagu Bai explained that production costs have increased because they began using higher-quality ingredients like cashew nuts, cardamom, and jaggery to enhance flavour and nutrition. The Sangam directly procures dried Mahua flowers from Adivasi farmers in nearby villages. "We purchased 100 quintals of dry Mahua recently, paying ₹50 per kg, to meet rising demand," she said.

### BC Leaders Slam Arvind, BRS

Telangana leaders supporting Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy on the Backward Classes (BC) reservation issue on Saturday accused BJP and BRS figures, including MP Dharmapuri Arvind and MLC Balmoor Venkat, of betraying BC interests and obstructing passage of the BC bill. The leaders demanded urgent action in Delhi to secure approval and warned that continued opposition would provoke strong

public anger.

The speakers claimed Arvind's criticisms of the state government over Kaleshwaram and alleged phone tapping were opportunistic and came too late.

He called on BC organisations and intellectuals to unite and expose both Congress and BRS for their deception. BJP Telangana vice president Dr Kasam Venkateshwarlu said the Congress government's poor legal understanding had created uncertainty over BC reservations. He contrasted it with Tamil Nadu's Ambashankar Commission, which relied on scientific surveys, and said Congress was hiding caste census data to escape accountability.

PM Modi will inaugurate projects worth over ₹5,450 crore in agriculture, animal husbandry, fisheries, and food processing sectors, while laying the foundation stone for projects valued around ₹815 crore. Key projects include Artificial Insemination Training Centers in Bengaluru and J&K, IVF Lab in Assam under the Rashtriya Gokul Mission, milk powder plants in Mehsana, Indore, and Bhilwara, a fish feed plant in Tezpur, Assam, and infrastructure for agro-processing clusters, integrated cold chains, and value addition facilities.

### Maratha Quota Order Limited to Hyderabad Gazette: Bawankule

**MUMBAI** Wakeup telangana

In a major announcement, Maharashtra revenue minister Chandrashekhar Bawankule on Friday made it clear that the order issued by the State Government regarding the Maratha reservation is limited only to the Hyderabad Gazette. Bawankule, who is also the chairman of the cabinet OBC sub-Committee, said, "Confusion is being created that injustice is being done to the OBC communities in Maharashtra by creating a ruckus against State Government's decision. But the government order is limited only to the Hyderabad Gazette. The State Government's GR, issued on September 2, allows Marathas, who can prove their Kunbi lineage through old records such as the Hyderabad gazetteer, to apply for Kunbi caste certif-

icates. Following this, the

Maharashtra government

has also begun implement-

ing the Gazette Resolution allowing Marathas who can prove Kunbi lineage to apply for OBC certificates. However, OBC communities have strongly opposed the GR contending that granting Kunbi certificates to Marathas will effectively include them in the OBC category, reducing reservation benefits for existing OBC communities. The OBC communities led by Congress leader Vijay Wadettiwar on Friday also staged a large morcha in Nagpur demanding higher reservation, following the Telangana model. During the morcha, Wadettiwar challenged the state government saying "If you have the will, increase the OBC quota to 42% like Telangana. Come what may, we will protect the OBC quota and will not allow it to be diluted." The Congress leader claimed that the state government's move effectively gives Marathas 'backdoor entry' into the OBC

quota. "This decision is unjust and discriminatory. We will fight it both legally and through street protests," he

Commenting on it, Bawankule said, "The government, while issuing GR, has taken care that no person should be deprived of OBC reservation. It has made every effort to protect the interests of 353 castes of OBCs. The Mahayuti government is committed to protecting the rights of OBCs." In a setback to the OBCs, the Bombay High Court, last week, had refused to grant an interim stay on petitions filed by representatives of the Kunbi and Other Backward Class (OBC) communities challenging the State government's decision to allow Marathas from Marathwada to obtain Kunbi caste certificates under the Hyderabad Gazette. The petitioners had requested the High Court to immediately stop the government from carrying out its September 2 GR.

#### women journalist 'ban' at press meet **MUMBAI** Wakeup telangana

Afghanistan's Foreign Minister Amir Khan Muttaqi held a restrictive press conference in the Afghan Embassy premises in New Delhi on Friday, while no women journalists were allowed, who were informally invited to a press interaction. The banning of the women journalists led to a massive backlash on social media.

Muttaqi arrived in the capital on Thursday and held talks with EAM Jaishankar, where they held discussions on India's support for Afghanistan's development, bilateral trade, territorial integrity and people-to-people ties and capacity-building,

besides several other is-



sues. However, the press conference by Muttaqi held later at 3.30 PM at the Afghan Embassy was not open to a wider media fraternity, and excluded women journalists too.

Despite being a significant diplomatic engagement- especially given India's cautious stand on the Taliban, wherein EAM Jaishankar announced India's upgradation of the Technical Mission in Kabul to the

status of Embassy, most journalists were neither notified nor given access.

The Afghan Embassy in Delhi continues to be run by Charge d'Affaires Mohammad Ibrahimkhail from the erstwhile Ashraf Ghani administration, while consulates in Mumbai and Hyderabad are already under Taliban control.

Similarly, questions have also emerged over the restrictive media access given to journalists, as only 15-16 media personnel attended this conference.

According to the information, Taliban official Ikramuddin Kamil, who heads the Afghanistan's Mumbai consulate since last year, reached out to these selected journalists himself via a phone call and gave them the informal invitation. Similarly, women journalists have also expressed their anger at not inviting any female reporter. The selective outreach, along with the aid of cherry-picking of jour-

nalists by Muttaqi's media team, has sparked criticism within press circles, who argue that restricting coverage of such a crucial development undermines transparency and prevents wider media scrutiny of India's evolving engagement with the Taliban leadership.

### **AMID GLOBAL FLUX, SELF-RELIANCE THE WAY FOR INDIA**

The Trump-Putin Alaska meeting does not appear to have brought significant benefits to India. Although the meeting was held to resolve the Russia-Ukraine war issues, at a time when both the US and Russia are considered friendly nations by India, it is disappointing that there seems to be no indication of any change in the US tariff policies affecting India.

It appears the meeting was primarily aimed at securing economic advantages for Russia and the US in the coal and oil sectors, rather than resolving the Ukraine crisis. The ceasefire promise vanished from Trump's lips. When Russia insisted on a resolution, President Donald Trump predictably reverted to his usual habit of altering statements, which was diplomatically unsurprising to those familiar with his approach. With Trump and Putin revealing such tactics in Alaska, it is hard not to wonder if Ukraine is being sacrificed as a pawn. The emerging cordial atmosphere between the US and Russia might be seen by Prime Minister Narendra Modi as a potential relief for the economic pressures on India. Since India has always considered Russia a trustworthy friend, there is nothing wrong with the Prime Minister thinking along those lines. Reality of Alaska Summit However, the reality of the Alaska summit was quite different! While it may help restore US-Russia relations, it will clearly not improve ties with

India. Since Trump assumed the American presidency, efforts have been under way not only to enhance ties with Russia but also to boost Russia exports. Meanwhile, imports of Chinese oil from Russia are rising more than those from India —a fact no one can deny! While the US troubles India with tariffs, it simultaneously strengthens relations with Russia and ignores China's assertive actions — making it obvious that Washington looks down on India. America's double standards are evident: Trump repeatedly claims responsibility for a ceasefire between India and Pakistan, yet hosts grand dinners with Pakistan's Army Chief, showing excessive friendliness and granting wide publicity to such

### HC Sends Murder Convict Back To Jail


two-judge panel of the Telangana High Court dismissed a criminal appeal filed by an accused convicted for offences under Sections 302 and 307 of the IPC, which deal with murder and attempt to murder. The panel comprising Justice K. Surender and Justice J. Anil Kumar was dealing with the appeal filed by Kommu Anil. The appellant questioned his conviction for murder, in connection with the killing of four persons and injuries caused to two others in Karimnagar district in March 2012. He argued that there was no test identification parade and that the incident occurred in a sudden fight without premeditation, attracting Section 304 IPC, which covers culpable homicide not amounting to murder. The panel observed that the appellant stabbed six persons indiscriminately, killing four of them, and that the act was cruel and unusual. Holding that Exception 4 to Section 300 IPC, which applies to sudden fights without intent, did not cover the case, the panel dismissed the appeal and directed that the accused, who is on bail, be sent back to prison to serve the remaining sentence. A separate appeal by the state seeking to bar the accused's parole till his natural death was also dismissed, with the panel noting absence of any report from jail authorities that he misused bail or posed a continuing threat.

### Telangana HC Issues Notices to HYDRAA, GHMC, Others in BJP MLA's Petition

**HYDERABAD** Wakeup telangana

The Telangana High Court has issued notices to the state government, HY-DRAA, GHMC, HMDA, RERA, and other authorities in a writ petition filed by BJP Kamareddy MLA Katipally Venkataramana Reddy. The petition alleges widespread encroachments of lakes, ponds, and public lands by private real estate developers and challenges the state's failure to take action against such vio-

lations. According to the petitioner, several private developers have unlawfully occupied water bodies in the Hyderabad region. The Vajram Ixora Group allegedly encroached upon the lake area at Gopanpally in Serilingampally mandal



and obtained a fraudulent no-objection certificate (NOC) from the irrigation department. Similarly, Praneeth Pranav Grove Park is accused of encroaching the lake area at Gagillapur in Dundigal, Gandimaisamma mandal, while Phoenix 285FD allegedly encroached upon the Mukkasanikunta lake in Narsingi, Gandipet mandal. Venkataramana Reddy stated that he had repeatedly approached the HYDRAA, HMDA, GHMC, and other authorities with complaints and representations be-

tween December 2024 and January 2025, urging action against unauthorised constructions that had taken over public roads and water bodies. Despite these efforts, officials failed to act, prompting the MLA to move the High Court. His earlier attempt to file a public interest litigation (PIL) was advised to be converted into a writ petition, as he was not per-

sonally affected. During the hearing, Justice B. Vijaysen Reddy questioned the petitioner's counsel on why the MLA had not raised the matter on the floor of the Legislative Assembly. The counsel replied that, being a member of the Opposition, the petitioner's representations had not received any response from the authorities.

The High Court, taking

note of the allegations, issued notices to the state government agencies and respective district collectors. The court also permitted the petitioner to serve personal notices to the real estate firms named in the petition.

The case highlights growing concerns over unauthorised construction and encroachment on public lands and water bodies in Hyderabad. With political and administrative authorities allegedly failing to act despite repeated complaints, the High Court's intervention aims to ensure accountability and prevent further illegal encroachments by private developers. The notices signal that both the government agencies and private real estate firms will now have to respond to the allegations in court.

Most Fake News Was On Pol-

Over 500 fake news items were shared between 2022-24, with 60 per cent of them being on politics and religion, according to a study shared by Indian School of Business. The numbers were roughly calculated after extracting data from sources like Alt-News and Boomlive and a survey by the ISB. Prof. Manish Gangwar, executive director of Institute of Data Sciences (IIDS), ISB, on Thursday organised a workshop titled 'Cyber First Responders: Fighting Misinformation & Fake News in the Digital Age', at its Hyderabad campus. According to the data, 43.6 per cent of the fake news consisted of political news, followed by 33.6 per cent of general news and 16.8 per cent of the

fake news being related to religion. Among these, 35.60 per cent of the fake news was found to be circulated in the form of text and video, and platform X (twitter)

was found to be the biggest source of fake news (61 per cent). Speaking at the event, Major Vineet Kumar (retd), founder and global president, Cyber-Peace, underlined that fake news, AI-generated misinformation and deepfakes werren't just tech problems — they were trust problems. "With ISB, we're equipping journalists, content creators and influencers with fast, practical detection and verification to spot synthetic media and stop harm before it spreads. The goal: faster truth, fewer harms, and a stronger information ecosystem for India," he

### Telangana HC Rejects Pleas Against MBBS Local Quota Rule

**HYDERABAD** Wakeup telangana

A division bench of the Telangana High Court, comprising Chief Justice Aparesh Kumar Singh and Justice G.M. Mohiuddin, on Thursday dismissed a batch of writ petitions challenging Government Order (GO) 33, dated July 19, 2024. The order had amended Rule 3(a) of the Telangana Medical and Dental Colleges Admission Rules, 2017, which governs admissions into MBBS and BDS courses.

The amendment introduced a four-year consecutive study or residence requirement in Telangana as the basis for determining local candidature under the competent authority quota.

The petitions were filed by several students who contended that the amended rule was arbitrary, violated constitutional principles, and contradicted earlier division bench judgments. Previous rulings had held that such a residencebased criterion lacked a

rational nexus to the objectives of the Admission Rules. The petitioners sought directions for being treated as local candidates for MBBS/BDS admissions in the 2025-26 academic year in accordance with those earlier judgments. During the hearing, T.

Sharath, standing counsel for Kaloji Narayana Rao University of Health Sciences, Warangal, informed the court that the state had issued GO 150 after the Advocate General made a statement be-



fore the Supreme Court. The statement clarified that children of parents serving in Central Government services, including IAS, IPS, and IFS officers, would also be

considered under the local category. The Supreme Court took note of this submission and upheld GO 33. Subsequently, GO 150 was issued by the state government to en-

sure that candidates from Central Government service families were protected and not disadvantaged by the amendment.

Earlier, the petitions in the High Court had been adjourned sine die, pending the Supreme Court's decision on the state government's appeals against High Court rulings relating to the 2023-24 and 2024-25 admission years. With the apex court upholding the Government Order of July 2024 and the subsequent GO 150,

the Telangana High Court division bench dismissed all pending writ petitions challenging the amend-

However, the bench clarified that the university must still examine the cases of candidates seeking the benefit of GO 150. Each case is to be considered on its own merits, ensuring that eligible students from Central Government service families receive due consideration under the local category. This ruling reinforces the state government's au-

thority to determine local candidature criteria while balancing the rights of specific groups of candidates who may otherwise face exclusion under the amended rules. The decision marks a significant development in the ongoing disputes over Telangana MBBS/BDS admissions and reaffirms the state government's regulatory powers, while

### **New Research Highlights Child** Sexual Exploitation Risks in South Asia

A new study by the Childlight Global Child Safety Institute reveals that roughly one in eight children in South Asia experience sexual assault before 18, equating to about 54 million children in India, Nepal, and Sri Lanka. Girls are slightly more affected (14.5%) than boys (11.5%). The research also highlights rising online abuse, including AIgenerated "deep fake" sexual material involving children.

The findings, part of Childlight's Into the Light study, are being presented



at c0c0n in Kerala, Asia's largest cybersecurity conference, and at a trust and safety summit in Delhi. India, Bangladesh, and Pakistan report the highest volumes of child sexual

abuse material (CSAM) in South Asia. In 2024, India accounted for over 2.25 million reports, Bangladesh 1.11 million, and Pakistan 1.03 million. When adjusted for population,

the Maldives leads in CSAM prevalence, followed by Bangladesh and Pakistan. Childlight CEO Paul

Stanfield emphasized that abuse is preventable and urges proactive legislation, rapid removal of CSAM by tech firms, and educational programs for children and caregivers. The organization is working with Indian police across 20 states to identify victims and perpetrators, using AI tools. Experts, survivors, and officials highlighted the importance of data visibility in shaping law enforcement responses and effective child protection policies.



The required documents include NOCs from the Divisional Fire Officer and neighbors (for singleshop setups), land permission from GHMC or private owners, a site plan, and proof of fee payment of ₹600 at SBI, Treasury Branch, Gunfoundry. Authorities have warned that unlicensed storage or sale will invite strict action.

#### **TGSPDCL** engineer held for Rs 15,000 bribe in Secunderabad
