Baby Dies After Polio Drops in Sangareddy

A three-month-old baby boy, who was administered polio drops on Sunday in Sangareddy district, died under suspicious circumstances at Bhimra of Kangti mandal of Sangareddy district. While parents suspected polio drops to be the cause of death, a postmortem examination revealed that the baby had died due to tightening of the throat, which led to aspiration of food into the lungs. The boy was the fourth child of Sarkurdoddi Swarna Latha and Umakanth, after three girls. According to the parents, "The baby boy faced breathing issues minutes after Asha workers administered polio drops. He later vomited and **CONT:P5**

540 Indian Nationals In Nepal Prisons Absconding Since Gen Z Protests

Around 540 Indian nationals serving time in various prisons across Nepal have been absconding ever since the Gen Z protests, the Department of Prison Management said on Sunday. More than 13,000 prisoners escaped from various jails of Nepal during the second day of anti-government Gen Z protests on September 9. At least 5,000 Nepali citizens, convicted in various crimes, are still absconding, followed by 540 Indian nationals and 108 prisoners of other nations, the data revealed.

BJP, JD(U) Will Contest 101 Seats Each in Bihar

The Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) on Sunday finalised the seat-sharing arrangement for the upcoming Bihar Assembly elections, confirming that it will contest 101 constituencies, the same number as its key ally Janata Dal (United) [JD(U)]. Union Minister Chirag Paswan's Lok Janshakti Party (Ram Vilas) [LJP(RV)] will field candidates in 29 constituencies, while Jitan Ram Manjhi-led Hindustani Awam Morcha (Secular) [HAM(S)] and Upendra Kushwaha's Rashtriya Lok Morcha (RLM)] will contest six seats each. Announcing the deal,



BJP's Bihar poll in-charge and Union Minister Dharmendra Pradhan said the seat-sharing talks among National Democratic Alliance (NDA) partners concluded amicably. Expressing confidence in another NDA victory, he stated that Bihar was "ready for another NDA government." The decision came after the BJP's Central Election Committee meeting in New Delhi, attended by Prime Minister Narendra Modi and senior leaders, to finalise candidates. Prime Minister Modi is

set to launch the BJP's campaign in Bihar on Wednesday under the Mera Booth, Sabse Majboot initiative, where he will interact with party workers. "Our dedicated workers are working with full energy to ensure BJP-NDA's victory in Bihar," Modi posted on X. The NDA, comprising BJP, JD(U), LJP(RV), HAM(S), and RLM, will take on the RJD-led Mahagathbandhan alliance that includes Congress and Left parties. Prashant Kishor's Jan Suraj and AIMIM will contest independently. The 243-member Bihar Assembly will go to polls in two phases on November 6 and 11, with results on November 14.

Girls Should Not Go Out at Night: Mamta



West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee on Sunday expressed shock over the alleged gangrape of a medical student in Durgapur, while urging colleges to take stronger precautions for women's safety — including restricting girls from going out at night. "I'm shocked to see the incident, but private medical colleges also should take care of their students, especially girls. The girls should not be allowed to go outside (college) at night. They have to protect themselves also. There is a forest area. Police are searching all the people," Banerjee said. Her remarks came amid widespread outrage following the assault of a second-year student from Odisha studying at a private medical college in Durgapur. According to police, **CONT:P4**

JH BYPOLLS :KTR Says Choose Car of Development Over Bulldozer

BRS Working President K.T. Rama Rao has called on voters in the Jubilee Hills Assembly constituency to make a decisive choice in the upcoming bypolls, contrasting the "car" symbolising development with the "bulldozer," which he said represents the demolition of poor people's homes by the Congress. Speaking at Telangana Bhavan, Rama Rao alleged that the government, through HYDRABAD, was rendering the poor homeless and failing to deliver on basic promises. Rama Rao accused Chief Minister Revanth Reddy of turning the state government into a symbol of greed and destruction,

claiming the Congress had not built a single house or laid a brick in the past two years. He further alleged that the party borrowed Rs.2.3 lakh crore, spending the money to buy votes in Jubilee Hills, reportedly offering Rs.10,000 per vote through funds amassed via corruption. The BRS leader warned that the bypoll would

serve as a verdict on the Congress' "arrogance, corruption, and deceit." He said that public anger was growing over the government's failure to deliver on welfare promises, including pensions, housing, and fee reimbursement. "If Congress loses Jubilee Hills, it will finally learn a lesson, and only then will the promised 4,000 pensions and

other welfare schemes reach the people," Rama Rao added. He also criticised the BJP, calling it "a party of no relevance in Telangana," and said voting for either Congress or BJP would be like "throwing your vote into a drain." On BC reservations, Rama Rao accused Reddy of misleading the public, staging a drama in the Assembly despite knowing reservation laws must pass in Parliament. Rama Rao further alleged that Revanth Reddy had deceived former cricketer Mohammed Alzaruddin over an MLC promise and betrayed Muslims regarding burial grounds, claiming that "cheating has become Reddy's nature" and forms the foundation of his politics.

Tourism Police to Protect Tourists in Telangana

New delhi: For the first time in Telangana, a dedicated team of 80 'tourist police' personnel, specially trained to assist and safeguard domestic and foreign tourists, will begin duty at major tour-

ist destinations from Monday. The personnel have undergone specialised training focused on orientation, sensitisation, and tourism-specific security management — an initiative aimed at ensur-

ing the safety and convenience of visitors while enhancing their overall travel experience. After completing their basic course at the Police Academy, the personnel received additional train-

ing from the National Institute of Tourism and Hospitality Management (NITHM) between October 6 and 11, said Val-luru Kranthi, Director, Department of Tourism. (**Cont: P4**)

MoS to Represent India at Gaza Peace Pact

Israel expects to receive all living captives from Gaza on Monday

GAZA: Israel says it expects to receive all its remaining living captives from Gaza early on Monday, a key step in the ceasefire now in effect. Speaking on Sunday, government spokeswoman Shosh Bedrosian said Israel anticipates all 20 living captives will be returned together in the early hours of Monday. As in previous exchanges during the two-year war, the captives will first be handed over to the Red Cross, which will transport them to an Israeli military base inside Gaza for initial medical checks before they proceed to Israel to reunite with their (**Cont: P4**)

Starmer, and Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu, are expected to participate. Foreign ministers and leaders from Germany, Qatar, the UAE, Jordan, Turkey, Saudi Arabia, Pakistan, Indonesia, and Iran will also attend. Modi had earlier welcomed the first phase of

Trump's peace plan and praised Netanyahu's leadership after Israel and Hamas agreed to the pact. On X, Modi expressed hope that the release of hostages and enhanced humanitarian aid for Gaza would bring "much-needed respite" and pave the way for lasting peace. Modi also

called Netanyahu to reaffirm that terrorism in any form is unacceptable. India had previously welcomed President Trump's comprehensive plan for Gaza and reiterated support for a two-state solution, emphasizing peaceful coexistence between Israel and an independent Palestine. India also maintains strong ties with Egypt, which has played a key role in brokering the agreement. During Modi's visit to Cairo in June 2023, the two leaders elevated bilateral relations to a "Strategic Partnership," and Modi became the first Indian to receive Egypt's highest civilian honour, the Order of the Nile.

TCS Won't Hire H-1B Applicants in USA: CEO

Tata Consultancy Services (TCS) CEO K. Krithivasan said that the company is not looking to hire any new H-1B applicants. Speaking in an interview, he said that the company will look towards expanding their workforce with local manpower. TCS is the biggest company in the United States in terms of hiring H-1B holders,



with the company hiring 98,259 H-1B applicants between 2009 and 2025. In 2025 alone, TCS hired 5,505 H-1B applicants, ranking ahead of Microsoft, Meta, Apple and Google.

"We have enough people on H-1 already in the US. I don't think we would be looking for adding to that count anytime now (sic)," Krithivasan said. Speaking about renewal of existing H-1B visas, he said, "Our original plan was always to send people on H-1 with the intention of bringing them back and rotating them. So it continued to focus on bringing back at the end of the programmes, **CONT:P4**

Muttaqi Asserts Taliban Control Over Afghan Embassy in Delhi, Flags Raised, Women Journalists Attend Press Meet Amid India's Non-Recognition of Regime

Afghan FM holds second press meet with female journalists allowed

Visiting Afghan Foreign Minister Amir Khan Muttaqi on Sunday firmly asserted control over the Embassy here in New Delhi, indicating the Islamic Emirate's flag flying in front and behind him. "This is our flag. We fought jihad under this. This is 100 per cent our embassy. All those who are working here... they are all with us," Muttaqi

said in response to a question by IANS, pointing to the Islamic Emirate's flag fluttering behind his back and at the front of his table while the embassy officially still hoists the former flag, representing the former regime of Ashraf Ghani. India has, however, still not formally recognised the Taliban regime. Unlike the controversial press conference held on Friday, where no female journalist was permitted



entry and only 15-odd media persons were allowed, Sunday's briefing at the Afghan Embassy on Shantipath was packed with reporters, including several women journalists and foreign correspon-

dents. The move, seen as a course correction, came amid strong criticism from Indian media and foreign media over gender-based restrictions. Muttaqi, who is on a week-long visit to New Delhi, said his delegation has held "constructive and result-oriented" talks with External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar. "We discussed trade, economy, healthcare, aviation links and development projects. India

assured readiness to facilitate trade visas, student exchanges, and restart stalled infrastructure works," he said. Jaishankar, according to him, also conveyed India's decision to upgrade the embassy in Kabul. The Afghan FM announced fresh air connectivity plans, including Delhi-Kabul, Mumbai-Kandahar and Amritsar-Afghanistan flight routes. A joint trade committee between India and Af-

ghanistan will also be set up, and proposals for mineral cooperation, agriculture projects and sports diplomacy were discussed. Muttaqi confirmed that Afghanistan has requested India to consider opening the Attari-Wagah border for Afghan goods. Responding to concerns on women's rights, the Foreign Minister said: "Everyone's rights are protected in Islam, whether man or woman..

Srinivas Goud Rallies Door-to-Door Urges Voters to Choose Car for BRS Victory

Trying hard for a relief from the apex court has become all the more important as the High Court did not stall the election, according to the orders which became available on Saturday. Congress sources told Deccan Chronicle that the government was also in favour of going ahead with the 50 per cent cap if the apex court did not grant any relief. Legal experts were of the view that the Supreme Court might not go into the merits of the case and would probably refuse to intervene with the High Court’s interim order. “With the HC relying heavily on the triple test recommended by the Supreme Court, which, apart from others, insists on a 50 per cent cap, we are not hopeful of a final verdict in our favour. We do not want to drag the process by waiting for the final verdict and then approaching the SC,” a senior minister told.

Depriving the government of strong grounds to argue in the Supreme Court that the High Court had stalled the election process post issuance of the poll notification, the High Court division bench led by Chief Justice Aparesh Kumar Singh categorically stated, according to the final order that became available on Saturday, that the State Election Commission “would” proceed with elections to local bodies by declaring seats above 50 per cent as open category. Highly placed sources told that the government would immediately go ahead with elections with the 50 per cent cap if it failed to get relief from the apex court. “Though it is not binding on us to hold elections immediately, and we can wait till the final case is disposed of, the political top brass are in favour of holding polls,” sources pointed out.

BJP Calls Out BRS Misrule And Corruption, Vows To Deliver Telangana’s True Progress

BJP Assembly floor leader Aleti Maheshwar Reddy on Sunday accused BRS working president K.T. Rama Rao of making “baseless allegations” against the BJP-led Centre, claiming the former ruling party in Telangana ignored people’s welfare during its decade-long tenure. Speaking to the media, Maheshwar Reddy highlighted public rejection of the BRS in the last two major elections, attributing it to “rampant corruption” and “developmental failures” under their regime. He cited the arrest of former CM K. Chandrashekar Rao’s daughter, K. Kavitha, in the Delhi liquor scam and noted that senior BRS leaders are under investigation for phone tapping and other



alleged corrupt activities. Maheshwar Reddy warned that more prominent BRS figures could face arrest as ongoing probes uncover “hundreds of cases of malfeasance.” Challenging claims that the Modi government neglected Telangana, he pointed to central initiatives worth lakhs of crores, including robust funding for gram panchayats, local bodies, and distribution of 5-kg free rice to every poor family. According to him, these measures reflect sustained support from the Centre, countering BRS criticism.

Maheshwar Reddy also criticised the BRS’s electoral failures, noting that the party did not win a single MP seat in the recent elections, which he said demonstrated public anger over corruption and dynastic politics. He further condemned the state government for failing to allocate adequate funds to gram panchayats, accusing its leaders of neglect and corruption, and insisted that most village-level development is now funded by the Centre. Expressing confidence ahead of the Bihar Assembly polls, he predicted a BJP victory and reiterated that the Congress government has betrayed Telangana with unfulfilled promises, asserting that only a strong BJP-led administration can ensure development and accountability in the state.

Kamareddy farmers still await compensation a month after floods

It has been over a month since heavy rains lashed Kamareddy and caused extensive damage to crops. Despite assurances from the government, farmers, who suffered crop loss, are still waiting for compensation. This was observed by a team from Telangana Vikasa Samithi, comprising Professor K Seetaram Rao, Dr Erroju Srinivas, Hariprasad, Balunayak, Lingam, and others, who visited the rain-affected area to study the current situation. Apart from disrupting normal life in Kamareddy, heavy rains have severely affected tribal hamlets (thandas) in Rajampet mandal, Amaradi Colony, Mallareddypalli, and Chinna Mallareddy-



palli. The situation on the ground remains grim across several areas. Floods caused breaches in several tanks, inundated villages, colonies, and agricultural fields. This resulted in extensive crop damage and property loss. When the Telangana Vikasa Samithi members interacted with farmers, they said Agriculture Extension Officers (AEOs) had recorded all crop damage details. Yet, there has been no compensation so far.

In Chinna Mallareddypalli, the floods damaged borewells, agriculture pumps, starters, and other equipment. Farmers stated that no financial assistance has been provided for their losses. According to a local farmer, many ryots invested nearly Rs 30,000 per acre in paddy cultivation. Due to floods, they received no yield. Normally, an acre yields 35 to 40 quintals of paddy. Based on the Minimum Support Price (MSP) assured by the government, at Rs 2,380 per quintal, the farmers would have earned Rs 86,000. They estimated that restoration of sand-filled fields and making them fit for cultivation would result in an additional cost of Rs 15,000 to Rs 30,000 per acre.

Revanth Orders T Square Works to Begin by Nov

He stressed that top global brands like Apple should be encouraged to set up stores in the building, alongside provisions for a utility zone and adequate parking facilities. Revanth Reddy also directed officials to ensure 24x7 operational readiness at the T Square facility once completed. He further emphasized the creation of a dedicated corpus fund for the Artificial Intelligence (AI) hub and the formation of a board comprising repre-

sentatives from leading international AI companies to guide innovation and governance. In the interim, the Chief Minister instructed that the Engineering Staff College buildings be inspected to establish a temporary AI hub until permanent infrastructure is ready. Officials were told to maintain close coordination among departments to expedite the project and position T Square as a symbol of Telangana’s digital and innovation-driven growth.

Suspension of darshanams for devotees at Sri Rajarajeshwara Swamy temple in Vemulawada has drawn stiff opposition from right-wing groups, particularly the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP). As part of the temple’s expansion works, authorities have suspended darshanams for devotees from Sunday and arranged alternate facilities at Bheemeshwaralayam, an associate temple of the

Rajarajeshwara Swamy shrine. Ekantha sevalu will continue as usual in the main temple. However, pujas such as Kodemokku, Abhishekams, Annapuja, Kunkumapuja, Nitya Kalyanam, and Chandiyagam will now be performed at Bheemeshwaralayam. Temple Executive Officer Rama Devi clarified that the shrine was not being closed. “Devotees can continue to perform all pujas at Bheemeshwaralayam during the works,” she stated.



BJP activists, led by district president Reddaboina Gopi, staged a protest and burnt an effigy of the State government outside the temple on Sunday. Gopi questioned how rituals of Rajanna could be performed at Bheemesh-

waralayam and asserted that devotees must not be denied darshan of Rajarajeshwara Swamy. Union Minister of State for Home, Bandi Sanjay Kumar, condemned the decision, warning that he would “open the temple

by wearing panchas” if the authorities failed to revoke their order. Meanwhile, Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS) leaders who inspected the alternate arrangements at Bheemeshwaralayam also criticised officials for announcing darshanam arrangements before completion of the works. Government Whip and local MLA Adi Srinivas dismissed BJP’s allegations that the temple was closed. He said the expansion works were being carried out on the advice of Sringeri Peetadipathi

and that alternate facilities had been arranged for devotees. He explained that large construction equipment was being used for erecting mandapams and 64 to 70 pillars in the sanctum, creating safety concerns if devotees were allowed inside. “All pujas to the presiding deity will continue even as expansion works proceed,” he said, adding that opinions of the temple protection committee, Hindu organisations, and devotees were already taken.

Construction Sector Grows 11.97% in Telangana, Says Sridhar Babu

Telangana’s construction and real estate sectors have shown remarkable growth, with the construction industry alone contributing over Rs 80,000 crore to the state’s economy during the fiscal year 2024-25, IT and Industries Minister Duddilla Sridhar Babu announced on Sunday. Speaking at the 15th Naredco Telangana Property Show, the minister highlighted that the state’s construction sector grew at a

robust 11.97 per cent, while the combined output of the real estate and professional services sectors surged 15.4 per cent, underscoring the significant role these sectors play in Telangana’s economic landscape. Together, the real estate and construction industries now account for 24.9 per cent of the state’s services GDP, with the construction sector alone being a major contributor. The minister emphasized that these numbers reflect not only strong economic activity but also the resilience of Telangana’s real

estate market, dispelling notions of any slowdown. Highlighting recent trends in the housing sector, Sridhar Babu pointed out a sharp increase in property registrations across key districts. In September 2025, a total of 6,612 housing units, valued at Rs 4,804 crore, were registered, compared to 4,903 units worth Rs 2,820 crore in the same month last year. This represents a 35 per cent rise in volume and a striking 70 per cent increase in transaction value. Notably, properties valued above Rs 1 crore



witnessed a 151 per cent surge in registrations, accounting for 53 per cent of the total transaction value for the month. “These figures clearly demonstrate that Telangana’s real estate sector remains vibrant and continues to grow at a healthy

pace,” the minister stated. He also stressed the sector’s significance as India’s second-largest employment generator after agriculture, and called for increasing the real estate sector’s GDP contribution in India from the current 6-8 per cent to levels closer to those seen in developed countries and China, where it ranges from 10-25 per cent. The minister also outlined ambitious infrastructure and urban development projects aimed at reshaping Telangana’s economic and urban landscape. Key projects include El-

evated Corridors, Metro Rail Phase-II, Bharat Future City, Musi Riverfront Beautification, and the Regional Ring Road. Sridhar Babu announced plans to complete zonal planning for Bharat Future City by December and revealed that the groundbreaking for a 200-acre AI City would commence within two to three months. The AI City is expected to be developed to international standards, combining technology and urban planning to bolster economic growth. The event drew prominent industry fig-

ures, including Naredco officials Vijayasai Make, Kali Prasad Damerla, Dr. Lion Kiran, K. Sridhar Reddy, and R. Venkateshwara Rao, who lauded the government’s initiatives and highlighted the positive trajectory of Telangana’s real estate sector. With these developments, Telangana’s construction and real estate sectors are emerging as key drivers of economic growth, creating employment opportunities, attracting investments, and transforming the urban and economic landscape of the state.

being followed by host countries in school education. The same practices will be replicated in the state schools to enhance the quality of education. For the programme, three best teachers from

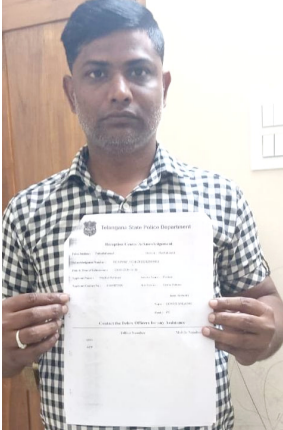

Complaint Filed Against Rubika for Rahul Gandhi Remarks

Mojibul Rahman, son of Md. Yunus, has accused television news anchor Rubika Liyaquat of using offensive and objectionable language against Congress leader Rahul Gandhi during a broadcast. He claims the remarks were disrespectful and intended to incite public sentiment. Rahman stated that he filed a formal complaint at the Pahari Sharif police station, but alleges that officers have refused to register an FIR despite multiple attempts.



He said he has also submitted written complaints to senior officials, including the ACP, DCP, and Commissioner of Police, but no action has been taken so far. Speaking to the media, Rahman said, “Rahul Gandhi is

our leader, and such language is unacceptable. There should be legal consequences for these words.” Expressing frustration over police inaction, he added that if authorities continue to ignore the complaint, he will take the matter to court. Rahman is demanding that a formal FIR be filed and legal proceedings initiated against the anchor. As of now, News18 and Rubika Liyaquat have not responded to the allegations, and police officials have yet to issue a statement.

Indian Roller, Telangana’s state bird, listed in IUCN red list, experts raise alarm



The Indian Roller (Palapitta), Telangana’s state bird, has been listed in the IUCN Red List for the first time, moving from the ‘Least Concern’ to the ‘Near Threatened’ category, as recommended by experts. The IUCN updates bird status twice a year based on surveys and reviews all species every five years. The State of Indian Birds (SoIB)-2023 report noted a 30 per cent decline in the Palapitta population across India over the past 12 years. Surveys around Hyderabad also indicate a steep fall in numbers. During the Hyderabad Birds Atlas (HBA) voluntary survey conducted in 2025, only 26 Indian Rollers were recorded in February and four in August out of over 70,000 birds identified. Another open-habitat bird, the Indian Cuckoo, was also moved from ‘least concern’ to ‘near threatened’, highlighting the shrinking grasslands and agricultural lands in India. Wildlife photographer Sriram Reddy of Hyderabad said the populations of open-habitat birds are declining rapidly due to habitat loss. In addition to these two species, the IUCN revised the status of 12 other bird species in India, four of which are found in Telangana. Two species in the State showed population growth: the Indian

Congress faces growing backlash from multiple communities in Telangana

The Congress government’s alleged betrayal of various sections, including BCs, Muslims, employees, unemployed youth, contractors and others, continues to stir resentment across the State, a factor that could prove crucial in the upcoming local body elections and the Jubilee Hills by-election. After assuring BCs of 42 percent reservations in local body elections, the government failed to keep its promise, resulting in the notification being kept in abeyance. Similarly,



Muslims, particularly those in Jubilee Hills constituency, feel let down by the ruling party. Just days before the by-election notification was issued, the Congress government allotted 2,500 square yards of land for a Muslim burial ground at Shaikpet. However, Army officials later claimed ownership of the site. Many in the community

believe the government knowingly allotted contentious land despite being aware of the possible dispute. The resentment is not limited to urban areas. The unemployed youth continue to stage protests demanding job notifications, while farmers, who had earlier faced severe hardship due to urea scarcity, are now angry over the delay in compensation for crop losses caused by recent heavy rains. Government employees too remain dissatisfied, accusing the State of reneging on its assurances. Despite several meetings and repeated promises, they al-

lege the government has been resorting to delaying tactics instead of resolving their long-pending issues. Employees have staged protests and lunch-hour demonstrations across districts and mandals, expressing frustration over delayed action. Apart from the partial release of funds towards pending arrears, the government has not addressed core demands such as the issuance of health cards. As one TGEJAC office-bearer remarked, “It would be wise not to even mention the pending five DAs and the Pay Revision Commission (PRC).”

TCS Won't Hire H-1B Applicants in USA: CEO

“We have enough people on H-1 already in the US. I don’t think we would be looking for adding to that count anytime now (sic),” Krithivasan said. Speaking about renewal of existing H-1B visas, he said, “Our original plan was always to send people on H-1 with the intention of bringing them back and rotating them. So it continued to focus on bringing back at the end of the programmes, or rotating them with locals. And how much we would renew or whom we would renew is a call we will take at the appropriate time. We are looking to increase our local participation.” “At the other geographies that we operate, like Latam (Latin America) or Middle East or APAC (Asia-Pacific), we operate with a very high percent-

age of local associates, and we are also moving to see how the new AI engagements are going to be done. They are going to require much closer collaborations with our clients, in terms of understanding the requirements and in terms of doing the build”, kirthivasan said. “It is going to require a very diverse skillset, compared to pure engineering or technology skills alone. Taking all this into mind, we would continue to expand the local workforce in all of the geographies, particularly in the US and Europe”, Krithivasan added. Industry experts are not only expecting a major downfall in H-1B applicants, but are also looking at a shift towards L-1 visa, which allows companies to carry intra-company transfer of employees from a foreign branch to a USA-based branch.

Don't Let Girls Out at Night: Mamata

“I’m shocked to see the incident, but private medical colleges also should take care of their students, especially girls. The girls should not be allowed to go outside (college) at night. They have to protect themselves also. There is a forest area. Police are searching all the people,” Banerjee said. Her remarks came amid widespread outrage following the assault of a second-year student from Odisha studying at a private medical college in Durgapur. According to police, three men have been arrested in connection with the case and were produced before a court on Sunday. “Further investigation is ongoing, and everything is going according to protocol,” said Asansol-Durgapur Police Commissionerate DCP Abhishek Gupta. The survivor’s father, speaking to reporters, said his daughter had

stepped out with a classmate to eat when two or three men attacked her. “Her friend fled the scene when they arrived. They raped her between 8:00 and 9:00 PM. The hostel was far away and the security arrangements were poor. Such a serious incident occurred, but there was no immediate action or system in place,” he alleged. Condemning the attack, Banerjee assured that the culprits would face strict punishment. “Nobody will be excused. Whoever is guilty will be punished strictly. Three people have already been arrested. We will take stringent action,” she said. However, her comment advising colleges to restrict girls’ movement drew criticism, with many interpreting it as victim-blaming. Banerjee also questioned the silence over similar crimes in other states, pointing to incidents in Odisha, Manipur, Uttar Pradesh, and Bihar.

Israel expects to receive all living captives from Gaza on Monday

Israel expects to receive all 20 of its remaining living captives from Gaza early Monday, marking a key step in the ceasefire currently in effect, government spokeswoman Shosh Bedrosian said on Sunday. The captives will first be handed over to the Red Cross, which will transport them to an Israeli military base inside Gaza for initial medical checks before they are reunited with their families. Hamas sources told Al Jazeera Arabic that the captives have been moved to three locations within the enclave in preparation for the transfer. Once Is-

rael confirms all captives are on its territory, it will begin releasing about 2,000 Palestinian prisoners, many held without charge, including 250 serving life sentences. Notably, Palestinian leader Marwan Barghouti will not be among those released. Some detainees will be freed in the West Bank, with relatives instructed not to hold celebrations or speak to the media. Israel is also preparing to receive the bodies of 28 captives who died in captivity. Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu, in a televised address, called the captives’ return an “emotional evening” and expressed hope it would



unify the country. However, some families criticized Netanyahu, accusing him of prioritizing military objectives over the hostages’ release. The transfer comes days after Israel approved the first phase of a Trump-led deal to end the war in Gaza, coinciding with US President Donald Trump’s visit to Israel before a summit in Egypt. Trump, accompanied by top US officials, said the hostages might be released “a little

early” and praised Qatar’s mediation role in the ceasefire. Al Jazeera described the deal as “Trump’s show,” with the US president expected to meet captives’ families, address the Knesset, and then travel to Sharm el-Sheikh for a summit of over 20 world leaders. Under the agreement, Israeli forces have withdrawn from parts of Gaza, including Gaza City and northern areas, though more than half of the terri-

tory remains under Israeli control. Palestinians returning to their neighborhoods encountered widespread destruction, described by Al Jazeera as “wastelands.” Humanitarian aid has begun trickling in, but distribution is slow. Many residents lack access to savings, banks, or basic supplies, relying entirely on aid for survival. The Sharm el-Sheikh summit, co-chaired by Trump and Egyptian President Abdel Fattah el-Sisi, is expected to produce a document formally ending the war in Gaza. While Israel and Hamas will not attend, more than a dozen world leaders—including UN Secretary-General

Antonio Guterres, King Abdullah II of Jordan, and Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdogan—are expected. Experts caution that phase two of the ceasefire, including Israeli withdrawal, Hamas disarmament, and Gaza reconstruction, will be complex. “If you look at Gaza, it’s like an earthquake happened. There’s no government, no schools, nothing there,” said Adnan Hayajneh, professor of international relations at Qatar University. US Vice President JD Vance stressed that US troops being sent to monitor the ceasefire will not have a combat role and will not enter Palestinian territory.

‘No new GST on carpets in UP’: CM Yogi Adityanath

Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath informed on Saturday that the government has not imposed a new Goods and Services Tax (GST) or tax on carpets. “No new GST or tax has been imposed on carpets,” the Chief Minister said while participating in the inauguration ceremony of the 49th International Carpet Fair, organised under the auspices of CEPC. The event was organised to promote the crafts and craftsmen of the world-renowned carpet city of Bhadohi. He also informed that the government has created new opportunities for the people through the recent free trade agreements with the UAE and the UK, which will help further growth. While addressing a programme on the upliftment of crafts and craftsmen, the Chief



Minister said that India’s traditional artisans and craftsmen have made a significant contribution to establishing India as a global economy. The Chief Minister said that checks for financial amounts were also provided to the beneficiaries of various schemes. “I assure you that the government always stands with full commitment alongside traders and entrepreneurs,” he said. The Chief Minister also said that the state government has not only revived agriculture and farming but also the textile industry and the MSME sector. “This sector has created

the most employment in the state,” the Chief Minister said. Last month, the Central government reformed the GST, which reduced tax rates of a range of daily-use items for consumers. The GST Council simplified the indirect tax system into a two-tier structure of 5 per cent and 18 per cent from a four-tier structure of 5 per cent, 12 per cent, 18 per cent and 28 per cent. This significant tax rationalisation is expected to boost the economy and consumers, contributing to the overall socio-economic development in the country.

Congress Eyes Vijay Alliance to Demand More Seats from DMK

With several Congress leaders openly demanding a greater share in power and more Assembly seats in Tamil Nadu following party leader Rahul Gandhi’s telephonic conversation with Tamilaga Vetri Kazhagam (TVK) chief Vijay, Tamil Nadu Congress Committee (TNCC) president K. Selvaperunthagai said on Sunday that all opinions would be conveyed to the party high command, which would take the final decision. Addressing reporters, Selvaperunthagai maintained that discussions about “seat-sharing and power-sharing cannot be done in public.” He added, “There is a party high command, and the DMK has its own leadership. The Congress will act as per the directions of our high command.” The remarks came amid increasing internal debate



within the Tamil Nadu Congress. After Deputy Chief Minister Udhayanidhi Stalin voiced concerns over Congress’s recent stance and hoped that it would remain within the DMK-led alliance, several Congress MPs began pressing for a share in governance and a higher seat allocation. Pro-Vijay sections within the party believe that an alliance with TVK could help the Congress expand its base and secure more seats. However, leaders favoring the continuation of the DMK alliance warn that such a move may backfire, citing the Congress’s poor performance when it contested alone in 2014, polling just 4.37% of votes. When questioned about the

steady fall in the number of Congress seats within the DMK alliance — from 63 in 2011 to 41 in 2016 and then 25 in 2021 — Selvaperunthagai said responsibility for the decline lay with those who handled earlier negotiations. He clarified that remarks made by Congress’s Tamil Nadu in-charge Girish Chodankar had been “misinterpreted.” Chodankar had only indicated that the party identified 125 preferred constituencies, not that it intended to contest all 125. Meanwhile, Virudhunagar MP Manickam Tagore, known to be close to Rahul Gandhi, reiterated the demand for both more seats and power-sharing in the state. His call was backed by Kanyakumari MP Vijay Vasanth, who said that sharing power was “the collective wish of Congress leaders in Tamil Nadu,” while emphasizing that the final decision rests with the party high command.

'Anger, Resentment Along Durand Line': India Says Pak-Afghan Clashes Not Unexpected

Tensions flared along the Pakistan-Afghanistan border as Taliban forces and the Tehrik-e-Taliban Pakistan (TTP) clashed with Pakistani troops on October 11-12, resulting in heavy casualties on both sides. The Pakistani military reported at least 23 soldiers killed and over 200 Taliban fighters dead, while Afghan sources claimed 58 Pakistani troops were killed and 30 injured during retaliatory operations. The clashes coincide with Taliban Foreign Minister Amir Khan Muttaqi’s visit to India, raising concerns over regional stability and potential impacts on Pakistan-India relations. Islamabad accused Afghan forces of unprovoked attacks, describing them as attempts to destabilise frontier areas and facili-



tate terrorism. Pakistani forces conducted precision strikes on Taliban posts, camps, and training facilities inside Afghan territory, claiming to minimise civilian casualties. Afghanistan confirmed the attacks as “retaliatory and successful opera-

tions,” targeting Pakistani posts across Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and Balochistan. Taliban spokesman Zabihullah Mujahid said 20 Pakistani outposts were destroyed, and military equipment was seized, with nine Afghan soldiers killed and 16 wounded. Operations

paused following diplomatic intervention by Qatar and Saudi Arabia. The conflict is rooted in longstanding resentment along the Durand Line, forced deportations of Afghans from Pakistan, and the rise of pro-Pash-tun sentiment. The TTP, with 3,000-5,000 fighters

skilled in guerrilla warfare, acts as a proxy for the Afghan Taliban, while Pakistan retains conventional military superiority. Experts say prolonged fighting could increase civilian casualties and regional instability. China and the U.S. are reportedly monitoring developments closely, with strategic interests in Afghanistan potentially limiting prolonged conflict. Analysts suggest Pakistan may accuse India of backing the Taliban and TTP, while India is likely to continue discreet engagement through diplomatic and humanitarian channels. Both Islamabad and Kabul have signalled readiness for further operations if border violations continue, leaving the fragile peace along the Durand Line under intense strain.

AMID GLOBAL FLUX, SELF-RELIANCE THE WAY FOR INDIA

The Trump-Putin Alaska meeting does not appear to have brought significant benefits to India. Although the meeting was held to resolve the Russia-Ukraine war issues, at a time when both the US and Russia are considered friendly nations by India, it is disappointing that there seems to be no indication of any change in the US tariff policies affecting India.

It appears the meeting was primarily aimed at securing economic advantages for Russia and the US in the coal and oil sectors, rather than resolving the Ukraine crisis. The ceasefire promise vanished from Trump's lips. When Russia insisted on a resolution, President Donald Trump predictably re-

verted to his usual habit of altering statements, which was diplomatically unsurprising to those familiar with his approach.

With Trump and Putin revealing such tactics in Alaska, it is hard not to wonder if Ukraine is being sacrificed as a pawn. The emerging cordial atmosphere between the US and Russia might be seen by Prime Minister Narendra Modi as a potential relief for the economic pressures on India. Since India has always considered Russia a trustworthy friend, there is nothing wrong with the Prime Minister thinking along those lines.

Reality of Alaska Summit However, the reality of the Alaska summit was quite different! While it may help restore US-Russia relations, it will clearly not improve ties with

India. Since Trump assumed the American presidency, efforts have been under way not only to enhance ties with Russia but also to boost Russia exports. Meanwhile, imports of Chinese oil from Russia are rising more than those from India — a fact no one can deny!

While the US troubles India with tariffs, it simultaneously strengthens relations with Russia and ignores China's assertive actions — making it obvious that Washington looks down on India. America's double standards are evident: Trump repeatedly claims responsibility for a ceasefire between India and Pakistan, yet hosts grand dinners with Pakistan's Army Chief, showing excessive friendliness and granting wide publicity to such events.

HC Sends Murder Convict Back To Jail

Two-judge panel of the Telangana High Court dismissed a criminal appeal filed by an accused convicted for offences under Sections 302 and 307 of the IPC, which deal with murder and attempt to murder. The panel comprising Justice K. Surender and Justice J. Anil Kumar was dealing with the appeal filed by Kommu Anil. The appellant questioned his conviction for murder, in connection with the killing of four persons and injuries caused to two others in Karimnagar district in March 2012. He argued that there was no test identification parade and that the incident occurred in a sudden fight without premeditation, attracting Section 304 IPC, which covers culpable homicide not amounting to murder. The panel observed that the appellant stabbed six persons indiscriminately, killing four of them, and that the act was cruel and unusual. Holding that Exception 4 to Section 300 IPC, which applies to sudden fights without intent, did not cover the case, the panel dismissed the appeal and directed that the accused, who is on bail, be sent back to prison to serve the remaining sentence. A separate appeal by the state seeking to bar the accused's parole till his natural death was also dismissed, with the panel noting absence of any report from jail authorities that he misused bail or posed a continuing threat.

Baby Dies After Polio Drops in Sangareddy

A three-month-old baby boy, who was administered polio drops on Sunday in Sangareddy district, died under suspicious circumstances at Bhimra of Kangti mandal of Sangareddy district. While parents suspected polio drops to be the cause of death, a postmortem examination revealed that the baby had died due to tightening of the throat, which led to aspiration of food into the lungs. The boy was the fourth child of Sarkurdoddi Swarna Latha and Umakanth, after three girls. According to the parents, "The baby boy faced breathing issues minutes after Asha workers administered polio drops. He later vomitted and fainted. We immediately shifted him to Naranakhed government hospital where the



doctors declared him dead. It was a pathetic situation." The district police registered a case of death under suspicious circumstances and shifted the body to a local area hospital for a postmortem. Collector P. Pravinya directed district medical and health officer (DMHO) Dr Naga Nirmala to submit a comprehensive report. The officials probed into the matter and determined that the death was not related to administering polio drops. "The baby was given Pulse Polio drops at around 12 noon and was

kept under observation till 12.30 pm. During this time, the baby was normal and did not show any problems. The parents took the baby home. At around 1 pm, the parents brought the baby back to the booth after the baby was crying continuously and vomitted once," DMHO said. DMHO Dr Nirmala claimed that the mother had given the boy a bottle of milk after they reached home. When the baby began struggling, the ASHA worker on duty advised the baby to be taken to Kangti Primary Health Care (PHC) for a medical examination. "However, the parents took the baby to a private doctor in Kangti at around 2 pm. The doctor examined the baby and informed the Kangti PHC medical officer. When the medical officer reached PHC and

examined the baby, he noticed that the lips were turning blue, foam was coming out of the nose, and he was not breathing. The doctor declared the baby dead at around 2.15 pm." The DMHO said the PHC Kangti medical officer had the body shifted to the Naranakhed area hospital for postmortem examination (PME). According to the PME report, the cause of death may have been laryngeal spasm (tightening of the throat), leading to aspiration of food into the lungs (aspiration). The stomach contents have been sent for laboratory examination, and the final report is awaited. A total of 108 children were administered Pulse Polio drops through the same vial in the same booth, but no adverse reactions were recorded in them, officials said.

Most Fake News Was On Politics, Religion, Finds ISB Chief

Over 500 fake news items were shared between 2022-24, with 60 per cent of them being on politics and religion, according to a study shared by Indian School of Business. The numbers were roughly calculated after extracting data from sources like Alt-News and Boomlive and a survey by the ISB. Prof. Manish Gangwar, executive director of Institute of Data Sciences (IDS), ISB, on Thursday organised a workshop titled 'Cyber First Responders: Fighting Misinformation & Fake News in the Digital Age', at its Hyderabad campus. According to the data, 43.6 per cent of the fake news consisted of political news, followed by 33.6 per cent of general news and 16.8 per cent of the

fake news being related to religion. Among these, 35.60 per cent of the fake news was found to be circulated in the form of text and video, and platform X (twitter) was found to be the biggest source of fake news (61 per cent). Speaking at the event, Major Vineet Kumar (retd), founder and global president, CyberPeace, underlined that fake news, AI-generated misinformation and deepfakes weren't just tech problems — they were trust problems. "With ISB, we're equipping journalists, content creators and influencers with fast, practical detection and verification to spot synthetic media and stop harm before it spreads. The goal: faster truth, fewer harms, and a stronger information ecosystem for India," he said.

Odisha Medical Student Allegedly Gang-Raped in Durgapur, Sparks Outrage

A second-year medical student from Odisha was allegedly gang-raped by unidentified men near a private medical college in Durgapur, Paschim Bardhaman district, on Friday night, police said. The 20-year-old student, hailing from Jaleswar in Balasore district, had gone out for dinner with a male friend when the attack occurred, triggering widespread concern and political reactions in West Bengal.

According to police, the student was approached by three men outside the college campus after her friend briefly left her. The men allegedly snatched her phone, dragged her to a nearby wooded area, and assaulted her. They reportedly threatened her with dire consequences if she reported the incident and demanded money in exchange for returning the phone. The survivor is currently receiving treatment at the college hospital. Officials described her condition as

stable but critical. She has recorded her statement with the police, who are conducting a thorough investigation. A police officer from New Township Police Station said, "The student went out with her friend around 8.30 p.m. The friend left her for a few minutes, during which three men approached, snatched her phone, and took her to a deserted spot where they raped her. They also demanded money to return the phone." Authorities have

launched an intensive probe, reviewing CCTV footage, questioning the victim's friend, and deploying a forensic team to collect evidence from the site. Deputy Commissioner (East) Abhishek Gupta described the case as "sensitive" and assured that the investigation was being carried out with all aspects in mind. The student's parents arrived in Durgapur on Saturday after being informed by her friends. Her father said, "We lodged a police complaint

after arriving. We sent our daughter here because of the college's reputation. We want justice." The National Commission for Women (NCW) has taken suo motu cognisance of the incident and sent a team to meet the survivor and her family. NCW member Archana Majumdar expressed concern over the rising crimes against women in the state, urging the Chief Minister to ensure accountability. The incident has also sparked a political row.

The BJP accused the ruling Trinamool Congress (TMC) government of failing to maintain law and order. Leader of the Opposition Suvendu Adhikari spoke with the survivor's father, offering support and suggesting that his daughter be shifted to a Kolkata hospital if required. "Since the RG Kar case, there have been multiple crimes against women. Law and order has collapsed under Mamata Banerjee, who is also the police minister," Adhikari claimed. BJP IT

cell head Amit Malviya posted on X that a complaint had been filed against Wasif Ali and his associates. Meanwhile, Women and Child Development Minister Sashi Panja described the assault as "deeply unfortunate" and appealed to political parties to refrain from politicising crimes against women. She assured that the state remained committed to ensuring justice and empowering women. West Bengal Congress president Subhankar Sar-

kar also condemned the attack, calling it a "reflection of the TMC government's failure to protect women," and dispatched a party team to Durgapur to assess the situation. The case comes amid heightened scrutiny of women's safety in West Bengal, following several high-profile assaults, including last year's RG Kar Medical College rape-murder case. Police continue to investigate and are working to identify the perpetrators.

Chloe Zhao reveals the areas of improvement for Hollywood

Chinese filmmaker Chloe Zhao, who is known for her work on ‘Eternals’, and ‘The Rider’, feels there are a few grey areas where Hollywood needs improvement. The Oscar-winning director got candid about Hollywood, the difficulty of financing films, and how neurodivergence has impacted her storytelling, reports ‘Variety’.

Her devastating historical drama ‘Hamnet’, about the personal tragedy that led to the creation of William Shakespeare’s ‘Hamlet’, starring Paul Mescal and Jessie Buckley, held its European premiere at the London Film Festival recently.

As per ‘Variety’, at the festival,



the film was welcomed with plenty of emotion (and a surprise appearance from producer Steven Spielberg). Speaking about making the film, Chloe Zhao said that the experience made her “very passionate about rediscovering and remembering some older ways of storytelling that have been forgotten in our

society”.

“Before we made everything factual and reasonable, there was a time where we’d see stories in different ways, from our dreams, our vision quests, from going into nature and listening to the birds”, she said. “So the language of ambiguity is, to me, vital for the health of a society. And I think even in Hollywood, in the film industry, we are not very good at preserving the language of ambiguity. If logos and mystery are in harmony, we would be living in a much better world”.

However, the director acknowledged that it’s oftentimes difficult to get stories like these financed for the big screen. Though profiting from a film is not her end goal, the filmmaker

acknowledged that “money is really important”.

She went on, “Maybe it’s because I’m Chinese, I don’t know what is it, but I’m so afraid of owing people money. I don’t like it. I don’t like being in debt. I want the people who put the money into my films to get the money back”.

“I don’t believe that my vision and whatever importance of my film should make people lose money. It’s just not for me. I try really hard to get financiers or studios to say, how much are you comfortable giving me so that you can survive as a company, please. And then I’ll do it within that. So I think it’s really helpful because limitations, I promise, are your best friend”, she added.

China tightens hold on Africa to exploit rare earths sector

China is further strengthening its dominance in the rare earth elements sector by making deeper inroads into African countries, which are rich in critical minerals like cobalt, lithium, and nickel, vital for the production of batteries, electric vehicles, and renewable energy technologies.

However, Chinese investment projects have faced criticism regarding worker exploitation, lack of transparency, and for using primarily local Chinese labour instead of hiring local workers.

China’s investments aim to strengthen its geopolitical influence and its high-tech manufacturing sector.

It has been using its infrastructure model of constructing roads and railways to get long-term mining rights. Finance is another potent instrument that Beijing uses to establish its foothold in African countries. Chinese loans to African governments and state-owned companies have surpassed a whopping \$152 billion, with Angola accounting for



nearly 30 per cent of the total, according to media reports.

Reports indicate that Chinese companies have invested nearly 8 billion in mining projects in Africa. Chinese investments in African rare earth minerals are driven by demand from China’s own economy and global clean energy needs, securing supply for its high-tech industries through direct investments in mines and financing. Africa is becoming a crucial source of raw materials, with countries like Tanzania poised to become major exporters to Chinese processors.

Chinese companies invest heavily in African mines and processing facilities to secure a stable and long-term supply of rare earth elements (REEs) and other critical minerals essential for modern technology.

Many projects are in different stages of development, with some expected to begin production in the coming years, which will significantly increase the continent’s output. Some examples include projects in Namibia, Malawi, Angola, Tanzania, and South Africa.

While Africa’s mining output is growing, China’s dominance lies in the processing and refining stages of the rare earth value chain, controlling a significant majority of global supply. Chinese firms have also been accused of corrupt practices. Namibia presents a typical case where Xinfeng Investments, a firm owned by Chinese interests, is accused of acquiring its Uis lithium mine through corrupt practices, utilising permits meant for small-scale miners.

India's sugar exports touch 7.75 lakh tonnes in 2024-25

India has exported 7.75 lakh tonnes of sugar in the 2024-25 marketing season, which stretches from October 2024 to September 2025, according to a statement issued by the All India Sugar Trade Association (AISTA) on Sunday. The top destinations for the country’s sugar exports were Djibouti with 1.46 lakh tonnes, followed by Somalia at 1.35 lakh tonnes, while Sri Lanka was at

the third spot with 1.34 lakh tonnes. Afghanistan figured next with shipments of 75,533 tonnes.

Sugar exports for the 2024-25 marketing season in India were allowed by the government on January 20, 2025, with the total quantity permitted for export at 10 lakh tonnes. According to the AISTA, of the total 7.75 lakh tonnes that were exported from February to September this year, white sugar exports were at 6.13 lakh tonnes, refined sugar comprised 1.04 lakh

tonnes, and raw sugar constituted 33,338 tonnes. About 21,000 tonnes of raw sugar were considered to be deemed exports as they were delivered at the SEZ. AISTA has requested the government to allow export of sugar in the 2025-26 sugar marketing year and announce the export quota by November 2025,” the statement said.

The trade body has also requested the government to follow the same export quota policy for allocation and exchange among

mills as followed in the 2024-25 sugar marketing year.

India is the world’s second biggest sugar producer and is expected to have sufficient surplus stocks to allow exports in the season beginning October 1, a senior government official said recently. Exports would help the Indian government support local sugar prices and ensure farmers receive timely payments of the guaranteed minimum price for their cane from sugar mills.

Department of Food and Public Distribution Joint Secretary Ashwini Srivastava said next season’s output looked good, and that after meeting domestic consumption and the requirement for ethanol production, there would be sufficient stocks for export.

A record 4.8 billion litres of ethanol is likely to be produced in the new season from sugarcane-based feedstock, he said. The country’s sugar consumption in the new season is likely to rise.

Australia captain Alyssa Healy said chasing 331 in 50 overs against India was new territory for her team, adding that stitching crucial partnerships despite cramp worries helped them seal victory in the Women’s World Cup.

Healy slammed a magnificent 142 off 107 balls, hitting 21 fours and three sixes, and shared crucial partnerships with Phoebe Litchfield (40), Ellyse Perry (47 not out), and Ashleigh Gardner (45) as they reached 331/7 in 49 overs to win the match by three wickets with six balls to spare.

"Great result. We'll take those two points. To chase down 330 in 50-over game is new territory for us. Hopefully don't have to do it again. Our top order felt like we needed to contribute more. Knowing that we needed to chase big, getting a quick start was crucial. That we were able to maintain the run-rate was cool," said Healy in the post-match presentation

on Sunday.

Australia were in huge trouble as Smriti Mandhana (80) and Pratika Rawal (75) shared a 155-run partnership for India to build a platform from which the hosts could have soared to even 400. But from 192/1, India lost their way and lost nine wickets for 138 runs, including the last six for 36 and were all out for 330, falling short of the target projected at one time.

Australia’s experienced pacer, Annabel Sutherland, played a leading role in scripting the turnaround, claiming five wickets for 40 runs, the best bowling figures for both teams. "She's probably the pick of our bowlers from length perspective. She identified the lengths to bowl and executed perfectly. There was some junk bowling. We were able to hang in there," she added.

The wicketkeeper batter said partnerships were key for her team and they managed to stitch some together on Sunday after failing to do so in their first two matches. "Part-



nerships are key, we lacked that in the first couple of games. We were able to have a significant one and to have Perry walking in at 30 not out is cheeky. Ultimately got the job done, that’s crucial,"

said Healy. The Australian skipper, who kept wickets for 50 overs of the Indian innings and then batted for nearly 39 overs, said cramps were a worry for her players. Elysse Perry had to go out for some

time because of hamstring cramps, but she came back and secured victory. "There are cramp worms going around our group, but we have a couple of days to rest and recover," she added.

Hyderabad Gets India’s First Fab Museum

Hyderabad has become home to the country’s first-ever Semiconductor Innovation Museum, launched by T-Chip ((Technology Chip Innovation Programme) on Sunday. The museum aims to showcase path-breaking research and technological advancements in chipmaking. Former Governor Bandaru Dattatreya and minister V. Srihari participated in the event. Speaking at the launch, T-Chip chairman and managing director Sundeep Kumar Makthala outlined the broader vision behind the initiative, stating, “This is not just a museum but a gateway to the technologies shaping India’s semiconductor future.” According to Makthala, while countries such as Taiwan and South Korea have museums dedicated to technology, none have focused exclusively on semiconductor innovations.He said the museum would host new ideas every month, with each innovation being showcased for 30 days before being replaced by another. “As semiconductors are trending worldwide, Hyderabad could serve as a launch pad for India’s semiconductor ecosystem,” Makthala said.

Congress leaders rush to pacify upset aspirants after Jubilee Hills

After the tussle over finalising a candidate for the Jubilee Hills by-election, the Congress in Telangana now faces the uphill task of pacifying disappointed aspirants who were keen on contesting the seat. On Friday, AICC in-charge Meenakshi Natarajan, AICC in-charge Vishwanathan, BC Welfare Minister Ponnamm Prabhakar and Labour Minister G Vivek Venkatswamy met former MP Anjan Kumar Yadav at his residence and attempted to placate him. Similarly, party leaders at Gandhi Bhavan said the BC Welfare Minister, Labour Minister and others met GHMC Corporator CN Reddy on Saturday. Along with the former MP, he too had aspired to contest the by-election on a Congress ticket. However, both leaders were left disappointed after the party decided to field V Naveen Yadav as its candidate. “The State leadership is definitely having tough times in pacifying the aspirants. It does not end with this by-election; they are likely to come up with more demands in future,” a senior leader from Gandhi Bhavan remarked. Fuming over the decision, Anjan Kumar Yadav is learnt to have raised several objections with the AICC in-charges during the meeting and expressed concern over the importance being given to loyal and senior leaders within the party.

At the same time, the commissioner issued a stern warning against negligence and misconduct. “It is unacceptable for anyone in uniform to take the law into their own hands. Any officer found guilty of dereliction of duty or misconduct will face strict departmental action,” he asserted. The launch coincided with the recognition of several officers for their recent achievements. Sub-inspectors Sudhakar, Shobha, Saikanth, and Shivakumar, along with their team, successfully cracked a child murder case under the

Madannapet police station limits. Afzal Gunj station house officer Ravi, Admin sub-inspector Niranjan, and ASI Dharmender were honoured for rescuing destitute individuals and relocating them to the Amma Nanna Ashram, providing them shelter and care. Film Nagar head constable Vijaya Sudhakar and constable Surender were also appreciated for arresting an accused in a case pending for over 30 years. VC Sajjanar, who took charge as Hyderabad Police Commissioner on September 30, replacing CV Anand (now Principal Secretary, Home Department), emphasised that the programme is not only about rewarding bravery and efficiency but also about fostering ethical policing and public trust. Officers said the initiative provides a significant morale boost and inspires them to go beyond routine duties to ensure safety, justice, and welfare for citizens.

Telangana to Launch AI Innovation Hub, Aiming to Make Hyderabad a Global AI Capital

Telangana is set to establish an AI Innovation Hub to consolidate all existing AI initiatives, startups, and centres of excellence under a single umbrella, the Chief Minister’s office announced on Sunday. The move is part of Chief Minister Revanth Reddy’s vision to position Hyderabad as a global AI capital. The government is rolling out a five-pronged strategy focusing on AI skilling, startup support, global collaboration, research advancement, and the creation of centres of excellence to attract global talent and boost innovation. Key initiatives include providing AI skill training



ing to millions through partnerships with leading international institutions such as Berkeley Artificial Intelligence Research, MIT’s Computer Science and Artificial Intelligence Laboratory, and the Mohamed bin Zayed University of Artificial Intelligence. The state will also target strategic sectors such as quantum computing, cybersecurity, semiconductors, data centres, and high-performance computing (HPC). Over the next year, the government plans to collaborate with 50 global AI startups, sign three MoUs with academic partners, skill one million professionals through the Global AI Skilling Academy, and establish multiple corporate partnerships. This initiative complements other futuristic projects in Telangana, including the ongoing ‘T Square’ development modelled after New York’s Times Square, reviewed recently by CM Revanth Reddy. With the AI Innovation Hub, Telangana aims to streamline innovation efforts, attract global investment, and create a skilled workforce ready to lead in emerging AI technologies.

In September, Hyderabad’s cybercrime police arrested 59 individuals from across India, recovering and refunding approximately Rs 86.64 lakh to victims of online fraud. The National Cybercrime Reporting Portal (NCRP) received 320 complaints during the month, out of which 222 FIRs were registered at local police stations and 106 at zonal cyber cells. The 59 arrests were connected to 257 cases nationwide, including 74 cases within Telangana. Investment fraud accounted for the majority of arrests, with 28 individuals apprehended, followed by six in digital fraud, four each in part-time investment scams, social media scams, and credit card fraud. Three arrests were made in both movie piracy and unauthorised transaction cases, two in matrimonial fraud, one in trading fraud, and two in other types of offences. During the operations, police seized 43 mobile phones, 23 ATM and debit cards, four laptops, nine cheque books, eight passbooks, 21 SIM cards, and a shell company stamp. The recovered funds were substantial, including Rs 58.47 lakh from investment fraud cases, Rs 5.21 lakh from OTP frauds, Rs 1.13 lakh from impersonation fraud, Rs 50,000 from APK fraud, Rs 12.43 lakh from trading fraud, Rs 2.58 lakh from credit card fraud, Rs 3.34 lakh from digital fraud, Rs 1.78 lakh from job-related scams, and Rs 1.18 lakh from other NCRP complaints. The cybercrime police have urged the public to exercise caution and verify the identity of anyone requesting money online, especially messages or friend requests claiming to be from senior government officials. They have also warned against fake investment groups promising high returns with little risk and APK files sent via SMS or WhatsApp claiming to be from banks. Victims of cyber fraud are advised to report incidents immediately on the helpline number 1930 or via the official NCRP website to ensure swift action and recovery of funds.

Hyderabad Set for Underground Power Cable Overhaul

The government plans to shift all overhead power lines in Hyderabad underground, making the city safer, smarter, and visually appealing, elevating its global profile. Deputy chief minister Bhatti Vikramarka Mallu, who also holds power portfolio, took this decision following fire tragedies at Pathergatti and Ramanthapur. The detailed project report (DPR) is nearly complete, with the pilot phase targeting the core urban region and covering about 528 km of 33 kV lines, 1,198 km of 11 kV



lines, and nearly 4,800 km of low-tension networks. Citywide, the system spans approximately 24,500 km. The phased rollout will use horizontal drilling to reduce disruption to traffic on the roads. Officials say the transition will save Rs 500 crore annually in reduced transmission losses, theft, and upkeep, besides supporting sustainable urban growth. To ensure quality, the government sent energy secretary Navin Mittal and southern discom chairman and managing director Musharraf Ali Faruqui to study Bengaluru’s model, which saw 1,400 km of cables moved underground for Rs 1,800 crore — roughly Rs 13 crore-Rs 15 crore per km. Hyderabad’s first-phase costs mirror these benchmarks, with estimated expenditure at Rs 2,800 crore-Rs 3,200 crore and the project cost is likely to exceed Rs 13,500 crore over four to five years. The shift to underground

cabling forms a vital part of Chief Minister Revanth Reddy’s grand vision for Hyderabad. His roadmap includes developing the Bharat Future City — a 30,000-acre hub with zones dedicated to AI, health, and education—alongside the Musi River rejuvenation and major works like T-Square. For Bhatti, upgrading century-old infrastructure goes well beyond beautification and is crucial for upgrading urban safety and governance. Underground networks will cut power theft, minimize outages, and free up city roads by removing poles from cramped lanes.
