The Congress high command has directed Telangana Congress leaders to strengthen the party's organisational structure from the grassroots level to ensure a second term for Congress government in the 2028-end Assembly elections. It instructed the leaders to approach every electoral contest in next three years in all seriousness and ensure consistent victories that would build momentum ahead of the 2028 polls.

The All India Congress Committee (AICC) held a series of one-on-one meetings on Saturday at Indira Bhavan, the party headquarters in Delhi, with Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy and Deputy Chief Minister Mallu Bhatti Vikramarka to discuss the roadmap for fortifying the party in Telangana. AICC secre-



tary (organisation) K.C. Venugopal chaired the meetings that was also attended by Telangana incharge Meenakshi Natarajan and TPCC president B. Mahesh Kumar Goud. According to party sources, Venugopal said that district Congress committees (DCCs) would play a crucial role in revitalising the party and said the AICC will constitute new committees by appointing only hardworking and deserving individuals as DCC presidents and executive members.

The AICC had earlier de-

puted observers to Telangana to identify suitable candidates for DCC posts. These observers toured all districts and submitted panels of three probables for each DCC president position. Venugopal reviewed the lists along with Revanth Reddy and Bhatti, seeking their inputs on each candidate. Based on their feedback, the high command will finalise one name for each DCC post within a week. The AICC also set an ambitious target of winning at least 80 per cent of the seats in all upcoming

Pan-India SIR of Voters' List Next Week

(SIR) of the voters' list next week, beginning with 10 to 15 states, including those scheduled to go to polls next year. According to reports, Assam, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry, Kerala, and West Bengal, which will hold elections in 2026, are among the first states where the voter list cleanup exercise will begin. Officials quoted in the reports said the poll body is expected to announce the first phase of the SIR by mid-next week, covering up to 15 states. The EC will not conduct the exercise in states where local body elections are currently underway or are due soon, as the local election machinery is engaged in those polls. The SIR in such states will be carried out in subsequent phases.

Two members of the Australian women cricket team visiting India for the ongoing ICC Women's World Cup Cricket were "approached and inappropriately touched" by a motorcycle-borne man in Indore in Madhya Pradesh, police said on Saturday. The accused followed the two women cricketers in his motorcycle when the two crickpopular café in Khajrana Road from their hotel, Radisson Blu Hotel, at around 11 am on Thurs-

Amith Shah Warns Bihar

NEW DELHI: US President Donald Trump left on Friday for Asia and high-stakes trade talks with Chinese counterpart Xi Jinping -- adding that he would also like to meet North Korean leader Kim Jong Un on his trip. Trump is set to meet Xi in South Korea on the last day of his regional swing in a bid to seal a deal to end the bruising trade war between the world's two biggest economies. He will also visit Malaysia and Japan on his first trip to Asia since he returned to the White House in January in a blaze of tariffs and international dealmaking. Trump told reporters aboard Air Force One that he hoped for a "very good meeting" with Xi, adding that he expected China to make a deal to avoid further 100 percent tariffs that are due to come into effect on November 1. As he left Washington, Trump added to speculation that while on the Korean peninsula he could meet Kim Jong Un for the first time since 2019." I would. If you want to put out the word, I'm open to it," Trump added aboard the presidential plane. "I had a great relationship with him." The two leaders last met in Hanoi, Vietnam, during Trump's first term. Kim has said he would also be open to meeting the US president if Washington drops its demand that Pyongyang give up its nuclear arsenal. Seoul's reunification minister has said there is a "considerable" chance that Trump and Kim will meet while the US leader is in South Korea, mainly for a regional summit.- Peace and trade deals - Trump's first stop will be Malaysia, where he arrives on Sunday, for the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) summit -- a meeting he skipped several times in his first term. In a shocking incident, Hyderabad South East Zone Deputy Commissioner of Police (DCP) S. Chaitanya Kumar was allegedly attacked by a mobile phone thief on Saturday, October 25, near Victoria Playground in Chaderghat. The officer opened fire in self-defence, injuring the accused, identified as

Mohammed Omar Ansari, a habitual offender from Kamathipura. According to Hyderabad Police Commissioner V.C. Sajjanar, Ansari has nearly 20 criminal cases against him, including property offences, extortion, and illegal possession of arms. He is also a rowdy-sheeter and has been detained twice under the Preventive Detention (PD) Act.


The incident occurred when DCP Chaitanya and his team, on their way to the office after a meeting with Commissioner Sajjanar, noticed Ansari allegedly stealing a mobile phone. When the police tried to apprehend him, Ansari pulled out a knife and attacked the DCP and his Personal Security Of-

"In response, DCP Chaitanya fired two rounds — Ansari was hit on his hand and abdomen," Commissioner Sajjanar told reporters. Another alleged

offender accompanying Ansari managed to flee the scene.

A wounded Ansari attempted to escape by running into a nearby residential building and jumping into a playground, but locals helped police capture him. He was taken to a hospital in Nampally for treatment, while the injured gunman and PSO were also hospitalised. DCP Chaitanya is reported to be out of danger.

The area was cordoned off for investigation, and police have launched a search for the absconding accomplice. Sajjanar said the crime scene will be reconstructed to establish the exact sequence of events. Reaffirming the department's stance, Commissioner Sajjanar stated, "If someone attacks police personnel, they will naturally retaliate. Public safety remains our top priority."



Congress, BJP Ignored Us—BRS Brought Us Home: Jordan Returnees

Twelve migrant workers from Telangana who were stranded in Jordan for several months have safely returned home, thanks to the intervention of former Minister T. Harish Rao and the Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS). The workers, who arrived in Hyderabad in the early hours of Saturday, met Harish Rao at his residence and expressed heartfelt gratitude for helping them return after enduring severe hardships abroad. They said their repeated appeals to the Congress and BJP governments went unanswered. Harish Rao said that, following the directions of BRS chief K. Chandra-



shekar Rao (KCR), the party had worked relent-lessly for nearly two weeks to secure the workers' release. "We brought to the notice of both state and central governments the plight of 12 Telangana migrants trapped in Jordan, but there was no response. Hence, we took it upon ourselves to bring them home," he said.

The migrants had trav-

elled to Jordan for employment but were reportedly trapped by local agents and employers. Despite several appeals to the Indian Embassy in Jordan, they received no assistance. Eventually, Harish Rao, through BRS MP Suresh Reddy, contacted officials in the Ministry of External Affairs and held discussions with the Jordanian company concerned.

Srivarshita's Suicide Sparks Outrage Over Gurukula Schools Mismanagement

A tragic incident at Vangara Gurukula School, under Minister Ponnam Prabhakar's Husnabad constituency, has triggered widespread outrage. Srivarshita, a topper from Huzurabad, committed suicide on the evening of October 25 after allegedly being harassed by the school principal and vice-principal. She reportedly spoke to her parents at 6:30 PM and took her life by 7:30 PM. Her body was reportedly taken away in a tractor.

The school, part of KCR's initiative costing Rs. 25 lakh per student, has faced criticism for poor governance. BRS General Secretary Dr. R.S. Praveen Kumar highlighted that 110 students have died in Gurukulas over the past two years, raising serious concerns about safety and accountability. Padi Kaushik Reddy has stood by Srivarshita's family, demanding immediate suspension of the principal and warden and ex-gratia compensation of Rs. 1 crore for the bereaved family. Questions have been raised over Minister Ponnam Prabhakar's absence from his



own constituency during the incident and the government's silence.

Critics allege ministers are more focused on contracts, tenders, and personal gain than student welfare. The incident has drawn sharp social media reactions from both Congress and BJP, with calls for large-scale protests if accountability is not ensured.

Dr. Praveen Kumar emphasized the need for protection for Gurukula children and IAS officer Rizvi, citing neglect and misuse of authority in Jubilee Hills and elsewhere. He questioned the moral responsibility of ministers, including Revanth Reddy, Seethakka, Adluri Laxman, and Ponnam Prabhakar, urging immediate action to prevent further tragedies.

Kavitha demanded that the Group-1 examination be cancelled and re-conducted to ensure transparency and fairness, asserting that the movement would continue until justice is achieved for the unemployed youth.

Madhu demanded a government inquiry into the office, questioning why no investigation has been nducted against Sridhar Babu for actions affecting SC, BC, and ST communities. He urged the Chief Minister to form a committee to probe alleged corruption and illegal dealings in the Secretariat and the minister's office.

₹8,000 Crore HAM Road Scam, Govt Looting Public Money: BRS

<u>HYDERABAD</u> Wakeup telangana

Former Minister and MLA Vemula Prashanth Reddy has alleged massive corruption in the Telangana government, claiming an ₹8,000 crore scam in Hybrid Annuity Mode (HAM) road tenders. The estimated cost per kilometer was inflated by 85%, with tenders floated for ₹17,000 crore for roads meant to be built for ₹9,000 crore.

Prashanth Reddy accused the Chief Minister of personally dividing shares when disputes arose between ministers over work tenders. He further claimed threats against contractors, misuse of officials, and scams like the liquor bottle hologram case.

The HAM model, he said, burdens taxpayers heavily, with the government itself paying interest on bank loans under CRF 10. Small contractors are



particularly disadvantaged, while mobilization advances are misused. Prashanth Reddy urged engineers, officials, and major contractors not to participate in what he called "government loot" and demanded immediate cancellation of HAM tenders. He also called for central investigative agencies, including the CBI, to step in, citing two central ministers from Telangana who could be involved indirectly. "The Telangana Congress government has become a role model in corruption," he said, criticizing the CM for frequent trips to Delhi to shield himself. He vowed to raise his voice on every platform against these HAM road tenders draining public

Mega Job Mela in Huzurnagar

Huzurnagar witnessed a record turnout as thousands of job seekers thronged the two-day mega job fair organised by the Industries Department with support from Singareni Collieries Company Limited (SCCL) and the Digital Employment Exchange of Telangana (DEET). BRS Spokesperson Krishank slams CM Revanth for "Aha Na Pellanta" repeat act before Jubilee Hills

BRS spokesperson Krishank launched a sharp attack on Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy, accusing him of repeating the "Aha Na Pellanta-style drama" ahead of the Jubilee Hills by-election. Drawing parallels with the popular Telugu movie, Krishank said that just as the film's chicken scene makes everyone's mouth water without ever serving food, Revanth Reddy has been raising people's hopes with hollow promises that remain unfulfilled. MLC and Chief Whip Patnam Mahender Reddy had promised development funds during the campaign but never revisited Cantonment after elections or released a single rupee. Rajya Sabha MP Anil Kumar Yadav's assurance to use his MP

funds for Cantonment's development, too, remained only on paper. Issuing a challenge to the Congress leadership, Krishank said, "Before stepping into Jubilee Hills to seek votes again, let all those who campaigned in Cantonment show proof of what they have delivered from their earlier promises."

He added that the people are no longer ready to believe the Congress's "Aha Na Pellanta-style" false assurances. "Empty words won't build homes, regularise lands, or bring funds for development," Krishank said, urging voters to see through the Congress's repeated theat-

Unseasonal rains wreak havoc on cotton and paddy crops in Adilabad

Unseasonal rains damaged standing cotton, paddy and other crops in parts of Mancherial and Adilabad districts on Friday night. According to the Telangana State Development Planning Society, Mancherial district recorded an average rainfall of 19 mm, with Kasipet mandal receiving 47.5 mm. Nennal mandal witnessed 42 mm, followed by Vemanapalli with 38 mm. Naspur, Jaipur, Bheemaram, Chennur and Bellampalli mandals recorded rainfall between 15 mm and 35 mm. Adilabad district reported an average rain-



fall of 17.7 mm. Gudihathnoor mandal recorded the highest at 60 mm, while Thalamadugu, Bazarhathnoor, Ichoda, Sirikonda, Boath and Neradigonda mandals saw between 15 mm and 45 mm. The district's actual rainfall stood at 1,421 mm against the normal of 1,064 mm, indicating an excess of 33 per

flattened paddy crops and caused losses to farmers in both districts. Cotton, which was at the harvesting stage, was also affected. Farmers urged the government to conduct crop damage surveys immediately and provide compensation, lamenting that erratic weather was repeatedly pushing them into financial distress.

"If this indifferent approach continues, the Union will not hesitate to call for a strike," he warned. The workload has intensified in recent years. Sai Baba pointed out that despite repeated representations to management

and the state government, many chronic problems remain unaddressed. He noted that following the intervention of the Electricity Department Minister, discussions were held with TRANSCO management, and solutions were agreed upon for several issues. However, no formal orders have been issued to implement these resolutions, leaving artisans' concerns—such as being forced to work without

minimum leave and perform menial tasks—unresolved to this day. The Union leader lamented that workers have been waiting "too long" for action on their demands. "We can no longer afford to wait. The situation demands immediate intervention," he stressed. Among the pressing demands raised, he said there is a need for immediate initiation of promotion processes for eligible employees and labourers.

The forest department is expected to put this call out soon, not announcing jobs but seeking volunteers to assist it as it gears up for Phase-I of the sixth cycle of the All India Tiger Estimation next month. Faced with a staff deficit across the department, particularly in the two tiger reserves at Amrabad and Kawal, the forest department is planning to invite volunteers to join the six-day Phase-1 of the tiger estimation exercise which is expected to be held in the third week of November. A senior department official said options were being created using



which volunteers can sign up for taking part in the tiger estimation which will give them an opportunity to not just go into the forest, but actually observe wildlife, and contribute to the efforts to save the tiger, the forests, and rest of the wildlife. A meeting has been scheduled by the department on October 31 with NGOs involved with nature and wildlife, after which the volunteering process will begin. "All those selected will be trained on what they will be expected to do

and now to do it during the walks," the official

The Phase-I of the estimation exercise involves 5 km one way carnivore walks and 2 km one-way transect walks during which the survey team will be expected to take notes of signs of presence of tigers or leopards, and prey animals such as various species of deer. The estimation exercise will not just in the two tiger reserves but in all forest areas including all the reserve forests, and its seven wildlife sanctuaries

at Eturunagaram, Pakhal, Pranahita, Sivaram, Pocharam, Kinnerasani, and Manjira. Though the department has vacancies across the board, around 1,800 at last count, the vacancy level is the high est in the Amrabad and Kawal tiger reserves which between them have 42 per cent of posts lying vacant. This past April, Union forests minister Bhupender Yadav had written a letter to Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy highlighting the need to fill the vacancies in the tiger reserves. From tomatoes to terrain: Teachers learn how Drones Map India's changing landscape

"Do you know where tomatoes and paddy are grown the most in Telangana? Can you teach your students that?" These question from drone expert R.S. Rayudu sparked curiosity among over 30 geography teachers who attended the GeoMap Society's (GEMS) orientation programme here on Saturday at Kamala Nehru **Engineering College** (KNEC), Nampally. While drones are often associated with weddings, Rayudu explained their real purpose — advanced

mapping, surveillance, and data collection. "We can track where paddy or vegetables like tomatoes are cultivated more. During natural disasters, drones help identify damaged houses and inaccessible areas. Even for large gatherings like Medaram Jatara, drone surveys provide pinpoint construction data," he said. The event, titled GEO-TOP - GeoTeachers Orientation Programme, was organised as a prelude to GeoMap Quiz. Teachers from city schools attended the hands-on workshop on mapping and geographical

information systems (GIS). Sujaya Sahapala, PGT geography teacher at Hyderabad Public School, said, "Students are techsavvy, so we teachers need to upgrade ourselves. This GIS workshop helps us understand how drone imagery can be used to make lessons more visual and relevant." Maj. Shiva Kiran (retd), president of GeoMap Society, presented applications of GIS and mapping in urban planning, healthcare, and public administration. Drone expert Rayudu conducted a demonstration — mapping a 22-acre area in 15 minutes

with a 25-cm resolution pictures using AI-based georeferencing and flight tracking. The GeoMap Quiz brochure was released at the event, with prelims scheduled for November 19, coinciding with International GIS Day under the theme 'Geo-Generalist Era: Where Spatial Meets Everything'. Speakers including M. Chandrashekar, secretary of KNEC, and Dr D. Gangadhar Rao, president of the economic committee, highlighted the scope of GIS in property mapping and agriculture.

Rights groups hold protest rally in Kolkata against SIR

Rights groups including Association for Protection of Democratic Rights (APDR) on Saturday held a protest rally against the Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of electoral rolls planned in West Bengal by the Election Commission of India (ECI).

As the poll panel is gearing up to conduct SIR of Bengal's voter list, the rights body claimed that National Register of Citizens (NRC) will be carried out in the name of SIR. To mark their protest, members of the rights group took out the rally from College Street in north Kolkata to Dorina Crossing in central Kolkata.



APDR alleged that a conspiracy is going on to take away the voting rights and citizenship of many people through this process.

General Secretary of APDR,

Ranjit Sur said, "In the name of creating the voter list under SIR, every person aged 18 years and above will have to mandatorily fill the SIR form. Along with this, every appli-

cant will have to fill a self-declaration form to get their name included in the voter list. Along with the place and date of birth, the place and date of birth of the parents will have to be mentioned compulsorily along with proof. Even the information of the husband and wife will be taken. But none of these will be mentioned in the voter card. Then why is it being taken?"

The APDR general secretary further said, "They will conduct NRC based on all this information. In 2019, an attempt was made to include this information with the census. But then the government could not do it due to the pressure of the civic movement. The responsibility of proving citizenship has been imposed on the individual. This is against the Indian judicial system. Moreover, the Election Commission has no authority in this matter. There is a Supreme Court verdict in this regard. Most of the people will not be able to get all the documents that are being asked for." The rights body claimed that

neither Aadhaar nor voter card is being accepted by the Election Commission. They fear that, if the common man fails to submit the documents properly, his citizenship will be taken away.

Sleeper Buses Banned Abroad, Thrive In India

The bus fire in Kurnool that claimed 19 lives and injured 26 others has reignited concerns over the safety of sleeper-class buses in India — a mode of travel that several countries have long deemed unsafe. While nations such as China, Germany and Vietnam have either banned or heavily restricted sleeper buses citing safety and evacuation challenges, India continues to allow thousands of such vehicles to ply across state borders with minimal checks despite repeated tragedies.

In China, sleeper buses were phased out more than a decade ago, in 2012, after a string of deadly crashes and fires. In 2011, a bus carrying 46 people caught fire in Henan province, killing 41 passengers and leaving only five and the driver alive. Following the accident, China's



ministry of transport issued guidelines mandating that long-distance drivers rest between 2 am and 5 am. A year later, a sleeper bus carrying 39 passengers collided with a methanol tanker in Shaanxi province, setting the vehicle ablaze and killing 36 people. Only three passengers survived with severe burns. In response, the Chinese government banned the manufacture and registration of new sleeper coaches in 2013, citing their instability and the difficulty of rescuing

passengers during emergencies.

Germany also restricts the use of sleeper-style layouts on public roads. Rules introduced in 2006 require all passengers to be seated upright with seat belts fastened while the vehicle is in motion. Defrom transport operators, sleeper buses remain prohibited. Vietnam, once known for its extensive overnight sleeper network, began curbing routes after data showed a disproportionately high number of fatal crashes

involving such vehicles. Several

Vietnamese cities, including Ho Chi Minh City, have now imposed local bans, especially on mountainous or highway routes. Experts say the design of sleeper buses — with enclosed bunks, narrow aisles and limited exits — makes evacu ation nearly impossible during collisions or fires. In many cases, passengers get trapped inside as the main door is often locked by the driver for security reasons while the bus is in motion.

Tejashwi Vows To Transform Bihar

I.N.D.I.A. bloc's chief ministerial candidate for Bihar Tejashwi Yadav on Saturday said he would transform the state into one of the country's leading states by attracting investments and setting up industries if the Opposition coalition is voted to power. Addressing consecutive rallies in Parbatta and Alauli (Khagaria district) and Shahpur (Bhojpur district), the RJD leader said he was contesting the election not merely to form a government but to rebuild Bihar's economy and infrastructure.

"We need to make Bihar number one by bringing in investment, improving education, and ensuring better healthcare facilities," Yadav said. He criticised Union home minister Amit Shah, claiming the BJP leader had remarked that factories cannot be set up in Bihar due to a shortage of land. "We will set up fac-



tories

and attract investors to put Bihar on a development path," Yadav asserted. Accusing Prime Minister Narendra Modi's government of neglecting the state, Yadav said, "The Centre has not even set up a needle factory in Bihar. The PM opens factories in Gujarat and seeks votes in Bihar."

He also attacked the Nitish Kumar government's liquor prohibition policy, calling it "a sham." Yadav alleged that while affluent sections get home delivery of liquor, poor families, especially women,

face harassment through latenight raids. "Meanwhile, rats are drinking thousands of litres of liquor in police stations," he said, referring to reports of missing seized alcohol. Yadav further accused Modi and Shah of "hijacking" Chief Minister Nitish Kumar, saying he was "incapable of leading Bihar anymore." He declared that the time for change had arrived.

was "incapable of leading Bihar anymore." He declared that the time for change had arrived. Promising to address unemployment, Yadav said that if the I.N.D.I.A. bloc forms the government, it would enact a law within

20 days to ensure at least one government job per family, with recruitment completed in 20 months. "I cannot ignore the pain of unemployed graduates. I will reveal my financial plan for this soon," he added. Highlighting the recurring flood problems in Khagaria, Yadav said the district remains inundated from July to December every year, yet no government visits the affected areas. "I will ensure proper drainage facilities to end waterlogging once and for all," he promised.Reiterating his welfare pledges, he said the new government would regularise contractual workers and community mobilisers and provide ₹30,000 annually to women in a single instalment, contrasting it with the NDA's "debt of ₹10,000." Concluding his speech, Yadav invoked Chhath Maiya, saying, "I pray to Chhathi Maiyya to end the people's suffering by overthrowing the NDA government."

Shah Warns Bihar Against Return of Jungle Raj

He warned that a Lalu-Rabri government would bring back lawlessness, while an NDA victory would ensure a progressive Bihar. "If NDA comes to power, Bihar will make its mark as a developed state," he said. Highlighting development under the NDA, Shah said Prime Minister Narendra Modi had restored Nalanda University's historic legacy, claiming that even "100 Bakhtiyar Khaljis cannot destroy it again."

He noted that elections in Bihar are now being held in two phases, unlike the six phases during Lalu Prasad's regime, and predicted that the next elections would be conducted in a single phase. "Vote for the NDA to make that happen," he appealed. Accusing the Opposition alliance of "corruption and nepotism," Shah alleged that RJD supremo Lalu Prasad was only focused on his family's welfare. "Nitish babu wants Bihar's development, while Lalu wants to make his son chief minister and Sonia Gandhi wants her son to be prime minister," he said, adding that there were no corruption charges against Modi or Nitish

Shah alleged that under the RJD, Bihar had become a hub of "murder, robbery, extortion, and kidnapping," while industries fled the state. "Under Nitish babu's leadership, the NDA ended jungle raj, dynastic politics, and Naxalism," he said. Extending greetings for Chhath Puja,

Shah prayed for Bihar to remain free of lawlessness and to continue progressing. "May our sisters and daughters remain safe, and may Bihar become a developed state," he said. Outlining the NDA's priorities, he said the government's focus was on schools, healthcare, irrigation, and drinking water for all households. He highlighted the government's welfare initiatives, including the ₹10,000 deposit to one crore women under the Jeevika scheme, increased pensions for widows and the elderly from ₹400 to ₹1,100, and the ₹3,000 monthly honorarium for ASHA workers. Shah also cited Modi's leadership, claiming that India's economy had moved from 11th to 4th position globally and would rise to third by 2027, adding that the government had successfully struck at terrorist hideouts inside enemy

'Killer Bus' Ran Over Fallen Bike

The sequence of events, which briefly emerged on Friday but was dismissed by the police, emerged after the police began following up on a CCTV camera from a petrol bunk that showed Sankar and Erriswamy. The timestamp on the video showed 2.22 am, about half an hour before the accident which is believed to have occurred between 2.45 am and 3 am. Kurnool SP Vikrant Patil said police verified CCTV footage from nearby areas and identified the pillion rider as Erriswamy, also known as Nani, a GHMC worker

from Tuggali mandal. Police traced Erriswamy and questioned him. DIG Dr Koya Praveen said that the bikers had not consumed alcohol. The duo had dinner together and as there were no buses available to the village at that time, Siva Sankar offered to drop Erriswamy on his

way to Dhone.
According to the police, Siva Sankar, a granite worker, and Erriswamy left Lakshmipuram village around 2 am. After refuelling their bike with petrol worth ₹300 at the bunk, they continued their journey. A few minutes later, near Chinna Tekuru, Siva Sankar lost control of the bike, which skidded and hit the divider on the right side of the highway. He died on the spot, while his friend Erriswamy escaped with

minor injuries.

Erriswamy told police that he pulled Siva Sankar off the road and checked if he was alive. While he tried to move the fallen bike, he saw the speeding bus heading towards him. He escaped, and the bus struck the bike for a short distance before bursting into flames. Erriswamy fled the scene and reached Tuggali. Initially, police believed the version given by the bus driver or others, who claimed that the vehicle hit a moving bike. But the new footage and Erriswamy's statement have exposed the truth — the bus driver failed to notice the bike lying on the road and ran over it due to sheer negligence, leading to the loss of 19 innocent lives.

SP Vikrant Patil said Ulindakonda police have registered a case and are continuing the investigation. With regard to the bus fire victims, DIG Praveen said the police had gathered details of passengers who made reservations. One person boarded the bus at Aramghar in Hyderabad without a reservation, and his whereabouts are still unknown. He said the district SP has contacted Rajendranagar police to obtain CCTV footage of that individual. He added that a detailed report from the RTA officials regarding the bus is awaited. "If the forensic or motor vehicle inspection reports confirm negligence by the bus owner, we will take appropriate action," the DIG stated.

PM Modi to Take Part in Asean Meet Virtually

Economic collaboration will be another key focus area, with discussions likely to include progress on the review of the Asean–India Trade in Goods Agreement (AITIGA).

India remains one of Asean's top trading partners. In 2024-25, bilateral trade between India and the Asean bloc rose to US\$123 billion, with Indian exports valued at \$38 billion and imports at \$84 billion. Between 2000 and 2023, cumulative Foreign Direct Investment (FDI) from Asean countries into India amounted to \$156 billion, primarily from Singapore. Officials noted that Asean is a crucial pillar of India's Act East Policy and its broader Indo-Pacific vision. A strong and unified Asean, they said, plays an essential role in shaping regional dynamics, while India remains committed to sup-

porting ASEAN centrality, unity, and the Asean Outlook on the Indo-Pacific. The Association of Southeast Asian Nations (Asean) currently includes Brunei, Cambodia, Indonesia, Lao PDR, Malaysia, Myanmar, the Philippines, Singapore, Thailand, and Vietnam. Timor Leste is expected to be formally inducted on Sunday as the 11th member of the grouping, after being granted observer status in February 2023. Malaysia chairs Asean this year, while the Philippines will take over in 2026.

Declare sports quota results, TGPSC told

Justice Namavarapu Rajeswar Rao of the Telangana High Court directed the general administration department and other authorities to declare the results of sports quota in government recruitment. The judge was dealing with a batch of writ pleas filed by G. Sammaih and several other sportspersons who participated in senior national, junior national, and university-level events. The petitioners contended that the Telangana Public Service Commission (TGPSC) wrongly restricted the benefit of the quota only to those who represented India in international competitions under Form-I of the gov-

ernment order of August 2012. They pointed out that though the Group-I recruitment notification issued in February 2024 earmarked four posts under the 2 per cent quota, the commission allowed only one such candidate to appear for the mains until the court, by an interim order, directed that all petitioners be permitted to take part, subject to the result of the case. The state and the commission maintained that only candidates with Form-I certificates were eligible for Group-I posts. The petitioners argued that these forms were merely proof of participation and not a basis to deny consideration, as the government orders clearly recognised merit across all levels of sport.

HC orders diet contract for tribal woman

Justice Nagesh Bheemapaka of the Telangana High Court directed the chairman of the Nirmal district diet managing committee and other competent authorities to award a hospital diet supply contract to a tribal woman contractor who has been supplying food to inpatients for nearly a decade. The judge was dealing with a writ petition filed by L. Jhansi, a member of the Scheduled Tribe community, who contended that the contract for supplying diet to government hospitals was improperly allotted to another bidder through a draw of lots, despite a clause in the tender notification stating that local women would be given preference. The dispute arose from a tender notification issued in June 2025 for the supply of diet

to patients at Community Health Centres in Mudhole and Bhainsa and the Area Hospital in Narsapur. Multiple bidders, including the petitioner, quoted an identical rate of `72 per patient per day. The district authorities conducted a draw of lots among those tied on price and selected the unofficial respondent, a society, without informing the petitioner. She argued that she was neither notified

nor given an opportunity to be present during the finalisation process and that her statutory priority as a local tribal woman was ignored. The respondents contended that all qualified bidders consented to the draw of lots and that the petitioner's husband had been informed. They argued that there was no violation, as participation in the bidding process did not guarantee a right to be awarded the contract.

Setback for IAS, IPS Who

Bought Bhoodan Land

In a setback to IAS and IPS officers who purchased alleged Bhoodan and gairan land in Survey No.s 181, 194 and 195 of Nagaram of Maheswaram mandal, the Telangana High Court on Friday dismissed their request to remove the properties from the prohibited list. The court rejected their interim applications seeking to allow the transactions or alter or change the character of the land. Justice K. Lakshman on Friday dismissed the interim applications filed by IAS officer Naveen Mittal; Aishwarya Raj, daughter of IAS officer Vikas Raj; Perla Varun, son of IPS officer Vishwa Prasad; and others, who had requested the court to vacate the stay orders issued on April 24. The stay orders

were issued by Justice C.V. Bhaskar Reddy while dealing a petition filed by Birla Mallesh alleging government inaction on the complaints against the IAS and IPS officers and their kin for purchasing government or bhoodan land.

land. Petitioner Mallesh had requested the court to direct a probe by the Enforcement Directorate and the CBI. Justice Reddy while issuing stay orders had directed the government to move the properties to the prohibited list and not allow transactions, alterations or any changes. **EIPL** Constructions and their directors and several IAS and IPS officers and their kin had filed interim applications seeking to vacate the stay orders and allow transactions and alienations by removing the properties from the prohibited list.

A 36-year-old woman

A 36-year-old woman from Karmanghat was duped of Rs 6.58 lakh after investing in a fraudulent mobile app, for which a link was sent by her friend, that falsely claimed to be government-authorised and police-certified. According to a complaint filed with the Rachakonda cybercrime police, Vijayalaxmi, was introduced to an app named LF WORK by a friend in June. After registering with her Aadhaar details, the victim was contacted by a woman identifying herself as Park Lina, who claimed the platform was approved by the government and verified by the police. To reinforce the claim, the fraudster shared a certificate which later investigations estab-


alaxmi was added to two WhatsApp groups administered by individuals using names such as Lee Young-ac, Park Ji, and Song Yunah, apart from Park Lina. The victim initially received small profits, which encouraged her and her husband to invest larger sums. When the couple attempted to withdraw their money, the fraudsters informed them that the funds could only be released after three years. Vijayalaxmi told the police she had invested Rs 7,59,266 and managed to recover only Rs 1,00,640, losing Rs 6,58,626 in total. A case has been registered, and an investigation is underway. Officials said the scammers made the app appear genuine by falsely portraying it as government-certified and policeauthorised.

HC Upholds Preventive Detention of Jewel Thief



A two-judge panel of the Telangana High Court, comprising Justice Moushumi Bhattacharya and Justice Gadi Praveen Kumar, upheld the preventive detention of Nazim Aziz Kotadia, detained under the Telangana Prevention of Dangerous Activities Act, 1986, rejecting the plea filed by his father, Aziz Hassan Kotadia, seeking his release through a writ of habeas corpus. The prosecution said the detenue was involved in theft of jewellery from shops, including one incident in Medchal, during which he attempted to murder the shop owner when the latter tried to apprehend him. Nazim Aziz

was booked under Section 307 of



the BNS, which deals with theft with preparation for violence and was subsequently sent to Central Prison, Cherlapalli, by order of the Cyberabad police commissioner. It was contended that the detenue was a habitual offender and fell within the definition of a 'goonda' under Section 2(g) of the Telangana Prevention of Dangerous Activities Act, 1986. The division bench noted that the detenue's acts, committed in public places, disturbed public order and warranted preventive detention. The court rejected the plea that there was a violation of procedural safeguards on the ground that the detenue was unfamiliar with the English language. The bench accepted the argument advanced by government pleader Swaroop Oorilla, who contended that the detainee's past conduct and likelihood of committing successive offences justified his continued detention. The court dismissed the habeas corpus petition.

AMID GLOBAL FLUX, SELF-RELIANCE THE WAY FOR INDIA

The Trump-Putin Alaska meeting does not appear to have brought significant benefits to India. Although the meeting was held to resolve the Russia-Ukraine war issues, at a time when both the US and Russia are considered friendly nations by India, it is disappointing that there seems to be no indication of any change in the US tariff policies affecting India.

It appears the meeting was primarily aimed at securing economic advantages for Russia and the US in the coal and oil sectors, rather than resolving the Ukraine crisis. The ceasefire promise vanished from Trump's lips. When Russia insisted on a resolution, President Donald Trump predictably re-


verted to his usual habit of altering statements, which was diplomatically unsurprising to those familiar with his approach.

With Trump and Putin revealing such tactics in Alaska, it is hard not to wonder if Ukraine is being sacrificed as a pawn. The emerging cordial atmosphere between the US and Russia might be seen by Prime Minister Narendra Modi as a potential relief for the economic pressures on India. Since India has always considered Russia a trustworthy friend, there is nothing wrong with the Prime Minister thinking along those lines. Reality of Alaska Summit However, the reality of the Alaska summit was quite different! While it may help restore US-Russia relations, it will clearly not improve ties with

India. Since Trump assumed the American presidency, efforts have been under way not only to enhance ties with Russia but also to boost Russia exports. Meanwhile, imports of Chinese oil from Russia are rising more than those from India -a fact no one can deny! While the US troubles India with tariffs, it simultaneously strengthens relations with Russia and ignores China's assertive actions - making it obvious that Washington looks down on India. America's double standards are evident: Trump repeatedly claims responsibility for a ceasefire between India and Pakistan. yet hosts grand dinners with Pakistan's Army Chief, showing excessive friendliness and granting wide publicity to such events.
















India Eyes 350 Airports by 2047 as Renovated Delhi Terminal 2 Reopens

MUMBAI Wakeup telangana

Civil Aviation Minister K. Rammohan Naidu inaugurated the extensively renovated Terminal 2 (T2) at Delhi's Indira Gandhi International Airport (IGIA) on Saturday, unveiling a key milestone in the government's ambitious plan to transform India into a global aviation hub. The minister emphasized that India's long-term vision includes operating 350 airports by 2047, more than double the current number, as the country seeks to meet growing domestic and international air travel demands. India presently operates 164 airports, including both domestic and international facilities. Speaking to the media, Naidu explained that the challenge ahead is not merely constructing

new airports, but ensuring that



India attracts a higher number of aircraft to service these expanded routes. "Building airports is just one part of the equation. The real task is to bring more aircraft into India and ensure connectivity matches our infrastructure growth," he

The T2 terminal, which has been closed since April 2025 for extensive renovation, is set to resume operations on Sunday. The overhaul of T2 is part of a broader modernization effort at IGIA, aimed at increasing pas-

senger-handling capacity and improving the overall travel experience. The Civil Aviation Minister described the upgrade as "a critical step in positioning India as a major global aviation hub." Delhi's IGIA has witnessed a sharp surge in passenger traffic over recent years. Naidu highlighted that the airport is now targeting a capacity of 120 million passengers annually, with the T2 expansion alone projected to add approximately 15 million seats. The minister underscored that these developments reflect India's rapid growth in air travel infrastructure and its commitment to world-class airport facilities. Addressing ongoing concerns regarding aviation safety, Naidu confirmed that a thorough investigation is underway into the AI-171 crash. While he did not

provide a definitive timeline for

the completion of the inquiry, he emphasized that the Aircraft Accident Investigation Bureau (AAIB) is strictly following International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO) protocols. Highlighting a recent domestic milestone, the minister revealed that the black box from the incident was decoded in India for the first time—a significant technological achievement for the country's aviation sector. Reflecting on India's progress in the past decade, Naidu remarked, "We have built so many airports over the last 10 years that we've become experts. Give us land anywhere in the country, and we can deliver a state-of-the-art airport." His comments underline the government's confidence in India's aviation capabilities and its determination to expand infrastructure to meet future demand.

Crossing the Due Date: Why Waiting Too Long Can Endanger Mother and Baby

Waiting past the due date can turn the joy of pregnancy into a medical emergency, and doctors warn that post-dated pregnancies, if not closely monitored, can endanger both mother and baby. Recently, a 28-year-old mother of two who delayed going to the hospital after crossing her expected delivery date by a week required an emergency cesarean when doctors discovered dangerously low amniotic fluid levels Prolonged pregnancy, defined as 41-42 weeks, and post-dated pregnancy, beyond 42 weeks, occur in 4-15% of pregnancies and may result from incorrect estimation of the due date, maternal obesity, prior prolonged pregnancies, or

waiting for natural labour without medical supervision. Beyond 40 weeks, the placenta begins to age, reducing oxygen and nutrient supply, while amniotic fluid decreases by roughly 33% per week, raising risks of fetal distress, cord compression, stillbirth, meconium aspi-

ration, macrosomia, reduced baby movements, and placental insufficiency.

Regular monitoring in the final month is crucial, with weekly antenatal visits to track fetal heartbeat, movements, amniotic fluid, and placental health; doctors may recommend Non-Stress Tests, ultrasounds, or labour induction at 40-41 weeks if labour does not begin naturally. Expectant mothers should confirm their due date early, track daily fetal movements, avoid delaying hospital visits after 40 weeks, and discuss delivery planning with their doctor. A baby is safest in the womb only until its time, and as Dr. Amreen Sharif emphasizes, awareness, timely check-ups, and early action are essential for safe motherhood.

Trump says trade deal with South Korea 'pretty close' to being finalised

US President Donald Trump has said a trade deal with South Korea is "pretty close to being finalised", noting that he is "ready" if the Asian country is ready for finalising the details of the framework deal struck in July. Trump made the remarks in a press meeting aboard Air Force One on Friday, as he was en route to Malaysia as part of his Asia trip that will also take him to South Korea and Japan. Seoul and Washington have struggled to bridge differences over how to implement Korea's US\$350 billion investment pledge under the July deal.

"It's pretty close to being finalised," he said, according to the White House pool report. "If they have it ready, I'm ready." In a separate online briefing on Friday, a senior US official said the United States

Korea as soon as Seoul is willing to take "appropriate" commitments. The two countries reached their trade deal in late July, under which Seoul committed to investing \$350 billion in the US, among other pledges, in return for Washington's agreement to lower its "reciprocal" tariff and sectorspecific duty on South Korean autos to 15 percent from 25 per cent. But the deal has yet to take effect amid negotiations to reconcile differences over a series of sticking points, including how to fund the investment package. In recent weeks, top South Korean officials, including Kim Yong-beom, the presidential chief of staff for policy, Finance Minister Koo Yun-cheol and Industry Minister Kim Jung-kwan, have visited Washington multiple times, underscoring

Seoul's stepped-up efforts.

Pakistan's public debt reaches 'unsustainable' \$286 billion by FY25

hit \$286 billion by the end of the 2024–25 fiscal year, and its borrowing has reached an "unsustainable" level, a new report has said. The figure, up 13 per cent from the previous year, underscores not only a fragile recovery but also the deep structural flaws that have become the hallmark of Pakistan's fiscal management, according to the report from Maldives In-

sight

Pakistan's total public debt

"Pakistan's economy is not expanding fast enough to outpace its liabilities, and its borrowing remains both habitual and unsustainable," the report said, adding that servicing debt, rather than financing growth, remains the single largest use of public resources. Pakistan's Ministry of Finance's 'Annual Debt Review 2025' concedes that the debt-to-GDP ratio has climbed to 70 per cent, up from 68 per cent the previous year.

Pakistan's fiscal deficit for the year stood at \$25.2 billion, financed primarily through domestic borrowing, the report said, adding that domestic debt alone now accounts for \$194 billion, up 15 per cent from the previous year. Meanwhile, the external debt rose to \$92.5 billion, up 6 per cent. The ministry reported an average time to maturity for domestic debt of 3.8 years and a reduced external debt share. However, interest expenses increased by 9 per cent yearon-year, limiting development spending, according to the report. Multilateral loans accounted for 57 per cent of total exter-

its Multilateral loans accounted for 57 per cent of total external debt, bilateral loans constituted 26 per cent, and commercial borrowing, which includes Eurobonds, made up the remainder. The report noted that these numbers demonstrate the extent to which Pakistan's economic sovereignty is dependent on the conditionalities and fluctuations of external financiers.

Centre harmonises customs exemption framework to boost ease of doing biz, effective from Nov 1

The government has issued a new notification towards bringing a major reform in the customs exemption framework towards ease of doing business. The new notification by Ministry of Finance (Department of Revenue) rationalises and harmonises existing customs duty exemptions across various sectors. The Central Board of Indirect Taxes and Customs (CBIC) has consolidated 31 separate Customs Duty notifications into a single comprehensive document. The sectors covered include renewable energy, metals, fertilisers, agriculture, pharmaceuticals, electronic components etc. Effective from November 1, 2025, the no-

tification consolidates a



wide range of legacy notifications into a single unified structure, while providing conditional exemptions on customs duties, Integrated GST, and compensation cess where applicable. The 'Notification No. 44/2025-Customs dated 24th October 2025,' amends several existing Customs notifications in the public interest. The new consolidated notification effectively merges all relevant exemptions and procedural details into a single framework,

thus eliminating redundancy while preserving the substance of existing benefits.

The amendments affect key notifications governing customs exemptions and procedural frameworks, including Notification Nos. 11/2018-Customs, 8/2020-Customs, 11/2021-Customs, and 52/2017-Customs. The current changes bolster the government's effort to harmonise customs provisions with ongoing budgetary and policy adjustments under the

Integrated and Goods and Services Tax framework.

Earlier this month, the CBIC introduced system-based auto-approval for IFSC code registration to enhance the ease of doing business. The system will automatically approve requests for registration of the same incentive bank account and IFSC code for a particular Importer Exporter Code (IEC) at multiple Customs locations, provided the same combination has already been approved at any one location.

The move comes as part of the CBIC's initiatives to leverage tech nology to simplify procedures, reduce transaction costs, and enhance the ease of doing business for India's trade community, the statement added.

Over 1.5 crore train passengers travelled in festive season so far: Ashwini Vaishnaw

Railways Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw on Saturday said nearly 1.5 crore train passengers have travelled so far in this festive season, adding that over 2.5 crore passengers are likely to travel by the end of the festival season. Vaishnaw informed that big holding areas have been set up at 30 railway stations for smoother crowd manage-

Speaking to reporters here, the minister further said that during former Railways Minister Lalu Prasad's tenure, 178 special trains were run during the Diwali and Chhath festival, which have now increased to over 13,000 — a massive jump. The safety has also increased, and the number of accidents has reduced from over 170 in 2014 to just 31 in 2024-25, and "we aim to reduce it further

and make it safer." According to Vaishnaw, rail track construction has risen from 400-600 kilometres per year to over 4,000 per year. The Indian Railways is also gearing up for the safe and comfortable return journey of passengers after the Chhath Puja festivities. For October 28, 6,181 special trains have been notified to facilitate passengers returning to their workplaces after the festival season. Around 30 stations in Bihar are gearing up for

the festive rush with holding areas, additional ticket counters, CCTV surveillance, and other passenger-friendly arrangements. Moreover, Railways has set up 24x7 medical booths at Patna, Muzaffarpur, Darbhanga, Gaya, and Saharsa with fire brigade and ambulance services on standby for prompt passenger health assistance and safety management.

Telangana DCA flags illegal sale of steroids in gyms

He Telangana Drug Control Administration (DCA), on Saturday, October 25, warned retail and wholesale pharmacies against the illegal sale of mephentermine injections to gyms and fitness center. The DCA maintained that certain gyms and fitness centers illegally procured and sold anabolic-androgenic steroids and cardiac stimulants like mephentermine Injection to gym-goers, who are reportedly misusing them for bodybuilding purposes.

"The abuse of prescription medicines such as anabolic-androgenic steroids, mephentermine sulphate injections, etc., for bodybuilding purposes can lead to serious adverse effects, including cardiovascular disorders, hormonal imbalance, psychiatric disturbances, and, in some cases, even death," said the DCA.

It stated that anabolic androgenic steroids and cardiac stimulants like mephentermine injection, etc., are 'Prescription Medicines,' and shall mandatorily be sold only against a valid prescription issued by a registered medical practitioner.

"Any illegal sale, diversion, or distribution of such prescription medicines for non-therapeutic or abusive purposes constitutes a serious violation of the provisions of the Drugs and Cosmetics Act, 1940 and the Rules thereunder, and shall be dealt with strictly," the DCA warned. It added that the strict compliance of all stakeholders is mandatorily required to ensure that these prescription medicines are not diverted for misuse and that public health and safety are effectively safeguarded.

Telangana DGP Reviews CID, Orders Yearly Crime Focus



fficials of the Hyderabad Disaster Response and Assets Protection Agency (HYDRAA) on Saturday, October 25, fenced a public utility land measuring 4,300 sq. yards, valued at around Rs 86 crore, in Kondapur, Serilingampalli mandal of Rangareddy district. Criminal cases have been registered at the Gachibowli police station against those accused of attempting to encroach on the land.

The land is located within the Osmania University Teachers' Welfare Society layout at Raja Rajeshwari Nagar, Kondapur, which originally consisted of 370 residential plots approved by the gram panchayat in 1978. At the time, the seller, Chinthala Pochaiah, had earmarked the open space for a school building and other public utility purposes. Telangana government junior college students likely to get free uniforms from next academic year

If the Intermediate Education Department's proposal fructifies, students in government junior colleges will get uniforms from the next academic year.

The department has proposed providing two pairs of uniforms free of cost to each student studying in all government junior colleges in the State. On Saturday, the government held discussions with officials from various departments on this proposal. "The idea behind propos-

ing uniforms at the intermediate level is to ensure uniformity among stu-

dents and to help identify those who skip classes and roam outside during college hours," sources said. At present, there are 430 government junior colleges across the State, with over 1.6 lakh students enrolled.

It may be mentioned here that the State, in partnership with the Central government, already provides free uniforms to students in government-run schools. Every year, about 24 lakh students receive two pairs of uniforms each. The government spends Rs 600 per pair, incurring a total annual cost of about Rs 133 crore for one academic year.

Cellphones in Bus Were Delivered by Hyderabad Businessman

Telangana officials have revealed that a massive lithium-ion battery explosion from 243 illegally stored new mobile phones in a Vemuri Kaveri Travels bus may have triggered the fire that killed 19 passengers. The batteries, worth about Rs

49 lakh, were packed in

placed in the luggage cabin, where the blast tripped the ignition system and jammed the hydraulic door, trapping passengers inside.

Investigators said Hyderabad businessman Manganath handed over 234 boxes of mobile phones to

driver Shiva Narayan and

co-driver V. Laxman for

delivery to a Bengaluru

cardboard boxes and

dealer against an online order. The driver had illegally agreed to carry the consignment. Police have taken Manganath into custody and plan to hand him over to Andhra Pradesh police for further investigation.

Forensic experts confirmed that a "massive lithium-ion battery explosion" was the primary cause. Telangana CLUES team head Narakuti Venkanna explained that overheating or damage can trigger thermal runaway in lithium-ion batteries, causing short circuits, rapid gas release, and chain explosions. In this case, the initial blast spread to other batteries and the air-conditioner compressors, igniting a catastrophic blaze. Andhra Pradesh fire services DG P. Venkataramana added that the aluminium flooring melted under extreme heat, accelerating the fire. RTA officials noted that using aluminium instead of iron in the bus body increased combustibility. Joint Commissioner C. Ramesh warned that carrying cargo other than passenger luggage is prohibited under the Motor Vehicles Act, and vio-

lators risk suspension or cancellation of permits. Many operators evade Telangana road tax by obtaining National or Temporary Permits from other states, officials said. Private bus drivers are also incentivised for early arrivals, often driving above 120 kmph with minimal speed monitoring, raising safety concerns.
