#### **White House Slams Democrats Over 'Fake Narrative' Linking Trump to Epstein**

The White House on Wednesday accused Democrats of spreading a "fake narrative" after the release of emails suggesting that President Donald Trump was aware of Jeffrey Epstein's sexual abuse activities. Press Secretary Karoline Leavitt dismissed the revelations as a "hoax" intended to divert attention from an upcoming congressional vote to end the longestever U.S. government shutdown, which Trump has hailed as a Republican victory."The Democrats selectively leaked emails to the liberal media to smear President Trump," Leavitt said, adding that "any American with common sense sees right through this clear distraction."The controversy erupted after Democrats on the House Oversight Committee released emails, first reported by The New York Times.

#### **Bomb Threat on Air India Express Flight from**

**Mumbai to Varanasi** 

An Air India Express flight operating from Mumbai to Varanasi received a bomb threat on Wednesday prompting the security agencies to carry out extensive searches. The flight carrying over 170 passengers landed safely at the Varanasi airport at 4 pm. The passengers were deboarded and the flight was searched. So far nothing was found. "One of our flights to Varanasi received a security threat. In line with protocol, the government-appointed Bomb Threat Assessment Committee was immediately alerted, and all necessary security procedures promptly initiated. The flight landed safely and all guests disembarked.

Red Fort Terror Blast: 'Doctor Module' Exposed — Turkey, Afghanistan Links Unravel in Deadly Plot

The Centre on Wednesday confirmed that the Red Fort car explosion, which claimed 12 lives and injured several others, was a terrorist attack. Investigating agencies have uncovered an international network linking the masterminds to handlers based in Turkey and Afghanistan. These handlers were reportedly in contact with members of the "doctor module" — a group of highly educated recruits connected to the banned Jaish-e-Mohammad (JeM).

Investigations revealed that Dr. Umar Nabi, who drove the explosivesladen car, had planned a major strike around the Babri Masjid demolition anniversary on December 6. His plan reportedly fell

Optional Practical Training, or OPT, allows international students in the US to work for 12 months in their field of study before or after completing their course requirements. Each year, around 250,000 students participate in OPT and STEM OPT, which provides an additional 24 months extension (beyond OPT) in a science, technology, engineering or math field.

# **ATS Seizes Chemicals** from Hyderabad Doctor

Gujarat ATS Seizes Chemicals from Hyderabad Doctor in Ricin Terror Plot

In a major development in the alleged Ricin chemical poison terror conspiracy, the Gujarat Anti-Terrorist Squad (ATS) on Tuesday conducted searches at the residence of arrested doctor Ahmed Mohiyuddin Saiyed in Hyderabad's Rajendranagar area, seizing unidentified chemicals and raw materials suspected to be used in preparing a toxic substance. Officials confirmed on Wednesday that the seized materials have been sent for forensic analysis. The searches were carried out as part of an ongoing probe into a suspected terror syndicate allegedly linked to the Islamic State Khorasan Province (ISKP).

#### Telangana **Records Deflation** for 2nd Month

Telangana recorded deflation for the second consecutive month in October, according to data released by the Central government on Wednesday. The state registered a deflation rate of 1.16 per cent in October, slightly lower than the 1.5 per cent recorded in September. Telangana was among 11 states that witnessed deflation, while India's overall inflation eased to a 13-year low of 0.25 per cent. The country's rural inflation also slipped into deflation at 0.25 per cent.

The decline in both headline and food inflation was attributed to the fullmonth impact of the GST reduction.

Official sources on Wednesday said that each woman will receive two saris under the "Indiramma Saris" scheme, launched by the Congress government to replace the "Bathukamma Saris" scheme implemented by

the previous BRS regime.

The distribution was ini-

tially scheduled during the



Bathukamma and Dasara festivals in October, but was deferred following the enforcement of the Model Code of Conduct for local body elections after the Telangana State Election Commission issued poll notifications. However, the elections were later cancelled after the Telangana High Court stayed the 42 per cent reservation for Backward Classes in these polls. Subsequently, the Election Commission of India announced the Jubilee Hills Assembly bypoll on October 13. The ruling Congress government, led by Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy, was fully engaged in the high-stakes

The government has already supplied the required stock to warehouses across all dis-

This year, the government has allocated ₹480 per sari, compared to ₹350 spent under the previous Bathukamma Saris scheme. The saris are being produced under the "Indira Mahila Shakti" initiative by handloom weavers' societies in Rajanna-Sircilla, Karimnagar, and Hanumakonda districts.


## BRS projected to retain Jubilee Hills with 8 percent lead: KK Surveys exit poll **HYDERABAD**

Multiple exit polls had on Tuesday itself predicted that the BRS would retain the Jubilee Hills constituency, which has remained the party bastion for the last 11 years. Now, KK Surveys and Strategies has also declared BRS as the frontrunner in the bypoll with a significant eight percent margin against the Con-

According to the KK exit poll, BRS was leading with 49 percent vote share, followed by Congress at 41 percent and BJP at 8 percent. KK Surveys and Strategies attributed the BRS lead to the public trust in the party's governance and the strong

Exit polls conducted by KK Surveys and Strategies indicate that the Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS) is poised to retain the Jubilee Hills constituency, a bastion it has held for over a decade. The survey shows BRS leading with 49 per cent vote share, ahead of Congress at 41 per cent and BJP at 8 per cent.

#### Over 1L acres of crops damaged in Telangana by Cyclone Montha: Agri dept

**HYDERABAD** Wakeup telangana

Cyclone Montha has damaged crops spread across 1,17,757 acres in Telangana, affecting 1,22,142 farmers in 27 districts, according to the state agriculture department's report. The most severe losses were reported in the Nagarkurnool district.

Of the total affected acreage, 83,407 acres were under paddy, 30,144 acres under cotton, and 2,097 acres under maize.

Agriculture Minister Tummala Nageswara Rao said the government is preparing to pay compensation at the rate of Rs 10,000 per acre to the affected farmers. The agriculture department has been instructed to complete the verification process and release the assistance at the earliest.

As per central government norms, sand-cast lands are eligible for Rs 7,285 per acre, lands under irrigation projects and tanks for Rs 6,880 per acre, rainfed crops for Rs 3,440 per acre, and horticultural crops for Rs 9,106 per acre. The total compensation requirement is estimated at Rs 70 crore.

The minister stated that the comprehensive damage report would be forwarded to the central government to seek additional financial aid. "In earlier instances, Telangana did not receive central support.

This time, we are requesting immediate assistance and have also asked the Centre to send a team to inspect the affected areas," he said after reviewing the department's report at the Secretariat on Tuesday, November 11.

# Ponguleti Inspects Medaram Works, Sets Dec 15 Deadline for Bridges

The state government is committed to permanently upgrading the Medaram temple area to accommodate up to 10 crore devotees in the future. All development works for the Sammakka-Saralamma Jatara will be completed two weeks before the festival, scheduled for January next year, said erstwhile Warangal Incharge minister Ponguleti Srinivas Reddy. Accompanied by ministers Seethakka, Konda Surekha, and Adluri Laxman, along with MP Porika Balram Naik, Srinivas Reddy inspected the ongoing developmental works and offered prayers to the tribal goddesses Sammakka and Saralamma during his visit to Medaram in Tadvai mandal of Mulugu district on Wednesday.

During a review meeting held at Haritha Kakatiya Hotel with senior officials and contractors, Srinivas



Reddy directed that civil works, including the elevation of platforms (gaddelu), construction of main gateways, and four watchtowers, be completed swiftly within the stipulated timeframe. He instructed that the construction of CC roads, greenery, and plantation around the compound wall be carried out simultaneously.

He also ordered that the Mallampalli and Katakshpur bridge works on the National Highway be completed by December 15 and that all approach roads leading to Medaram, including dividers

and plantation, be finished within a month. The minister directed officials to immediately prepare proposals for check dams on the Jampanna Vagu, as requested by Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy. He also instructed them to propose a permanent bus station and submit plans for the beautification and development of Jampanna Vagu through the tourism department. Additionally, he directed the animal husbandry department to establish four modern slaughterhouses.

Srinivas Reddy emphasised that the ongoing development is aimed at

# **Princeton Students Protest Over** Campus Recruitment Charges

Students of Princeton Engineering College have complained that the college is refusing to accept their semester examination fees unless they first pay the Campus Recruitment Training (CRT) charges. The issue has created tension ahead of the university exams under Jawaharlal Nehru Technological University Hyderabad (JNTU-H). On Wednesday, several students staged a kneel protest in front of the JNTU-H administrative building, demanding im-



mediate action against the college management. They said the protest was meant to draw attention to the continued inaction despite repeated complaints to university authorities. Students said the management is collecting several thousand rupees from

each student in the name of CRT fees and blocking access to examination registration for those who have not paid. "We were told that until we clear CRT fees, our exam fee payment will not be accepted. Many of us are scared that we will not be

pointed out that Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy had recently warned private colleges against harassing students over fee disputes. "If the government really wants to stop this kind of exploitation, it should act quickly," said one of the protesters, Durga Prasad. Students demanded that JNTU-H intervene and allow them to pay examination fees directly without any condition related to CRT charges. They said if no steps are taken, they will continue their protest until they are allowed to write the exams.

## Telangana SSC exams likely from March 18, 2026

# **Minority Students in TMREIS** Schools Face Harassment, Dropouts Rise

Dr. Anis Siddigui Team Steps In to Help Students

Minority students in certain Telangana Minorities Residential **Educational Institutions** Society (TMREIS) schools are reportedly facing oppressive treatment from principals and staff, causing disillusionment with education and increasing dropout rates, according to concerned stakeholders.

The decline in minority student enrollment has created vacant positions, which, it is alleged, some staff are attempting to fill with non-minority students with political backing. Safety concerns have

also emerged, particularly in girls' residential schools, where the appointment of male staff has reportedly led to insecurity. Several molestation and sexual harassment cases have been reported in the media, prompting calls for male staff to be replaced by female personnel.

Religious rights violations have also been highlighted, with minority students reportedly being compelled to participate in rituals against their faith. Stakeholders emphasize that such practices must be strictly

prohibited. To curb these irregularities, a proposal has been made to form district-level vigilance committees comprising committed parents and social organization members to inspect schools regularly. Dr. Anis Ahmed Siddiqui, President of the All India Muslims Think Tank Association, has offered his team's voluntary support for monitoring and investigating these institutions. The memorandum urges the TMREIS administration and the Telangana government to take immediate action to safeguard student welfare, ensure safety, and uphold religious freedoms.

#### Malkajgiri Corporator Seeks Funds for Crematoriums, Safilguda Lake, and Road Works

Malkajgiri Corporator Sravan met Secunderabad Zonal Commissioner Ravi Kiran Kumar today to request additional funds for multiple civic development projects across Malkajgiri Division. During the meeting, Sravan sought immediate sanction for the complete development of the Sardar Patel Nagar crematorium, including making its gas crematorium operational. He also submitted a formal request for the full-scale

development of the Yadav crematorium

at Kakatiya Nagar. On environmental concerns, Sravan highlighted the ongoing cleanup of Safilguda Lake, noting that a major portion of the invasive horseweed (Parthenium) has already been removed. The corporator emphasized the urgency of these measures to improve public amenities, sanitation, and safety in the division, urging the officials to expedite approvals and fund allocation. These initiatives reflect ongoing efforts to enhance civic infrastructure, environmental management, and public welfare in the Malkajgiri area.

#### Second ragging incident within a week rocks Nalgonda **Medical College**

Within less than a week, five juniors faced abuse from a similar senior group. This time also the victims did not dare to lodge a formal complaint. But as the information reached the management, the higher authorities have reportedly called for video footage of the campus happenings. Nalgonda Superintendent of Police Sharat Chandra Pawar has addressed both the students and staff sounding a warning against repetition of such inci-

# Myanmar Military Takes Delivery of Helicopters, Aircraft From Russia and China

Myanmar's military government has formally commissioned new Russian helicopters and Chinese aircraft into its air force, highlighting its ongoing reliance on Moscow and Beijing for military support despite international sanctions and pressure to end the country's civil war. Photos released by the Tatmadaw, Myanmar's military, show three Russian Mi-38T helicopters and two Chinese Y-8 transport planes commissioned on November 7 in the capital, Naypyitaw. Military officials said these aircraft will likely be deployed to transport troops into mountainous regions, boosting operational mobility and air support in conflict zones.



"The current international conflicts and internal situation clearly indicate the essential role of all types of aircraft," said Senior Gen. Min Aung Hlaing, head of the ruling junta. According to the military, the new aircraft will enhance its ability to secure Myanmar's airspace and conduct operations more effectively. Analysts note that Myanmar is the first known export customer for Russia's Mi-38T helicopter. Despite sanctions imposed by the United States, the European

Union, and other countries banning arms sales to Myanmar, Russia and China have supplied the military with hundreds of millions of dollars' worth of equipment. Morgan Michaels, a Singaporebased analyst with the International Institute of Strategic Studies, said the deliveries "demonstrate that the Myanmar military continues to acquire critical equipment despite economic and diplomatic pressures, with Russia serving as a key lifeline." # Israel's Army Chief Vows to End Settler Attacks in West Bank

Israel's military chief on Wednesday pledged to halt settler violence in the occupied West Bank, following a wave of attacks targeting Palestinians in the territory. On Tuesday, Israel's police and military said security forces had arrested several Israeli settlers after clashes near the West Bank city of Tulkarem, during which Palestinians were injured and property destroyed. The military said it dispatched troops after "masked Israeli civilians... attacked Palestinians and set fire to property in the area," adding that four injured Palestinians were evacuated for medical treatment. "We are aware of

the recent violent incidents in which Israeli civilians attacked Palestinians and Israelis. I strongly condemn them," army chief Lieutenant General Eyal Zamir said, in a statement issued by the military. Zamir said the military "will not tolerate criminal behaviour by a small minority that tarnishes the law-abiding public. "These acts contradict our values, cross a red line, and divert the attention of our "We are determined to

troops from their mission," he warned.

"We are determined to stop this phenomenon and will act decisively until justice is served."

Israel has occupied the West Bank since 1967, and more than 500,000 Israelis live in settle-

ments in the Palestinian

territory. A minority of these Israelis engage in violence against Palestinians, who complain that Israeli forces usually do not arrest settlers. All settlements in the West Bank are illegal under international law.

The UN's Office for the

Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs said that October 2025 was the worst month for settler violence since it began recording in 2006, with 264 attacks that caused casualties or property damage. Almost none of the perpetrators have been held to account by the Israeli authorities. Zamir said that troops were operating "to prevent threats and harm to residents of the area."

## EAM Jaishankar holds talks with Saudi Foreign Minister at G7 meetings in Canada

External Affairs Minister (EAM) S Jaishankar held bilateral talks with Saudi Arabia's Foreign Minister Faisal bin Farhan on the sidelines of the G7 Foreign Ministers' Meeting in Niagara, Canada. EAM Jaishankar posted on X, "Met with FM Prince @FaisalbinFarhan of Saudi Arabia. Our interaction covered bilateral ties, regional hotspots, connectivity and energy." The Saudi Ministry of Foreign Affairs also wrote on X, "Foreign Minister HH Prince @FaisalbinFarhan met with Minister of External Affairs of India, @DrSJaishankar, on the sidelines of His Highness's participation in #G7FMM."

Earlier on Wednesday, Jaishankar attended a special session on maritime security along with other G7 foreign ministers.



He also held a bilateral meeting with US Secretary of State Marco Rubio, where the US Secretary of State offered his condolences on the loss of lives in the Delhi blast on Monday.

EAM Jaishankar posted on X, "Good to meet @SecRubio this morning at #G7 FMM. Appreciate his condolences on the loss of lives in the blast in Delhi. Discussed our bilateral ties, focusing on trade and supply chains. Exchanged views on the Ukraine conflict, the Middle East/West Asia situation and Indo-Pacific."

On Tuesday, Jaishankar held a series of bilateral meetings with his counterparts from Canada, Mexico, France, Brazil, South Africa, the United Kingdom and Germany. India is participating in the G7 Foreign Ministers' Meeting as an invited partner under the Canadian presidency, alongside countries such as Brazil, Australia and South Korea. The twoday event focuses on global security, economic resilience, energy cooperation and strengthening partnerships in the Indo-Pacific region.

India is on track to command 10 per cent of the global green hydrogen demand by 2030, Union Minister Shripad Y. Naik said on Wednesday. While addressing the third International Conference on Green Hydrogen (ICGH 2025) here, the minister noted that India's energy transition is among the boldest and fastest in the world, guided by the visionary leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi and his 'Panchamrit' commitments at COP-26. He said the country is steadily advancing toward its target of 500 GW of non-fossil-fuel capacity by 2030 and net-zero emissions by 2070. The minister added that India's installed non-fos-

sil-fuel-based power gen-

energy.

"This strong renewable base has now empowered India to take the next decisive step -- the Green Hydrogen Revolution -- converting renewable strength into clean molecules that can decarbonise industries, fuel transport, and enable global trade," he noted.

Naik pointed out that India's green hydrogen

Naik pointed out that India's green hydrogen market is projected to grow at a compound annual rate of 20-40 per cent over the next decade.

With its renewable-energy abundance, strategic ge-

abundance, strategic geography and enabling policy environment, India is poised to become both a leading producer and exporter of green hydrogen and its derivatives such as green ammonia and methanol.

The union minister emphasised that India is not merely participating but leading the global hydrogen transition through robust policy frameworks, standardisation initiatives and international collabo-

ration. Naik urged industry and investors to accelerate project execution, scale up electrolyser manufacturing, and strengthen innovation pipelines. He also encouraged State Governments to develop hydrogen hubs and industrial clusters to anchor local economies.

Calling the Green Hy-

Calling the Green Hydrogen transition an economic, environmental, and societal transformation, Shri Naik said it would fuel sustainable prosperity and strengthen India's position as a key pillar of the global hydrogen value chain.

Highlighting the rapid progress of the National Green Hydrogen Mission (NGHM) launched in January 2023, the union minister stated the Mission has transitioned from planning to implementation, with incentive schemes worth Rs 17,000 crore supporting green hy-

drogen production and electrolyser manufacturing.

Projects have been awarded for 3,000 MW per annum of domestic electrolyser manufacturing and 8.62 lakh metric tonnes per annum of green hydrogen production. The Solar Energy Corporation of India (SECI) has discovered globally competitive prices, among the lowest in the world, for the supply of 7.24 lakh MTPA of green ammonia to fertiliser units. Further, projects have been sanctioned for the supply of 20,000 MTPA of green hydrogen to IOCL, BPCL and HPCL refineries.

The minister also added that 'ICGH 2025' highlights India's commitment to advancing green hydrogen technology, fostering innovation, and accelerating our journey toward a clean and sustainable energy future.

# MLA writes to Guv demands separate state for 15 districts in North K'taka

Congress MLA and President of the North-West Karnataka Road Transport Corporation, Raju Kage, has written a letter to the Governor of Karnataka, Thawarchand Gehlot, on Wednesday, demanding a separate state for 15 districts in North Karnataka. In his letter addressed to the Governor, Raju Kage stated that he was demanding separate statehood for 15 districts of the North Karnataka region for better administrative convenience and comprehensive development.

The proposed state would comprise 15 districts --Bidar, Kalaburagi, Vijayapura, Yadgir, Bagalkot, Belagavi, Dharwad, Gadag, Koppal, Raichur, Karwar, Haveri, Vijayanagara, Ballari, and Davanagere.

He noted that since the unification of Karnataka,

all sectors of this region have been subjected to constant injustice, discrimination, and stepmotherly treatment. "The creation of another Kannada-speaking state would be a matter of pride for us," he claimed. "North Karnataka is rich in natural resources and is a land of prosperity. This region has made significant contributions towards the preservation of the Kannada language and the unification of Karnataka," MLA Kage stated.

"I extend my full support to the collection of signatures by the representatives of the people under the North Karnataka Agitation Committee. They have collected more than one crore signatures and written opinions," he said. He further mentioned that a memorandum in this regard had been submitted to the Governor on January 5, 2024.

#### Red Fort Blast Unmasks In-

Telegram group records link them to Pakistan-based handler Umar bin Khattab, who instructed them to plan coordinated attacks across India.

Before the explosion, Nabi, an assistant professor at Al-Falah University, was seen offering prayers at a mosque near Ramlila Maidan. He later parked the car at Sunehri Masjid before leaving the area. Police have since seized another car registered in his name and detained a Faridabad dealer involved in its sale. The Delhi Police Special Cell, NIA, and intelligence agencies continue joint investigations, describing the "doctor module" as one of the most sophisticated terror cells recently exposed in India.

#### Centre Declares Red.....

Observing a two-minute silence in memory of the victims, the Cabinet adopted a resolution expressing deep sorrow over the loss of lives and stated that the situation is being closely monitored at the highest levels of the government. Modi also visited Lok Nayak Jai Prakash Hospital to meet the injured soon after returning from his two-day Bhutan visit. Later, he chaired a meeting of the Cabinet Committee on Security.

"The Cabinet directs that the investigation into the incident be pursued with utmost urgency and professionalism so that the perpetrators, their collaborators,

FROM FRONT PAGE and sponsors are identified and brought to justice without delay. The situation continues to be closely monitored at the highest levels of the government," the resolution stated. Terming the explosion a "senseless act of violence," the Cabinet condemned the cowardly attack and extended its heartfelt condolences to the bereaved families. It also prayed for the speedy recovery of the injured and commended medical teams and emergency responders for their swift action. Information and broadcasting minister Ashwini Vaishnaw, reading out the resolution, said the Cabinet appreciated global statements of solidarity and support received from many governments. The Cabinet further praised the timely and coordinated response of authorities, security forces, and citizens who acted with courage and compassion. "Their dedication and sense of duty are deeply commendable," the resolution said, reaffirming the government's resolve to safeguard the lives and security of every Indian. The Cabinet meeting took place two days after an explosives-laden car detonated outside the Red Fort, killing 12 people. On the same day, police arrested eight persons, including three doctors, after busting an inter-state "white-collar" terror module.

#### ATS Seizes Chemicals.....

The ATS had earlier arrested three suspects — Dr. Saiyed, Azad Suleman Sheikh, and Mohammad Suhail Moham-

mad Saleem — for allegedly plotting to manufacture and use Ricin, a highly lethal biological toxin derived from castor beans. Two Glock pistols, a Beretta pistol, 30 live cartridges, and four litres of castor oil were reportedly recovered during the arrests.

According to ATS DIG Sunil Joshi, Dr. Saiyed, who holds a medical degree from China, had begun chemical research and initial processing to produce Ricin. His handler, identified as Abu Khadija, an Afghanistan-based operative linked to ISKP, was allegedly in contact with individuals from Pakistan. Meanwhile, searches conducted at the residences of Sheikh and Saleem in Uttar Pradesh yielded no incriminating evidence, officials said. They also clarified that no connection has been established between Dr. Saiyed and the doctors arrested in the recent Delhi car blast case. The trio has been booked under the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act (UAPA), the Bharatiya Nyay Sanhita, and the Arms Act. A court has remanded Dr. Saiyed to ATS custody till November 17 as the investigation continues. Officials said the case underscores growing concerns about bio-terrorism threats and the alleged use

#### AMIDST SIR ROW, RAHUL'S HARYANA EXPOSE JOLTS EC

The Election Commission, established as an independent body under the Constitution to conduct free, transparent and ideally flawless elections, operates a "system" that is replete with errors and wholly complicit in hiding flaws. Its functionaries serve up the weakest excuses when its systems are exposed as inefficient. Asked about the magnitude of errors found in electoral rolls in Dhakola village of Haryana's Ambala district last week, booth level officer Arvind Aggarwal said: "Only previous officials can explain how this mistake happened." However, the EC, under its current chief, Gyanesh Kumar, doesn't have the luxury of dodging responsibility. He declared himself a new broom that will usher in a new era. Alas, the past

mistakes left uncorrected were discovered and the onus is on him. Institutions, unfortunately, can't argue that "previous officials can explain how this mistake happened". Institutions like the EC have histories, precedents and continuing responsibilities. After spending thousands of crores of rupees on making the "system" work, it must own up for its mistakes. A national newspaper was following up on Rahul Gandhi's momentous revelations that in Haryana's Dhakola, the same woman's photograph appears on the voters list over 223 times. A report found it was an understatement; her photo appears 255 times against different names in two booths in the village. Charanjeet Kaur knows the voters list is replete with mistakes; her reaction was: "Whenever I go to vote, the election staff,

polling agents all laugh." But this is not a laughing matter for the EC, the Haryana government and everyone who, from all accounts, knew what was wrong, but failed to revise the voters' list. There was a moment in the history of elections in India when Mamata Banerjee, then in the Congress, marched to Kolkata's Writers' Buildings to evict the government of Jyoti Basu as she doubted the legitimacy of the election that was widely suspected of being "scientifically rigged". Though the Basu government survived, the electoral rolls and proof of voter identity changed forever. Instead of just names and addresses, voters were enrolled with photographs and the Electoral Photo Identity Card (EPIC). This is what the EC has succeeded in subverting; putting a name, a face and an address together.

## Retd employee loses Rs 20 L to online fraud

A retired employee from Kondapur lost '20.72 lakh to cybercriminals who duped him through a fake online trading platform, police said. According to the complaint, the 65-yearold victim was lured by online advertisements and phone calls claiming that the company was authorised by the Central government to provide professional trading assistance. Believing the claims, he opened a trading account on October 9 and initially saw fabricated profits on the website, which prompted him to invest further. He transferred money in several instalments from his bank accounts to those shared by the company representatives through various UPI IDs. Later, the fraudsters claimed he had suffered "trading losses" and demanded an additional `10 lakh to recover his funds. When he said he had exhausted his savings, they persuaded him to borrow money and continue trading through a fake mobile application. In total, he transferred

transferred '20,72,320.When he could neither withdraw nor see genuine profits, he realised the platform was fraudulent and lodged a complaint with the police on November 11.

# Child run over near home in Shastripuram

An eight-year-old Class 2 student was killed after being run over by a minilorry in Shastripuram, Mailardevpally, on Sunday evening. The accident occurred just 500 meters from his home, police said. "The driver failed to notice him and kept moving," said investigating officer Sheikh

Abdullah. The boy sustained grievous injuries and died while being shifted to the hospital. The driver, Gulam Rasool, was caught by locals and handed over to the police after being beaten. # Realtor duped of Rs 8 lakh in fake promotional scheme NEW DELHI business and generate However, only ₹51,356 dividuals claiming affili-

A city-based businessman from LB Nagar has reportedly been cheated of more than ₹8 lakh by two individuals who posed as executives of the wellknown real estate firm, Lodha Group. The victim, a 29-year-old entrepreneur, fell prey to a fraudulent promotional scheme that promised daily profits through online investments. According to police sources, the accused, identifying themselves as Venkateshwar and Vinay, initially contacted the businessman through messages, claiming to represent Lodha Group. They assured him that investing in their scheme would help expand his

consistent daily returns.
Though initially skeptical, the victim was eventually persuaded after the scammers shared screenshots showing supposed clients earning profits through their platform.
The accused maintained

The accused maintained regular contact via WhatsApp calls and emails, further enhancing the illusion of legitimacy. They even provided login credentials in emails appearing to be from the company, making the operation seem authentic. Convinced by their elaborate setup, the businessman began transferring money for the so-called promotional campaigns. Over time, he made a total of 17 transactions, amounting to ₹8,72,258.

However, only ₹51,356 was returned, raising suspicions about the scheme's authenticity. When the accused became unreachable, the businessman approached Rachakonda Cybercrime Police and filed a complaint against them.

Preliminary investigations revealed that the scammers had created a fake online portal and misused the Lodha Group's name to gain the victim's trust. Police are now tracing the accused using phone numbers and transaction details to apprehend them. Authorities have urged the public to exercise caution while dealing with investment or promotional schemes, particularly when approached by unknown ination with reputed companies. Verification of such schemes before transferring money online is crucial to avoid falling victim to fraud. This case highlights a growing trend of sophisticated online scams, where fraudsters exploit popular company names to lure unsuspecting investors. Officials advise that individuals remain vigilant, avoid sharing sensitive financial information, and report suspicious activity immediately to cybercrime authorities. As the investigation continues, Rachakonda Police are working to track the perpetrators and prevent further instances of similar fraud in the city.



# Public sector banks clock net profit of Rs 93,675 crore in first half of 2025-26

Public sector banks have reported a robust net profit of Rs 93,675 crore in the first half (April-September) of FY 2025-26 and a marked improvement in their asset values with Gross NPAs declining to a multiyear low of 2.3 per cent while Net NPAs have dipped to 0.45 per cent. The aggregate business of the government-owned banks has increased to an impressive Rs 261 lakh crore with advances growing by 12.3 per cent year-on-year and deposits by 9.6 per cent, according to a Finance Ministry statement issued on Wednesday. The Return on Assets of

public sector banks was 1.08 per cent while the cost of funds improved to 4.97 per cent, reflecting better efficiency and profitability during the first half of the current financial year. The Secretary of the Department of Financial Services (DFS), M. Nagaraju, chaired a review meeting of public sector banks here, with the Managing Directors and Chief Executive Officers of Public Sector Banks (PSBs) to assess their performance for the H1 FY 2025-26.

On the asset quality front, it was noted that PSBs continued to register improvement in recoveries. The National Asset Reconstruction Company Limited (NARCL) has acquired debt aggregating



Rs 1.62 lakh crore and achieved significant recoveries during the first half of the year. Banks were advised to leverage digital platforms such as BAANKNET for faster and transparent resolutions and to maintain focus on strengthening early warning systems. The meeting reviewed key areas including financial performance, asset quality, recovery and resolution, digital transformation and progress

and agriculture sectors. Banks were advised to further strengthen risk management, underwriting practices, and operational resilience to sustain profitability in an evolving financial environment. Public Sector Banks also showcased advancements in digital banking and mobile app services. A live demonstration highlighted improvements in user interface, multilingual options and transaction efficiency.

The Secretary emphasised that digital banking must remain inclusive and secure, urging banks to enhance cyber resilience, ensure operational continuity and improve the quality and timeliness of grievance redressal.

# Centre invites online applications for recognition as govt-approved test centres

The Department of Consumer Affairs on Wednesday invited applications through online portal for recognition as government approved test centres (GATCs), in a significant step in expanding India's verification ecosystem and infrastructure for weights and measures, which is aimed at ensuring accuracy, transparency and fairness in trade. Private industries, la-

boratories, and testing facilities can apply through the online portal till November 30, according to Ministry of Consumer Affairs, Food and Public Distribution. Applicants must have proper testing and

calibration facilities linked to national standards, along with qualified technical staff who have at least three years of experience in Legal Metrology.

Before granting approval, officials from the Department and State Legal Metrology offices will inspect the applicant's premises to verify infrastructure, staff competence, and calibration systems. As per the Legal Metrology (GATC) Amendment Rules, 2025, applicants are required to pay an online fee of Rs 2 lakh per category of instrument or equipment, which will also apply annually for renewal of recognition. The recognized GATCs shall take verification or re-verification fees as specified in the

newly introduced Fifth Schedule of the Rules. These standardized fees ensure uniformity and transparency across the country.

Recognized GATCs will be authorised to verify 18 types of weighing and measuring instruments, including water meter, Sphygmomanometer, Clinical thermometer, Automatic rail weighbridges, Tape measures, Gas meters, Energy meters, Speed meters for vehicles, Breath analvzers and more. "Anv organisation seeking recognition as a Government Approved Test Centre can now apply online through the new portal by submitting the prescribed form to the Joint Secretary, Department of Consumer Af-

# India's textile exports record growth in 111 countries

India's global exports of textiles, apparel and made-ups grew by 0.1 per cent during April-September 2025, compared to the corresponding period in 2024, the government data showed on Wednesday. The textile and apparel sector, including onstrated remarkable resilience in the first half of FY 2025-26 despite global headwinds and tariff-related challenges in major

Some of the large export markets for India which clocked impressive

growth rates were the UAE (14.5 per cent), the UK (1.5 per cent), Japan (19.0 per cent), Germany (2.9 per cent), Spain (9.0 per cent) and France (9.2 per cent).

On the other hand, some

of the other markets that recorded higher growth rates were Egypt (27 per cent), Saudi Arabia (12.5 per cent), Hong Kong (69 per cent), etc. These 111 markets contributed \$8,489.08 million during April-September 2025, compared to \$7,718.55 million in the previous year — reflecting a 10 per cent growth and an absolute increase of \$770.3 million.

The key sectors driving this growth included ready-made garments (RMG) of all textiles (3.42 per cent growth) and Jute (5.56 per cent growth). The ministry said that this performance highlights the sector's adaptability and competitiveness in the face of global uncertainties. India's continued expansion into non-traditional markets reinforces the Government's policy focus on export diversification, value addition, and global market integration under the "Make in India" and "Aatmanirbhar Bharat" initiatives. The Telangana High Court on Wednesday extended till January its interim order restraining the State government from taking any adverse action against BRS chief K Chandrasekhar Rao and others based on the findings of a judicial commission into allegations of irregularities in the execution of the Ka-

After the batch of writ petitions filed by KCR,

former Minister Harish Rao, former Chief Secretary Shailendra Kumar Joshi and senior IAS officer Smita Sabharwal came up for hearing before the division bench comprising Chief Justice Aparesh Kumar Singh and Justice G M Mohiuddin on Wednesday, the counsel for the State government sought more time to file the counter affidavits.

While posting the matter to January 2026, the HC also extended the interim protection

granted to KCR, Harish Rao, Joshi and Sabhar-

wal. A commission, headed by retired Supreme Court judge Justice P C Ghose, which investigated the alleged irregularities into the construction of Kaleshwaram Lift Irrigation Project during the previous BRS tenure, had earlier submitted its report to the government. The report was tabled in the State Assembly in August this year and after a discussion, Chief Minister A Revanth

Reddy had announced the government's decision to hand over the investigation to CBI.In its report, the commission held Chandrasekhar Rao accountable for alleged irregularities in the project's construction and other aspects. The report also found fault with Harish Rao, nephew of KCR and the Irrigation Minister during the BRS regime. Challenging the report, KCR and Harish Rao, and others had approached the High Court.

#### **Owaisi appointed to JPC** examining bills on removal of PM, CMs, ministers after arrest

IMIM chief Asaduddin Owaisi has been appointed as a member of the Joint Parliamentary Committee (JPC) tasked to examine the controversial bills that propose to remove any minister, chief minister, or prime minister from their office if they are arrested for 30 consecutive days for an offence punishable with five or more years of imprisonment.

The bills were tabled in the lower house during the Monsoon Session in August by Union Home Minister Amit Shah, evoking large scale protests from the Opposition.

# Waqf Faces Hurdles In **Umeed Uploads**

With the December 6

deadline to upload Waqf property details on the Umeed portal fast approaching, waqf managing committees in Telangana are uncertain whether they can register properties themselves, as many of their terms have expired. Custodians are also struggling with missing records and poor technical support on the portal. They said land demarcation, a mandatory step for uploading data, has been difficult as Waqf and mandal surveyors are not assisting. Many also lack Waqf gazettes and are unsure whether mosques and religious



structures on private land should be registered. Telangana Waqf Board member Abul Fateh Syed Bandagi Badshah Quadri said several custodians raised these concerns during a recent workshop. Seeking clarity from the Central and state governments on these issues, the custodians expressed unhappiness over the Umeed portal not being user friendly and slow while doing the registration process. Waqf board chairman Azmatullah told Deccan Chronicle that the Board will soon de-

cide on extending the tenure of the committees. "If not, the Board will directly take up property registration," he said.He noted that more than 7,000 properties have been registered on the Umeed portal so far. "Since this is the first such exercise, the process takes time as every property requires valid proof. Unless the properties are more than 400 years old, the property details will be somehow available through the Waqf or revenue records. We have also set up a help desk to assist custodians. With all these issues and little time left for uploading details, we are seeking a deadline extension," he added.
