

Congress Victory Not a Clean Sweep: KTR

After a tough municipal battle with the ruling Congress, BRS working president K. T. Rama Rao on Friday said the party is open to aligning with like-minded secular forces to protect Telangana's interests.

Addressing the media at Telangana Bhavan, he rejected claims of a Congress "clean sweep," stating that the ruling party secured only around 60 per cent of the 123 urban local bodies — far from a landslide. Of the 116 municipalities



and seven municipal corporations, BRS directly won about 16 and played a decisive role in nearly 30 others where hung verdicts were reported, including Jangaon, Mahabubabad, Gadwal and Wardhannapet. He said the cur-

rent results reflect growing public dissatisfaction with the Congress government.

He noted that BRS-backed candidates won nearly 40 per cent of gram panchayats and over 4,000 sarpanch posts in recent rural polls. In ward-level contests, BRS secured over 730 of nearly 2,580 seats — more than 30 per cent — despite alleged misuse of official machinery by Congress. Alleging irregularities in counting at places like Gadwal and Wardhannapet, he accused Congress leaders of attempting to

lure BRS winners. "We will fight politically and legally," he said.

Rama Rao indicated possible cooperation with parties such as the CPI in select civic bodies, and said a final decision would be taken after consulting party chief K. Chandrashekhar Rao. Taking a swipe at Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy, he said voters have a history of defeating leaders who underestimate them. He asserted that BRS has emerged as the principal opposition and will carry this momentum into upcoming local polls.

Telangana Agitators Demand Welfare Recognition Now

BJP's 30-Seat Shock in Karimnagar

Historic BJP Surge in Karimnagar Shakes Congress Stronghold Across Telangana Politics

The municipal election results in the united Karimnagar district have triggered a major political shift in Telangana, with the BJP delivering a stunning performance in the Karimnagar Municipal Corporation. While the Congress dominated the district overall — winning 10 out of 13 municipalities and two municipal corporations — the spotlight turned to Karimnagar city, where the BJP secured a historic 30 seats. The result has reshaped the political narrative in the state and drawn national attention.

Sircilla Municipality remained with the BRS, and Jammikunta Municipality



ended in a hung verdict, adding a layer of political uncertainty. However, it was Karimnagar Municipal Corporation that produced the most dramatic outcome.

The BJP's performance in Karimnagar came despite the Congress deploying five ministers to campaign extensively across the district. In contrast, the BJP

campaign centered largely around Union Minister Bandi Sanjay Kumar, who spearheaded the party's efforts single-handedly. From the announcement of the election notification, Bandi Sanjay took charge of the campaign in the united Karimnagar district, focusing on cadre mobilization, grassroots outreach, and aggressive

public engagement. His strategy translated into a significant electoral breakthrough for the BJP in a region where Congress appeared dominant. Political observers say the 30-seat victory in Karimnagar Corporation marks a turning point for the BJP in Telangana, positioning the party as a stronger urban force. The outcome has not only intensified state-level political debate but also attracted attention from the BJP's national leadership, which has reportedly praised Bandi Sanjay's leadership and campaign strategy. With this result, Karimnagar has emerged as a key battleground in Telangana's evolving political landscape.

ED intensifies probe into Universal Srushti Fertility Centre case

The Enforcement Directorate (ED) has stepped up its investigation into alleged irregularities linked to the Universal Srushti Fertility Centre and reportedly took into custody its owner, Dr Namrata, in connection with a money laundering case. According to information available, Dr Namrata and her son Jayanth Krishna were taken into custody with police assistance after investigators found prima facie evidence of financial misconduct. The agency suspects that large sums of money were collected from childless couples through illegal channels, including 'hawala' transactions. The probe has also opened a new angle of inquiry that whether child trafficking was carried out under the guise of surrogacy. The police have alleged that infants were procured from tribal families and falsely presented as babies born through legitimate surrogacy procedures. Police said the fertility centre had earlier faced multiple complaints. In previous cases, couples seeking IVF treatment

Bhatti, Ponguleti: Urban Voters Reposed Faith in Cong Government

He pointed out that the public has consistently endorsed the Congress in successive elections, in

**Power Unions Stage
Lunch-Hour Protest
Against Electricity
(Amendment) Bill**

Telangana Power Employees Joint Action Committee held a lunch-hour demonstration at Vidhyut Soudha on Thursday, protesting the Electricity (Amendment) Bill 2025 and calling it a gateway to power sector privatisation. Committee chairman G. Saabu, convenor P. Rathnakar Rao and secretary-general E. Sridhar, leading the protest, slammed the Bill's proposed multiple licensing policy, claiming it favoured private players while burdening consumers through lost cross-subsidies and tariff hikes for non-profitable users like farmers and households.

They warned that the proposed Bill endangered national power security and farmers' relief, echoing All India Power Engineers Federation (AIPEF) concerns over threats to public discoms and state autonomy. Key demands include immediate withdrawal of the Electricity Amendment Bill 2025, SHANTI Act 2025, and National Electricity Policy 2026, halting all privatization moves, scrapping smart metering, regularizing contract jobs, urgent taking up of new recruitments and restoring Old Pension Scheme (OPS).

BRS Comeback in Civic Polls

Urban verdict signals shifting mood, dents Congress mid-term advantage

The latest municipal election results in Telangana indicate a significant political comeback for the Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS), even as it sits in the opposition. Although the ruling Indian National Congress secured a numerical majority of urban local bodies, the broader picture suggests shifting political equations and signs of public dissatisfaction.

The BRS won more than 760 wards across various civic bodies and directly gained control of 16 urban local bodies. In nearly 30 municipalities, voters delivered hung verdicts, limiting the Congress party's ability to claim an outright and uncontested victory. These outcomes have not only revived morale within BRS ranks but have also reinforced its standing as the principal opposition force in the state's political landscape. Traditionally, local body elections conducted mid-term tend to favour the ruling party, largely because of its administrative advantage, visibility in governance, and implementation of welfare schemes and development programmes. However, this conventional trend did not fully materialise in these municipal polls. The



BRS strategically framed the elections as a referendum on the Congress government's performance, focusing its campaign on alleged delays in fulfilling the six guarantees and 420 promises made during the Assembly elections. The municipal results follow a turbulent phase for the BRS. In the 2023 Assembly elections, the Congress emerged victorious with 64 seats and a 39.4 percent vote share, while the BRS was reduced to 39 seats with a 37.35 percent vote share. The setback deepened in the 2024 Lok Sabha elections, where the BRS failed to win a single parliamentary seat and saw its vote share fall sharply to 16.62 percent. However, early signs of recovery emerged during

the 2025 panchayat elections, where the BRS improved its vote share to an estimated 29 percent. Although this figure remained lower than its previous Assembly performance, political observers considered it a substantial improvement compared to its Lok Sabha showing. The latest municipal results appear to have consolidated that recovery phase.

Historically, when it was known as the Telangana Rashtra Samithi (TRS), the party had dominated urban Telangana in 2020, winning 1,762 out of 3,112 wards across 10 corporations and 120 municipalities. Its vote share at the time stood at 44 percent in municipalities and 36.7 percent in corporations, marking a high

point in its urban political strength. Despite losing state power and facing defections, the BRS kept its grassroots network intact. Municipal elections often hinge on booth-level organisation, local leadership, and cadre strength rather than large-scale rhetoric. In this arena, the BRS demonstrated resilience and organisational depth. While municipal elections do not determine the survival of a state government, they often serve as indicators of public mood. The results suggest evolving political currents in Telangana, with the BRS regaining confidence and exploring potential alliances with like-minded secular forces, positioning itself strongly for future electoral battles.

Osmania University defers PG exams to March amid student protests

Osmania University on Friday postponed all PG first semester exams commencing February 19. These examinations will now be conducted in the first week of March. A detailed examination schedule will be released in due course, the university said.

The decision from the university comes in view of the protest by students who demanded exams postponement citing unfinished syllabus.

Earlier, a protest demanding postponement of PG semester examinations, commencing February 19, continued on the Osmania University (OU) campus.

Nearly 150 students from Arts College squatted at the administrative building and wanted resolution to their issue.

The protesters alleged that the syllabus had not been completed for the semester and wanted authorities to defer the exams. Students had also staged a protest on the same issue on Thursday night.

Students complained that despite repeatedly explaining that the syllabus was not completed, officials were firm on holding the examination as per the timetable.

Further, administrative officials, as per students, the exams postponement would only be considered if they produce a letter from the department concerned or principal stating that the syllabus was unfinished. Students criticised such conditions set by the administration and decided to sit in until the exams.

Repeal the Anti-Worker Labour Codes": Dr. Satyam

Dr. Satyam Srirangam Backs Nationwide Strike, Warns of Intensified Protests

In a strong show of solidarity with workers across the country, PCC Member and TPCC Official Spokesperson Dr. Satyam Srirangam demanded the immediate repeal of the four Labour Codes introduced by the Narendra Modi-led Central Government, calling them "a direct assault on workers' rights and job security." Participating in the nationwide general strike organized by central and state trade unions, Dr. Srirangam joined a large protest at Narsapur Crossroads, Balanagar, Kukatpally constituency. The protest was held under the joint leadership of major trade unions including INTUC, CITU, AITUC, HMS, TUCI, TNTUC, BRTU, AIUTUC and the Telangana Pradesh Congress Committee Labour Cell.

Addressing the gathering, Dr. Srirangam stated that consolidating 44 hard-earned labour laws into four Labour Codes

weakens trade unions, dilutes job security, and benefits corporate interests over workers. He alleged that the Centre notified these codes during the December 2025 Winter Session and warned that if they are not withdrawn, the government will face continuous nationwide protests.

He further demanded restoration of employment and social security protections, strengthening of MGNREGA, halting privatization in LIC, and ensuring equal pay for equal work. The protest concluded with strong slogans against the Central Government's alleged anti-worker policies, with participation from trade union leaders and Congress representatives in large numbers.

After 17 Years In Exile, Bangladesh's Tarique Rahman Set To Become PM

Tarique Rahman-led Bangladesh Nationalist Party (BNP) raced towards a decisive win in the crucial national election held on Thursday, setting the stage for Rahman, 60, to become Bangladesh's next prime minister.

Tarique, who returned to the country after 17 years in exile in the UK, has been elected from both Dhaka-17 and Bogura-6, according to unofficial results from the Election Commission (EC) and party sources, The Daily Star reported.

On Friday, Prime Minister Narendra Modi congratulated Rahman and the BNP for a "decisive victory". "I convey my warm congratulations to

Mr Tarique Rahman on leading BNP to a decisive victory in the parliamentary elections in Bangladesh," the prime minister said in a post on X.

"This victory shows the trust of the people of Bangladesh in your leadership." PM Modi assured the incoming dispensation that India will continue to stand in "support of a democratic, progressive and inclusive Bangladesh."

"I look forward to working with you to strengthen our multifaceted relations and advance our common development goals," he said. The United States looks forward to working with you to realize shared goals of prosperity and security for both our countries."

The BNP entered the electoral race as the frontrunner, contesting 292 out of 300 seats and sharing the rest with smaller partners. Facing the BNP was an 11-party alliance led by Jamaat-e-Islami. "Congratulations to the



BNP election committee spokesman Mahdi Amin told reporters the party was on track to win at least two-thirds of seats, adding that Tarique Rahman had won both seats he had run in.

Senior BNP leader Ruhul Kabir Rizvi, in a party statement, claimed a "sweeping victory," without giving figures, and called on followers to give thanks in prayer on Friday rather than celebrate on the streets. Who Is Tarique Rahman? Tarique Rahman, 60, is the eldest son of former Bangladesh President Ziaur Rahman and three-time Prime Minister Khaleda Zia. He returned to the country from exile after nearly 17 years, following his mother's death, and quickly emerged as a frontrunner for the prime

minister's post in the absence of the Awami League, which could not contest because its registration was suspended. Rahman was elected BNP chief after Khaleda Zia died. He had been serving as the acting chairman of the BNP before that. Days after Khaleda Zia's demise, Rahman formally assumed office as Chairman of the BNP in December 2025. He is often called the "dark prince" and is said to have been the de facto boss from 2001 to 2006 during a coalition government led by the BNP and Jamaat-e-Islami, while Khaleda Zia was prime minister. At the time, Rahman worked out of Hawa Bhaban, a two-floor building with a "wind tunnel," described as a "shadow PMO."

"Take Money, Whistle Podu": Vijay On DMK's 'Rs 2,000 Women Summer Special'

Weeks before the Tamil Nadu election Tamilaga Vettai Kazhagam leader and actor Vijay delivered a blockbuster campaign speech in Salem, accusing Chief Minister MK Stalin and the ruling Dravida Munnetra Kazhagam of abuse of power and corruption, and urging voters to "blow the whistle".

The hugely popular movie star, his every thunderous exclamation cheered, targeted Stalin over the transfer of Rs 3,000 as an 'advance payment' for women under a state-sponsored scheme and underlined his casting of the DMK as 'evil'. "Will you vote for 'good' TVK or 'evil' DMK?"

Stalin had also promised Rs 2,000 more per



woman as part of a 'summer bonanza', payment of which, the obvious implication was, would be contingent on the DMK winning the election. Claiming the DMK is trying to buy votes, Vijay called on the Tamil people to "take the money, but blow the whistle", referring to his party's election symbol and, obliquely, the 'whistle podu' row. "How was this 'special summer allowance' of Rs 2,000 announced? Does summer only occur this year?"

"I am opposing those who fool the people... I am targeting those in power. I will provide good governance... will never disappoint those who trust me... and won't make empty promises."

In a speech replete with counter-punches, Vijay also hit out over restrictions - including limiting the crowd to 4,998 and verifying identity cards - on people attending this afternoon's rally.

On paper, the restrictions follow a stampede at a rally in Karur last year, at which 41 people died. The DMK accused Vijay of having failed to follow SOPs as advised by the police. The TVK, though, said the ruling party orchestrated the violence to defame the actor.

From Seva Teerth, PM Modi Clears Big-Ticket Welfare Push For Women, Farmers

In his first major set of decisions after moving to Seva Teerth, Prime Minister Narendra Modi approved a series of welfare and development measures that the government says are rooted in the idea of public service and inclusive growth. The clearances span emergency healthcare, women's empowerment, farm infrastructure and the innovation economy.

Under the scheme, victims will be entitled to cashless treatment of up to Rs 1.5 lakh. The initiative is intended to prevent loss of life in the crucial golden hour due



to financial hurdles. Officials say the move seeks to strengthen emergency response systems and provide relief to vulnerable families facing sudden medical crises.

Lakhpatti Didi Mission Expanded

The government has also announced that it has crossed the milestone of three crore 'Lakhpatti Didis', ahead of the original March 2027 timeline.

Building on that, the Prime Minister has set a fresh target of six crore 'Lakhpatti Didis' by March 2029. The programme focuses on enabling women linked to self-help groups to earn

Fund Of Funds 2.0

To energise the country's innovation ecosystem, the Prime Minister has approved the Startup India Fund of Funds 2.0 with a corpus of Rs 10,000 crore.

The new fund is expected to support early stage ventures, deep technology, advanced manufacturing and other sunrise sectors. By expanding access to capital, the government aims to back the next wave of Indian startups and reinforce India's position as a global innovation hub.

Ministers Issue Midnight Rebuttal Over Rahul's Trade Deal Charges

Union ministers Piyush Goyal and Shivraj Singh Chouhan on Friday rejected allegations by Leader of the Opposition Rahul Gandhi that the India-US interim trade deal compromised farmers' interests, well past midnight asserting that the agreement fully safeguards the agriculture sector. The rebuttal followed a video message posted by Gandhi on X, in which he accused Prime Minister Narendra Modi of being "anti-farmer" and "selling" the country through the trade deal.

Commerce and industry minister Goyal said, "In a video released today, he (Gandhi) has surpassed all limits in making false statements and levelling unfounded allegations. He is misleading farmers with a fabricated narrative and attempting to provoke our an-nadatas. He has never demonstrated concern for



anti-national things. He broke all records of lying in his video message." He asserted that the Prime Minister has always taken decisions in the interest of farmers. "The schemes launched under his leadership have changed the lives of farmers. Farmers' interest has been fully protected in the recent deal signed with America," he said.

Addressing the 64th convocation ceremony of ICAR-IARI later in the day, Chouhan said, "All the FTAs, including one with the EU and other countries, are all in the interest of the country. The deal with the US is in India's national interest and completely safeguarded. The interests of the farmers have been kept at the top." In an apparent reference to Gandhi, he said, "They are creating a ruckus and saying we are looted. We are ruined. Everything is destroyed. Nation is sold out," adding that "they cannot bear the strength of the farmers".

And it is his responsibility. Law and order situation is deteriorating not only in Mumbai but also in his hometown Nagpur." Earlier this week, Dhurandhar star Ranveer Singh received a threat through WhatsApp from unidentified persons, while an unidentified shooter fired five rounds at filmmaker Rohit Shetty's residence in Juhu. A member of the Lawrence Bishnoi gang took responsibility for the shooting.

"Failure of law and order could be seen even during election time. There have been threats to filmstars Salman Khan and Ranveer Singh, and filmmaker Rohit Shetty. Shots were fired at Salman Khan's house, and these things are happening frequently, but the government does not have an answer to these issues," the Congress leader said. He said that when the Congress was in power, it had taken strict action against extortion rackets and put an end to the underworld gangs in Mumbai.

He criticised Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis, who also heads the home department, for "failing" to rein in criminal elements in the state. Londhe further said that while security agencies, po-

lice, and ministers are discussing Bishnoi's role in these threats, it is unclear how the gangster has remained out of the law's grasp despite being behind bars. "He (Bishnoi) is in prison, and you are in power and controlling the prison, but still, he is able to do all these things. So whose failure is this? It is completely the failure of Devendra Fadnavis and the Maharashtra government," he said.

The Congress leader alleged that Bishnoi can operate from prison because he has the support of someone from the administration and political establishment. "It is very clear that this government is short of ideas and not in a position to take strict actions. They are only after Hindu-Muslim debates instead of addressing unemployment, inflation and women's safety," he said.

Dubey said that in his notice, he has stated how the leader

of the opposition visits foreign countries, joining hands with the Soros Foundation, USAID and Ford Foundation, and "colludes" with anti-India elements.

HC Asks Condition of a Baby Who Kept in Protection House

The Telangana High Court has asked the state's women and child welfare department to submit a comprehensive report on the condition and well-being of a minor girl who was taken from her adoptive parents during an investigation into an alleged child trafficking network and lodged in a state home. A division bench headed by Chief Justice Aparsh Kumar Singh and Justice G. M. Mohiuddin was dealing with an appeal filed by the adoptive parents who were seeking legal remedies to get back

the two-year-old baby. Earlier, a single judge had declined to hand over custody of the girl to the couple, observing that the adoption had not been carried out through legally prescribed procedures.

The aggrieved parents then filed an appeal which was heard by the division bench.

The parents agreed that procedural lapses had taken place in the adoption process and admitted that money had been paid to a mediator to secure the baby. They argued that the child's best interests, security, and her future well-being, warranted restoring custody to them.

Cybercops Nab 5 for Duping Woman of Rs 1.08 Lakh

Hyderabad Cyber Crime Police arrested five men for running fake online loan schemes by impersonating Mudra Loan officials. The accused — Bochu Arun, Gadam Bharath, Samara Tirupati, Velugonda Tharun and Chukka Shyam, all from Warangal district — allegedly cheated a 36-year-old Hyderabad woman of Rs 1,08,274. She had responded to an Instagram loan advertisement in November 2025 and was contacted by a caller posing as "Kila Pavan Kumar" from Mudra loan services.

The fraudster claimed a Rs 3 lakh loan had been sanctioned and demanded payments under various heads, including insurance and TDS. Despite transferring over Rs 1 lakh, the victim was pressed for more money even after seeking cancellation. DCP V. Arvind Babu said the gang operated from rented flats in Kolkata and Delhi, running fake call centres with SIM cards, mobiles, bank accounts and UPI IDs provided by organisers. Each member allegedly made 180–200 calls a day and earned a 30 per cent commission. Police seized eight mobile phones and 10 SIM cards.

Telangana HC Halts Construction at J Hills Public School Over Lease Dispute

The Telangana High Court has passed an interim order directing status quo in respect to ongoing construction activity at the Jubilee Hills Public School premises. The Jubilee Hills Cooperative House Building Society had approached the court after placing on record that the lease period with the school had expired in 2017 and was not extended thereafter. In addition, the petitioner said, no valid no-objection certificate or subsisting lease agreement existed in favour of the Jubilee Hills Educational Society, which was running the school. Objections were submitted before the GHMC prior to

the grant of permission for construction for the school. After hearing the matter, the High Court directed that status quo be maintained pending further proceedings. Following the order, Ravindranath Bollineni, president of Jubilee Hills Cooperative House Building Society, in a press release stated that the order safeguarded the society's rights and reinforced the principle that development within a society's jurisdiction must strictly comply with lawfully procedures and required permissions. The managing committee of the housing society reiterated that every action taken was solely for the protection of society property, legal compliance, and the collective interest of

members. Society president Bollineni also stated that the society remained committed to protecting its institutional integrity and would continue to pursue lawful remedies whenever required. The grievance of the Jubilee Hills Cooperative House Building Society, represented by counsel V. Hari Haran, was that though there was no effective subsisting lease in favour of Jubilee Hills Educational Society and despite objections raised, the Greater Hyderabad Municipal Corporation (GHMC) had given it permission for the construction of three additional floors over the existing leased premises contrary to Section 429 (1) (aa) of the GHMC Act, 1995. The housing society contended

that the permission granted by the GHMC was liable to be suspended as Jubilee Hills Educational Society was proceeding with the construction in a brisk manner.

M. Arun Kumar, standing counsel for the GHMC, submitted that the corporation had granted permission as per GO Ms. 168 MA, dated April 7, 2012, after verifying the documents and requested time to get instructions. The educational society had taken land admeasuring 6.02 acres, equivalent to 29,282 square yards, in Ward No. 8, Block 2 of Jubilee Hills on lease from the society through a lease deed dated August 21, 1987, for 30 years.

ASSAM CM'S HATE TALK NEEDS TO BE REINED IN

The contents of the petitions moved in the Supreme Court by Left parties CPI and CPI(M) and a few residents of Assam seeking action against the state's chief minister Himanta Biswa Sarma for his non-stop spewing of hatred on the Muslim community in the state are a troubling sign of the times which all right-thinking people in the country, and not just the judiciary, must address to find a solution.

Mr Sarma has been out to prove that he is more loyal than the king to the Hindutva cause ever since he assumed office in 2021. Goods Exports To Grow 4 pc to \$455 bn In FY26: EXIM Bank

Despite the trade tariffs and uncertainties, India's merchandise exports for FY26 are expected to grow by 4.1 per cent to \$455.6 billion, finds EXIM Bank. The EXIM Bank expects India's export outlook to improve further, supported by a rise in overall competitiveness, though risks of global uncertainty and volatility in commodity prices persist. India's total merchandise exports for the full year for FY2026 are expected to be at US\$ 455.6 billion, growing 4.1 per cent from \$437.7 billion. The growth in exports is higher than the marginal rise of 0.08 per cent clocked in FY25. The better growth can be at-

\$98 bn, with a y-o-y growth of 5.7 per cent during the same quarter. Between April and December in FY26, India had managed to grow merchandise exports by 2.44 per cent to \$330.29 billion.

In the September to December quarter, the merchandise exports were valued at \$101.02 billion, lower than \$125.3 billion projected by EXIM Bank for the March quarter.

India's export outlook is expected to improve further, supported by a rise in overall competitiveness driven by sustained macroeconomic stability, competitive exchange rate, and the higher capital expenditure committed in the recent Union Budget, finds EXIM Bank.

Loan Growth Rebounds To 14.6% in Jan 15-31

Lower interest rates, GST rationalization and a sharp revival in wholesale lending has helped banks' sustain double digit credit growth that has risen by 14.6 per cent year on year in the fortnight ended January 31, 2026 to Rs 204.75 lakh crore. Deposit growth also remained strong, rising 12.5 per cent year on year during the same period to Rs 248.81 lakh crore. In the fortnight, credit expanded by Rs 3.41 lakh crore or 1.7 per cent, and deposits expanded by Rs 3.82 lakh crore or 1.6 per cent according to the data released by the Reserve Bank of India on Friday. Interestingly, bank credit growth had slowed down a bit in the first fortnight of 2026 (January 15) to



13.1 per cent year on year while deposit growth had slowed to 10.6 per cent year on year. In the fortnight, credit had contracted by Rs 1.88 lakh crore while deposits contracted by Rs 3.57 lakh crore. Credit growth had remained subdued in the first half of the year but gained traction from late August and continued to strengthen during the festive period, GST rate cuts and improved corporate credit growth.

According to CS Setty, chairman SBI, the India-US trade deal is expected to unlock fresh opportunities for exporters and multinational supply

chains, which could translate into stronger corporate lending and higher working-capital demand in the coming quarters. Meanwhile, outstanding credit balances of Urban Co-operative banks stood at ₹3.4 lakh crore as of September 2025, representing a 1.9 times increase over the last five years, according to Sahakar Trends, a joint publication by the National Urban Co-operative Finance and Development Corporation (NUCFDC) and TransUnion CIBIL. While UCs continue to hold a modest share of overall industry credit at around 1.8 per cent, the data shows a system that is expanding in scale while adapting to changing borrower profiles, competitive dynamics, and regulatory expectations.

Dubai Tourism Breaks Records with 19.59 Million Visitors in 2025

Dubai's tourism industry achieves third successive record-breaking year with 19.59 million international visitors in 2025, up 5% YoY

Dubai recorded its third consecutive record-breaking year for tourism in 2025, welcoming 19.59 million international overnight visitors, a 5% year-on-year increase from 18.72 million in 2024, according to data released by the Dubai Department of Economy and Tourism (DET). million visitors (21%), followed by CIS and Eastern Europe (15%), South Asia (15%), and the combined GCC and MENA regions contributing 26% of total arrivals. Growth was also recorded from Asia, the Americas, Africa and Australasia, confirming Dubai's expanding global reach.

Benchmark equity indices Sensex and Nifty tumbled over 1 per cent in early trade on Friday, led by steep losses in IT stocks amid weak global cues and persistent concerns over artificial intelligence-led disruptions which weighed on investor sentiment.

Anthropic Clinches \$380 Billion Valuation After \$30 Billion Funding

Anthropic has raised \$30 billion in its latest funding round, more than doubling the Claude chatbot maker's valuation to \$380 billion and underscoring massive investor interest in the startup and the broader AI industry. The company has differentiated itself by focusing its model training on coding, with Claude Code gaining strong traction among developers and helping the company gain an edge over rivals in the enterprise AI market.

Anthropic's recently launched series of plugins for its Cowork agent had sparked a brutal sell-off in global software stocks as investors debated the disruptive potential to the sector from sophisticated AI models. The funding round, announced on Thursday, was co-led by investors including D. E. Shaw Ventures, ICONIQ and MGX. It also included a portion of pre-

viously announced investments from Microsoft and Nvidia.

Anthropic, backed by Google and Amazon, had raised \$13 billion in a Series F round that valued the company at \$183 billion, the company said in early September. Meanwhile, OpenAI could be valued at about \$830 billion as part of talks with SoftBank Group to invest as much as an additional \$30 billion in the ChatGPT maker, Reuters reported in January.

Anthropic has rapidly built its revenue base — the company said its current run-rate revenue is \$14 billion. For Claude Code alone, the run-rate revenue has grown to over \$2.5 billion, more than doubling since the beginning of 2026.

Business subscriptions to Claude Code have quadrupled since the start of the year, with enterprise use now representing over half of all Claude Code revenue, the company said. Anthropic has further deepened its push for business deals with products like Claude Code, which executes computer tasks for white-collar workers. The company has also taken a different approach to AI regulation. While tech companies have pushed for less regulation, Anthropic has drawn up plans to donate \$20 million to back U.S. political candidates who support regulating the AI industry.

"The companies building AI have a responsibility to help ensure the technology serves the public good, not just their own interests," Anthropic had said separately earlier on Thursday. Earlier this week, Reuters reported that Blackstone, the world's largest alternative asset manager, was increasing its stake.

Students To Get Instant Temp EAPCET Scores

Students appearing for the Telangana Engineering, Agriculture and Pharmacy Common Entrance Test (EAPCET-2026) will be able to check their temporary scores immediately after the completion of the examination, based on the preliminary answer key. Marks-based ranks of the two previous years will also be uploaded to enable students to get a fair picture of where they stand. The final marks and ranks will be available after the answer key is finalised, following objections, if any.

Jawaharlal Nehru Technological University (JNTU), Hyderabad, which is conducting the test, has decided to display scores based on the preliminary key. Speaking to Deccan Chronicle, TG EAPCET convener Dr K. Vijaya Kumar Reddy said rank bands from the last two years will be uploaded on the website along with marks scored. This, he explained, will enable students to ascertain their temporary rank based on the preliminary key.

Small Apartments Need Not Register with RERA, Rules Tribunal

The Telangana Real Estate Regulatory Authority (TGRERA) Appellate Tribunal reiterated that building projects on plots smaller than 500 square yards do not need to be registered under the Real Estate (Regulation and Development) Act. The tribunal was hearing a case involving a complaint from Veena Dhari that the builder, RR Construction, who developed the Sri Vajra Residency in Nallakunta, had not fixed construction defects or provided the occupancy certificate as agreed. TG RERA had earlier ordered the developer to correct the issues and pay a penalty. However, on appeal, the tribunal said that the project was exempt from RERA registration under Section 3 (2) (a) of the RERA Act since the land area of the developed apartment was under 500 square yards. The appellate tribunal added that a project can be outside RERA's scope if it meets either one of two conditions: land parcel must be under 500 square yards or less than eight apartments in the building. If either one of the criteria is met, the project does not have to be under RERA. The appellate tribunal has set the earlier RERA aside, and said that buyers in such cases should seek resolution in a civil court or consumer forum.

QR Reflective Tapes Mandatory for Telangana Transport Vehicles

In a major road safety initiative, the Telangana Transport Department has made it mandatory for all transport vehicles in the state to install QR code-enabled reflective tapes and rear marking plates to reduce road accidents, especially during nighttime travel. The new regulation will come into force from February 20, as per an official statement issued on February 12. Under the new rule, installation of reflective tapes has been made compulsory for obtaining the annual Fitness Certificate. Vehicles that fail to comply will not be issued the mandatory fitness certification required for legal operation, making adherence to the directive essential for all transport vehicle owners.

The primary objective of this move is to improve vehicle visibility in low-light and night driving conditions, a major factor contributing to road accidents. Authorities believe the enhanced reflectivity will help drivers identify vehicles from a distance, thereby reducing collision risks. To ensure standardisation and authenticity, the department has empanelled five authorised companies to handle the installation process. These companies have been approved to operate until February 8, 2027. Each reflective tape will carry the Telangana Transport Department logo along with a unique QR code and serial number, enabling easy digital verification and helping prevent duplication, misuse, and illegal installations. After installation, vehicle owners will receive an official certification document containing the vehicle registration number, company details, photograph of the installed reflective tape, and warranty information.

This documentation will serve as proof of compliance during inspections and fitness certification procedures. Officials have strictly advised vehicle owners to purchase and install reflective tapes only through authorised dealers of the empanelled companies to ensure compliance with government standards and avoid penalties. The government expects this initiative to significantly improve road safety across Telangana, particularly during nighttime operations, and play a crucial role in reducing accident rates while strengthening regulatory enforcement and vehicle monitoring systems.

With a strong base in Bhainsa, where it earlier held the chairman's post, AIMIM is poised to play a decisive role. Congress may seek its support, while BRS and independents could also influence the final outcome.

1/800 NEET-PG Scorer Bags MS Ortho Seat at Pvt College in Hyderabad

The situation follows a policy revision announced in January by the National Board of Examinations in Medical Sciences (NBEMS) in coordination with the Union health ministry. The qualifying percentile for the general category was lowered from the 50th to the 7th percentile to fill more than 18,000 vacant PG seats across the country for the 2025-26 academic year. Candidates from OBC, SC, ST and PwD categories — including those with negative scores — were also made eligible for counselling.

After the revision, candidates in Telangana secured seats in reputed institutions such as Osmania Medical College and Gandhi Medical College, including in high-demand specialties like orthopaedics, paediatrics and general medicine. Medical leaders warned that the move risks diluting standards and patient safety. Dr Ajay Kumar Goud of T-JUDA said near-zero score admissions reflect a system under strain, while Dr Kiran Madhala of TTGDA pointed to faculty shortages.

TGSRTC plans 2,800 e-buses for Hyderabad by 2027 via retrofitting

The Telangana State Road Transport Corporation (TGSRTC) has announced a major expansion of its electric bus programme to curb urban air pollution and promote sustainable public transport in Hyderabad, with a target of introducing 2,800 electric buses within the Outer Ring Road (ORR) limits by 2027.

As part of the initiative, TGSRTC is converting existing diesel buses into electric vehicles through a retrofitting programme. Tenders for the project were issued on September 15, 2025, and finalised on September 30, 2025. Con-

tracts were awarded to Sai Green Mobility for converting 200 buses and Kalyani Powertrain Limited for 40 buses.

Currently, 325 electric buses are operating from six city depots, while another 175 buses are expected to be inducted during the current financial year. To support the expanding fleet, charging infrastructure is being developed at 19 additional depots. The corporation is also planning to construct 10 new depots and 10 dedicated charging stations, with the total estimated infrastructure cost pegged at ₹392 crore.

Officials said the programme is expected to increase public transport usage, reduce dependence on private vehicles, lower emission levels and improve public health outcomes across the city. HYDRAA removes encroachments from parks in Jeedimetla, Gudimalkapur

Hyderabad Disaster Response and Asset Protection Agency (HYDRAA) on Friday, February 13, removed encroachments from 3712 yards of park land, with an estimated value of ₹37.12 crore.

In Jeedimetla village of Medchal – Malkajgiri district, a layout for Bhagyalakshmi Colony was established in 1968 with 810 plots across 80 acres. A total of 10 parks were also allotted with the layout, HYDRAA said.

However, a high-tension power line meant for supplying electricity to industries in Jeedimetla also

passed over this layout, and some of the parks were located right under the power line, preventing development.

These lines were later removed after industries started getting electricity through another route, allowing people to encroach on the land.

Upon receiving complaints from locals, HYDRAA conducted a survey and removed encroachments from six of the parks. They also erected boards and fencing to prevent further encroachments. Additionally, HYDRAA also protected a park in Hyderabad's Gudimalkapur area.

According to HYDRAA,

the AG Office Cooperative Housing Society layout that had been established with 83 plots across 10 acres had three plots that were in a depression. Later, the layout was revised, and alternative sites were allocated to those who had plots there. The 1500-yard site in the depression was designated as a park.

However, due to delays in filling the depression and developing the park, multiple people encroached on the land. One person started running a sand business, one used it for vehicle parking, and another person was running a coconut business, HYDRAA said.

1500 Community Dogs Poisoned to Meet Poll Promise: PETA

A memorial billboard at Nayapal circle here alleges that more than 1,500 community dogs were poisoned across multiple districts in Telangana in what was described as a coordinated attempt to create "dog-free" villages. "The sheer scale and apparent coordination of these poisonings is horrifying. These dogs were mothers, babies, friends — all individuals who suffered and felt pain and did not want to die," said Shaurya Agrawal, policy associate at PETA India. The display, erected by PETA along High Court Road in Ghansi Bazaar, features the image of a dog and cites killings reported from Jagtial, Hanamkonda, Kamareddy, Rangareddy and Nirmal

districts. According to the organisation, the animals were often poisoned in broad daylight. PETA alleges that the killings were carried out to fulfil an election promise to make certain villages "dog-free."

It contends that such actions violate the Animal Birth Control Rules, 2023, which mandate sterilisation and return of community dogs, and the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act, 1960, which prohibits killing. Section 325 of the Bharatiya Nyaya Samhita, 2023 makes the maiming or killing of any animal, including by poisoning, a cognisable offence punishable with imprisonment of up to five years, a fine, or both. The group has called for prosecution of those responsible.

In surprise move, DCP inspects Punjagutta PS as common citizen

The Greater Hyderabad Municipal Corporation (GHMC) is set to start construction of flyovers and underpasses under package 2 works at KBR Park in February third week. On Friday, Chief Engineer (Maintenance & Project) Sahadev Ratnakar inspected works proposed at surroundings of KBR Park under H-CITI, along with engineering officials.

As per an official press release, the H-CITI officials inspected KBR package 2 works that are to be started at Road no 12, Banjara Hills, covering Agrasen Junction and Kalinga Junction, along with PMC consultant and the agency concerned. The estimated cost of the project is ₹580 crore. KBR package II includes construction of flyovers and underpasses at four junctions—Road no. 45 Junction, Film Nagar junction, Maharaja Agrasen junction and Cancer Hospital junction—at the KBR Park. The estimated cost of the project is ₹510 crore, it said.
