Rs.1L Cr Challenge Fund Up for Grabs

The Union Cabinet, chaired by Narendra Modi, has approved the launch of the Urban Challenge Fund (UCF) with a central assistance of ₹1 lakh crore and sanctioned construction of the country's first underwater road-cum-rail tunnel between Gohpur and Numaligarh in Assam at a cost of ₹18,662 crore. Briefing reporters, Union Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw said the UCF will provide 25 per cent central assistance for projects, subject to at least 50 per cent funding being mobilised from the market. The initiative is expected to catalyse investments of about ₹4 lakh crore in the urban sector over the next five years.

Assam To Get Rs 50,000 crore As Its Tax Share This Year: PM

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Saturday launched a frontal attack on the Congress party, accusing it of resorting to divisive politics, corruption in defence deals, and neglecting the Northeast. While addressing BJP workers here, Mr Modi said that while the Muslim League divided India during Independence, "today, Congress has become Muslim League-Maoist Congress and is in the process of dividing India." Accusing that the Congress lacked the courage to take decisions and, at best, only made statements, he said that the grand old party always put the country at risk. "Congress never prioritised the nation's security. Because of the negativity of Congress governments, the entire Northeast lived in fear and insecurity. Congress always kept the country at risk. During Congress's tenure, whenever weapons were purchased for the military, it meant a scam worth...."

CM Revanth Eyes Win In 37 Hung Civic Bodies

8 AIFB winners join Cong., give it Wadepally

Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy on Saturday asked ministers and senior Congress leaders to intensify efforts to secure control of the 37 urban local bodies that delivered hung verdicts in the municipal elections, as well as the Nizamabad and Karimnagar municipal corporations. The elected representatives will select chairpersons of 116 municipalities and mayors of seven corporations in indirect polls on February 15. Revanth Reddy was speaking with ministers and senior leaders at this residence to review municipal election results and to finalise party's strategy for Monday's polls. On Saturday, eight



ward members elected from All India Forward Bloc in Waddepally municipality in Gadwal district, joined the Congress in the presence of CM. With this, the Congress secured Waddepally municipality. Stating that the Congress had won nearly 70 municipalities, Revanth Reddy set a target of crossing 90. He instructed ministers, MLAs, MPs and MLCs to engage with Independents and rebel candidates who emerged victorious and, if they were willing to support the Congress in the interest of development of

their wards and towns, facilitate their entry into the party.

The Chief Minister asked party leaders to remain vigilant and effectively counter any attempts by opposition parties to influence elected members ahead of the indirect polls.

Reviewing the party's performance, Revanth Reddy congratulated ministers for their coordinated efforts and attributed the results to the Congress government's welfare measures and development initiatives undertaken over the past two years. He said the mandate reflected public trust in the "People's Government," asserting that significant progress had been achieved in two years compared to the previous decade of BRS rule.

Kharge, Rahul Hail Congress Win in T'gana Civic Polls

The Congress leadership on Saturday hailed the party's emphatic victory in the Telangana municipal elections, describing the outcome as a strong endorsement of the Revanth Reddy government's governance model. AICC leader Rahul Gandhi thanked the people for the mandate and said the results reflected public approval of people-first policies rooted in social justice, dignity and inclusive growth. In a post on his 'X' handle, Gandhi congratulated Chief Minister Revanth Reddy and appreciated the efforts of party leaders and grassroots workers, stating that the victory belonged to every karyakarta and to the people of the state. He reiterated the party's commitment to building a "Prajala Telangana" where progress reaches every family. AICC president Mallikarjun Kharge said the mandate demonstrated the trust reposed by the people in the Congress government and affirmed that the party remained committed to ensuring social justice, economic empowerment and sustained development for all sections of society. AICC general secretary Priyanka Gandhi conveyed her congratulations to the Chief Minister, noting that the results mirrored

Cong. Neglected NE, Dividing India: Modi

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Saturday accused the Congress of divisive politics, corruption in defence procurement and neglect of the Northeast, while addressing BJP workers in Assam.

He said the Congress has become "Muslim League-Maoist Congress and is in the process of dividing India." He alleged that the Congress lacked the courage to take key decisions and had compromised national security during its tenure. Referring to defence purchases under previous regimes, he said they were linked to scams. He also accused the Congress of attempting to "unsettle Assam" and of supporting infiltrators. "Congress never prioritised the nation's security. Because of the negativity



of Congress governments, the entire Northeast lived in fear and insecurity. Congress always kept the country at risk. During Congress's tenure, whenever weapons were purchased for the military, it meant a scam worth thousands of crores," he said. Modi said the present government was strengthening border infrastructure, including highways, tunnels, bridges and airfields, to enhance national security. He also said, "Congress wants to unsettle Assam once again. Congress wants to return it to infiltrators once

again. Be it its top leadership in Delhi or leaders here, they all are trying to save infiltrators. They want to change the original identity of Assam." He stated that the Northeast was central to the government's development agenda and described it as "Goddess Ashtalakshmi". Citing Union Budget allocations, he said Assam would receive about Rs 50,000 crore as its tax share this year, compared to around Rs 10,000 crore during the Congress regime.

C'garh : 3 CoBRA Commandos, Car Driver Killed In Road

In a tragic incident, three CoBRA (Commando Battalion for Resolute Action) jawans and the car driver were on Saturday killed when the vehicle in which they were travelling rammed into a truck, parked roadside, at Khapri bypass road in Chhattisgarh's Dhamtari district. The car carrying five people, including the driver, from Jagdalpur, headquarters of Bastar, to Raipur in Chhattisgarh hit the stationary truck and was mangled, police said. Another jawan, identified as Abhiman Rai, travelling in the car was injured and rushed to Raipur for advanced medical attention. The passengers of

the ill-fated car were removed from its wreckage with much difficulty, police said. The three slain jawans have been identified as sub-inspector Umed Singh, head constable Mukesh Kumar, and constable Raj Kumar, while the deceased civilian driver has been identified as Hiralal Nagar, according to Dhamtari district superintendent of police Suraj Singh Parihar. The CoBRA personnel had availed leave to visit their homes. Chhattisgarh chief minister Vishnu Deo Sai expressed shock and sorrow over the demise of the three COBRA jawans, describing it 'deeply disturbing'. 'The sad demise of our brave soldiers, dedicated to the service of the nation, is extremely painful.

'Bangladesh 1st': Tarique Rahman's Reply To Query On Ties With India

After a sweeping victory in the 13th National Parliamentary Elections, Bangladesh Nationalist Party (BNP) chief Tarique Rahman, in a press conference, said that Bangladesh's foreign policy will prioritise the country's interests over others.

"The interests of Bangladesh and its people will determine our foreign policy," he said as a response to a question on ties with India.

"Freedom loving pro-democracy people of the country have once again brought victory to the Bangladesh Nationalist Party," he said in English, before switching to Bangla.



"We have cleared ourselves regarding the foreign policy which is in the interest of Bangladesh, and the interest of the Bangladeshi people comes first. By protecting the interest of Bangladesh and the Bangladeshi people, we will decide our foreign policy," Rahman said. Answering how the government would approach international relations, senior BNP leader Amir Khasru Mahmud Chowdhury said that the party would stick to multilateralism and not go

after a country-centric approach.

That being said, Rahman's "Bangladesh First" policy aims to balance ties with neighbouring countries like India, China and Pakistan. The BNP leadership also highlighted how important safeguarding sovereignty, ensuring strategic autonomy and mutual respect would be to shape foreign relations. Humayun Kabir, who handles international relations for Rahman and is set to be a key official in the new regime, said the priority is to build a "stronger cooperation among our people". He said India will be one of the countries that "we will visit", though he did not give a definite time.

Central Cabinet Approves 4-Lane Gudebellur-Mahabubnagar on NH-167

The Centre has approved the widening of the national highway from Gudebellur to Mahbubnagar on the Hyderabad-Panaji economic corridor to four-lane standard. Work on the 80.01 km stretch of the highway is expected to cost ₹3175.08 crore. The project will be executed in hybrid annuity mode (HAM) under (National Highways (Original) scheme, and was approved by the the Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs (CCEA)



on Friday. The project will provide significant benefit to Narayanpet and Mahbubnagar districts in Telangana. This route links Mahbubnagar to Gudeballur near the Karnataka border and extends towards Raichur, passing through Marikal in Telangana and Deosur in Karnataka. The project aims to facilitate

smoother movement between Hyderabad, Warangal and other Telangana cities to destinations in Karnataka and Goa, reducing fuel consumption and travel time.

Currently, travellers from Hyderabad and Warangal to Goa, Raichur, Mantralayam and other Karnataka towns commute via Jadcherla and Mahabubnagar on a two-lane road. Converting this stretch into four lanes is expected to ease traffic flow, enable faster transit and boost regional economic prospects.

The Centre has reportedly allowed the prosecution of senior IAS officer Arvind Kumar in connection with alleged irregularities in the Formula E racing case. BRS working president K.T. Rama Rao is another accused in the scam case. The sanction came within a day of the fast-changing political scenario in Telangana – with the BJP making a grand statement as a party in waiting to replace the BRS as the principal Opposition and the Congress being further strengthened by the latest in a series of poll victories.

The saffron party had made unprecedented gains in the Lok Sabha elections

Vexed with the infighting, the central leadership, according to insiders, preferred to not waste its energy and resources on the Telangana unit as state leaders themselves weren't keen to take on the BRS. Top sources in the BJP told that a section of party leaders could convince the Central leadership that the time had come to go aggressive and push the BRS to the third place.

Hung Verdicts Spark Resort Politics in 37 Municipalities

The municipal election results declared on Friday produced a hung verdict in 37 municipalities, setting off hectic political manoeuvring by the ruling Congress, the opposition BRS and the BJP. With no party securing a clear majority in these bodies, all three major parties have resorted to 'camp politics', shifted their elected councillors to resorts around Hyderabad and other undisclosed locations to prevent poaching by rival parties and luring Independents, rebels and members



lected from smaller parties such as BSP and AIFB. The indirect elections to the posts of mayor and deputy mayor in municipal corporations and chairpersons and vice-chairpersons in municipalities scheduled for February 16 have intensified the scramble for numbers. Independents have emerged as 'king-makers' in many munici-

palities, while in several others the ex-officio votes of MPs, MLAs and MLCs are expected to determine the outcome. Political equations remain fluid as parties explore possible alliances wherever they fall short of a majority. In Jangoan, BRS won 13 wards and Congress 12 in the 30-member body, leaving five Independents to tip the balance. Jagtial saw Congress secure 23 of 50 wards, ahead of BJP with six and BRS with four, while 17 Independents hold the key. In Raikal, BJP led with five of 12 wards but needed additional support, and in Metpally it secured 10 of

26 wards, still short of a majority. Gadwal gave Congress 16 of 37 wards, followed by BRS with 11 and BJP with seven. Alampur witnessed a tie, with Congress and BRS winning five wards each in the 10-member municipality, making ex-officio votes crucial. Kamareddy delivered a close contest, with Congress at 19, BJP at 18 and BRS at 10 in a 49-member body. In Vemulawada, Congress won 13 of 28 wards and requires additional backing, while in Jinnaram BRS secured eight of 20 wards and needs three more for control. Jammikunta also reported a frac-

tured mandate with BRS at 12, Congress at 10 and BJP at four in a 30-member municipality. In Asifabad, the BRS won nine of 20 wards, ahead of Congress with seven. Kagaznagar gave BRS 11 of 30 wards and Congress nine. Bellampalli saw Congress and BRS tied at 14 each in a 34-member body. Kyatanapalli placed the BRS ahead with 10 of 22 wards. In Mahbubabad, the Congress emerged as the single largest party with 13 of 36 wards, while Kesamudram recorded a tie between Congress and BJP at eight each in 16 wards.

Poor Maintenance of GHMC Children's Park at Tarnaka

Raises Safety Concerns
Residents of Tarnaka, Gokul Nagar, Sainagar colony Street No.1, have raised serious concerns over the neglected condition of the local children's park maintained by the Greater Hyderabad Municipal Corporation (GHMC). The park, once meant to be a safe recreational space for children and families, is now in a state of complete neglect. Overgrown bushes have taken over large portions of the park, and heaps of garbage and waste materials are scattered inside the premises. Local residents state that the park gates are not opened for a long period, depriving children of a safe play area. Adding to the problem, cut tree branches have been dumped in front of the park entrance, creating obstruction and an unpleasant environment. Due to unchecked vegetation and accumulated waste, snakes and insects are frequently spotted in and around the park. This has created fear among residents, particularly fam-



ilies with young children and elderly people living nearby. The lack of regular maintenance has not only affected public safety but also caused inconvenience to households surrounding the park. Residents allege that despite being under GHMC's jurisdiction, no proper cleaning or monitoring activities have been carried out for a considerable period. Citizens are now urging the authorities to take immediate action by clearing the bushes, removing waste, ensuring regular opening of the park gates, and restoring the park to a clean and safe condition. The people of Tarnaka hope that the concerned officials will respond promptly and fulfill their responsibility to maintain public spaces for the welfare of the community.

Blistering Sun, No Shade Commuters Struggle at Tarnaka Bus Stops

As summer temperatures soar, passengers along the Tarnaka—Moulali ECIL—Nagaram—Rampally X road—Keesara corridor are battling more than just the heat—they are fighting for basic shelter at bus stops. Most Telangana State Road Transport Corporation (TGRTC) stops in this busy area lack protective sheds, leaving commuters exposed to harsh sunlight and rain. Some existing shelters are under repair, while others are partially blocked by footpath vendors, forcing commuters to stand dangerously close to moving traffic. People Want Alternative Politics, We Won 40 Seats: Kavitha

Telangana Jagruthi President K Kavitha said that Telangana Jagruthi in alliance with the All India Forward Bloc secured 40 seats in recent municipal elections, asserting the results reflect growing public support for alternative political forces. She stated that although only 33 victories were officially recorded, technical issues related to B-Forms prevented seven winning candidates from being formally counted. According to her, many voters supported the Indian National Congress mainly due to the absence of a strong alternative. She alleged serious election law violations in Panchayat and municipal polls, accusing authorities of misusing government machinery and remaining silent. She also criticised the Bharat Rashtra Sami-



thi for comparing present results with Congress's opposition-era performance instead of evaluating its own record while in power. Kavitha further claimed that in North Telangana the BRS indirectly helped the Bharatiya Janata Party, suggesting a tacit understanding, and questioned its support to the Communist Party of India. Referring to local bodies, she said the alliance received a clear mandate in Vadeppally but alleged attempts by rivals to lure their elected representatives. In Narayanpet, she claimed an offer for the vice-chairman post was made to their side and the

matter was left to local leadership. She added that her organisation and labour allies would jointly contest upcoming elections in Singareni Collieries Company Limited, alleging workforce numbers dropped from 60,000 to 40,000 due to lack of new mines. State convener Ambati Jojireddy alleged the BJP lacks a real majority in Karimnagar and accused Bandi Sanjay of heavy poll spending. Leader Riyaz Ahmed also alleged intimidation of their candidates, while Jojireddy highlighted the party's legacy founded by Subhas Chandra Bose.

Union minister of state Bandi Sanjay Kumar accused the Congress, BRS and the MIM of indulging in “dirty and cheap politics” by uniting in Karimnagar to block the BJP from power. Despite their efforts, he claimed, the three parties were limited to 26 divisions, while the BJP — with 30 seats and support from independents — had crossed the majority mark in the 66-member corporation. Speaking at the state party office in Nampally, Sanjay said the parties were ashamed to ally openly. He pointed out that BRS MLA Gangula Kamalakara had publicly urged his corporators to back the



Congress-nominated mayoral candidate. Extending mock “Valentine’s wishes” to Congress and BRS, he alleged MIM was maintaining an “illegal relationship” with both. Sanjay asserted that voters sensed this tacit pact even before the polls and backed the BJP. He questioned why the Congress government was not acting against BRS leaders in cases such as phone tapping, the Formula E race and the Kaleshwaram project if no

deal existed. He warned that BJP workers would chase Congress and BRS leaders through Karimnagar’s streets if they defied the people’s mandate. The BJP, he added, would expose Congress’s unfulfilled promises to women, farmers, teachers, youth and retired employees, citing withheld retirement benefits, five months’ DA and EPF amounts. Nicknaming Chief Minister Revanth Reddy “Bade Bhai” and AIMIM leader Akbaruddin Owaisi “Chota Bhai,” Sanjay noted that even Owaisi’s campaigning yielded MIM only three seats. Ahead of the polls, BJP had released a booklet detailing promises fulfilled, including ₹1,400 crore from the Centre under the

Smart Cities Mission. “We’re ready to prove our mettle in the upcoming GHMC elections,” he declared. 

Assam To Get Rs 50,000 crore As Its Tax Share This Year: PM Modi

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Saturday launched a frontal attack on the Congress party, accusing it of resorting to divisive politics, corruption in defence deals, and neglecting the Northeast. While addressing BJP workers here, Mr Modi said that while the Muslim League divided India during Independence, “today, Congress has become Muslim League–Maoist Congress and is in the process of dividing India.”

Accusing that the Congress lacked the courage to take decisions and, at best, only made statements, he said that the grand old party always put the country at risk.

“Congress never prioritised the nation's security. Because of the negativity of Congress governments, the entire Northeast lived in fear and insecurity. Congress always kept the country at risk. During Congress's tenure, whenever weapons were purchased for the military, it meant a scam worth thousands of crores,” he said.

Mr Modi further said, “Today, the country is strengthening its armed forces. India is building magnificent highways, magnificent tunnels, high-rise bridges, and modern airfields on its borders. It is enhancing the nation's security, and that is why Congress is bewildered. They are wondering how Modi manages to do all this.” He also said, “Congress wants to unsettle Assam once again. Con-



gress wants to return it to infiltrators once again. Be it its top leadership in Delhi or leaders here, they all are trying to save infiltrators. They want to change the original identity of Assam.”

Pointing out that BJP looks northeast as “Goddess Ashtalakshmi”, Mr Modi while highlighting the Union Budget allocations, said that Assam would receive Rs 50,000 crore as its tax share this year. “The budget focuses heavily on making the northeast economically self-reliant. This year, Assam will receive ap-

proximately Rs 50,000 crore as its tax share... We should remember well how Assam was left starving during the Congress government. During the Congress regime, Assam received only Rs 10,000 crore as its tax share. Now, under the BJP government, Assam is receiving 5 times more money than it did under the Congress government,” he said.

He pointed out that over the past 11 years, Assam has received more than Rs 5.5 lakh crore from the Centre for various development projects. The Prime Minister said that the latest budget focuses heavily on improving connectivity and economic self-reliance in the Northeast, which he described as “Goddess Ashtalakshmi.” Thousands of

crores have been allocated for highways and road projects in Assam, he said, adding that improved connectivity would boost employment and tourism. Asking party workers to intensify efforts for the forthcoming assembly polls in Assam, Mr Modi said that the greatest pride and honour of his life is being a karyakarta of the Bharatiya Janata Party.

US Ocean Regulator Criticized for Altering Right Whale Protection Rule

The U.S.'s ocean regulator plans to make industry-friendly changes to a longstanding rule designed to protect vanishing whales, prompting criticism from environmental groups who cite the recent death of an endangered whale. The rules protect the North Atlantic right whale, which numbers less than 400 and lives off the East Coast. The giant animals are protected by a vessel speed rule that requires large ships to slow down at certain times to avoid collisions, which is a leading cause of death for the whales.

The National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration said in a Thursday statement to The Associated Press that it plans to soon announce proposed new rules designed to “modernize” the whale protections.

The proposal will be a “deregulatory-focused action” that will seek to “reduce unnecessary regulatory and economic burdens while ensuring responsible conservation practices for endangered North Atlantic right whales,” the statement said.

A notice of rulemaking about the right whale rules is listed on the U.S. Office of Information and Regulatory Affairs website, but it does not include any details about the proposal. NOAA said in its statement that more

information about the rules was forthcoming and that the agency was focused on “implementing new technologies, engineering approaches, and other advanced tools” to protect the whales.

Several environmental groups criticized the move away from vessel speed rules. Some cited the Feb. 10 confirmation of the death of a 3-year-old female whale off Virginia. The cause of the animal's death was not yet determined, but it died at a far younger age than typical.

1,000 Days Of Congress Government Siddaramaiah Defends Record, Accuses BJP Of False Propoganda

Marking the completion of 1,000 days of his government, Chief Minister Siddaramaiah on Friday launched a sharp attack on the Bharatiya Janata Party, accusing it of spreading false propaganda and having no moral right to criticise the Congress government. Speaking after inaugurating the government's 1,000-day celebrations and the title deed distribution under Land Guarantee programme for 1 lakh beneficiaries, Siddaramaiah said his government had proved its commitment to the people by delivering on its promises.

“Our successful 1,000 days of governance are proof of our commitment to a people-oriented administration. Our govern-



ment has completed 1,000 days of successful rule. Only a Congress government truly practises what it preaches,” Siddaramaiah said. He said the Revenue Department had set a record by distributing title deeds (hakku patras) to 2.20 lakh families across the state, with one lakh beneficiaries receiving them in the second phase at Haveri on Saturday.

He also praised Revenue Minister Krishna Byregowda and said that providing legal documents to families who had lived for decades without land records had brought about a “revolutionary change”.

He assured that the remaining eligible beneficiaries would be covered soon. “All the achievements have been made despite injustice from the Central government. MP and Former Chief Minister Basavaraj Bommai, and Union Ministers Prahlad Joshi and Jagadish Shettar, are not speaking out in Delhi against the injustice being done to Karnataka,” he said expressing his unhappiness.

“Our government has completed two years and nine months in office. Out of the 590 promises we made, 243 have already been fulfilled. We will

fulfil the remaining promises in the rest of the term. Even during 2013–18, we fulfilled all the promises we had made and implemented 30 additional promises that were not even in the manifesto, setting a record of ‘walking the talk’,” he said. He accused the BJP of spreading false propaganda that the state treasury is empty. “The BJP government did not fulfil even 10 percent of its promises during its four-year tenure and is now making false allegations that the treasury is empty and that no development work has been done. Within one year of coming to power, our government implemented five guarantee schemes, spending Rs 1.18 lakh crore on them. Tax collection has increased, and the state now ranks first in the country in GDP.

How Epstein Used Sham Marriages, Student Visas To Keep Women Bound To Him

In early 2013, Jeffrey Epstein's girlfriend, Karyna Shuliak, was stressed about her US visa status. Later that year, she married an American citizen and her worries were gone. A Green Card followed, and, in 2018, citizenship. Then Shuliak divorced her spouse: a woman named Jennifer who had been in a relationship with Kimbal Musk after Epstein connected them. “now that she's an american you should throw her a big ole party,” one of Epstein's go-to immigration lawyers messaged on the day of Shuliak's naturalization interview. “With a mechanical bull, red white and blue balloons, and deep fried snickers bars on fry toothpicks.” Shuliak's immigration story - and the stories of



several other women revealed in a cache of files released by the US Department of Justice - show how Epstein used student visas, English language courses and sham marriages to make sure the women in his orbit stayed right where he wanted them.

The convicted pedophile had arranged for Shuliak's admission to Columbia University's dental school, as a transfer student from Belarus who hadn't finished her degree, via a complicated process that began

in 2011. After she got in, communications between her and members of the Ivy League school's international student office show her immigration case was another hurdle to clear. “I am so sorry if you were given the run a round with the immigration office today,” an official at Columbia's dental school wrote to Shuliak in July 2012. “At this time I believe that everything is fine with your immigration status.” Columbia and the official didn't re-

spond to a request for comment.

Epstein, apparently, wanted to be sure of Shuliak's immigration status. He reached out to his network seeking help to quietly restore her student visa.

“I don't want to ask as I prefer her not to be a part of my file,” Epstein wrote in late 2012 to Ian Osborne, a British investor who appears multiple times in the files. “I recall you had a good lawyer friend for immigration in Washington.”


Osborne said he had someone with links to the highest level at the Immigration and Naturalization Service. That person, Osborne said, was Greg Craig, then a Skadden, Arps, Slate, Meagher & Flom partner, and former White House counsel to President Barack Obama.

Ministers Issue Midnight Rebuttal Over Rahul's Trade Deal Charges

Union ministers Piyush Goyal and Shivraj Singh Chouhan on Friday rejected allegations by Leader of the Opposition Rahul Gandhi that the India-US interim trade deal compromised farmers' interests, well past midnight asserting that the agreement fully safeguards the agriculture sector. The rebuttal followed a video message posted by Gandhi on X, in which he accused Prime Minister Narendra Modi of being “anti-farmer” and “selling” the country through the trade deal.

Commerce and industry minister Goyal said, “In a video released today, he (Gandhi) has surpassed all limits in making false statements and levelling unfounded allegations. He is misleading farmers with a fabricated narrative and attempting to provoke our anadatas. He has never demonstrated concern for



the nation, nor can we expect him to contribute to building a strong and prosperous India,” He stated that major crops, including wheat, rice, millets, soybean, corn, GM food products, spices and potatoes, have been “fully safeguarded”. “We have also fully protected the interest of farmers producing major fruits, including apples. India's doors have not been opened for dairy products or poultry,” he said.

Union agriculture minister Chouhan termed Gandhi's claims “baseless” and said, “Rahul Gandhi is a liar. He has nothing to do with the country and its farmers. He does not like the empowerment of farmers. He is always seen saying

anti-national things. He broke all records of lying in his video message.”

He asserted that the Prime Minister has always taken decisions in the interest of farmers. “The schemes launched under his leadership have changed the lives of farmers. Farmers' interest has been fully protected in the recent deal signed with America,” he said.

Addressing the 64th convocation ceremony of ICAR-IARI later in the day, Chouhan said, “All the FTAs, including one with the EU and other countries, are all in the interest of the country. The deal with the US is in India's national interest and completely safeguarded. The interests of the farmers have been kept at the top.” In an apparent reference to Gandhi, he said, “They are creating a ruckus and saying we are looted. We are ruined. Everything is destroyed. Nation is sold out,” adding that “they cannot bear the strength of the farmers”.

Cong. Neglected.....

He added that over the past 11 years, the state had received more than Rs 5.5 lakh crore from the Centre for various development projects. Referring to the 2019 Pulwama attack, he paid tributes to the security personnel who lost their lives and cited Operation Sindoor as an example of India's response to terror threats. “Today is Pulwama anniversary. I pay my respect to the deceased. India has since shown how to respond. You have seen recently in Op Sindoor. But could you expect it from the Congress which refuses to acknowledge India as a nation?” he said.

Earlier, the Prime Minister inau-

gurated and flagged off development projects worth over Rs 5,450 crore in Assam. In Guwahati, he inaugurated the Kumar Bhaskar Varma Setu across the Brahmaputra, built at a cost of Rs 3,000 crore, and virtually inaugurated the temporary campus of IIM Guwahati and the National Data Centre for the North Eastern Region at Amingaon in Kamrup district. He also flagged off 225 electric buses under the PM-eBus Sewa scheme for Guwahati, Nagpur, Bhavnagar and Chandigarh.

Rs.1L Cr.....

The UCF will be operational from FY 2025–26 to FY 2030–31, with a possible extension till FY 2033–34. It will support cities with a population of 10 lakh or more, all State and Union Territory capitals, major industrial cities with a population above one lakh, and urban local bodies in hilly and northeastern States. A provision of ₹5,000 crore has been approved under a Credit Re-payment Guarantee Scheme. Projects will be selected through a challenge-based framework and linked to governance, financial and urban planning reforms. Monitoring will be undertaken through a digital portal of the Ministry of Housing and Urban

Affairs. The Cabinet also cleared a four-lane access-controlled greenfield corridor for Gohpur on NH-15 to Numaligarh on NH-715, including a 15.79-km road-cum-rail tunnel under the Brahmaputra river. At present, the 240-km road journey between the two points via the Kaliabhomora bridge takes about six hours. The government said the project would improve connectivity in Assam and neighbouring northeastern States, enhance freight movement and generate around 80 lakh person-days of employment.

Central Cabinet ..

The CCEA also approved the rehabilitation and upgradation of the Ghoti-Trimbak (Mokhada)-Jawhar-Manor-Palghar section of NH-160A in Maharashtra at ₹3,320.38 crore. The road will serve the region west of Nashik, particularly around Ambad and Satpur, which hosts a dense cluster of industrial units.

The project has been proposed in line with the PM GatiShakti principles and will connect 6 PM GatiShakti economic nodes, a social nodes and 8 logistics nodes in Maharashtra. The CCEA also approved construction of four-lane sections of Dhamasiya-Bi-

tada/ Movi and Nasarpore-Malotha in Gujarat at ₹4,583.64 crore. The 107.67-km long project is a part of NH-56 which starts at Nimbahera in Rajasthan and traverses through Dahod district in Gujarat, Alirajpur district in Madhya Pradesh and then re-enters Gujarat near Chhota Udepur district, terminating at its junction with NH-48 near Vapi. The project is designed for 100 km/h, enabling 70 km/h average speed which will cut travel time by 40 per cent - from 2.5 to 1.5 hours.

Centre Clears.....

“We also have to keep in mind that the AIMIM is spreading its base and we must make quick counter moves,” said a senior party leader. The party leaders were of the view that MIM's growth would eventually polarise the Telangana electorate. Significantly, Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy had made the Centre's delay in sanctioning prosecution against Arvind Kumar an electoral issue in the just-concluded campaign for the urban local body polls. “Arvind Kumar played crucial role in the scam and the investigation cannot be taken to its logical conclusion without Centre's sanction of prosecution,” Revanth Reddy.

2 Held In Kushaiguda Hit-And-Drag Case

Two men accused of knocking down a private employee and dragging him for nearly a kilometre were arrested and remanded in judicial custody by Kushaiguda police. The incident occurred on February 9 at around 8 pm. Complainant Panuganti Raju, 20, a resident of Rampally, said he was travelling with colleagues Vijay Kumar and M. Sathish, 45, from Mallapur to Rampally when their car was rear-ended by a sports utility vehicle (SUV) bearing registration number TS09 FP 0094. The SUV, driven rashly, sped away. Raju and his colleagues pursued the vehicle and intercepted it near the NTR statue signal at HB Colony. When Sathish attempted to stop the SUV by standing in front of it, the driver knocked him down and dragged him for nearly a kilometre. Sathish sustained severe bleeding injuries and was shifted to a private hospital. Police registered a case and arrested Uppari Mahesh, 23, of Santhoshnagar, and Anagandula Tarun, 22, of Venkateshwaranagar.

Attapur Police Arrest Man For Damaging Car And Setting Shop On Fire

Attapur police arrested 24-year-old Mohammed Salman alias ‘Shooter’ Salman for trespassing into a shop, damaging a car and setting a business premises on fire in Attapur. The complainant, 23-year-old Syed Furkhan runs a second-hand air-conditioner shop at Akber Hills in Attapur. Police said that on February 12 at around 7 pm, Salman barged into the shop and allegedly tried to attack Furkhan with



a stick. Fearing for his safety, Furkhan closed the shop for the night. Soon after, Salman reportedly noticed a black car parked outside the shop, which belonged to Furkhan’s friend. Police said the accused broke the car’s window glass with a stick, and then set fire to Furkhan’s air conditioner shop.

Panel Cuts Land Value By Half, Court Stays e-auction

Renuka Yara of the Telangana High Court has stayed an e-auction notice issued for the sale of agricultural land that had been offered as collateral security by a guarantor to a nationalised bank. The interim order was passed while hearing a writ petition filed by Malireddy Koti Reddy, who challenged the proposed auction of nearly 11 acres of agricultural land with a reserve price fixed at ₹6 crore. The petitioner contended that he had stood

only as a guarantor for the loan obtained by the principal borrower, who was subsequently declared bankrupt. Despite this, the creditor bank initiated recovery proceedings against the collateral property furnished by him. He argued that such action, particularly at the undervalued reserve price, was unjust and prejudicial. It was submitted before the court that two earlier valuation reports had assessed the fair market value of the land at ₹17.22 crore and ₹19.66 crore respectively. However, a subsequent valuation report prepared in January by the same valuers drastically reduced the value to approximately ₹10.66 crore. The petitioner alleged that this steep reduction of nearly 50 per cent was made without assigning any reasons and was arbitrary in nature, especially when agricultural land prices generally tend to remain stable or appreciate over time.

The petitioner further informed the court that he had identified a prospective buyer willing to purchase the property for ₹11 crore. Conducting the auction at a reserve price of ₹6 crore, he argued, would result in irreparable loss and injury. Cybercops Nab 5 for Duping Woman of Rs 1.08 Lakh

Hyderabad Cyber Crime Police arrested five men for running fake online loan schemes by impersonating Mudra Loan officials. The accused — Bochu Arun, Gadam Bharath, Samara Tirupati, Velugonda Tharun and Chukka Shyam, all from Warangal district — allegedly cheated a 36-year-old Hyderabad woman of Rs 1,08,274. She had responded to an Instagram loan advertisement in November 2025 and was contacted by a caller posing as “Kila Pavan Kumar” from Mudra loan services.

The fraudster claimed a Rs 3 lakh loan had been sanctioned and demanded payments under various heads, including insurance and TDS. Despite transferring over Rs 1 lakh, the victim was pressed for more money even after seeking cancellation. DCP V. Arvind Babu said the gang operated from rented flats in Kolkata and Delhi, running fake call centres with SIM cards, mobiles, bank accounts and UPI IDs provided by organisers. Each member allegedly made 180–200 calls a day and earned a 30 per cent commission. Police seized eight mobile phones and 10 SIM cards.

HC Asks Condition of a Baby Who Kept in Protection House

The Telangana High Court has asked the state’s women and child welfare department to submit a comprehensive report on the condition and well-being of a minor girl who was taken from her adoptive parents during an investigation into an alleged child trafficking network and lodged in a state home. A division bench headed by Chief Justice Aparesh Kumar Singh and Justice G. M. Mohiuddin was dealing with an appeal filed by the adoptive parents who were seeking legal remedies to get back

the two-year-old baby. Earlier, a single judge had declined to hand over custody of the girl to the couple, observing that the adoption had not been carried out through legally prescribed procedures. The aggrieved parents then filed an appeal which was heard by the division bench. The parents agreed that procedural lapses had taken place in the adoption process and admitted that money had been paid to a mediator to secure the baby. They argued that the child’s best interests, security, and her future well-being, warranted restoring custody to them.

HC has limited scope on service matters


A two judge panel of the Telangana High Court reiterated the limited jurisdiction of the writ court in dealing with punishment in service matters. The panel comprising Chief Justice Aparesh Kumar Singh and Justice G.M. Mohiuddin was hearing a writ appeal filed by the Central Industrial Security Force (CISF) challenging the order passed in a review petition. Writ petitioner Kishan Kumar Azmeera, a constable/sweeper in CISF, was removed from service in 2012 on charges of unauthorised absence and exhibiting an incorrigible attitude in light of his past service record. His statutory appeal and revision were dismissed, and a writ petition assailing



the removal was also dismissed in 2018. Subsequently, in a review petition, the single judge modified the penalty from removal to compulsory retirement, holding that the punishment was disproportionate to the charge of unauthorised absence and directing grant of pensionary benefits. Assailing the modification, standing counsel for the Central government contended that the single judge had transgressed the limited parameters of review jurisdiction under the CPC. It was argued that a review cannot operate

as an appeal in disguise and that no error apparent on the face of the record or discovery of new material was demonstrated. It was argued that the review court impermissibly re-appreciated the proportionality of punishment, which had been examined in the original writ proceedings. It was further contended that the respondent, being a member of a disciplined force, had repeatedly absented himself without authorisation and had failed to participate in the departmental enquiry despite multiple call-up

notices, thereby justifying the penalty of removal. Appearing party-in-person, the respondent argued that the review was necessary to prevent miscarriage of justice and that the court was empowered to correct manifest injustice in exercise of its review jurisdiction. The panel ruled that the power of review was circumscribed and cannot be invoked to undertake a fresh appraisal of facts or substitute a different view on punishment. The court observed that the single judge had effectively reassessed the material on record and altered the penalty, which was impermissible in review proceedings. The panel while allowing the appeal directed release of admissible terminal benefits, including general provident fund amounts.

ASSAM CM'S HATE TALK NEEDS TO BE REINED IN

The contents of the petitions moved in the Supreme Court by Left parties CPI and CPI(M) and a few residents of Assam seeking action against the state’s chief minister Himanta Biswa Sarma for his non-stop spewing of hatred on the Muslim community in the state are a troubling sign of the times which all right-thinking people in the country, and not just the judiciary, must address to find a solution. The charges against Mr Sarma are not about taking a political position or an ideological stance but instead about what can easily fall into the category of hate speech. It is very tough for an Indian citizen to conceive the chief minister of a state making an open call to the people to underpay Muslim employees and assuring them that the “Assam police will take care of the rest”. His video, purportedly with a gun aiming at two Muslims, shared by the official handle of his party, completes the picture of a ruler who has failed to live up to the oath that he took while entering the office. He is constitutionally mandated to treat every citizen under his government equally and “act without fear or favour”.

Mr Sarma has been out to prove that he is more loyal than the king to the Hindutva cause ever since he assumed office in 2021. The politician who grew up in the Congress and was made a minister by that party several times switched his loyalty to the saffron side late in the day. He now appears to be in a hurry to establish himself as a true-blue Hindutva apparatchik. His statements and actions targeting the Muslim community must be seen as only a part of this hidden agenda. Mr Sarma and his party have every right, and responsibility, to act against illegal migrants in the state. There are established and legal ways to carry out that responsibility but Mr Sarma is not seen doing just that. Instead he indulges in rhetoric that flies in the face of

every convention, protocol or even common decency. He has infamously threatened to use the special intensive revision of the electoral roll in the state as a tool to disenfranchise the Muslim community. It is completely undemocratic, not to mention inherently inhuman, to paint a whole community as comprising illegal aliens and lead a hate campaign against them. It is something even chief ministers of other BJP-ruled states have refrained from doing. Hate is something that India with its diverse social fabric can ill afford. There will be a number of fault lines in every small society in India, something that is unusual in another country. Religion, region, language, race, sex and caste are some of the ready reasons for discovering those fault lines. A sensible society will build bridges over them so that the people can progress as a community. History has proved that divisive tactics have never paid their users expected dividends.

Markets slip nearly 1 pc for the week amid IT sell-off and weak global cues

Indian equity benchmarks lost nearly 1 per cent during the week, weighed down by weak global cues and sharp declines in IT index, tracking Wall Street losses due to AI-related fears. Nifty lost 0.87 per cent during the week and dipped 1.30 per cent on the last trading day to 25,471. At Friday's close, the Sensex was down 1,048 points or 1.25 per cent at 82,626. It declined 1.14 per cent during the week. Sectoral performance remained firmly negative, with all major indices ending in the red. Nifty Metal was the worst performer, dropping 3.3 per



cent, followed by realty, down 2.2 per and FMCG, down 1.9 per cent. The Nifty IT index touched a 10-month low before closing 1.4 per cent lower, even as selective buying helped it recover from intraday lows. Analysts said the IT sector continues to face head-

winds amid rising concerns that rapid AI advancements could disrupt traditional service models and weigh on future revenue visibility. The US dollar strengthened on the back of stronger-than-expected US January jobs data, which reduced expecta-

tions of near-term interest rate cuts by the US Federal Reserve. Dollar gained further traction amid media reports that Russia may consider re-entering the dollar settlement system as part of a potential economic understanding with the US, adding additional pressure on precious metals. Analysts predicted that a "break below the 25,400 mark in Nifty could open the door for a move toward the 25,100 gap area. On the upside, the 25,700–26,000 zone is likely to act as a strong resistance band in case of any recovery." Broader indices showed divergence from the benchmark indices during the week, with the Nifty

Midcap100 only down 0.11 per cent, while Nifty Smallcap100 added 0.56 per cent. Apart from IT, FMCG and realty also appear vulnerable to further declines, while banking, auto, energy and select metal stocks may continue to show relatively better strength, market participants said. Looking ahead, investor attention is expected to shift toward global macro developments, with the earnings season drawing to a close, they said. Evolving geopolitical dynamics, and key take-aways from the 'India AI Impact Summit' scheduled in New Delhi next week, are other important cues for investors.

Reliance Wins US Licence for Venezuelan Oil, Sources Say

The United States has issued a general licence to India's Reliance Industries Ltd that will allow the refiner to buy Venezuelan oil directly without violating sanctions, two sources familiar with the matter said. Following the U.S. capture of Venezuelan President Nicolas Maduro earlier this month, U.S. officials said Washington would ease sanctions imposed on Venezuela's energy industry to facilitate a \$2 billion oil supply deal between Caracas and Washington and an ambitious \$100 billion reconstruction plan for the country's oil industry. A general licence authorises the purchase, exportation, and sale of Venezuelan-origin oil that has already been ex-

tracted, including the refining of such oil. Handing a licence to Reliance could speed up Venezuela's oil exports and reduce crude costs for the operator of the world's biggest refining complex. Reliance, which applied for the licence in early January, did not respond to an email request for comment. The U.S. Office of Foreign Assets Control did not immediately respond outside of regular business hours. Earlier this month, Reliance bought 2 million barrels of Venezuelan oil from trader Vitol, which was granted, along with Trafigura, U.S. licences to market and sell millions of barrels of Venezuelan oil after Maduro's capture. Direct purchase of Venezuelan oil will help Reliance replace Russian oil in a cost-effective way, as heavy crude from Caracas

is sold at a discount, said one of the sources. President Donald Trump earlier this month removed a 25% punitive tariff on India and said New Delhi would buy more oil from the U.S. and potentially Venezuela. Indian refiners, including Reliance, are avoiding Russian oil purchases for delivery in April and are expected to stay away from such trades for longer, refining and trade sources said, a move that could help New Delhi seal a trade pact with Washington. The conglomerate used to be a regular buyer of Venezuelan oil for its advanced refining complex, but had to stop purchases in early 2025 due to U.S. sanctions. Reliance operates two refineries with a combined capacity of about 1.4 million barrels per day.

Gold drops 1.82 pc in a volatile week; silver gains on US CPI data

Gold prices fell almost 1.82 per cent during the week, as investors remain cautious amid huge volatility with the dollar showing occasional bouts of strength. Meanwhile on Friday, MCX gold February futures surged 0.20 per cent while MCX silver March futures added 3.62 per cent. Currently gold futures stand at Rs 1,56,200, while silver futures at Rs 2,44,999 per kg. The price of 10 grams of 24-carat gold was at Rs 1,52,765 on Friday down from Rs 1,55,593 seen on Monday, according to data published by the India Bullion and Jewellers Association (IBJA). Gold traded positive in early session on Friday, but overall tone remains volatile to weak after

sharp sell-off from Rs 1,58,000 to Rs 1,54,000, as prices failed to sustain above the Rs 1,60,000 mark, said Jateen Trivedi, VP Research Analyst – Commodity and Currency, LKP Securities. Resistance is now firmly placed near Rs 1,60,000, and if gold continues to trade below Rs 1,56,000, a retest of the Rs 1,51,000 support zone cannot be ruled out, the analyst said. Gold and silver prices bounced back strongly on Friday buoyed by the softer-than-expected US CPI data which put pressure on the US dollar. The US Bureau of Labor Statistics reported the US CPI inflation of 2.40 per cent in January 2026 below market expectations of 2.50 per cent, however 0.30 per cent above the December 2025 CPI in-

flation. Analysts said that structural supply deficits and industrial demand from green energy, EVs, AI and electronics for silver continue to underpin its bullish bias, also noting relentless gold accumulation by the central bank. Market participants forecasted that gold and silver have entered a 3-5 year bull run, supported by favourable macroeconomic conditions, structural demand trends, and shifting investor preferences. However, they maintained investors to only hold gold and silver as part of a diversified portfolio with 10 – 15 per cent of their portfolios in precious metals. Any incremental additions should be made during periods of correction, they added.

India doubles down on state-backed venture capital, approving \$1.1B fund

India has cleared a \$1.1 billion state-backed venture capital program that will channel government money into startups through private investors, doubling down on its effort to finance high-risk areas such as artificial intelligence, advanced manufacturing and other sectors broadly referred to by the industry as deep tech. First outlined in the January 2025 budget speech by India's finance minister, the ₹100 billion fund won cabinet approval this week (more than a year after the speech), allowing the government to move ahead with deployment. A previous iteration of the program, launched in 2016, committed ₹100 billion to 145 private funds that have invested



more than ₹255 billion (about \$2.8 billion) in over 1,370 startups, according to official data released on Saturday. The program is structured as a fund of funds, a common venture capital model in which governments back startups indirectly by committing capital to private investment firms. It is designed to take a more targeted approach than its 2016 counterpart, focusing on deep-tech and manufac-

turing startups that typically require longer time horizons and larger amounts of capital, while also backing early-stage founders, expanding investment beyond major cities and strengthening India's domestic venture capital industry, particularly smaller funds, per the Indian government. At the announcement on Saturday, IT minister Ashwini Vaishnaw highlighted the scale of India's startup expansion, point-

ing to figures shown on a presentation slide indicating the number of startups has grown from fewer than 500 in 2016 to more than 200,000 today. The slide said more than 49,000 startups were registered in 2025 alone, the highest annual total on record. The cabinet approval follows recent changes to India's startup rules aimed at easing pressure on deep-tech companies. New Delhi doubled the period for which such firms are classified as startups to 20 years and raised the revenue threshold for startup-specific tax, grant and regulatory benefits to ₹3 billion, or about \$33 million, up from ₹1 billion previously. The approval comes just ahead of the government-backed India AI Impact Summit, where global AI

companies including OpenAI, Anthropic, Google, Meta, Microsoft, and Nvidia are set to participate alongside Indian corporates such as Reliance Industries and Tata Group. India, the world's most populous country and one of its largest internet markets with more than a billion online users, has become an increasingly attractive arena for global tech companies looking to expand their user base. At the same time, private capital has become harder to secure. India's startup ecosystem raised \$10.5 billion in 2025, down just over 17% from a year earlier, even as investors grew more selective and sharply reduced the number of deals. The number of funding rounds fell nearly 39% to 1,518 transactions, according to data from Tracxn.

Nothing opens its first retail store in India

Nothing, the hardware company backed by Tiger Global, is opening its first retail store in India, its biggest market. The store is located in Bengaluru, where the company says a large chunk of its user base is concentrated. The new, two-story location will showcase Nothing's products and other projects. Customers will also be able to buy hardware products and other merchandise from the store and have select items customized. "We wanted to create a fun space," the company's co-founder and CEO Carl Pei said. "It's kind of inspired by all the parts that are related to the brand. For instance, the factory: if you buy a product, there's like a production line where the product comes out. We also show machines where phones go through

testing, like USB port testing or water resistance testing. So we just wanted to bring that world together." The store will feature products from both Nothing and CMF, its budget brand, which it spun off last year. Notably, CMF is headquartered in India and has a joint venture with local Indian ODM (original design manufacturer), Optimus. Pei mentioned that both brands are differentiated in terms of the products they offer, which fall into different price ranges, as well as the audiences they target. "Nothing is more niche with a higher price. CMF is more [targeted toward] mass [market]. You know it's mass, but it's not just off-the-shelf rebrand products that usually [appear] in this price point. They are also products that we put a lot of care into," he said.

62% of Gen Z, Millennials Still See Gold as Safest Investment, Survey Finds

Gold continues to maintain its status as one of the most trusted investment choices among young Indians, even as modern financial instruments gain popularity. A recent survey of 5,000 consumers aged between 18 and 39 revealed that 62 percent of respondents consider gold their top investment preference, underlining its strong and lasting appeal. Interestingly, 66.7 percent said they make gold-buying decisions on their own, indicating a clear shift away from purely traditional-based purchases toward more informed, logic-driven financial choices. The survey also highlighted evolving buying habits. Nearly 62 percent of participants reported that their most recent gold purchase was under 5 grams. This trend sug-



gests that younger buyers are moving toward smaller, more frequent investments instead of making large, occasional purchases. Such behavior reflects a strategic approach, allowing investors to gradually build assets while managing their budgets more efficiently. When asked how they would invest ₹25,000 today, 61.9 percent chose gold, placing it far ahead of other options. Mutual funds were selected by 16.6 percent, fixed deposits by 13 percent, stocks by 6.6 percent, and cryptocurrency by only 1.9 percent. These figures reinforce gold's strong position as a preferred investment

vehicle, especially among younger individuals seeking stability. During times of economic uncertainty, confidence in gold appears even stronger. Around 65.7 percent of respondents described it as the safest investment compared with bank savings, equities, or mutual funds. This perception of security continues to drive demand and strengthens its reputation as a reliable asset. The findings also show that gold purchases are no longer primarily linked to weddings or traditional occasions. About 24 percent of participants said their first gold purchase was inspired by receiving their first salary, while 23.9 percent cited investment motives. Overall, the survey highlights gold's evolving role as both a cultural symbol and a modern financial asset in today's world.

Hyderabad Police Intensify Rowdy-Sheeteer Checks

The Hyderabad police conducted combing and cordon search operations on Saturday across the Shamshabad zone to curb crime and strengthen law-and-order enforcement. The drive was carried out within Balapur limits under the supervision of B. Rajesh and D. V. Pra-deep Kumar Reddy. More than 300 personnel participated, forming multiple search and cut-off teams to cover sensi-tive pockets and suspected hideouts. During the operation, officers searched about 800 houses in Wadi-E-Saleheen and Shaheen Nagar. The inspections led to the seizure of 27 two-wheelers without number plates, two autorick-shaws lacking valid documents, nine illegal gas cylinders, and one unhygienic fry-onion manufac-turing unit operating in violation of safety norms. Police also apprehended 17 rowdy sheeters and seven persons listed as suspects, who were taken into custody for verification and preventive ac-tion.

Telangana Pharma Hub Gets Centre Of Excellence Status

In a boost to Telangana’s pharmaceutical research ecosystem, National Institute of Pharmaceutical Education & Research (Niper) Hyderabad has been chosen as one of seven centres of excellence (CoEs) under the Centre’s Promotion of Research and Innova-tion in Pharma-MedTech (PRIP) scheme. Each Niper will host a CoE to strengthen research infrastructure, ac-celerate innovation, and deepen industry–academia col-laboration. The Hyderabad centre will focus on bulk drugs, a critical area for reducing import dependence. The PRIP scheme, with an outlay of ₹5,000 crore till FY 2030, supports R&D across the pharma–medtech lifecycle — from early research to product development and commercialisation. Financial assistance is extended to industries, MSMEs, and startups for projects on new medicines, complex generics, biosimilars, and novel medical devices, either independently or in partnership with academia. The announcement comes amid the Centre’s wider push for bulk drug manufacturing. While Telangana has not secured a Bulk Drug Park under the ₹3,000 crore scheme — parks have been ap-proved in Andhra Pradesh, Gujarat, and Himachal Prades-h — it benefits from priority land allotment for PLI-prioritised products. Union minister of state for chemicals and fertilisers Anupriya Patel, in a Lok Sabha reply, underscored the Centre’s strategy to cut API im-port dependence and promote domestic innovation. With its pharma hub status, Niper Hyderabad is positioned to play a pivotal role in this national drive.

Hyderabad Police Recover 32 Lost Mobile Phones, Hand Them Back to Owners



In a swift recovery drive, police in Hyderabad re-turned 32 lost mobile phones to their rightful owners on February 14, demonstrating an efficient complaint-tracking system and rapid response mecha-nism. According to A Sudhakar, Deputy Commissioner of Po-lice, Chandrayangutta, every complaint registered on the Central Equipment Identity Register (CEIR) portal is acted upon immediately. Once a complaint is filed, the phone’s IMEI number is blocked and tracked, enabling officials to trace devices quickly and prevent misuse. He cautioned citizens that lost phones can be exploited for online fraud, financial scams, or unauthorized trans-actions if not reported promptly. To tackle this, each po-lice station now has a dedicated unit focused solely on tracing missing or stolen mobiles. Officials urged the public not to panic if they lose their devices but to file a complaint on the CEIR portal without delay. Prompt re-ported significantly improves recovery chances and helps authorities curb cybercrime by disabling stolen de-vices before they can be misused.

AIMIM celebrates 68th Revival Day amidst recent electoral gains

Winning candidates from two States to join celebrations as party showcases civic poll surges

The All India Majlis-e-It-tehadul Muslimen will celebrate its 68th Revival Day on Saturday evening with a major show of strength at its head-quarters, Darussalaam, in Hyderabad, where party president Asaduddin Owaisi is set to hoist the flag and address sup-porters. Owaisi takes swipe at Yogi Adityanath

All India Majlis-e-It-tehad-ul-Muslimeen (AIMIM) chief Asaduddin Owaisi on Sat-urday (February 14, 2026) took a jibe at Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath for using the word “qayamat” (doomsday) while asserting that the Babri Masjid would never be rebuilt. In an interview with ANI, Mr. Owaisi said, “At least he had to speak an Urdu word, what would be a hindi word for ‘qayamat’. Ask him.” His remarks come after CM Yogi Adityanath, while ad-dressing a gathering in Bara-banki, said, “The day of ‘Qayamat’ (doomsday) will never come, and hence the Babri structure will never be rebuilt. Those who are dreaming of the day of ‘Qayamat’ will rot away; that day will never come.” Further, he denied any role in the no-confidence motion against Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla and the motion against Leader of Opposition Rahul Gandhi. “Neither was I asked nor did I sign the no-confidence mo-tion against Lok Sabha Speaker... There is nothing in the privilege motion and no-thing will happen,” Mr. Owaisi said

On Monday, the gates of the exhibition grounds will be closed for visitors, and the traders will be given a day to pack their merchandise and shift it.

Telangana Winter Ends, Heat Rising

Winter has officially withdrawn from Te-langana, including its capital Hyderabad, with temperatures set to increase gradu-ally in the coming days, weather fore-caster T Balaji said. He also warned of possible unseasonal rains and thunder-storms in parts of the state between Feb-ruary 25 and 28, signalling a brief spell of unstable weather before summer con-ditions intensify. For now, daytime temperatures are ex-pected to remain below 33°C for the next few days, while night temperatures will hover between 17°C and 19°C, providing relatively mild conditions despite winter’s exit. According to the latest re-port from the India Meteorological De-partment, several areas recorded cooler-than-normal readings on Saturday morning. Among them, Patancheru reg-istered the lowest temperature at 13°C, making it one of the chilliest spots in the



state for the day. Other locations that experienced below-normal temperatures included Rajendar-nagar, Hanamkonda, Khammam, and Medak. Meteorologists note that such brief cool spells during seasonal tran-sitions are not unusual, especially when atmospheric systems shift. However, the overall trend indicates a steady warming pattern across the region, marking a clear transition from winter to pre-summer conditions. Residents are advised to pre-prepare for rising daytime heat in the coming weeks while also keeping watch for sudden rain or thunder activity later this month.

Advocate Killed By Brothers-In-Law Over Dowry Abuse

A lawyer practising in Rangareddy courts, Mo-hammed Khadeer, was al-legedly killed by his brothers-in-law after a vi-olent confrontation at his office in Attapur on Sun-day, police said. Two sus-pects, Anif and Arshad, were taken into custody as investigators began prob-ing the circumstances sur-rounding the fatal assault. Preliminary findings sug-gest the incident stemmed from a long-running do-mestic dispute involving allegations of dowry ha-rassment and a disagree-ment over property

ownership. Khadeer’s wife had reportedly been living with her parents for some time due to marital tensions. According to sources, her family had al-lotted a residential plot in her name in the same lo-cality, which Khadeer al-legedly insisted should be transferred to him. The demand was refused, further straining relations between him and his in-laws. Police said Khadeer al-legedly called one of his brothers-in-law to his of-fice to resolve the issue, but the meeting turned into a heated argument. During the altercation, Khadeer is said to have at-

tacked the relative, who managed to escape un-harmed. Shortly after-ward, the man allegedly returned with his brother and two others, con-fronted Khadeer, and as-saulted him in retaliation. The attack left Khadeer with severe injuries, and he died at the scene before he could receive medical assistance. Officers stated that they are verifying statements, examining ev-idence, and reconstructing the timeline to determine the exact sequence of events. Authorities con-firmed that further legal action will depend on the outcome of the ongoing investigation.

Indian Army opens Agniveer recruitment, urges Telangana youth to apply

The central government released a notification for the recruitment of unmar-ried youth under various categories of the Agniveer scheme on the Indian Army website on Feb-ruary 13, inviting applica-tions from all permanent residents of Telangana. Recruitment is open under the categories of Agniveer general duty, Agniveer technical, Agni-veer clerk/ store keeper technical, Agniveer tradesman 10th pass and Agniveer tradesman 8th pass. Candidates can apply to any two categories based on their eligibility. Ad-ditionally, the upper age limit for all categories has been increased from 21 to 22 years. Online Common En-trance Examinations (CEE) for candidates will be conducted in 13 lan-

guages, including Telugu, and bonus marks will be allotted to ITI, Diploma and National Cadet Corps-qualified candi-dates. The online window for submission of applications will close on April 1 and admit cards for the en-trance examination, ten-tatively scheduled from June 1 to June 15, can be downloaded from the aforementioned website. Candidates are also asked to regularly check the website for any updates and their registered email IDs for the admit cards. For further assis-tance, candidates can con-tact the Secunderabad Army Recruiting Office at the number 040-27740059. Candidates have also been asked not to fall for touts and fraud-sters who claim that they can help anyone pass or get enrolled, a press re-lease said.

Hitech City Road Widening to Ease Traffic Bottlenecks

Cyberabad Municipal Corporation Commis-sioner G Srijana on Sat-urday inspected a one-kilometre road-widening stretch in Hitech City aimed at easing severe traffic congestion faced daily by more than 1.3 lakh commuters in the IT corridor. The inspection covered the key corridor from Lemon Tree Hotel to Shil-paramam, where officials assessed bottlenecks and reviewed execution time-lines. Representatives from the traffic police and civic engineering teams participated, while Man-aging Director Ashok Reddy of the Hyderabad Metropolitan Water Supply and Sewerage Board joined zonal of-

ficers to coordinate inter-departmental works. Au-thorities said junctions at Madhapur, Mind Space and surrounding zones are expected to benefit most once expansion is com-pleted, as these stretches currently witness peak-hour gridlocks and slow vehicle movement. In a parallel inspection, officials from multiple de-

partments—including Hy-derabad Metropolitan De-velopment Authority and Greater Hyderabad Mu-nicipal Corporation—re-viewed sanitation safeguards around Dur-gam Cheruvu to ensure untreated sewage does not enter the water body. Reddy directed that only treated water from Sewage Treatment Plants

be used for construction, gardening and landscap-ing in commercial hubs such as Raheja Mind Space. He also proposed a de-dicated pipeline from the lake’s STP to supply recy-cled water for non-potable uses. Officials noted that wastewater generated in Madhapur and nearby catchment areas is already processed through two treatment plants before being re-leased into the lake to support groundwater re-charge. Additionally, a 1000-mm pipeline project is under-way to prevent excess sewage inflow from other zones, a step authorities say will protect lake ecol-ogy while supporting urban infrastructure ex-pansion.
