EC to Hold Polls to 2 Rajya Sabha Seats in Telangana in March

The Election Commission (EC) of India on Wednesday released the schedule for the biennial elections to the Rajya Sabha to fill two seats from Telangana that are set to fall vacant in April. The six-year terms of sitting members K.R. Suresh Reddy of the BRS and Abhishek Manu Singhvi of the Congress will end on April 9, necessitating elections to the Upper House from the state. According to the schedule, the notification for the elections will be issued on February 26. The last date for filing nominations is March 5, scrutiny of nominations will be taken up on March 6 and the final date for withdrawal of candidature is March 9.

Hyderabad To Turn Net Zero City By 2034, Says Revanth

Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy on Wednesday said that Hyderabad will achieve Net Zero emissions by 2034 and a city-wide carbon footprint audit will be undertaken shortly. Addressing Mumbai Climate Week 2026 in Mumbai on Wednesday, the Chief Minister said that within the next five years there would be no factories within the Hyderabad urban area, as all manufacturing units will be shifted from the core urban region to peri-urban zones.

He highlighted sustainability initiatives in Hyderabad, including the rejuvenation of river



Musi, restoration of lakes, strengthening of water and energy grids, and the establishment of HYDRAA, described as India's first dedicated environmental police force. Describing energy as central to economic growth, the Chief Minister said development is measured by power generation and consumption. Telangana currently consumes an average of 16,610 MW per day. The

peak demand recorded last year was 17,162 MW, which is expected to exceed 19,000 MW this year and projected to cross 34,000 MW by 2034 as the state targets a \$1 trillion economy. Nearly 25 per cent of the state's energy is sourced from green power, he said.

In Hyderabad, he said, axes on electric vehicles have been removed, re-

Maharashtra Govt Cancels 5 % Muslim Quota

The Maharashtra government led by the Bharatiya Janata Party has scrapped the 5 per cent reservation for Muslims in jobs and education, ending years of legal uncertainty surrounding a 2014 ordinance that never became law.

The decision triggered criticism from Opposition parties, including the Indian National Congress



and Nationalist Congress Party, which accused the administration of an anti-minority stance and questioned the need to revoke a measure that had already lapsed.

The quota was originally

introduced in 2014 under the Special Backward Class-A category by the government headed by Prithviraj Chavan, with Ajit Pawar serving as Deputy Chief Minister. Soon after, the Bombay High Court stayed its implementation in public employment while permitting it in educational institutions.

However, the ordinance required legislative approval before December 23, 2014. As it was never

passed by the state legislature, it automatically expired, leaving the policy in prolonged legal limbo until the government issued orders declaring it void, effectively closing the chapter on the controversial quota. Leaders said the step clarifies the state's legal position, while critics argued it symbolically targets minorities despite having no practical effect because the quota had long ceased to operate.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Wednesday began a series of bilateral meetings with visiting world leaders ahead of the Leaders' Plenary of the India AI Impact Summit in New Delhi. The Prime Minister held back-to-back meetings at Hyderabad House with Spanish Prime Minister Pedro Sánchez, Bhutanese Prime Minister Tshering Tobgay, Finnish Prime Minister Petteri Orpo, Croatian Prime Minister Andrej Plenković, Kazakh Prime Minister Olzhas Bektenov, Estonian President Alar Karis and Serbian President Aleksandar



Vučić.

In the evening, he welcomed the dignitaries at Bharat Mandapam, the summit venue, and hosted a dinner. The leaders also attended cultural performances. On Thursday, the Prime Minister will inaugurate the Leaders' Plenary of the India AI Impact Summit. The opening session will also be addressed by

French President Emmanuel Macron and United Nations Secretary-General António Guterres. The programme includes a visit to the India AI Impact Expo 2026 and participation in the Leaders' Plenary focusing on AI governance, infrastructure and international cooperation.

French President Mac-

ron arrived in New Delhi after talks with Modi in Mumbai. Brazilian President Luiz Inácio Lula da Silva, Dutch Prime Minister Dick Schoof, Greek Prime Minister Kyriakos Mitsotakis, Slovak President Peter Pellegrini and Mauritius Prime Minister Navinchandra Ramgoolam also reached the Capital. During talks with Sánchez, the two leaders reviewed bilateral cooperation across trade, technology, defence, space, renewable energy and cultural exchanges. They welcomed progress in the Tata-Airbus C-295 transport aircraft final assembly line at Vadodara and stressed defence industrial collaboration.

Harish Rao Slams Delhi Summons

Harish Rao Calls Delhi Summons of Telangana Cabinet “Humiliating”

Senior BRS leader T. Harish Rao on Wednesday launched a sharp attack on the decision to summon the entire Telangana Cabinet to New Delhi by the All India Congress Committee, describing the move as “deeply humiliating” and an affront to the state’s democratic spirit and self-respect. He questioned whether people had voted for an autonomous state government or for one that functions “by remote control from Delhi,” asserting that such actions send a troubling message about political independence and federal balance. In an open letter addressed to Mallikarjun Kharge, Rahul Gandhi, Priyanka Gandhi, Mee-



nakshi Natarajan, and Sid-daramaiah, Rao argued that summoning an elected state Cabinet before party leadership reflects an erosion of federal principles. He said Telangana was achieved after years of struggle, sacrifice, and a mass movement demanding self-rule and political dignity, and therefore any act that appears to place the state leadership under central command under-

mines the very ideals on which the state was formed. He likened the development to a “Delhi durbar” culture, suggesting that it symbolises excessive centralisation within party structures. The senior leader further demanded that the Indian National Congress explain what he termed a “collapse of governance and betrayal of promises” in the state. He urged party leadership to direct Chief

Minister A. Revanth Reddy to honour commitments made to the electorate, at least during the remainder of the government’s tenure. According to him, voters deserved accountability and timely implementation of assurances rather than political reviews conducted outside the state. Sharpening his criticism, the veteran Bharat Rashtra Samithi figure accused the Chief Minister of prioritising frequent visits to the national capital instead of focusing on administration and governance at home. He alleged that such travel signalled misplaced priorities and weakened governance delivery, adding that people expected visible development, welfare implementation, and ad-

ministrative responsiveness rather than political consultations far from the state. Rao maintained that these developments raise serious questions about autonomy, accountability, and respect for state institutions. He said Telangana’s people had fought hard for self-governance and would not accept any arrangement that appeared to compromise that principle. His remarks come amid intensifying political confrontation between the ruling Congress and opposition BRS, with both sides trading accusations over governance performance, fulfilment of electoral promises, and the proper balance of authority between state leadership and national party command..

'No Bag Day' Uneven In Telangana Schools

Two years after Telangana introduced a monthly “No Bag Day” in schools, the policy remains in the academic calendar but implementation is uneven, especially in private institutions that remain exam-driven. “It is being followed in government schools. However, many private and corporate schools are ignoring it,” said Chava Ravi, state president of the Telangana State United Teachers Federation (TSUTF). He said while DEOs and headmasters monitor government schools, private institutions face little supervision. The initiative, launched in June 2023, designates



the third Saturday of each month as a bagless, activity-based day for Classes I to X. It builds on earlier rules capping schoolbag weight, first issued in 2005 and revised in 2017. G. Ramesh, director of SCERT, said reports are being sent from some schools to MEOs and monitoring officers are visiting institutions. “No specific study has been conducted yet, but we plan to,” he added, stressing that DEOs have been instructed to ensure compliance. Feedback suggests un-

even adoption and lack of clarity on activities. “It should not become a mechanical exercise,” said Ravi. Some private schools say they observe the day regularly. Madhusudan Sadula, principal of a city SSC school, said his institution holds presentations, stage programmes and practical sessions. Dr Prasad Rao, who runs a group of schools, said his students engage in nature walks, carpentry, robotics, arts and music. He argued the concept should be implemented nationwide, not confined to circulars. The Centre’s School Bag Policy of 2020 also recommends bagless days and limits bag weight to a percentage of body weight, leaving execution to states.

Ponguleti Orders Code Audit of Dharani Portal

Revenue minister Ponguleti Srinivas Reddy has ordered a comprehensive code audit of the Dharani portal to detect irregularities allegedly committed during the previous BRS regime. He warned that strict action would be taken against those responsible. Chairing a review meeting with senior revenue officials and members of a high-level inquiry committee at the Secretariat on Wednesday, the minister said the affairs of the portal were akin to “pulling a thread and seeing the entire knot unravel,” indicating deep-rooted systemic issues. He alleged that a system originally designed to safeguard people’s properties had been misused by influential persons in the past government for



vested interests. The high-level committee probing irregularities related to the alleged siphoning of stamp duty and registration charges by exploiting loopholes in Dharani has unearthed several findings. Ponguleti clarified that the lapses were not mere technical glitches but deliberately created flaws. Preliminary findings revealed that deficiencies identified during an earlier security audit were not rectified, though reports claimed otherwise. The portal was allegedly designed to enable human interference and manipulation. Suspicious land

transaction data was made inaccessible, certain logins were deleted, and confidential login details were found missing. The minister said information relating to land transactions conducted in violation of norms had been rendered unavailable, and a code audit was not undertaken as part of the earlier forensic audit. He noted that issues had arisen after entrusting maintenance of the portal to a foreign firm, Terrasis. Referring to Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy’s instructions, Ponguleti said the government would act firmly against those who misappropri-

ated stamp duty and registration charges. “No one who has committed wrongdoing will be spared. Every rupee due to the government will be recovered,” he asserted. He directed officials to conduct a detailed code audit immediately and ensure that lapses do not recur. He instructed that the Bhu Bharati portal, which replaced Dharani, be developed in a transparent, people-friendly manner, eliminating scope for manipulation. Reiterating that there would be no compromise on protecting land rights, Ponguleti said every irregularity committed in the name of Dharani would be exposed. He also directed officials to extend forensic audits to other districts, on the lines of those conducted in Siricilla and Siddipet.

M.D. Wajid Wins Ward 21, Felicitated

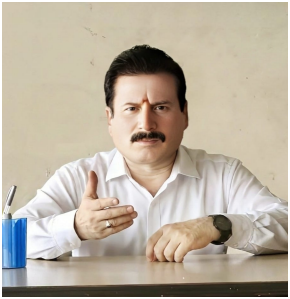

Panduranga Reddy Slams Govt Over Unfulfilled Welfare Promises

He pointed out that the promised ₹2,500 monthly financial assistance to women under the Mahalakshmi scheme has not been implemented, calling it a betrayal of women who trusted the assurances. He further questioned the delay in enhancing pen-

He demanded that the upcoming budget allocate sufficient funds to implement all pending promises for women, elderly citizens, persons with disabilities, farmers, and activists. Warning of protests, he said Telangana Jagruti would launch large-scale agitations if the government fails to act promptly, asserting that deceiving voters undermines democratic values.

Vigilance Officials
Raid Illegal Sand
Miner

Vigilance and Enforcement department officials have raided sand reaches, where the illegal sand mining and transportation were taking place in Karimnagar. According to vigilance and enforcement director-general Shikha Goel, officials intercepted five sand-loaded tractors, each transporting approximately 5 metric tonnes of sand from the Manair river belt under the guise of free sand meant for Indiramma Houses.

Following the raids, the police have registered a criminal case under the relevant sections of BNS against the tractor drivers and owners for illegal sand transportation, causing damage to natural public resources, theft of state property and rash and negligent driving, and endangering human life and personal safety. With onset of summer, miscreants would indulge in illegal transport of sand from different sand reaches. Following the tip-off, the vigilance would crack the whip on illegal transportation of sand. Similarly, the vigilance officials of Hyderabad rural unit office interpreted the vehicle carrying 12 MTs PDS rice to Zaheerabad from Hyderabad. Civil supply officials registered cases and seized PDS rice worth '4.5 lakh. Police registered cases against Pawar Jitu, Pawar Vijay and the driver Md Shabbir.

Youth's Stunt for Social Media Reels
Creates Suspicion at Korutla Bus Stand

A young man's attempt to create social media "reels" led to tense moments at the Korutla bus stand after he was found moving around in a burqa under suspicious circumstances. According to sources, staff at the Korutla bus station grew suspicious upon noticing a person in a burqa behaving unusually and loitering



around the premises. Acting promptly, the staff detained the individual for questioning.

Upon inquiry, it was revealed that the person was a Young man who had allegedly worn the burqa as part of a stunt to shoot content for social media reels. His actions reportedly raised concerns among passengers and staff, prompting immediate intervention.

The bus stand authorities later handed the young man over to the police for further investigation. Officials stated that such acts, especially in public places,

can cause unnecessary panic and security concerns.

Police are examining the incident and have cautioned youth against engaging in irresponsible stunts for online attention, particularly in sensitive public areas. Authorities reiterated that while creativity on social media is not discouraged, it should not compromise public safety or disturb law and order.

BRS leader Balka Suman arrested for
attacking Congress minister's convoy

Former MLA and Bharat Rashtira Samithi (BRS) leader Balka Suman was arrested on Wednesday, February 18, for allegedly attacking Minister Vivek Venkatswamy's convoy in Mancherla district the previous day.

He has reportedly been sent to a 14-day judicial remand. BRS cadres reportedly pelted stones at the minister when he was enroute to attend the election of the municipal chairperson of Kyathanpally along with his son, MP G Vamsi Krishna, and other Congress leaders on Tuesday. A police constable and a Congress worker reportedly suffered injuries in the attack.

A case was registered against Suman for allegedly behaving rudely with the police and for trying to prevent them from discharging their duties.

Tension prevailed at Suman's residence on Wednesday, when police



arrived to make the arrest, as his supporters gathered there in large numbers and resisted the attempt by police.

KTR, Harish Rao condemn arrest

The arrest attracted condemnation from senior BRS leaders and accused Congress of an "anarchic attitude". "We strongly condemn the arrest and detention of former MLA and Dalit leader Balka Suman for trying to stop the undemocratic and arrogant actions of Congress in Kyatanapally. Even though @BRSparty secured a full majority in Kyatanapally, the way the Congress party openly mocked democracy in broad daylight has made the entire Telangana feel disgusted," said Siddipet MLA Harish Rao.

He alleged that Congress was

grabbing the posts of chairpersons of every hung municipality through "back door" methods. "Not just Kyatanapalli — in places like Thorur, Jangaon, Ibrahimpatnam, Zaheerabad and every other hung municipality, they are grabbing the chairman posts through backdoor methods without respecting the people's verdict," his post read.

Meanwhile, KTR warned that once BRS comes back in power, all those abetting Congress's actions would have to pay a heavy price.

"Despite BRS winning a clear majority, CM Revanth and Minister Vivek are indulging in such despicable politics. The people of Kyatanapally observed a complete bandh today to protest against the undemocratic actions of the Congress government, but this government has not come to its senses. If some police officers who are acting as pawns of the ruling party do not change their attitude, they will have to pay a suitable price." KTR stated in an X post.

Komatireddy Calls
For Push To RRR,
HAM Roads

Roads and buildings minister Komatireddy Venkat Reddy on Wednesday directed officials to prepare focused and outcome-oriented Budget Estimates for 2026-27, stressing that the department has a key role in driving Telangana's growth. He called for a major push to flagship projects such as the Regional Ring Road (RRR) and roads under the Hybrid Annuity Model (HAM).

Reviewing last year's allocations and progress at the Secretariat, the minister said the upcoming budget must be guided by clear planning, measurable outcomes and strict financial discipline. He termed the RRR a "game changer" in line with the state's long-term development roadmap.

Referring to Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy's "Rising Telangana-2047" vision, Komatireddy said strengthening the road network is a top priority given rising vehicular load and population. He urged officials to resolve bottlenecks through co-ordination between departments and emphasised transparency in fund utilisation between the Centre and state. On national highways, the minister announced that the eight-lane expansion of the Hyderabad-Vijayawada stretch of NH-65 is expected to begin soon.

He said he would again request Union minister Nitin Gadkari to expedite the project, which could reduce travel time between the two cities to about two-and-a-half hours. He added that he would meet Union ministers to speed up other centrally assisted projects in Telangana.

Eradication of Drugs is a Collective Responsibility: Pamela

The District Collector Pamela Satpathy has emphasized that the eradication of narcotic substances is a shared responsibility of the entire society. She called upon officials, teachers, youth, and parents to work collectively to eliminate the menace of drug abuse from the district. The remarks were made during the District-Level Narcotics Coordination Centre (NCORD) Committee meeting held on Wednesday at the Collectorate Conference Hall. Addressing the officials, the Collector stated that coordinated efforts by the Police, Excise, Women Development, and Child Welfare Departments have been yielding positive results in controlling drug-



related activities in the district. She directed the Police and Excise Departments to intensify joint operations to dismantle drug supply networks at their roots. The Drug Inspector was instructed to closely monitor the sale of medicines in private medical stores and to take strict action against those selling intoxicating drugs without valid prescriptions from registered medical practitioners. The Collector further instructed officials to conduct awareness programmes in all govern-

ment and private schools, hostels, and colleges. She stressed that students must be educated not only about the dangers of drugs but also about the harmful effects of alcohol consumption and smoking. Surprise inspections in suspected areas were also ordered to curb illegal activities. Speaking on the occasion, Police Commissioner Gaus Alam stated that the Police Department has been taking stringent measures to combat drug-related offences. He revealed that since January 2025, a total

of 37 cases have been registered in the district, with 87 accused persons arrested so far. Authorities have seized 42 kilograms and 225 grams of ganja during various operations. He added that intensified checks are being carried out with the assistance of the Dog Squad and through the use of drug detection kits. The Commissioner warned that strict action will be taken against anyone involved in the sale, consumption, or transportation of narcotic substances, asserting that the police will adopt a zero-tolerance approach toward drug offences. The meeting was also attended by Excise Superintendent Srinivasa Rao and other officials from various departments.

Galgotias Thrown Out For Chinese ‘Robodog’ Row

Greater Noida-based Galgotias University was asked to vacate its stall at the AI Expo on Wednesday after allegedly showcasing a Chinese-made robot as its own innovation, government sources said. The action followed controversy over the display of a robotic dog identified on social media as the Unitree Go2, manufactured by China’s Unitree Robotics and priced at about \$2,800. Users claimed the machine was not an in-house development of the university. IT secretary S. Krishnan said the government would not permit

exhibitors to present items that were not their own creations. “We do not want such exhibits to continue,” he said, adding that misrepresentation of exhibits as original innovations would not be tolerated. Sources said the organisers directed the university to vacate the exhibition space after the controversy escalated. By Wednesday, the university’s stall reportedly had no display. The issue gained traction after Union IT minister Ashwini Vaishnaw shared a video clip of the robotic display on his official social media account. The post was later deleted. In a statement, the university said the robotic



programming exercise was aimed at imparting hands-on AI skills using globally available tools and platforms. “Our faculty and students are deeply distressed by the propaganda campaign against the institution. Our focus remains firmly on student learning and innovation, ensuring access to modern

technologies that provide practical exposure and prepare them for the future. Spreading negativity undermines the morale of students who are striving to innovate, learn and build their skills using global technologies,” it said. Professor Neha Singh of the university said there was no claim that the robot had been

manufactured in-house. “Regarding the robot dog, we have never claimed that it was manufactured by us. It was introduced to students as a learning tool to inspire them to design and build more advanced innovations on their own. Our university remains committed to nurturing future leaders by providing access to cutting-edge technologies in artificial intelligence and will continue to do so,” she said. On reports that the government had asked the university to vacate the expo area, she said she had no information about it. “What I know is that today we are all present here,” she said.

West Begnal Govt Show Cause Notice to Kabir’s Wife For Wetland Grab

Suspended Trinamul Congress MLA of Bharatpur in Murshidabad of West Bengal Humayun Kabir’s wife Meera Sultana was served a show cause notice by the district land and land reforms department on Thursday for allegedly grabbing a wetland under the state government. According to sources, Ms Sultana came under the scanner after she illegally filled the water body of two acres by force, converted it into a land and built a house there. Her property is located at Manikyahar Mouja at Beldanga Block II



in Rejinagar. The district land and land reforms department became active after getting a mass petition from the locals. It has sought Ms Sultana’s explanation in the show cause notice within seven days, otherwise, her property would be attached. Mr Kabir, who has floated a new outfit, Janata Unnyan Party, and started building a Babri Masjid-styled mosque at Beldanga in

the district, to contest the upcoming Assembly Election, however challenged the notice verbally. He called it a revenge by the ruling party for failing to fight him politically. The step on his wife came days after the district police attached properties worth around ₹10.73 crores belonging to the in-laws of their daughter, Nazma Sultana, in a drug smuggling case.

Epstein Files Allegations May Amount to Crimes Against Humanity: UN Experts

Millions of files linked to Jeffrey Epstein point to what independent specialists appointed by the United Nations Human Rights Council describe as a possible “global criminal enterprise” involving acts that may legally qualify as crimes against humanity. In a strongly worded statement, the panel said the material released by the U.S. Justice Department depicts offenses committed within a wider environment marked by supremacist ideology, racism, corruption, and entrenched misogyny. According to the experts, the evidence illustrates a disturbing pattern of exploitation in which women and girls were treated as commodities, stripped of dignity, and subjected to systemic abuse. They emphasized that the scale, organized



nature, and international reach of the alleged crimes are so severe that several incidents “may reasonably meet the legal threshold of crimes against humanity,” a classification reserved for the most serious violations under international law. The panel called for a comprehensive, independent, and impartial investigation to determine the full extent of wrongdoing and accountability. It also urged authorities to examine how such conduct could continue for years without meaningful intervention, raising questions about institutional fail-

lures, oversight gaps, and potential complicity. So far, more than 1,200 victims have been identified in the records made public. The disclosure followed legislation passed with bipartisan backing by the United States Congress in November mandating the release of all documents connected to Epstein. However, the experts voiced concern about what they described as “serious compliance failures and botched redactions” in the released files, warning that errors in handling sensitive information exposed personal details of survivors

and risked causing further harm. They added that incomplete transparency and limited investigative scope have intensified frustration among survivors, some of whom say they feel retraumatized and subjected to what they call “institutional gaslighting.” Such reactions, the panel noted, highlight the importance of victim-centered approaches, confidentiality safeguards, and credible accountability mechanisms. The Justice Department did not immediately respond to requests for comment regarding the experts’ findings or recommendations. Documents made public so far reveal Epstein’s extensive associations with influential figures across politics, finance, academia, and business, both before and after his 2008 guilty plea to prostitution-related charges involving an underage girl.

SC Adjourns ED Plea Alleging Obstruction By Mamata Govt

The Supreme Court of India on Tuesday adjourned the hearing on a petition filed by the Enforcement Directorate (ED) alleging obstruction by the West Bengal government, including Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee, during searches conducted at the office of the political consultancy firm I-PAC and the residence of its director, Pratik Jain. The bench, comprising Justices Prashant Kumar Mishra and K.V. Viswanathan, deferred the matter to March 18 after Solicitor General Tushar Mehta informed the court that a rejoinder would be filed on the issue. The petition by the ED relates to its ongoing investigation into a money laundering case



linked to alleged coal pilferage in the state. The agency has alleged that during searches conducted on January 8, key evidence—including documents and electronic devices—was removed by officials connected to the West Bengal government, including the Chief Minister herself, thereby obstructing the investigation and intimidating officers involved in the probe. The Supreme Court had, on January 15, described the alleged obstruction as

“very serious” and indicated that it would examine whether a state’s law enforcement authorities have the legal right to interfere with investigations conducted by a central agency into serious offences. At that time, the court had also stayed the FIRs lodged against ED officials who carried out the searches at I-PAC’s premises and directed the West Bengal police to preserve all CCTV footage recorded during the raids. In response to the ED’s petition, the Supreme Court issued notices to the Chief Minister, the West Bengal government, Director General of Police Rajeev Kumar, and other senior police officers. The ED has sought a Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) probe into the al-

leged obstruction, arguing that the actions of state officials disrupted its inquiry into the multi-crore coal pilferage scam. The case highlights the ongoing tension between central investigative agencies and state governments, raising important questions about the scope of state authority in interfering with central probes, especially in cases involving large-scale financial irregularities and corruption. The Supreme Court’s next hearing, now scheduled for March 18, is expected to consider the rejoinder and further submissions from all parties involved, which could determine the future course of the investigation and potential accountability of senior state officials.

Congress Targets Centre Over Adani, Renews Demand for JPC Probe

The Congress on Wednesday intensified its attack on the Centre over the Adani Group, alleging use of benami funds to build large shareholdings in the conglomerate and reiterating its demand for a Joint Parliamentary Committee (JPC) probe. Congress general secretary (communications) Jairam Ramesh, citing a report by the Organised Crime and Corruption Reporting Project (OCCRP), alleged that close associates of the group, Chang Chung-Ling and Nasser Ali Shaban Ahli, used benami structures to acquire substantial stakes in Adani Group companies. He claimed the two allegedly held nearly \$3 billion worth of Adani shares through hedge



funds until 2023, and said the findings were backed by documentary evidence, including alleged admissions to a Swiss bank. Ramesh further alleged that the Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI) has made little progress in probing 22 of the 24 matters linked to the group. These, he said, include allegations of insider trading, violations of minimum public shareholding norms, 13 “suspicious transactions” flagged before the Supreme Court in August 2023, and alleged laundering of ₹20,000 crore through shell companies.

He said an investigation directed by the Supreme Court in March 2023 to be completed within two months remains pending. Recalling remarks made by Prime Minister Narendra Modi at the 2014 G20 Summit in Brisbane on eliminating safe havens for economic offenders, Ramesh accused him of shielding the conglomerate and blocking a JPC inquiry into what the party termed the “Adani mega scam”. The Congress also alleged misuse of central agencies, biased privatisation, questionable overseas contracts, over-invoicing of coal imports and an alleged solar power bribery case under investigation by US authorities. The Adani Group has repeatedly denied the allegations and earlier rejected the OCCRP re-

Hyderabad Will.....

In Hyderabad, he said, axes on electric vehicles have been removed, resulting in higher adoption. Discussions are under way with EV firms for manufacturing investments. Over 2 lakh auto rickshaws are being retrofitted towards green alternatives, more than 3,500 RTC buses are being replaced with electric buses, and the Hyderabad Metro is being expanded from 71 km to over 200 km, he added. Revanth Reddy said every unit of power that turns green benefits the state, the country and the planet, and underlined the need for manufacturing growth powered by green energy. Outlining Telangana’s long-term development vision, the Chief Minister linked economic growth with environmental sustainability. He said understanding 2047 required beginning with 1947, and noted that between 1950 and 1990 India prioritised education and irrigation, building educational institutions from village schools to premier institutes and constructing major dams for power and irrigation. By 1990, he said, India had achieved food sufficiency, improved life expectancy, and gained global

recognition for its professionals. Referring to the period from 1991 to 2020, he said the focus shifted to liberalisation, privatisation and globalisation, with India emerging as a services-driven economy led by telecom and software. He said that although the period delivered significant success, the manufacturing opportunity was missed, and added that the approach had changed particularly after Covid-19.

Modi Holds 7.....

With Tobgay, Modi discussed co-operation in AI and digital technologies and reaffirmed India’s support for Bhutan’s development priorities. In meetings with Karis and Orpo, discussions centred on technology partnerships, trade expansion, quantum and 6G collaboration, renewable energy and skilling. With its comfortable majority in the Legislative Assembly, the ruling Congress is expected to bag both the seats. Official sources said that 41 votes are required to win each Rajya Sabha seat. The Congress currently has a strength of 66 MLAs in the Assembly, besides the support of one MLA from its alliance partner CPI. In contrast, the BRS has 37 MLAs, the BJP has 8 and the AIMIM has 7. Except the Congress, no other party has the required 41 votes to secure a seat on its own. Sources in the Congress indicated that the party high command is likely to renominate Abhishek Manu Singhvi for another term. There are, however, several aspirants for the remaining seat. Senior leaders who could not secure MLA or MP tickets in the 2023 Assembly elections and the 2024 Lok Sabha polls, as well as those who contested but failed to win, are said to be in the race for a Rajya Sabha berth. Singhvi, a senior Congress leader and noted Supreme Court advocate, was elected unopposed to the Rajya Sabha from Telangana on August 27, 2024, in a by-poll. He secured only a 19-month

tenure as he was elected to fill the vacancy caused by the resignation of former BRS MP K. Keshava Rao.

AI Summit: Microsoft Says it is on Pace To Invest \$50 Billion in 'Global South' AI Push

Technology leader Microsoft on Wednesday announced that it is on pace to invest \$50 billion by the end of the decade to help bring AI to countries across the Global South. The announcement was made at the AI summit in New Delhi, where top executives from global AI giants meet several world leaders this week. However, the company warned that AI adoption in the Global North is roughly twice that of the Global South and the gap is widening. “An urgent action is needed to prevent a growing AI divide from deepening global



economic disparities,” said the tech giant’s vice chair and president Brad Smith and vice president and chief responsible AI officer Natasha Cramp-ton. While announcing the plan at the India AI Impact Summit, they said in a blog that the summit rightly has placed this challenge at the center of its agenda. “For more than a century, unequal access to electricity exacerbated a growing eco-

the decade to help bring AI to countries across the Global South,” they wrote. The \$50 billion pledge will be deployed through a five-part programme focused on infrastructure, skilling, multilingual AI development, local innovation and measurement of AI adoption. “The company invested more than \$8 billion in data centre infrastructure serving the Global South in its last fiscal year, including in India, Mexico and countries across Africa, South America, Southeast Asia and the Middle East,” Microsoft said. The company is also pursuing a goal to extend internet access to 250

million people in under-served communities, including 100 million in Africa. It said 117 million people across Africa have already been reached through partnerships, and it is nearing its global target. The company also said that it is balancing digital sovereignty needs with commitments to cybersecurity, privacy and resilience, while supporting cross-border investment flows. “We invested more than \$2 billion last fiscal year in cloud, AI and digital skilling programmes across the Global South, including grants, technology donations and discounted products,” the company said.

New PAN Quoting Rules For These 5 Transactions Proposed in IT

Last week, the government released the draft Income Tax Rules 2026 proposing to significantly raise the transaction limits for quoting of PAN for cash deposits/withdrawal in banks, purchase of motor vehicles and property, payment of hotel bills and insurance premium. The following five key PAN-related changes could bring significant relief to common taxpayers and small businesses that handle cash deposits and withdrawals. Cash deposits at bank or post office—Under the proposed regulation, PAN will be required if total cash deposits or withdrawals from one or more accounts in a financial year exceed Rs 10 lakh. Currently, cash deposits over Rs 50,000 in a single transaction require PAN



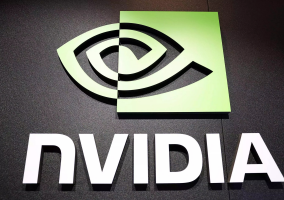
disclosure. Sale/purchase of motor vehicle—In the case of motor vehicles (including motorcycles), the PAN requirement will be a must if the price exceeds Rs 5 lakh (excluding tractors). Under the existing Income Tax Rules, 1962, quoting of PAN is mandatory for sale and purchase of all vehicles except two wheelers. Cash payment to hotel/restaurant—The draft norms have proposed to increase the threshold for quoting PAN if the payment to hotels/restaurant bills exceeds Rs one lakh from the existing limit of Rs 50,000. Life Insurance

premium—The proposed norms shift from payment based threshold to relationship based reporting. PAN will be mandatory for starting an account-based relationship with an insurance company. Under the old norms, payments aggregating to more than ₹50,000 in a financial year as life insurance premiums require a PAN. Immovable property transaction—For immovable property including sale, purchase, gift, or joint development agreements, the limit will increase from ₹10 lakh to ₹20 lakh, allowing smaller real estate deals to proceed with less documentation. These draft rules are open for public feedback until February 22, 2026, on the Income Tax portal. After this feedback, the CBDT is expected to notify the norms.

Nvidia To Sell Meta Millions of Chips in Multiyear Deal

Nvidia has secured a major multiyear agreement to supply millions of artificial intelligence chips to Meta Platforms, underscoring its dominance in the fast-growing AI hardware market and signaling continued confidence from one of its largest customers. The deal, announced Tuesday by Nvidia, covers both existing and next-generation processors, including its current Blackwell AI chips and forthcoming Rubin models. It also includes deployments of the company’s Grace and Vera central processing units, which are designed to rival offerings from Intel and Advanced Micro Devices. While financial details were not disclosed, analysts say the scale suggests a substantial long-term commitment tied to expanding data-center infrastructure. The agree-



ment highlights Nvidia’s push to expand beyond graphics and AI accelerators into the broader CPU market. Its Grace and Vera processors—built using technology from Arm Holdings—were first introduced in 2023 as companion chips for AI workloads. The latest announcement indicates the company now intends to position them as standalone solutions for high-intensity backend computing, such as database management and large-scale AI agent operations. Industry analysts note the timing is significant because Meta has been developing its own custom AI chips and has also explored potential collaborations with Google for access to Ten-

sor Processing Units. By locking in a new supply agreement, Nvidia appears to have reinforced its role as a primary infrastructure provider even as its customer diversifies suppliers. Technology analyst Patrick Moorhead said the public announcement likely serves a strategic purpose: demonstrating that Nvidia has retained one of its biggest buyers while also proving its CPUs are gaining traction. Though Nvidia does not break out revenue from individual clients, market observers widely believe Meta is among a small group of customers responsible for more than half of the company’s quarterly revenue. Early testing results for Nvidia’s Vera processors at Meta have reportedly been promising, suggesting the partnership could deepen as demand for AI computing power accelerates worldwide.

MobiKwik turns PAT profitable in Q3 FY26

After 90 days in jail, iBomma Ravi released on conditional bail

After spending nearly 90 days in jail, Immadi Ravi, the main accused behind the iBomma piracy racket, was released from the Chanchalguda Jail on Wednesday evening, February 18. The previous day, he was granted conditional bail by the Telangana High Court, which directed him to submit his passport to the police. He cannot leave the country without the court's permission.

Ravi is also required to appear before the CCS (Central Crime Station) police every day at 11 am and refrain from engaging in social media platforms under any circumstances. Ravi was arrested by the CCS police on November 14 last year after he landed in Hyderabad from France. He is accused of causing losses worth thousands of crores to the Telugu film industry by running a network of 65 mirror websites. He was also found diverting lakhs of users from these piracy portals to illegal online betting platforms such as 1win and 1xbet.

Investigation revealed that he had data of 50 lakh subscribers and about 21,000 movies on his hard disks. His operations earned him approximately Rs 20 crore, which he used to purchase plots and flats and maintained a balance of Rs 3.5 crore in his bank account, which has now been frozen by the police.

Ravi created the iBomma piracy website in 2019, using his background in web hosting and development. During the COVID-19 lockdown, the platform exploded in popularity by offering newly released films in HD for free, drawing nearly 5 million users per month.

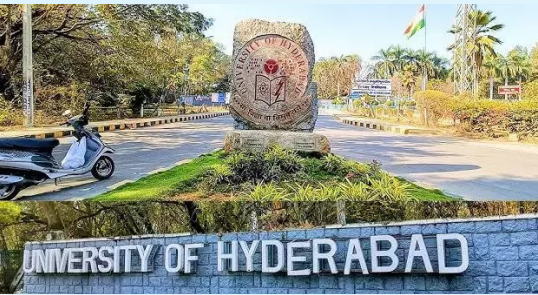
MIM MLC Alleges 'Protocol Breach' During Azhar Event

Tension prevailed at an event organised by the Telangana Minority Finance Corporation (TMFC) after AIMIM MLC Mirza Rahmath Baig objected to the presence of Siasat news editor and former MLC Amer Ali Khan on the dais, citing protocol concerns.

The programme, attended by several dignitaries, witnessed brief disruption when Baig said he would not share the stage with a person who does not currently hold a government position. He stated that if Amer Ali Khan was attending in his capacity as a media representative, he should be seated in the designated media enclosure.

The objection led to discussion at the venue over protocol and the presence of representatives from different political parties on the same stage. TMFC chairman Obedulla Kotwal intervened and persuaded the MLC to take his seat. Following the intervention, both Baig and Khan remained on the dais and the event proceeded.

Students flag Priorities In UoH Spending



An RTI reply has detailed how Institution of Eminence (IoE) funds were received and spent at the University of Hyderabad (UoH), drawing criticism from the Students' Federation of India (SFI) over spending priorities. According to the IoE directorate, UoH received allocations between 2019-20 and 2025-26, including ₹22 crore in 2019-20, ₹52.80 crore in 2020-21, ₹57.79 crore in 2021-22, ₹43.29 crore in 2022-23, ₹54.57 crore in 2023-24, and ₹70 crore in 2025-26.

The RTI revealed that over ₹330 crore has gone into IoE buildings, ₹59.07 crore into equipment, ₹11.83 crore into library resources, and ₹102.74 crore into other capital expenditure. Project-wise, ₹116 crore was spent on the Interdisciplinary Research Centre, ₹22.76 crore on a guest house, and ₹50.76 crore on lecture hall complex-IV (80 per cent complete). Two hostels for 400 students each cost ₹35.79 crore apiece, while the administration building cost ₹55.93 crore, with most of the amount already spent.

On academic support, the RTI lists ₹68 crore for research calls, ₹8.56 crore for conferences and workshops, ₹4.4 crore for travel grants, and ₹3.38 crore for publication incentives. SFI alleged that while infrastructure spending is high, direct student support remains limited.

Ramzan Arrives: Prayers, Charity and Festive Buzz

Ramzan begins after crescent sighting in hyderabad first time in february after 33 years

The holy month of Ramzan commenced on Thursday after moon-sighting committees in Telangana and Andhra Pradesh confirmed the crescent was visible Wednesday night, marking the start of fasting across the Telugu states and much of India. In Hyderabad, mosques immediately began special nightly Taraweeh prayers as thousands of worshippers gathered.

This year's observance is notable because it begins in February for the first time in over three decades. The last such occurrence was in 1993. Because the Islamic lunar calendar is about 11 days shorter than the solar calendar, Ramzan shifts earlier each year and cycles through seasons roughly every 33 years. As a result, fasting durations this year are among the shortest in decades, ranging in the city from about 12 hours and 40 minutes at the start to roughly 13

hours and 21 minutes later in March. Authorities and community groups have made extensive arrangements to support devotees. Several charitable organisations are providing free pre-dawn Sahar meals to students, especially girls living in hostels, while some services offer paid doorstep delivery. Select railway stations will also supply Sahar meals to passengers who pre-book.

In addition, a few hotels in the old city are serving complimentary meals to the poor. Markets witnessed heavy crowds late Wednesday night, particularly around the historic Charminar, where streets were illuminated and decorated. The state government has allowed shops to remain open until 5 a.m. throughout the month to accommodate festive shopping and night-time activity.

Mosque committees are also using the gatherings to raise awareness about the upcoming voter list revision scheduled for March-April, helping citizens verify their names and documents. Officials meanwhile cautioned the public to beware of fraudulent charity links, urging donors to verify organisations before making Zakat or other contributions online.

Shops in Telangana allowed to operate till 5 am for Ramzan

The Telangana Labour Commissioner M Dana Kishore on Tuesday, February 17, issued an order allowing shops and establishments in Telangana to operate beyond their regular hours till 5 am for the month of Ramzan.

As per the order, all shops and establishments have been exempt from provisions of Section 7 (1), 12 (1) and 31 (1) of the Telangana Shops and Establishment Act 1988 from February 19 and March 20. That means



shops can remain open till 5 am, or Sehri time, during the holy month. Section 7(1) stipulates that no shop shall open earlier or close later than the hours fixed by the government, while the other two sections deal with employees' holidays and working hours.

However, these exemptions are subject to certain conditions. The Commissioner has directed that employees must be paid overtime wages at twice their ordinary rate and that employees who work on holidays must be given a compensatory holiday. Employees are also not allowed to work for more than 13 hours on any day, including Sunday. Meanwhile, female employees are exempt from the extra hours of work and no female employee is allowed to work after 8:30 pm.

Telangana BJP seeks equal festival benefits after Ramzan relaxations

Criticising the Congress government in Telangana over its order allowing Muslim employees to leave offices early during Ramzan, the BJP on Wednesday, February 18, said similar courtesies should be extended to the Hindu community.

Selective concessions risk creating a perception of discrimination, Telangana BJP Chief Spokesperson N V Subhash said. He cited instances where Hindu employees observing the 41-day 'Ayyappa Deeksha' vow were discouraged from attending work in traditional black attire.

Restrictions are also frequently imposed on Hindu festivals, particularly during Ganesh Chaturthi and Deepavali, including limitations on firecrackers, he added. "While no one objects to

facilitating religious observances, the Congress government must ensure equal treatment for all communities," Subhash said.

He emphasised that "true secularism lies in equal respect and facilitation for all faiths." The Revanth Reddy government should adopt a uniform policy framework that ensures parity in extending religious concessions, he added. "If considerations are shown during Ramzan, they must also be extended during major Hindu observances. Equality before law and governance cannot be compromised," he added. Referring to Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy's comments two months ago that "Congress means Muslims and Muslims mean Congress," Subhash said government actions must align with Constitutional secularism.

Minority Welfare Schemes Launched, Assets Distributed in Hyderabad
