With municipal elections entering a decisive phase, campaign spending has emerged as a key issue in the erstwhile Karimnagar and Warangal districts, shifting focus from political ideology to the financial capacity of candidates. Senior party leaders are reportedly holding negotiations with dummy candidates to persuade them to withdraw and prevent vote splitting, even as official candidates intensify door-to-door campaigns.

RSS Chief Mohan Bhagwat Urges People To Detect, Report Infiltrators To Police

Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh chief Mohan Bhagwat on Sunday urged people to "detect and report" the "illegal infiltrators" to the police. He also urged people not to give them any employment and to be more "vigilant." Speaking at the Two-Day Lecture Series On '100 Years Of Sangh Journey - New Horizons' in Mumbai, Bhagwat highlighted that the Special Intensive Revision (SIR) exercise has already revealed the "foreigners" living in the country. We will not give employment to any foreigner. If someone is from our country, we will give them employment, but not to foreigners. You should be a little more vigilant and aware," he added. Emphasising the inclusivity of the Sangh, he said that anyone can become 'Sarsanghchalak' (RSS chief), including the SC and STs, as the decision is solely dependent on the work that any individual put for the organisation. "Kshatriya, Vaishya, Shudra or Brahmin does not qualify for the Sarsanghchalak

Major agreements include cooperation in semiconductors, cross-border digital payments, social security for Indian workers in Malaysia, and promotion of local currency trade using the Indian Rupee and Malaysian Ringgit. Both sides also strengthened collaboration in defence, maritime security, trade

Malaysia also announced the opening of an Indian consulate in Kota Kinabalu, a Thiruvalluvar Centre at Universiti Malaya, and Thiruvalluvar Scholarships for Malaysian nationals.

The two leaders strongly condemned terrorism in all forms, including cross-border terrorism, and reaffirmed commitment to freedom of navigation, peaceful dispute resolution

tion and stability in the Indo-Pacific region. They also called for an early review of the ASEAN-India Trade in Goods Agreement to make it more trade-facilitative.

Prime Minister Modi highlighted India as a key investment destination for Malaysian firms, while Anwar Ibrahim welcomed the role of Indian manufacturing and technology companies in Malaysia. Both leaders stressed deeper cooperation in semiconductors, digital economy and advanced manufacturing.

Modi described Malaysia as the destination of his first overseas visit of 2026 and underlined strong historical and cultural ties, while Anwar Ibrahim called India and Malaysia "true friends" and praised India's global rise.

Red Carpet for Surrendered Maoists: Amith Shah

Union Home Minister Amit Shah on Sunday reiterated the Centre's appeal to Maoists to surrender, promising a "red carpet welcome" for those who lay down arms and declaring that the Maoist menace will be eradicated by March 31. Addressing the 'National Conclave on Chhattisgarh @25, Shifting the Lens', Shah said the government does not want to kill anyone, but it has the responsibility to protect the people. Maoists who surrender will be accorded a red carpet welcome," Shah said, urging insurgents to abandon violence and rejoin the mainstream. He cautioned citizens against the Naxal ideology, which, he said, believes in resolving issues through guns rather than dialogue and democracy.

Shah rejected the view that Maoism is rooted in lack of

The trade deal with the US will "ultimately help our farmers", who are already exporting USD 50-55 billion worth of agricultural and fish products, he said. KTR Calls FSL Fire a Conspiracy to Destroy Evidence

KTR suspects conspiracy to destroy Cash-for-Vote case evidence in FSL fire, demands judicial probe

Raising serious doubts over the fire at Telangana State Forensic Science Laboratory (FSL) in Nampally, BRS working president K.T. Rama Rao alleged it was a deliberate attempt to destroy crucial evidence in the 11-year-old Cash-for-Vote case, in which Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy is an accused. He called for immediate central intervention and a judicial probe by a retired judge. Rama Rao questioned how a high-security fo-

party delegation and forensic experts to assess the damage, and public disclosure of all facts by the police. He urged the Union government to launch an impartial investigation to determine whether the fire was accidental or orchestrated.

"Telangana's people see this as a conspiracy. Only a transparent judicial probe can uncover the truth," he asserted, emphasizing the need to safeguard the criminal justice system and maintain public trust.

Harish Rao Slams Congress, Urges Support for BRS in Sadashivapet

Former Minister T. Harish Rao on Sunday launched a sharp critique of Congress leader T. Jagga Reddy, claiming he was never accessible to the common people. In contrast, he said Sangareddy MLA and BRS district president Chintha Prabhakar welcomed everyone at his residence. Addressing a municipal election campaign meeting in Sadashivapet municipality, Harish Rao asked the crowd how many of them knew the location of Jagga Reddy's residence, emphasizing that ordinary citizens could not approach the Congress leader for help. Harish Rao alleged that



the Congress had lost public trust within just two years of its rule. He also accused Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy of trying to lure voters with cash bags. Alleges ₹100-Crore Congress-AIMIM Deal to Defeat BJP

Political temperatures soared in Karimnagar ahead of the municipal elections as Union Minister of State for Home Affairs Bandi Sanjay Kumar made sensational allegations against the Congress and AIMIM parties, accusing them of entering into a ₹100-crore deal to defeat the BJP in the Karimnagar Municipal Corporation polls.

Addressing a massive 'Vijaya Sankalpa Rally' organised by the BJP on Wednesday evening, Bandi Sanjay said a "political kabaddi game" had begun in Karimnagar. He alleged that while the BJP was playing on behalf of "India", the Congress and AIMIM had joined hands and were playing on behalf of "Pakistan", drawing sharp political reactions. Bandi Sanjay claimed that surveys had clearly indicated a landslide victory for the BJP with nearly 50 seats in the

Senior party leaders are reportedly holding negotiations with dummy candidates to persuade them to withdraw and prevent vote splitting, even as official candidates intensify door-to-door campaigns.

To manage the large crowd, Bowenpally and Alwal police departments arranged tight security, ensuring the procession passed peacefully. The event concluded with enthusiastic participation from Muslim minority leaders and local youth, reflecting strong community spirit and shared harmony.

Sources said major parties prioritised the financial strength of aspirants while finalising ticket allotments, assessing their ability to sustain expensive campaigns. Local observers noted that even party workers now expect monetary support to actively engage in electioneering. The scale of expenditure for councillor posts is reported to be high. In the 13 municipalities of Karimnagar and 12 in Warangal, candidates are said to be preparing to spend between Rs 30 lakh and Rs 40 lakh each, far exceeding prescribed limits. Spending in larger municipal corporations is expected to be higher. The Election Commission's (EC) expenditure caps are widely viewed by candidates as procedural rather than restrictive.

To track expenses, the EC has issued a detailed price list for campaign materials. Under this, silk scarves are priced at Rs 50, cotton scarves at Rs 10, VIP scarves at Rs 75 and shawls at Rs 150. Party-symbol T-shirts are valued at Rs 110 and saris at Rs 150. Bulk SMS charges are fixed at 10 paise per second for BSNL users and 11 paise for other networks. Food expenses are also monitored through fixed rates. A biryani plate is capped at Rs 150, while vegetarian and chicken meals are priced at Rs 120 each and mutton meals at Rs 130. Campaign autorickshaw hire is officially set at Rs 1,500 per day, a rate candidates claim is unrealistic. Cultural campaign activities are similarly regulated, with payments to Dappu artists, Bathukamma groups and other folk performers fixed at Rs 500 per person. As campaigning enters the final phase, the gap between official rates and actual market costs remains a major point of discussion, underscoring the increasing role of money in municipal elections.

Ramchander Rao Urges Voters To Reject BRS, Congress

Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) Telangana State president N. Vote After Recalling Welfare Benefits of Last Two Years: Komatireddy



Roads and buildings minister Komatireddy Venkatesh on Sunday urged people to recall the welfare benefits they had received over the last two years before casting their votes in the upcoming municipal elections and support Congress candidates. Material objects in Note for Vote, phone tapping cases are safe: Telangana FSL

Telangana Forensic Lab confirms all evidence from high-profile cases, including Note for Vote and phone tapping, is safe despite a recent fire at its premises.

With questions being raised in different circles about the safety of material objects pertaining to several high profile cases including the 'Note for Vote' scam allegedly involving Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy, the Telangana Forensic Science Laboratory on Sunday clarified that the material objects pertaining to the cases are safe.

Shikha Goel, Director Forensic Science Laboratory (FSL) Telangana on Sunday said that in the 'Note for Vote' case, the FSL in the year 2015 received 16 material objects from the ACB. "All the material objects and reports were



returned to the court in 2021 itself. No material was stored in the FSL," she clarified. In the 'phone tapping case', the official said from 2024 to January 2026, a total of 136 material objects were received at the FSL. "Except seven, the remaining material objects were submitted to the forwarding authority. The remaining

seven items available in the FSL have been retrieved safely and are kept under security and proper guard," she said.

When asked about the quantum of damage due to the fire, the Director FSL said that the process of retrieving data is under process. "We are hopeful of retrieving all the material from the computers. The FSL is capable of

doing it," she said. The official said that the fire started at 10.08 am, and the office boy Sai noticed the fire and alerted the official concerned. The fire tenders arrived and put off the fire by 1.30 pm. "The computer lab and its related rooms, conference hall and library were damaged due to fire. The remaining facilities in the laboratory are functioning as usual," said Shikha Goel.

A police case is registered at Nampally police station and the police will investigate it from all angles. "The police and fire department will give the exact cause of the fire after investigation," the official added.

Voters Must Teach a Lesson to Congress: Srinivas Goud

Former Minister Srinivas Goud said the Congress government has failed the people and must be taught a lesson in the coming election. Campaigning in Christian Palli, Pathapalamuru, Shivasakti Nagar, Bhagiratha Colony, Veeranapet, Premnagar, and other areas of Mahabubnagar, he accused the ruling party of betraying public trust.

Goud said leaders who



once demolished the houses of the poor and the blind are now seeking votes. He recalled how BRS leaders stood with people when houses were razed at midnight and fought on their behalf. Gandhi Hospital Opens Pre-eclampsia Clinic



Pre-eclampsia, a pregnancy complication, can raise long-term risks of heart and kidney disease, doctors warned as Gandhi General Hospital launched a multidisciplinary clinic at its Mother and Child Health building. The facility brings together obstetrics, cardiology, nephrology and internal medicine specialists for comprehensive care. Doctors listed symptoms such as high blood pressure, severe headache, swelling, foamy urine, blurred vision, stomach pain, sudden weight gain and shortness of breath. They cautioned that untreated cases could lead to miscarriage, low birth weight and lasting health problems.

Dr Shobha, head of the gynaecology department, said: "High blood pressure and protein in urine are key warning signs. Early detection during the antenatal stage is crucial." She added that severe cases may cause cardiac and renal failure or HELLP syndrome, sometimes requiring termination of pregnancy to save the mother.

The prime minister said India is committed to development, peace and stability across the entire Indo-Pacific region together with ASEAN (Association of Southeast Asian Nations). Malaysian Prime Minister Ibrahim said India and Malaysia continue to expand collaboration in trade, investment, connectivity and defence. India has registered a spectacular rise in global trade and economic front, he said.

India's Russian Oil Buy To Dwindle, Some Irreplaceable Imports To Continue For Now

India is likely to begin scaling back its crude oil purchases from Russia under an agreement reached with the United States in exchange for lower trade tariffs, sources said, adding that these imports will continue for now, as refiners like Nayara Energy have limited alternatives. US President Donald Trump on Friday signed an executive order rescinding a punitive 25 per cent duty on all imports from India, saying the move followed New Delhi's commitment to stop imports of Russian oil.

While Indian refiners, which process crude oil into fuels such as petrol and diesel, have not received any formal directive to halt Russian purchases, they have been informally advised to begin scaling back buys from Moscow, three sources with knowledge of the matter said. Most



refiners will continue to honour purchase commitments made before the announcement - orders typically placed six to eight weeks in advance - but will not place new orders thereafter, they said. Hindustan Petroleum Corporation Ltd (HPCL), Mangalore Refinery and Petrochemicals Ltd (MRPL) and HPCL-Mittal Energy Ltd (HTEL) had stopped buying oil from Russia soon after the US last year slapped sanctions on Moscow's key exporters, while others like Indian Oil Corporation (IOC) and Bharat Petroleum Corporation Ltd (BPCL) will wind down their purchases, sources said. Reliance Industries

Sources said India's oil

imports from Russia have been on the decline since the US sanctions on Rosneft and Lukoil came into effect. In December 2025, they averaged 1.2 million barrels per day, down from a peak of USD 2.1 million barrels per day in May 2023. In January, they further came down to USD 1.1 million barrels, and the expectation was that they may decline to less than USD 1 million this month or the next. With the new understanding with the US, the imports may halve soon. India meets about 90 per cent of its crude oil needs through imports, and purchases of discounted Russian oil - sold at lower prices after Western countries imposed sanctions on Moscow over its invasion of Ukraine in February 2022 - have helped reduce its import costs. Nayara, sources said, is likely to continue purchases of Russian oil from non-sanctioned entities in the near future.

Kota Building Collapse: Death Toll Rises to Two as Several Injured

The death toll in the building collapse in Kota has risen to two, while at least 13 people were reported injured, officials said. Kota Divisional Commissioner Anil Kumar Agrawal stated that the incident occurred at a site where new construction was underway, and the structure collapsed from top to bottom. "Two deaths have been reported. We have information on 13 injured. Our information is that some new construction was underway and collapsed from top to bottom. It could be due to negligence related to the quality of construction. Some local residents report that drilling was underway and that there were complaints about it. Further technical investigations into the causes will be conducted, and the results will be shared," he told reporters. Meanwhile, Lok Sabha Speaker and Kota MP Om



Birla expressed grief over the incident in the Indravihar area of the city. He said he was in constant contact with the district administration and had directed officials, including the District Collector, to expedite relief and rescue operations. Birla also instructed authorities to ensure timely and proper medical treatment for the injured and extended his prayers for their speedy recovery, expressing solidarity with the affected families. "The incident of the building collapse in Kota's Indravihar is extremely heartbreaking. I am in constant touch with the district administration. I have directed the concerned offi-

Bengal pledges 8,505 officers ahead of Sir hearing

The West Bengal government has informed the Election Commission that it is ready to provide 8,505 Group B officers of the state or its instrumentalities for the ongoing Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of electoral rolls, according to an agency report. The submission assumes significance as the poll panel had earlier told the Supreme Court that the state had made available only a limited number of officers for overseeing the exercise.

The development comes ahead of a scheduled hearing on Monday before a Supreme Court Bench comprising Chief Justice of India Justice Surya Kant, Justice Joymalya Bagchi and Justice N.V. Anjaria, which is set



to hear a batch of pleas related to the SIR process in West Bengal, including a petition filed by Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee. Sources were quoted as saying that the state government had conveyed to the Election Commission of India its willingness to deploy 8,505 Group B officers for the revision exercise.

During the February 4 hearing, senior advocate Rakesh Dwivedi, appearing for the poll panel, told the apex court that the state had provided only 80 Grade II officers, such as sub-divisional

magistrates, to supervise the SIR. He had also submitted that lower-ranked staff, including Anganwadi workers, were largely deployed for the exercise. Banerjee had disputed the allegation, stating that the state had provided all assistance sought by the Election Commission. She had urged the Supreme Court to intervene in the SIR process, alleging that West Bengal was being unfairly targeted and that voters were being inconvenienced.

The Supreme Court took note of the Chief Minister's petition and observed that genuine voters must remain on the electoral rolls. It issued notices to the poll panel and the Chief Electoral Officer of West Bengal, seeking their responses by February 9.

Raut Questions Salman Khan's Presence at RSS Centenary Event

Senior Shiv Sena leader Sanjay Raut has questioned actor Salman Khan's presence at Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh (RSS) event asking whether the invitation was more about coercion or conviction. Alleging that RSS was involved in spreading hatred and vindictiveness between Hindus and Muslims for some time, the Sena (UBT) leader demanded clarification from RSS chief Mohan Bhagwat. Was the actor invited to signal that Muslims are now welcome in the organisation, he asked. "What kind of a welcome was it for Salman Khan? Was he brought in as a very big Bollywood star to gather a crowd, or is there an



open invitation for Muslims in the Sangh from now on?" Mr. Raut said. Accusing the BJP of indulging in hate politics, Mr. Raut said, "(Prime Minister Narendra) Modi, (Maharashtra Chief Minister Devendra) Fadnavis, (Union Home Minister) Amit Shah and the other people who are doing hateful politics between Hindus and Muslims are all originally from the Sangh. So, my question is, was it (invitation) limited to Salman Khan only, to show people that he is a big artist and can also come on our platform... Currently, there is power... when the government is gone tomorrow, will all these people come on your dais again? This is a very funny question." Mr Raut's remarks came after Salman Khan attended Mr. Bhagwat's speech during the two-day New Horizons lecture series held to mark the RSS Centenary Year in Mumbai. The event saw the presence of over 900 eminent personalities, including Salman

Khan, Ranbir Kapoor, as well as prominent scientists, industrialists and artists. The Shiv Sena (UBT) leader also spoke about Maha Vikas Aghadi's preparations for upcoming Rajya Sabha and Vidhan Parishad elections. He urged party chief Uddhav Thackeray to re-enter the Vidhan Parishad, saying his presence in the legislature was essential for Maharashtra. "We have requested Uddhav Thackeray to return to the Vidhan Parishad. Having served as the Chief Minister, his presence in the legislature is essential for the state and the people. It is the collective wish of the Maha Vikas Aghadi (MVA) that he leads from the front," Mr. Raut stated.

trying to mislead the people, and there's still a lot of clarity required," he said. He added that both India and the US have sensitivities about a certain set of products, and both have safeguards for those. "We've safeguarded all of them," he said, adding that India has not granted any duty concessions in dairy products. GM (genetically modified) products, meat, poultry, soya meal and corn. But, there are some pulses and lentils, which India imports, and "we have given them some access, market access," he said. "Ultimately, it has to be a give and take. So, if I don't give anything, how will I open the market for my farmers in the US?" he said. On dry fruits, he said, India is importing about three and a half billion dollars of dry tree nuts, and of that, already a billion dollars comes from the US. Threat to blow up Vande Bharat rattles Sec'bad

Railway authorities have received a letter claiming to be from "ISIS-Jihadists," threatening to blow up the Vande Bharat Express at Secunderabad if a ransom of ₹2 crore was not paid. The letter, dated February 2 and addressed to the Secunderabad division general manager, warned that failure to meet the demand would result in a blast killing at least 350 passengers. Special

teams were formed to probe the threat. Investigators examined footage from over 450 CCTV cameras and found the letter had been posted from a Rangareddy post box. Bomb detection squads and sniffer dogs were deployed across railway stations. A senior railway police officer said the letter appears to be a hoax, mischievously posted, but added: "We are probing all aspects and will soon get the culprits."

51 Naxalites Surrender In Chhattisgarh

Union home minister Amit Shah arrived in Chhattisgarh on Saturday on a three-day visit to review the anti-Naxal strategy ahead of the March 31 deadline to end Maoism. Shah is scheduled to hold a high-level meeting of state and Central security officials late on Saturday night to assess counterinsurgency measures in view of the target date. Sources said the meeting would be attended by senior officials from security forces and intelligence agencies. On Sunday, the home minister is expected to

chair another high-level review meeting focusing on the security situation in Naxal-affected areas of Chhattisgarh, Telangana, Maharashtra and Odisha. The meeting will review the progress of anti-Naxal operations and intelligence inputs, sources said. "The meeting may prepare a strategy to end the remaining vestiges of Left Wing Extremism in the country," a senior police officer said. Shah is also scheduled to attend the closing ceremony of the three-day 'Bastar Pandum' festival at Jagdalpur, the headquarters of Bastar, on Monday before concluding his visit.

Teacher To Undergo Fresh Disability Test

A two-judge panel of the Telangana High Court directed a fresh medical examination of a postgraduate teacher appointed under the Persons with Disabilities (PWD) quota, after noting serious inconsistencies in the disability certificates produced in her case. The panel comprising Justice P. Sam Koshy and Justice Narsing Rao Nandikonda was dealing with a writ appeal filed by the Telangana Residential Educational

Institutions Recruitment Board (TREIRB), challenging an order of a single judge who set aside the cancellation of the petitioner's appointment. The dispute concerns the appointment of V. Srijan, selected as a post-graduate teacher (Biological Science) under the PWD (hearing impairment) category pursuant to a recruitment notification issued by TREIRB. It was pointed out that while she was initially issued a disability certificate in 2015 assessing her hearing impairment at 54 per cent, a

medical examination conducted during the recruitment process in May 2024 assessed her disability at 29 per cent, which fell below the 40 per cent threshold prescribed under the notification. On this basis, her appointment was cancelled on August 21, 2024. The writ petitioner contended that she was validly selected under the PWD quota based on a disability certificate and that the subsequent reduction in the percentage of disability was arbitrary and unjustified. She argued that hearing impairment

was a permanent condition and that minor variations in assessment should not defeat her statutory entitlement. Opposing the plea, TREIRB contended that the recruitment notification mandated a minimum 40 per cent disability at the stage of verification and appointment. It was argued that the medical assessment conducted during recruitment in May 2024, which reflected only 29 per cent disability, was decisive and binding and that selection under the PWD category was conditional.

Brother Held For Murder of Advocate Over Land

A day after advocate Gotike Swapna was murdered in her agricultural land at Kethireddyapally in Moinabad, police on Thursday arrested four persons including her brother G. Raju and his associates Errolla Sandeep, Vadde Veeresh and Kavali Shiva Lingam. The murder was said to be the fall-out over a property dispute. Swapna was murdered when she went to the farmland to get the land surveyed with the intention of selling a portion of it for her marriage expenses. Police said she had recently married a man she was in a relationship with through an Arya Samaj ceremony. To raise funds for a traditional marriage, she planned

to sell one acre out of the four acres of land said to be registered in her name. Chevella DCP Yogesh Gautham said she was accompanied by her mother Venkatamma, another advocate and a surveyor to the land in Survey No. 339. "Raju knocked down Swapna with his car. When she fell down, his associates attacked her," he alleged. Police said Swapna's father had married Mallamma, who had no children. He later married her younger sister Venkatamma, with whom he had four children: two sons and two daughters including Swapna and Raju. The eldest daughter was married in 2001, while one of the brothers later died in a road accident.

Plea claims GHMC inaction

Justice Lakshmi Narayan Alishetty of the Telangana High Court took on file a plea alleging inaction on the part of GHMC in preventing alleged illegal and unauthorised constructions by Meridian School at Madhapur, Serilingampally mandal. The judge was dealing with a writ petition filed by Umesh Lunker and another. According to the petition, the petitioners were owners of land in Survey No. 14/1, Madhapur, where Meridian School was allegedly carrying out construction

activities without obtaining a sanctioned building plan from the competent authorities. It was contended that the petitioners submitted a detailed representation requesting the authorities to restrain the school management from proceeding with further construction. Despite the lapse of several years, no action was taken. The petitioner contended that the unauthorised constructions had continued unchecked due to administrative apathy. Counsel appearing for the respondents contended that the school had not deviated from the permissions granted.

HC Says Renewal Of Passport Is Not Automatic


The Telangana High Court made it clear that passport renewal was not automatic and that the authorities were empowered to revoke a passport on the basis of intelligence inputs that the holder may, or was likely, to engage, outside India, in activities prejudicial to the sovereignty and integrity of the nation. Justice Nagesh Bheemappa of the High Court held that issuance or renewal of a passport was governed by statutory provisions under the Passports Act, 1967, and could not be claimed as a matter of right when national security concerns were involved. Saying so, the judge dismissed a petition filed by Akram Ali Mo-

hammed, who challenged the action of the Regional Passport Authority (RPA) in revoking his passport in 2019, though it was valid up to July 3, 2028. The petitioner said he was working as a journalist since 2005 and was now running his own Urdu news website. He alleged that the RPA had revoked his passport without prior notice or opportunity of hearing. The RPA justified the revocation on the basis of intelligence inputs received from the state intelligence department. According to the authorities, the petitioner was likely to engage in activities outside India prejudicial to the sovereignty and integrity of the nation. The city police commissioner filed a counter-affidavit, referring to the

petitioner's alleged involvement in a criminal case, connections with alleged anti-national elements, possession of arms and explosives, and activities said to have caused communal disharmony through media broadcasts. It was also stated that a personal surveillance file had been opened against the petitioner. It was stated that the petitioner had connection with ISI activists Mohammad Saleem Ju-naid and had concealed a pistol of 30 rounds and 1 kg of potassium chloride mixer at his cycle shop godown. The police submitted to the court that in 2018, an issue was raised between Sunni and Shia sects about a hate speech in Abubakar Masjid situated at Mirchowk, Hyderabad, and petitioner had broadcast

his views in favour of one community through his news channel. It was also stated that in 2019, an issue was raised in the Amberpet police limits with regard to Ek-Khana Mosque between GHMC and the Muslim community and petitioner had shot a video and made it viral "in order to corrupt the minds of a particular sect of people".

After considering the facts and technical lapses on the side of the petitioner in filing the petition against revocation of the passport, the court stated when the activities of a person were under surveillance by the police, the courts should be careful while considering the case, that too when it was seriously alleged that the petitioner's activities would affect.

RBI NEUTRAL AMID UNCERTAINTY

The Reserve Bank of India-led Monetary Policy Committee's decision to leave policy rate unchanged at 5.25 per cent came along the expected lines as it is prudent to retain fire-power for the crisis day. The Central bank expects GDP growth for 2025-26 to be at 7.4 per cent, driven by private consumption, fixed investment and the service sector. The revival of the manufacturing sector's growth is visible even as construction and services remain resilient.

The RBI forecasts retail inflation based on the Consumer Price Index at 2.1 per cent for financial year 2025-26, which is below its inflation mandate of four per cent (with plus or minus two percentage points). Though the Central

bank predicts a slight uptick in the inflation figure at around four per cent in the next fiscal, it will remain comfortable for the country. Though the economy is expected to benefit from the India-EU Free Trade Agreement and proposed India-US trade deal, the Central bank remains cautious about the growth outlook as it has kept its monetary stance neutral, primarily because of global uncertainty.

While macroeconomic actions remain muted in the monetary statement, the central bank has taken steps to increase production and employment in the country by doubling collateral-free MSME loans from Rs 10 lakh to Rs 20 lakh. This move will help micro enterprises. The RBI's proposal to allow banks to lend to real estate infrastructure trusts (REITs) is expected to give a fillip to commercial real estate and, as a result, lead to employment generation. Relaxation in norms for branch expansion for select NBFCs too will create jobs. The biggest highlight of the monetary policy is the RBI's proposal to compensate customers, who lost their money in digital frauds, up to Rs 25,000. While it may give some relief to the victims of cyber frauds, it should not absolve RBI of its responsibility to make payment systems as far as possible fraud-proof.

FPIs turn net buyers in Feb; invest Rs 8,100 cr in a week on US trade deal

After three consecutive months of heavy selling, foreign portfolio investors (FPIs) turned net buyers in the first week of February, infusing more than Rs 8,100 crore in Indian equities, aided by improving risk sentiment, along with a trade deal with the US.

The inflows follow sustained withdrawals in recent months, with FPIs pulling out Rs 35,962 crore in January, Rs 22,611 crore in December, and Rs 3,765 crore in November, data with the depositories showed.

Overall, in 2025, FPIs pulled out a net Rs 1.66 lakh crore (USD 18.9 billion) from Indian equities,



marking one of the worst periods for foreign flows. The selling was driven by volatile currency movements, global trade tensions, concerns over potential US tariffs and stretched equity valuations. According to the data, FPIs invested Rs 8,129 crore in this month (till February 6).

Himanshu Srivastava, principal manager-research at Morningstar Investment Research India, said the recent buying re-

flects improving risk appetite and renewed confidence in India's growth outlook. "The sentiment was supported by easing global uncertainties, stability in domestic interest rate expectations, and optimism around India-US trade and policy developments," he added.

The turnaround contrasts sharply with January's outflows, when FPIs exited Indian markets amid a global risk-off environ-

ment and elevated US bond yields.

Echoing similar views, Vaqarjaved Khan, senior fundamental analyst at Angel One, said the breakthrough in India-US trade talks helped reduce geopolitical uncertainty and fuel a market rally, alongside stabilising US yields and supportive measures announced in the Union Budget for FY26, including fiscal stimulus and sector-specific incentives.

VK Vijayakumar, chief investment strategist at Geojit Investments, said the appreciation of the rupee also played a key role in improving sentiment. The rupee strengthened from a record low of 90.30 against the dollar, al-

though it later weakened to around 90.70 by the close of February 6. He said the rupee is expected to stabilise and gradually appreciate to below 90 per dollar by the end of March 2026, which could trigger additional FPI inflows, although outcomes will depend on how global trade and artificial intelligence-related developments unfold. Market participants remain cautiously optimistic. Further inflows could materialise if corporate earnings momentum continues and global trade tensions remain contained, although lingering rupee weakness, elevated valuations and potential shifts in US policy could limit upside, Khan said.

Mcap of 8 of top 10 valued firms surges by whopping Rs 4.55 lakh cr

The combined market valuation of eight of India's top 10 firms surged by Rs 4,55,336.36 crore last week, driven by a strong equities rally, with Reliance Industries emerging as the biggest gainer. The BSE benchmark index jumped 2,857.46 points, or 3.53 per cent, reflecting widespread investor optimism.

Reliance Industries added Rs 1,41,887.97 crore to its market capitalization, taking it to Rs 19,63,358.79 crore, retaining its position as the most valued company. Life Insurance Corporation of India (LIC) followed, with its valuation rising Rs 64,926.10 crore to Rs 5,70,198.54 crore. Bharti Airtel's market cap increased by Rs 52,516.39 crore to Rs 11,62,288.64 crore, while

ICICI Bank gained Rs 52,476.97 crore, reaching Rs 10,06,258.82 crore. HDFC Bank, State Bank of India, Bajaj Finance, and Hindustan Unilever also saw their valuations rise last week. In contrast, Tata Consultancy Services (TCS) and Infosys experienced declines. Infosys dropped Rs 63,462.66 crore to Rs 6,26,067.95 crore amid a global tech sell-off triggered by valuation concerns and apprehension over the rapid pace of artificial intelligence advancements.

After the latest moves, the ranking of India's most valued firms remained led by Reliance Industries, followed by HDFC Bank, Bharti Airtel, TCS, ICICI Bank, State Bank of India, Infosys, Bajaj Finance, LIC, and Hindustan Unilever. Market analysts attribute the strong performance of energy, banking, and

consumer stocks to renewed investor confidence in economic growth and robust quarterly earnings. The technology sector, particularly IT services companies, faced headwinds due to profit-booking and uncertainties around AI-related hype. Last week's rally highlighted the growing divergence in investor sentiment across sectors. While traditional heavyweights in energy, finance, and telecom captured most of the gains, IT majors struggled under the weight of valuation pressures and global tech volatility.

With the broader benchmark advancing more than 3 per cent in a single week, the market's optimism was evident, emphasizing the resilience of India's top companies amid global and domestic challenges.

India's Trade Balance With US To Fall From Surplus To Deficit

US trade deal framework may push India into trade deficit, \$500-billion import target seen as unrealistic

As agreed in the interim framework of the trade deal with the US, if India fulfills the \$500 billion import commitment, the country's trade balance will fall from surplus to deficit next year. However, fulfilling the commitment looks implausible to meet. The framework statement said that India intends to purchase \$500 billion of U.S. energy products, aircraft and aircraft parts, precious metals, technology products, and coking coal over the next 5 years. In FY25, the US imports into India stood at \$48 billion and exports to the US \$86.5 billion. The



\$100 billion imports per year will double the imports from the US and make India's trade balance swing from surplus to deficit. From next year, India will have a trade deficit with the two large economies – the US and China. However, this looks unlikely as aircraft are a major component of this commitment. At present, India operates around 200 Boeing aircraft. Even if India adds another 200

Boeing aircraft over the next five years, at an estimated cost of \$300 million per aircraft, the total value would be about \$60 billion. Moreover, such purchasing decisions are made by private airlines, not by the government. The framework also said that India has agreed to remove non-tariff barriers on food and agricultural products. Going by the terms of similar deals entered with other coun-

tries, this will let genetically modified soyabean, corn and dairy products into the country. "Recognizing the importance of working together to resolve long-standing concerns, India also agrees to address long-standing non-tariff barriers to the trade in U.S. food and agricultural products," the statement said.

Under its trade deal, Malaysia has a similar provision, which allows imports of dairy, meat, and poultry products from the US if they have the sanitary and health certificates from the relevant American authorities. This concession implies that the US certification would prevail over Malaysia's domestic

health and sanitary requirements, finds GTRI. Further, India will eliminate or reduce tariffs on all U.S. industrial goods and a wide range of U.S. food and agricultural products, including dried distillers' grains (DDGs), red sorghum for animal feed, tree nuts, fresh and processed fruit, soybean oil, wine and spirits, and additional products," the framework said. But it did not specify which the additional products are. Both these provisions can lead to the entry of genetically-modified foods like maize, soya bean, cotton and corn as well as dairy products of cows fed on animal feed.

Telangana Muslims Demand Strict Action After Jyotirao Phule Statue Vandalized

MD Shabbir, State Working President of the Telangana State Muslim Community Association, strongly condemned the attack on the statue of Mahatma Jyotirao Phule in Tellapur, Sangareddy. He demanded the immediate arrest of the culprits and strict legal action, warning that failure to act may provoke public anger.

Phule was a prominent social reformer who dedicated his life to the rights of marginalized communities, women's education, and the abolition of caste discrimination. Born on April 11, 1827, in Pune to a Mali family, he studied at a missionary school, where he developed a strong sense of social equality and human rights. At 13, he married Savitribai Phule, then 9, and personally taught her to become India's first female teacher.



In 1848, Phule started India's first girls' school in Pune and later set up schools for marginalized castes and night schools for working children. In 1882, he appeared before the Hunter Commission, advocating for compulsory primary education. He founded the Satyashodhak Samaj in 1873 to fight caste oppression. He promoted widow remarriage, supported destitute women, and established shelters to prevent female infanticide. His writings, including Gulamgiri and Raitu Bidda, highlighted social injustices. Phule's ideals later inspired leaders like Dr. B.R. Ambedkar and continue to influence India's struggle against social inequality.

"With the Union Budget 2026 and the RBI's monetary policy decisions now largely digested, Indian equity markets have entered a consolidation phase, shifting investor focus toward implementation, capex execution and the pace of actual spending.




Paul Thomas Anderson Wins DGA Award for Best Director

According to an official of the department, on a tip-off, the Special Task Force team raided the house of Vikas Singh alias Vicky, located at the Jummerat Bazaar area, and found the drug concealed in a bag and kept in a room. "Vicky was sourcing the ganja from some persons in Andhra Pradesh for Rs 2000 a kilogram. After bringing it to the city, he was packing the ganja in small sachets and selling 30 grams for Rs 1500 to customers," said the official. The accused have been identified as Vikas Singh, Mithilal Singh, Akash Singh and Vishal Singh. Four others involved in the case are absconding. Four motorcycles and five mobile phones were also seized during the raid.

Hyderabad Cybercrime Police refund over Rs 71L, makes 37 arrests in Jan

In January, the Hyderabad Cybercrime Police refunded Rs 71,91,371 to victims and arrested 37 individuals from seven different states in connection with 26 cases, a release said on Sunday, February 8. The arrested individuals are allegedly involved in 86 cases across India, with transactions amounting to approximately Rs 65 crore.

Fifteen individuals were arrested for investment fraud, two for digital arrest fraud, and four arrests were made in connection with online child sexual abuse material. One person was arrested for business fraud, one for gaming fraud, and three for job fraud. A total of 117 FIRs were registered last month. In January, zonal cybercells received 1,706 petitions from the Na-

tional Cyber Reporting Platform (NCRP), which resulted in 315 FIRs. A total of 13 individuals involved in 13 cases were arrested, and Rs 10,65,003 was refunded to the victims.

Hyderabad police have appealed to citizens to be wary of friend requests on social media platforms claiming to be from senior government officials and to not transfer money without thoroughly confirming the identity and legitimacy. "Do not believe investment schemes promising high returns with little or no risk on Telegram, WhatsApp, X, and Instagram and invest only through SEBI-approved applications," the release said. If anyone falls victim to cybercrime, they are urged to contact the help-line at 1930 or report it on the government's official website.

Telangana High Court Dismisses Journalist's Passport Renewal Petition

The Telangana High Court has dismissed a petition filed by a Hyderabad-based journalist seeking the renewal of his passport, reiterating that the issuance or renewal of a passport is not an automatic right and must strictly comply with established rules and regulations. The petitioner, a 52-year-old resident of Bahadurpura, who has previously worked with a daily newspaper and a television channel and currently manages a news website along with social media platforms, had his passport first issued in 1998 and renewed in 2018 for a period of ten years.



within a year following a report submitted by the state intelligence department. According to the report, the petitioner was allegedly involved in a criminal case registered in 1998, during which authorities seized a pistol, 30 live cartridges, and a substantial quantity of potassium chloride mixture, and the intelligence inputs also alleged connections with ISI operatives. In addition, the report claimed that the petitioner had engaged in activities that allegedly incited communal tensions between

two communities during 2018 and 2019, and that the Shamshabad zone special branch was maintaining a personal file to monitor his activities. Based on these intelligence inputs, authorities concluded that issuing a passport to him would be prejudicial to India's sovereignty and integrity. Before the High Court, the petitioner contended that the revocation was carried out without giving him an opportunity to be heard, which he claimed violated the principles of natural justice, and he sought suspension of the communication sent by the police recommending the revocation. Justice Nagesh Bheemappa observed that the petitioner had not challenged the original order revok-

ing his passport but instead questioned a subsequent communication. The court further noted that while the petitioner filed a rejoinder denying certain allegations, he did not specifically dispute the seizure of the pistol, ammunition, and potassium chloride or the alleged links with the ISI. Emphasizing that matters affecting national security require greater judicial caution, the court held that natural justice principles may not apply in cases involving public interest, national security, and confidentiality. Consequently, the court concluded that no justification existed to grant the relief sought, effectively dismissing the petition and upholding the revocation of the journalist's passport.
