Telangana Cabinet Clears VB-G RAM-G, to Move SC on State Rights

Hyderabad. Wakeuptelangana The Telangana Cabinet on Thursday decided to implement the new rural employment scheme, VB-G RAM G, which replaced the MGNREGA, but will approach the Supreme Court against it to fight for safeguarding the state's interests. Briefing reporters after a meeting of the cabinet, state Information and Public Relations Minister Ponguleti Srinivasa Reddy alleged that the Centre has unilaterally brought in the VB-G RAM G Act despite

objections raised by state governments, workers and other stakeholders. "The cabinet decided to approach the Supreme Court to protect our rights, while accepting the scheme," he said. The Viksit Bharat - Guarantee for Rozgar and Ajeevika Mission (Gramin) (VB-G RAM G) Act, 2025, came into force across the country on July 1, providing 125 days of wage employment to rural workers, while making states shoulder 40 per cent of expenditure incurred. TG Cabinet Clears ₹7,345 Cr Musi Phase-I Works

The state Cabinet on Thursday accorded administrative approval for the first phase of the ambitious Musi river rejuvenation project at an estimated cost of Rs 7,345.12 crore, setting in motion the implementation of the long-awaited riverfront development initiative. The government will issue technical sanction and approve the notice inviting tenders (NTT) by July 9. It plans to finalise the tender process and award contracts by August 19, paving the way for commencement of Phase-I works. This marks the formal initiation of the implementation of the first

phase of the Musi River rejuvenation project. Briefing the media on the Cabinet decisions, information and public relations minister Ponguleti Srinivasa Reddy said the Cabinet approved Phase-I works covering a 21-km stretch of the river at a cost of Rs 7,345.12 crore. The project will be taken up from the point where the streams from Himayatsagar and Osmansagar originate and converge at Babu Ghat, Langar Houz. The first phase comprises two stretches converging at the proposed Gandhi Sarovar near Babu Ghat. Stretch-A extends 9.2 km from Himayatsagar and Stretch-B covers 11.8 km from Os-

mansagar (Gandipet) - The Cabinet also approved the creation of 147 new posts for the implementation and maintenance of the Musi riverfront works. In addition, it cleared the deputation of required personnel from other government departments to ensure smooth execution and management of the project. According to official sources, Singapore-based engineering consultancy Meinhardt, working as part of an international consortium comprising Cushman & Wakefield and RIOS, submitted the draft detailed project report (DPR) for the first phase on May 30. The DPR focuses on ensur-

ing continuous fresh water flow in the Musi, creation of modern riverfront infrastructure and comprehensive flood mitigation measures aimed at transforming the river into a sustainable urban waterway. During the Cabinet meeting, Chief Minister Revanth Reddy directed officials to allot double-bedroom houses to families presently residing in the Musi riverbed as part of the rehabilitation process. He also instructed that landowners affected by land acquisition should either be provided transferable development rights (TDR) or paid suitable compensation. The Chief Minister directed officials to relocate structures situated on defence

land proposed to be acquired for the Gandhi Sarovar project, with the state government undertaking the responsibility for shifting them. Revanth Reddy also directed officials to establish a Musi experience centre on Necklace Road - P.V. Narasimha Rao Marg - along the Hussainsagar, to help the public understand the vision behind the project and the development works planned under it. He said the centre should comprehensively showcase all components of the project while also serving as a platform for collecting public feedback and suggestions on the proposed riverfront development initiative.



Hyderabad Tense as Harish Rao Arrested

Congress Backed Out of Debate Because It Cannot Defend Corruption in Gurukul Tenders: Harish Rao

Former minister and BRS Deputy Floor Leader T. Harish Rao on Friday accused the Congress government of backing out of a public debate on Telangana's debt and alleged irregularities in Gurukul tenders, claiming the ruling party withdrew because it could not defend what he de-

scribed as corruption in procurement worth nearly ₹2,000 crore. Addressing a press conference, Harish Rao said the Congress government had repeatedly challenged the BRS to a public debate but failed to honour its own invitation. He said senior BRS leaders, including K. T. Rama Rao, reached Telangana Bhavan for the discussion, but Con-

gress leaders did not turn up. "The Congress government challenged us to a public debate, but ultimately backed out. They scored an own goal after throwing the challenge," Harish Rao said, adding that the government's refusal to participate itself indicated that there were serious irregularities in Gurukul tenders. Harish Rao also questioned the

Congress government's allegations regarding the State's debt. He said Minister Jupally Krishna Rao initially claimed that the previous BRS government had left Telangana with a debt of ₹8 lakh crore, but later revised the figure to ₹7 lakh crore, raising doubts about the credibility of the government's accusations. He further alleged that the government prevented the debate from taking place by deploying police personnel and obstructing BRS leaders from reaching the designated venue. According to him, the move reflected the Congress government's reluctance to defend its claims in a public forum. On the issue of Gurukul tenders, Harish Rao

said he, along with BRS leaders R. S. Praveen Kumar and Koppala Eshwar, had presented documentary evidence highlighting alleged irregularities in procurement. He alleged that tenders involving groceries, uniforms, footwear, notebooks and other essential supplies for Gurukul institutions were manipulated, resulting in significant financial losses to the State. He claimed that inflated procurement costs for edible oils, spices and other essential commodities caused substantial losses to the public exchequer, and argued that the government's refusal to debate the issue amounted to an admission of wrongdoing. Harish Rao also accused the Congress

India, Japan Unveil Economic Security Framework Pact

India and Japan on Thursday unveiled a raft of landmark initiatives including an economic partnership framework and defence pact to co-develop military hardware following summit talks between Prime Minister Narendra Modi and his Japanese counterpart Sanae Takachi. The major outcomes from the meeting included a declaration on economic security, a joint statement for cooperation in the field of artificial intelligence and a document to bolster engagement in the energy supply chain. The two prime ministers carried out a comprehensive review of India-Japan ties in areas of trade and investment, economic security,



emerging technologies, defence and people-to-people exchanges. "The economies of India and Japan are complementary. From cultural values to modern technology, there is similarity in our thinking and approach as well," Modi said in his media statement. "And above all, the foundation of our relations rests on unbreakable mutual trust," he said, reflecting the growing congruence in ties between the two countries.

SC Throws Out NCLT Order for Relying on AI 'Hallucinated' Judgments

New Delhi: Red flagging the use of "non-existent, fake, and hallucinated" judgements generated by artificial intelligence (AI), the Supreme Court on Thursday set aside a verdict of the National Company Law Tribunal (NCLT), saying that courts must adopt zero tolerance against citing or using AI-generated precedents. The bench comprising Justices PS Narasimha and Alok Aradhe said, "The production of fake, non-existent, and hallucinated material and its utilisation as precedents in law, is like the release of methyl Isocyanate in the province of law and justice: invisible, insidious, and catastrophic by the time anyone notices. It not only contaminates but takes away the very lifeblood of judicial determination."

Wangchuk Weakens on Day 5 Fast

Social activist Sonam Wangchuk's health reportedly deteriorated on the fifth day of his indefinite hunger strike at Jantar Mantar in

New Delhi, with his blood sugar level dropping to 60 mg/dL and his blood pressure remaining critically low. Providing an update on social media platform X, Cockroach Janta Party (CJP) founder Abhijeet Dipke ex-

pressed concern over Wangchuk's condition and held the government responsible for any adverse outcome. "Sonam Wangchuk's health is continuously deteriorating. His sugar level has dropped to 60, and his blood pressure is also very low. If anything happens to Sonam sir, the government will be responsible," Dipke wrote on X. He also reiterated his demand for the resignation of the concerned authorities. As the broader protest entered its 13th day, Dipke launched an initiative titled "Chai Pe Charcha with Cockroaches" at the protest site to engage with demonstrators and gather suggestions on strengthening and expanding

the ongoing movement. Meanwhile, six students affiliated with the All India Students' Association (AISA) continued their indefinite hunger strike from a separate stage at Jantar Mantar. According to AISA, the health of the fasting students has also shown signs of deterioration. The student body stated that JNUSU Joint Secretary Danish's blood sugar level had fallen to 61 mg/dL. Two other fasting students, Aameen and Deepak Kumar Verma, have reportedly been advised by doctors to discontinue their fast due to worsening health conditions. The protest continues amid growing concerns over the health of the hunger

Healthcare, Consumer Goods Shine in FY27; Power Distribution Outlook Weak: Brickwork Ratings

from Tier-II/Tier III cities, and premiumisation. Meanwhile, tailwinds for the healthcare services sector include strong interest and debt coverage ratios, a medical tourism market of an estimated USD 13 billion, and expansion of the Ayushman Bharat Program to senior citizens over the age of 7. The India's Sectoral Credit Outlook 2026 marks Brickwork Ratings's first comprehensive annual assessment of credit quality across 25 key sectors. "Built on our proprietary five-pa-

Technology, automobiles, telecom, infrastructure, logistics, industrials, and power generation benefit from deleveraging, policy support, export opportunities under new trade agreements, and long-term demand visibility. "While sectors such as chemicals and textiles face margin pressures, and transport and airports re-

main relatively leveraged, their credit profiles are supported by strong solvency, improving profitability, and stable revenue visibility," said K. H. Patnaik, Chief Ratings Officer, Brickwork Ratings. Of the 25 sectors across 8 industry clusters rated in the report, BWR has given a negative-to-stable rating to the Power Distribution segment. GST Bill Changes Put ERP Readiness in Focus

IBill Changes Put ERP and ASP Readiness in Focus for Indian Enterprises GSTN's revised 01 August 2026 timeline gives businesses a critical window to strengthen data, API, and dispatch readiness India, June 2026: The recent GSTN advisory extending the implementation timeline for key Bill enhancements from 15 June 2026 to 01 August 2026 has brought ERP, ASP, and enterprise compliance readiness back into focus. The changes include mandatory capture of "Ship To GSTIN" in applicable Bill-To/Ship-To transactions, corresponding updates to e-Invoice and Bill by IRN APIs, and the introduction of a voluntary Bill closure facility. While the revised timeline offers businesses additional preparation time, it also highlights a larger shift in GST compliance - from document-level reporting to transaction-level movement visibility. For enterprises, the impact goes beyond adding one more field in the Bill system. In applicable transactions, missing or invalid Ship To GSTIN details may result in Bill validation failures and additional operational effort, particularly in ERP-integrated and API-driven environments. In high-volume businesses, even small gaps in master data can lead to failed transactions, manual cor-

rections, delayed movement of goods, and reconciliation issues across invoices, Bills, ERP records, and GST returns. The change is especially relevant for businesses managing multi-location supplies, project-site deliveries, warehouse dispatches, third-party shipping, branch transfers, and complex Bill-To/Ship-To scenarios. Many such transactions depend on accurate consignee details, delivery-location masters, GSTIN mapping, URP treatment, and system-level validation between tax, finance, logistics, and dispatch teams. GSTN has also clarified that where a Ship To GSTIN is not available, taxpayers may use "URP" in the Ship To GSTIN field, wherever applicable. Businesses should therefore review not only GSTIN master data but also the transaction scenarios where URP treatment may be required. In addition, GSTN has introduced validation controls aimed at improving transaction-level accuracy. These include validation of Ship To GSTIN, consistency checks between GSTIN and state codes, PIN code validations, and restrictions on using the same GSTIN for both Bill-To and Ship-To parties in applicable Bill-To/Ship-To transactions. As a result, businesses should review customer masters, delivery-location data, and ERP mappings well before the implementation date. The voluntary Bill closure

facility also brings a new operational control layer. After completion of delivery, businesses will have the option to voluntarily close the Bill, creating a system record of movement completion. This can help reduce open Bill exposure, improve audit trails, and strengthen visibility over delivery status after dispatch. "The revised implementation date should not be viewed as a delay in compliance, but as a readiness window. The real question for enterprises is whether their invoice data, dispatch data, ERP workflows, ASP integrations, and Bill APIs are aligned before the go-live date," said a Cygnet. One tax technology expert. ASPs, ERP vendors, GSPs, system integrators, and enterprise IT teams will need to ensure that updated payloads, validations, and API changes are configured and tested before 01 August 2026. Businesses generating Bills through ERP or integrated systems should review whether Ship To GSTIN or URP is being correctly captured and transmitted in relevant Bill-To/Ship-To flows. Particular attention may also be required in B2B and SEZ transactions, where certain Ship-To details provided during IRN generation cannot subsequently be modified during Bill generation through IRN-based APIs.

Free High-Density Cotton Seed Distribution Held at Mator Rythu Vedika

Aleru Constituency | July 2: The Department of Agriculture conducted a farmers' awareness programme and distributed free High-Density Planting System (HDPS) cotton seed kits at the Rythu Vedika, Mator Village, Motakondur Mandal, on Thursday morning to promote scientific cultivation and improve cotton productivity. Addressing the gathering, Mandal Agriculture Of-

ficer (MAO) Smt. AI Madhavi Latha explained the benefits of high-density cotton cultivation. She stated that the government is supplying laboratory-tested and certified cotton seeds, with two seed bags provided for cultivation on half an acre, and advised farmers to follow the recommended spacing and cultivation practices for higher yields. The Agriculture Officer further informed that officials from



the seed company, in coordination with the Agriculture Department, would regularly monitor the crop after sowing and provide technical guidance.

Air India Express resumes Kuwait, Oman flights

Less than 1 pc of SIR cases cleared in 100 days in Bengal



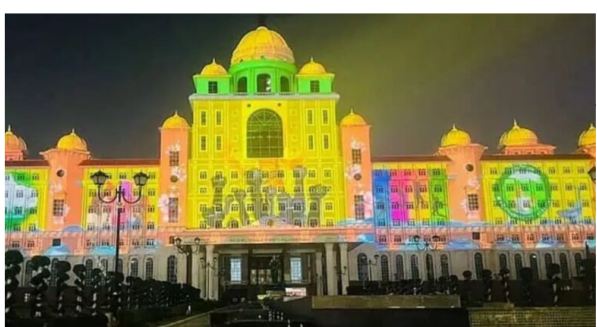
Kolkata: In the 100 days since starting operations, SIR tribunals in West Bengal have cleared 30,000 cases, less than

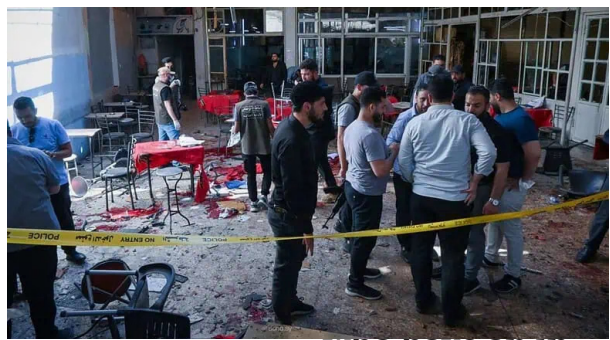

Six killed, 22 injured in bomb blast at cafe in central Damascus

Damascus: At least six people were killed and 22 others injured after a bomb exploded inside a crowded cafe in central Damascus on Thursday, July 2, the Syrian Arab News Agency (SANA) and Reuters reported. The explosion occurred at a cafe on Al-Nasr Street in the al-Marjah district, near the Palace of Justice. Syrian state television said the blast was caused by an explosive device planted inside the premises. Emergency responders rushed the injured to hospitals across the Syrian capital, while security forces sealed off the area and launched an investigation. Authorities are reviewing surveillance camera footage and gathering evidence to identify those responsible. Damascus Governor Maher Idlibi said preliminary findings indicated

who have an interest in the instability of the region, and everyone who has tampered with the blood of Syrians will be punished," Idlibi said. No individual or group had claimed responsibility for the attack at the time of publication. Images and videos circulating on social media appeared to show extensive damage inside the cafe and bloodstains on the floor. The bombing comes as Syria's new leadership continues efforts to strengthen security following the overthrow of former president Bashar al-Assad in late 2024, which brought more than 14 years of civil war to an end. Damascus has witnessed several security incidents in recent months, including a car bomb outside the Ministry of Defence in May that killed one soldier and injured at least 18 others. Syrian officials have previously warned that the Islamic

State group is seeking to exploit security gaps by reactivating sleeper cells, despite losing the territory it once controlled. The investigation into Thursday's bombing remains ongoing. The latest attack has renewed concerns over the fragile security situation in Syria despite recent efforts by the transitional government to restore stability and rebuild institutions after years of conflict. Security analysts have warned that isolated bombings and targeted attacks remain a significant challenge as authorities work to dismantle extremist networks operating in different parts of the country. The United Nations and several international humanitarian organizations have repeatedly stressed the need for sustained security measures alongside political reconciliation to prevent a resurgence of violence. The attack is expected to intensify calls for stronger intelligence coordination and enhanced protection of public places, particularly in major

cities such as Damascus. Residents of the capital expressed shock over the bombing, saying such incidents have become less frequent in recent months, making Thursday's explosion particularly alarming. Witnesses described scenes of panic as people rushed to help the injured before emergency teams arrived at the site. Hospitals across Damascus remained on high alert to treat those injured in the blast, while forensic teams continued collecting evidence from the damaged cafe. Authorities urged the public to remain vigilant and report any suspicious activity as investigators pursue leads into those behind the attack. Officials have not ruled out the possibility that the bombing was intended to undermine public confidence in the country's improving security environment. The investigation is continuing, and authorities have pledged to bring those responsible to justice.

RELIEF FOR INDIAN IMMIGRANTS



The United States Supreme Court's landmark ruling upholding birthright citizenship comes as a major relief for millions of immigrant families, particularly Indians who constitute a major chunk of the skilled professionals in the country. The top court has struck down President Donald Trump administration's January 2025 executive order attempting to restrict automatic citizenship for children born on US soil to various categories of immigrants. The ruling has upheld the constitutional guarantee that children born in the United States will continue to be recognised as Ameri-

Indian diaspora, as hundreds of thousands of H-1B and other visa holders work in America, many of whom have children born in the country and wait for decades for permanent residency. Trump's order, if followed through, would have left those children stateless or dependent on India's own citizenship laws, even though they were born and raised in America. More than one million Indians remain stuck in decades-long employment-based green card backlogs because of country-wise caps on permanent residency. For these families, uncertainty over immigration rules has long been a major

source of concern. The court's verdict comes as a profound affirmation of who belongs in America, a country enriched by the contributions of immigrants from all over the world. In fact, America's biggest modern success story is tied to immigration, particularly highly skilled professionals working in technology. Among them, Indians stand out for their stellar contributions. Geographic Reference Currently, nearly three out of every four H-1B visas approved by the US go to Indian nationals, making them the backbone of America's technology workforce and some of Silicon Valley's biggest companies. There are an estimated 5.2 million Indians in the US, including more than 1.2 million skilled professionals. Many Indian professionals spend years working in the US before becoming eli-

gible for permanent residency because of the lengthy green card backlog. During that period, they continue renewing temporary visas despite building their lives in America. Birthright citizenship has long been central to the immigrant experience and provides certainty for millions of families planning their future in America. By grounding its judgment in the Constitution, the Supreme Court made it extremely difficult for any future administration to reverse birthright citizenship. The concept of birthright citizenship stems from the 14th Amendment to the US Constitution, ratified in 1868. For many economists and industry leaders, America's ability to attract global talent has remained one of its greatest competitive advantages. Indian professionals have become central to that story, under-

India vs Sri Lanka Test schedule announced: Galle and Colombo to host crucial WTC series in August

Colombo: India's two-Test series against hosts Sri Lanka will be played in Galle and Colombo from August 15 to 27, the home board SLC announced on Thursday. The series is part of the World Test Championship. The first Test will be played at the Galle International Stadium from August 15, while the second will be at the SSC from August 23, read a statement from Sri Lanka Cricket. India, who have made two finals but never won the WTC title, are currently fifth in the standings, while Sri Lanka are sixth. India will also tour New Zealand this year for a two-match Test series in November-December. History

India had begun the Shubman Gill captaincy era with a commendable 2-2 draw in England before winning the home series against the West Indies. However, the mighty hosts were white-washed by South Africa at home last year, raising serious questions over the batters' ability to play spin. The Sri Lankan spinners in their own backyard will provide another stiff challenge to the Indian batters. The last time India toured Sri Lanka for a Test series was in 2017 when they had won 3-0. The upcoming series is expected to play a crucial role in both teams' World Test Championship campaigns, with valuable points at stake early in the new WTC cycle. India will be aiming to build momentum under the leadership of Shubman Gill, while Sri Lanka will look to make the most of familiar home conditions. Galle and Colombo have traditionally offered assistance to spin bowlers, particularly as the matches progress. The conditions are likely to test India's batting lineup, which has faced criticism in recent years for inconsistent performances against quality spin attacks on turning tracks. India are expected to rely on a balanced combination of experienced players and emerging talents, with the team's spin

department likely to play a significant role. Sri Lanka, meanwhile, will bank on its strong spin arsenal and home advantage to challenge the visitors. The series is also likely to feature several intriguing individual contests, including India's top-order batters against Sri Lanka's spin bowlers. The performances of the middle order and all-rounders could prove decisive in determining the outcome of the two-match contest. For Sri Lanka, the series presents an opportunity to improve their standing in the World Test Championship table and register a significant home victory against one of the world's strongest Test sides. The hosts have consistently been a formidable force at Galle, where spin-friendly conditions have often tilted matches in their favour. Cricket fans from both countries are expected to turn out in large numbers, particularly for the opening Test in Galle, one of the sport's most picturesque venues. The series is anticipated to provide high-quality red-ball cricket as both teams seek to gain an early advantage in the race for a place in the next World Test Championship final. Throughout the course of history, the FIFA World Cup has always carried political undertones. Way back in 1938, it was alleged that dictator Benito Mussolini had used his power to influence the referees in favour of Italy. In 1978, the event was hit by political controversy in the host country Argentina when the country's dictator General Jorge Rafael Videla kidnapped and tortured thousands of political opponents. So, the world's biggest sporting event has never existed in complete isolation from politics and its adverse effects. But perhaps the 2026 FIFA World Cup has demonstrated more

clearly than ever how political rivalries can spill into sport, with the experience of the Iranian national team becoming the tournament's most striking and shameful example. Ultimately, Iran was eliminated from the tournament, after not only competing against their opponents on the field but also struggling with the administrative system that was prejudiced against them. FIFA proudly proclaims that football unites the world regardless of politics, religion or nationality. But the reality is different. The events surrounding Iran's participation at the World Cup of 2026, have led many observers, including the famous former footballer and well-known commentator Gary Lineker, to question



whether that principle has been upheld by FIFA. It was not only Iran which suffered. At the very beginning, the first controversy erupted when referee Omar Artan of Somalia, who was adjudged Africa's Referee of the Year 2025, was detained by US immigration authorities and deported from the country. He missed the tournament entirely. Many others denied visa. For football lovers of several African countries, getting a visa was a big hurdle. After the start of the US-Israel war with Iran, America suspended routine con-

Iran Consul General Pays Tribute to Khamenei Ahead of State Funeral

Iran's Consul General in Hyderabad, Hameed Ahmadiyeh, has paid tribute to Ayatollah Seyyed Ali Husseini Khamenei in a statement issued ahead of the funeral ceremonies scheduled to begin on July 4, 2026, describing him as a "Martyr Leader" and praising his leadership of the Islamic Republic. In the statement dated July 2, 2026, Ahmadiyeh said Iran is preparing for state funeral ceremonies culminating in Khamenei's burial on July 9 in Mashhad at the shrine of Imam Reza, following funeral processions in Tehran, Qom, and cities in Iraq. The statement claims

that Khamenei was killed in a February 28, 2026, joint U.S.-Israeli airstrike on Tehran, which it says also claimed the lives of several family members and senior Iranian officials. It characterises the incident as an assassination and martyrdom. Reflecting the official Iranian government's position, Ahmadiyeh highlighted Khamenei's journey from his birth in Mashhad in 1939 to becoming one of the central figures of the 1979 Islamic Revolution. He noted that Khamenei, a close disciple of Imam Seyyed Ruhollah Khomeini, served as Iran's President before succeeding Khomeini as Supreme Leader in 1989, leading the country for



nearly four decades. The statement credits Khamenei with strengthening Iran's defence capabilities, advancing its nuclear programme, promoting self-reliance, and guiding the country through

regional and international challenges. It further describes Iran's political system as resilient, asserting that the country's leadership transition following his death demonstrated the continuity of

the Islamic Republic. According to Ahmadiyeh, millions of Iranians and supporters are expected to participate in the funeral ceremonies, with cities adorned in black banners as the nation pays tribute to its former Supreme Leader. Concluding his message, the Consul General said Khamenei's legacy would continue through the ideals of the Islamic Republic, stating that Iran's path of resistance remains rooted in principles rather than individuals.
